1 General Introduction

Thank you for choosing GSM Fixed Wireless Phone of Claro. To use your phone well, please read this user manual carefully before you use. The phone has been designed to operate with the latest digital communication technology -GSM. The phone provides the following advanced features:

Important Information

The product can only be installed indoors.

Do not place the phone near high temperature objects, under direct sunlight, near source of water, near fire or near inflammable and explosive materials. Avoid using the phone in high temperature or humidity.

The phone may interfere with heart pacemaker, hearing aid and other electronic medical devices. Therefore please follow the instructions given by your equipment suppliers or consult your doctor. Turn your phone OFF in health care centers if any regulations posted in the area instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care centers may be using equipment that may be sensitive to external RF energy.

Place the phone away from other electronic devices like TV and Radio to avoid interference.

Keep the product away from magnetic field and static electricity.

Place the phone out of the reach of small children.

Do not attempt to reassemble the phone by yourself. Only authorized personnel could service the phone and its accessories. Faulty installation or service can be dangerous and may invalidate the warranty.

Do not clean the phone while in operation. Before attempting to clean the phone, turn the phone off, disconnect the external power adapter and take out the battery. Use a dry, soft cloth for cleaning. Do

not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.

Do not drop, knock or shake the phone. Rough handling may break the phone body and internal circuit boards.

Do not use the phone if the antenna is damaged. Replace the damaged antenna immediately by a qualified technician. Use only a manufacturer approved antenna. Non-approved antennas, modifications or attachments may impair call quality and damage the phone.

Do not hold the antenna during operation. This may affect call quality and cause the phone to operate at unintended power levels.

Keep the antenna free from obstructions and position the antenna straight up. This will ensure best call quality.

Only use the battery and the power adapter approved by the manufacturer. If not, it may cause an explosion or result in a short circuit.

It is highly recommended to fully charge the battery before initial use. The battery might have been discharged during storage and delivery.

Do not throw battery. Batteries are not to be disposed off by putting them in fire. It may explode or catch fire.

The power adapter must be used within the specified AC voltage range.

Take out the battery if you won't use your phone for a long time and keep the battery well.

During lightning, do not touch the power plug. It may result in an electric shock or death.

Do not touch the plug with wet hands. Always grasp and pull the plug, not the cord. Do not put heavy things on the power cord or bend it too much.

During daily use, do not pull out the power adapter. The battery is used for backup power, which will not cause the increasing consumption of electricity.

Don't use the power adapter if the power cable is damaged. Contact the maintenance center immediately and replace the adapter.




Figure 2 Key Layout

1 Menu/Confirm key: under the hook on status, press this key to enter the menu; when enter the menu, press this key to operate the left bottom function;

2. \blacktriangleleft : under the hook on status, press this key to enter SMS menu; when enter the SMS, press this key to move the cursor to the left;

3. \blacktriangleright : under the hook on status, press this key to enter Template menu; when enter the SMS, press this key to move the cursor to the right;

4. PHONEBOOK/RETURN/DELETE key: when enter the menu, press this key to operate the right bottom function; when input the words, press this key to delete the word before the cursor; when there have the incoming call, press this key to reject the call;

5. \blacktriangle : when enter the menu, press this key to search upwardly; under the hook on status, press this key to enter the Alarm clock setup; when talking, press this key to turn the volume lower;

6. $\mathbf{\nabla}$: when enter the menu, press this key to search downwardly; under the hook on status, press this key to enter the call recorder setup; when talking, press this key to turn the volume higher;

7. Speed Dial Memory: can store M1-M10 speed dial memories; when dial, long press the M1-M10 to dial out the stored number;

8. Handsfree key: turn on or turn off the handsfree function;

9. Redial key: under hook off status, press this key to redial the last number;

10 POWER ON/OFF Key: Long press this key to power on/off the phone; when enter the menu, press this key to exit and return to the hook on status; under the hook on status and there is a call coming, press this key to reject the call; when talk, press this key to end the conversation and return to the hook on status.

11 OK key: when enter the menu, press this key to enter the next setup.

12 Outdoor antenna

The following icon may appear on the display of the phone:

4 Basic Operations

4.1 Insert SIM card and connect the battery

Open the battery cover, insert the SIM card as indication; then connect the battery; close the battery cover; please be sure that this step working is under the telephone power off status to avoid the SIM card damage.

4.2 Power On/Off

Connect the handset to your phone by the coiled cord and put the handset to hang up position, then connect DC power supply or insert the battery to the battery chamber., then press the Power On/Off Key on the panel for 3 seconds to power on the phone, your phone should go to idle screen and is ready to use.

If the phone will not be used for long time, press the Power On/Off Key for 3 seconds to power off the Phone.

4.3 Make a Call

While your phone is power on and at idle screen, enter a destination number you wish to call, then press "Handsfreee" Key or pick up the handset. (Note: To modify digits you enter, you can press "DELETE" Key to delete wrong digits first and then enter new digits). Once the call is connected, the

phone's screen will display the number you have dialed, and the time duration the call has lasted.

4.4 Answer a Call

When there is an incoming call, the phone will ring and display the Phone number of the incoming call (if the number is available). You can pick up the handset or press Handsfree Key to answer the incoming call. The ring tone and ring-tone volume can be changed in the setting menu.

4.5 End a Call

You can end a call by pressing "POWER ON/OFF" Key. If you are using the handset for a phone call, hanging up the handset will end the call automatically.

5.1 Names

Contacts

Contacts can be used to store contact's name and contact's phone numbers. You can store up to 300 entries to phone memory.

5.1.1 All Contacts 5.1.1.1 View a Contact

Press OK Key when the LCD display All Contacts to view the contact list in idle mode, scroll to the desired contact, press \blacktriangle or \checkmark Key, to view, and then press OK Key to view the contact information; Press MENU key to enter the Options when choice one contact,

1) When show NEW, press MENU or OK key to edit the contact information, press MENU to confirm or Back to return;

2) When show Write message, press MENU or OK key to enter the SMS and edit the message;

3) When show Call, press MENU or OK key to enter the voice call or IP call status;

4) When show DELETE, press MENU or OK key to delete this contact; press OK again to delete or press Cancel to exit;

5) When show Delete multiple, press MENU or OK to enter the delete the multiple contacts, press OK to choice the contacts you want to delete, press OK again to delete your choice contacts;

6) When show Copy, press MENU or OK to choice the Copy from Phone or Copy to Phone. To copy the contacts from SIM card to the phone or from the phone to the SIM card;

7) When show Others, press MENU or OK to check the Memory status. Press OK will show the memory capacity (Others are supported by the SIM card or telecom)

5.1.1.2 Add a New Contact

Add a New Contact from the Menu

Press the telephone number, or when the LCD displays the telephone number, press OK key, and the LCD displays New Contact, press OK key again and input the name, press MENU or OK key to store this contact information;

5.1.2 Find Contacts

When the LCD displays Find Contacts, press MENU or OK key, then please enter the contact name you want to find, press OK key to find the contact.

5.2 Message Settings

5.2.1 Write message

When LCD display Write message, press MENU key to enter;

when enter SMS setting;

- 1) you can check the SMS center number: the SMS center number is supplied by your local telecom;
- 2) choice the message validity period Maximum: you can choice 1,6,24,72 hours, 1 week and Maximum;
- 3) Status report: to confirm that the receiver receives the sent message;
- 4) Save sent message: for the sent message, you can choice: save, Don't save, Prompt user;
- 5) Preferred storage Phone: for the preferred storage place, you can choice SIM or Phone.

For the inbox messages, you can choice delete, translate, copy, move.

You can find Missed Calls, Dialed Calls, Received Calls, Erase Lists, and Call Duration in Recent Calls menu.

In idle mode, press \blacktriangleleft key and then select **Recent Calls**.

5.3.1 Missed Calls

1) Select Missed Calls in Recent Calls menu,

2) The Missed Calls List will be displayed; you could scroll to the desired number,

3) Press \triangleleft key to: View the call information; Delete the call log, Save the Number to Phone Book,

Dial, Edit this number, and Send SMS to this number.

5.3.2 Dialed Calls

1) Select Dialed Calls in Recent Calls menu, or press SELECT key in idle mode,

2) The Dialed Calls List will be displayed; you could scroll to the desired number,

3) Press ◄ key to: View the call information; Delete the call log, Save the Number to Phone Book,

Dial, Edit this number, and Send SMS to this number.

5.3.3 Received Calls

1) Select Received Calls in Recent Calls menu,

2) The Received Calls List will be displayed; you could scroll to the desired number,

3) Press \triangleleft key to: View the call information; Delete the call log, Save the Number to Phone Book,

Dial, Edit this number, and Send SMS to this number.

5.3.4 Erase Lists

Select Erase Lists in Recent Calls menu, you could scroll the cursor to erase Missed Calls,

Dialed Calls,

Received Calls list.

5.3.5 Call Duration

Select **Call Duration** in **Recent Calls** menu, you could scroll the cursor to view duration of **Last call Time**,

Total Dialed, Total Received, scroll to Erase All to erase all duration.

5.4 Call Settings

5.4.1 Memery key

This menu is operating as pressing MEMO key: you can store 10 groups memory number in M1-M10; When the Memory is empty, press MENU and the LCD displays Edit, press MENU to input number then press MENU to store. For the stored memory, press MENU to View, Edit, Modify contacts, Call, Delete.

5.4.6.2 Call time minute remember: off, 50s, 55s, 60s, Customize for the user choice;

5.4.6.4 Reply SMS after reject: choice this function turn on or off;

5.4.6.5 Any-key answer: choice this function turn on or off, if turn on, press any key will answer when there is a call in;

5.5.1 Go to date Press the digits to set the year, month, day; then the calendar will show the week.

5.6.1.1 Date & time

1) Set time: press the digits to set the time;

2) Set date: press the digits to set the year, month, date;

3) Time format: to choice 12 hours or 24 hours for the time format;

4) Date format: to choice Year-Mon-Day/Mon-Day-Year/Day/Mon-Year for the date format;

5) Auto update time: to choice the auto update time off or Activeate

To choice the Display/Writing language to be English or Spanish;

5.6.1.3 Shortcut settings

As the user want, to set $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright \blacktriangle \checkmark 4$ shortcut key menu;

Input password to restore factory setting, all the setup will return to the default;

Press \blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright to choice the display contrast level;

To choice the backlight time to be 5/10/15/20/30 sec or Always on;

To choice the keypad backlight time to be 5/10/20 sec, or off, or Night mode

Input the setup password, then input the new password, press MENU to confirm and input the new password again to confirm.

Choice the keypad lock off, or auto lock in 5/15/30 sec, or 1/5 minutes, when setup the auto keypad lock, long press # key, the keypad will be locked; except the emergency call can be dialed out, other digits can not be dialed; press MENU key and # key to unlock.

5.6.4.1 Ring setting

When enter the ring settings, you can choice the caller ring tone and the message ringtone.

5.6.4.2 Adjust volume

1) Adjust Caller ring tone volume: press MENU to select and press $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$ to choice the volume from 0-9 levels; when choice 0, it is mute and no ring sound;

2) Adjust Message ring volume: press MENU to select and press $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$ to choice the volume from 0-9 levels; when choice 0, it is mute and no message sound;

3) Adjust Alarm&calend volume: press MENU to select and press $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$ to choice the volume from 0-9 levels; when choice 0, it is mute and no sound;

4) Adjust Call volume: press MENU to select and press ◀ ► to choice the call volume from 1-9 levels;;

5) Adjust Power ring tone volume: press MENU to select and press $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$ to choice the power on/off volume from 0-9 levels; when choice 0, it is mute and no sound;

5.6.4.3 Ring type: choice the call alert ring tone/Message alert ring tone/Alarm&calend ring tone or

silent;

5.6.4.4 Other alert rings

- 1) Key tone ring tone or silent;
- 2) Battery low alarm Activate or off;
- 3) Power ring tone Activate or off;
- 4) Dial tone Activate or off.
