




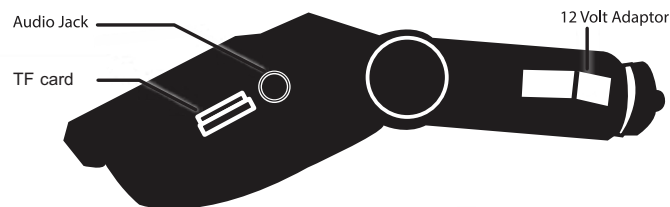
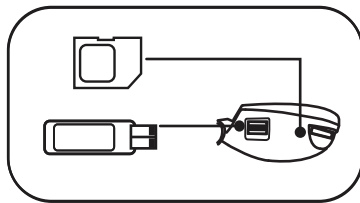
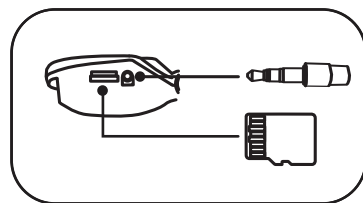


WIRELESS FM TRANSMITTER WITH REMOTE

Congratulations on purchasing the FM Transmitter
Follow these easy steps to get started

AUDIO DEVICE, SD/ MMC/TF CARD & USB FLASH DISK

- 1) Insert the SD/MMC/TF Card into the SD/MMC/TF Card slot of transmitter
Insert the USB Flash Drive in USB Port of transmitter
*unit can read SD/TF cards up to 16GB
Insert the audio device (MP3 Players or Cell phones) in the audio jack of FM transmitter
- 2) Press the  button once to start playing an MP3 file. Press again to pause.
- 3) Press the  button once to advance to the next file. Press and hold the  button to increase the volume.
- 4) Press the  button once to go to the previous file. Press and hold the  button to decrease the volume.
- 5) For audio device use your device's Play, Pause, Forward & Back Functions.



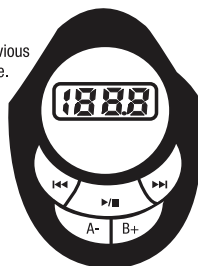
Previous Track & Volume Decrease
(USB FLASH DISK & SD/MMC/TF CARD)
Press this button once to return to the previous file. Press and hold to decrease the volume.



Next Track & Volume Increase
(USB FLASH DISK & SD/MMC/TF CARD)
Press this button once to advance to the next file. Press and hold to increase the volume.






Play/Pause
(USB FLASH DISK & SD/MMC/TF CARD)
Press this button once to start playing an MP3 file. Press it again to pause.

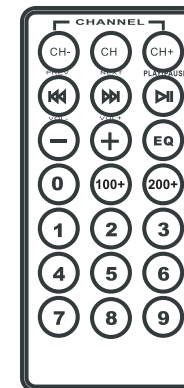


Channel Button
(USB FLASH DISK & SD/MMC/TF CARD)
Press the channel button to change the broadcasting frequency.

REMOTE INSTRUCTION

- 1) When you plug in your USB Flash drive or SD/TF Card it will list your songs in order of the upload to your device. It will also associate a track number to the song. To go to a song, press the track number associated with the song
(Example: To go to the #135 song press the numbers "1", "3", "5" The FM transmitter screen will flash the track number)
- 2) Press the **CH+** or **CH-** to change the frequency or press a frequency number then press **CH**
(Example: To go to FM frequency 107.5 press the numbers "1", "0", "7", "5"
The screen will flash the FM frequency then press **CH**). You can also **switch music between two folders by pressing 100+ or 200+**
- 3) To change the volume on the remote press the **-** to decrease or **+** to increase the volume.
- 4) Press the **EQ** button to change the mode of the transmitter from: NORMAL, POP, ROCK, COUNTRY, CLASSIC, JAZZ etc. The mode will cycle through the types individually with each push of the button
- 5) Press  to Play/ Pause your music. and press  to go to the next song, or press  to go back.
