- 1. The testing follows the guidelines in ANSI C63.10-2013
- 2. The EUT was arranged to its worst case and then turntable (from 0 degree to 360 degrees) to find the maximum reading. A pre-amp and a high pass filter are used for the test in order to get better signal level. Both horizontal and vertical polarizations of the antenna are set to make the measurement.
- 3. The EUT was placed on a turntable with 0.1 meter above ground.




