The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison Worse case is as below: [2441MHz -**1.13**mW output power] $(1.13mW / 5mm)^*[\sqrt{2.441}(GHz)] = 0.35mW < 3.0$ for 1 - g SAR Then SAR evaluation is not required
