5 DESCRIPTION OF TEST MODES

During the testing, the EUT was controlled via Rhode & Schwarz Digital Radio Communication Tester(CMU 200) to ensure max power transmission and proper modulation. Three channels (The low channel, the middle channel and the high channel) were chosen for testing on both GSM850 and GSM1900 frequency band.

Note: GSM 850, GSM 1900, modes have been tested during the test. the worst condition (GSM850, GSM1900) be recorded in the test report if no other modes test data.

Antenna port conducted and radiated test items were performed according to KDB 971168 D01 Power Meas. License Digital Systems v02r02 with maximum output power.

Radiated measurements were performed with rotating EUT in different three orthogonal test planes to find the maximum emission.

Radiated emissions were investigated as following frequency range:

1. 30 MHz to 10th harmonic for GSM850
2. 30 MHz to 10th harmonic for GSM1900

All modes and data rates and positions were investigated.

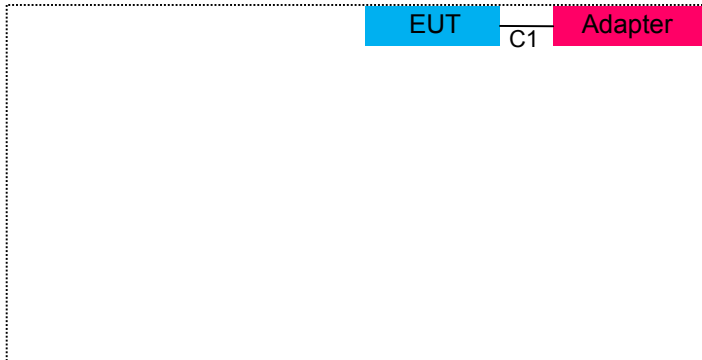

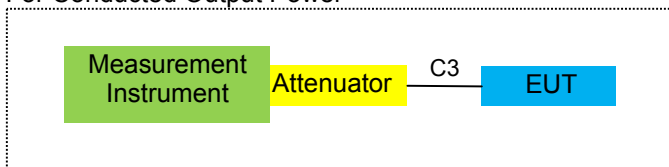
For AC Conducted Emission Mode



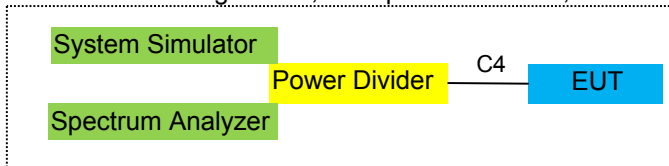
For Radiated Test Cases



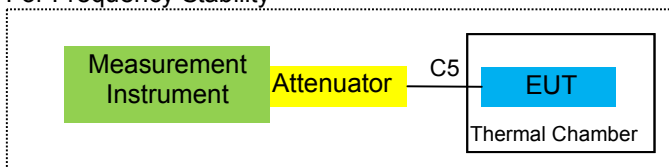
For Conducted Output Power

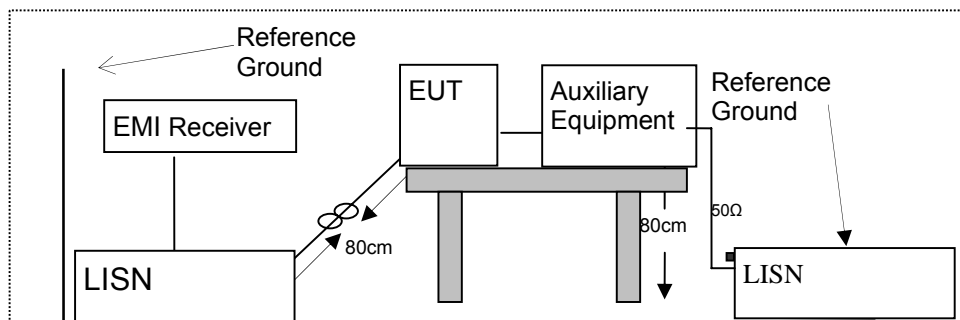

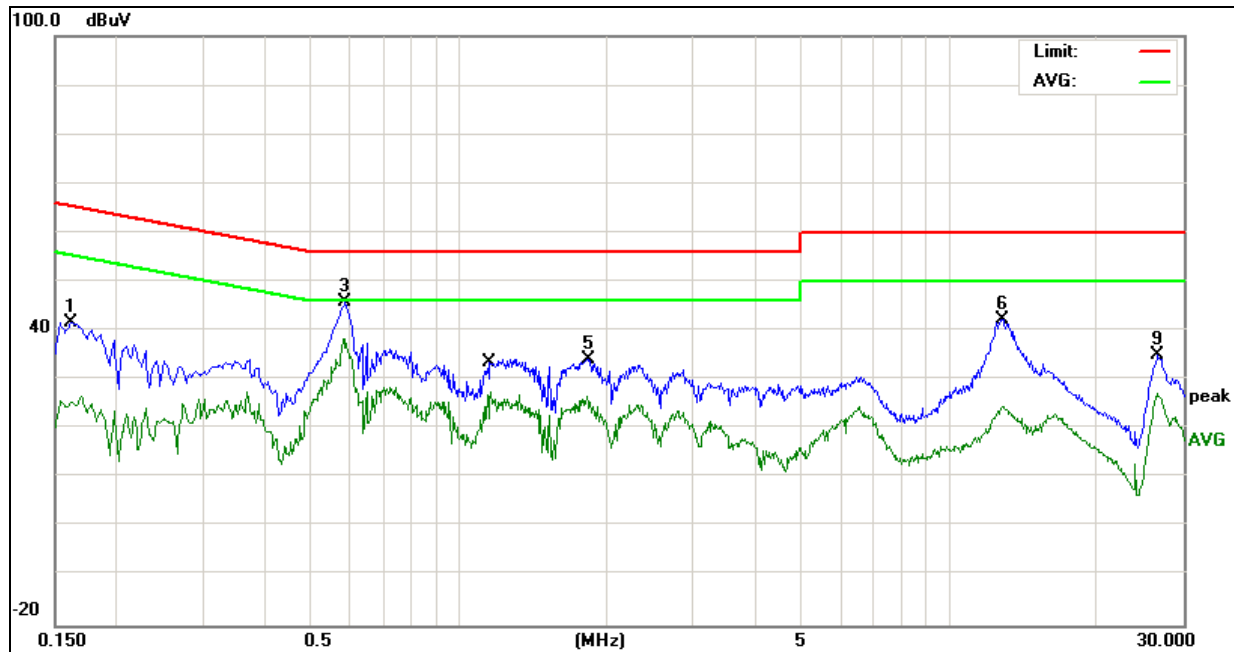
7.1.5 Test Procedure

According to the requirements in Section 13.1.4.1 of ANSI C63.10-2013 Conducted emissions the EUT measured in the frequency range between 0.15 MHz and 30 MHz using CISPR Quasi-Peak and average detector mode.

1. The EUT was placed 0.4 meter from the conducting wall of the shielding room.
2. The EUT was placed on a table which is 0.8m above ground plane.
3. Connect EUT to the power mains through a line impedance stabilization network (LISN). All other support equipments powered from additional LISN(s). The LISN provide 50 Ohm/ 50uH of coupling impedance for the measuring instrument.
4. Interconnecting cables that hang closer than 40 cm to the ground plane shall be folded back and forth in the center forming a bundle 30 to 40cm long.
5. I/O cables that are not connected to a peripheral shall be bundled in the center. The end of the cable may be terminated, if required, using the correct terminating impedance. The overall length shall not exceed 1 m.
6. LISN at least 80 cm from nearest part of EUT chassis.
7. The frequency range from 150KHz to 30MHz was searched.
8. Set the test-receiver system to Peak Detect Function and specified bandwidth(IF bandwidth=9KHz) with Maximum Hold Mode

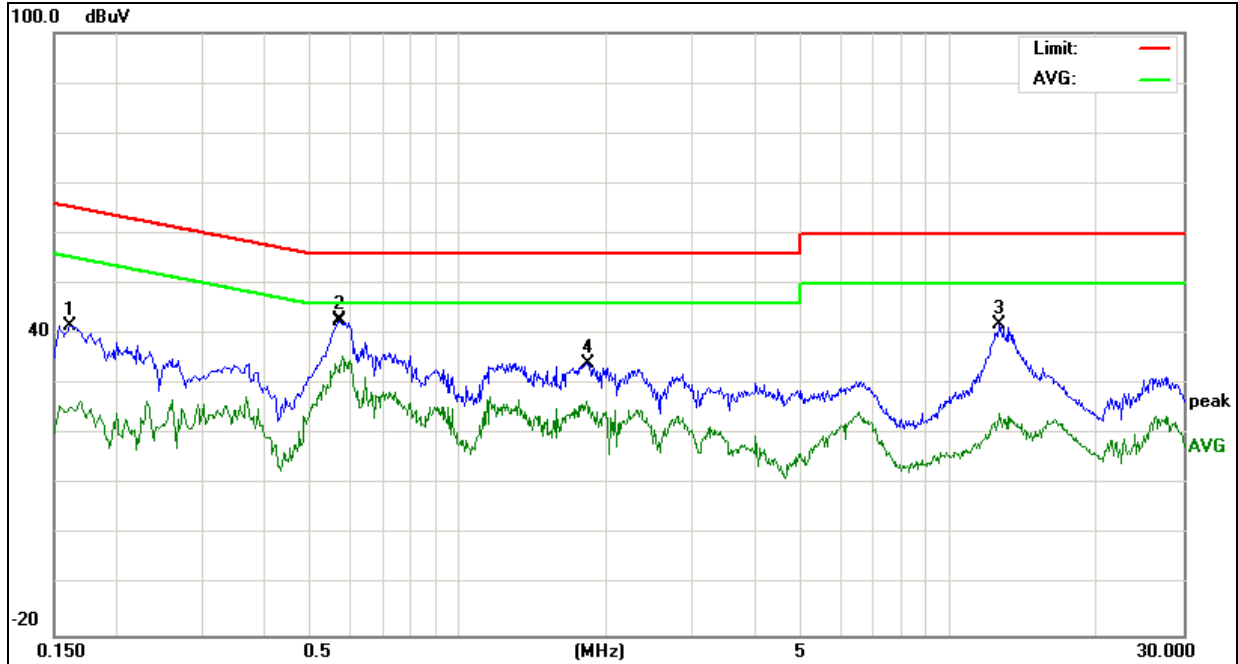

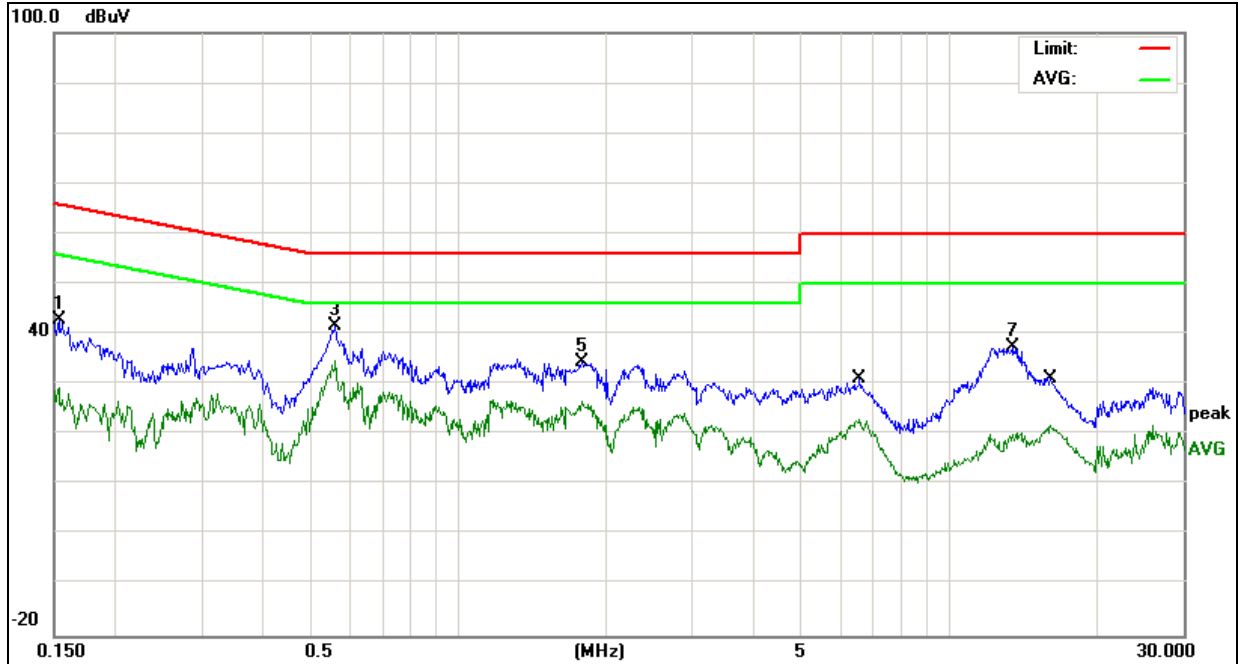

7.2.2 Conformance Limit

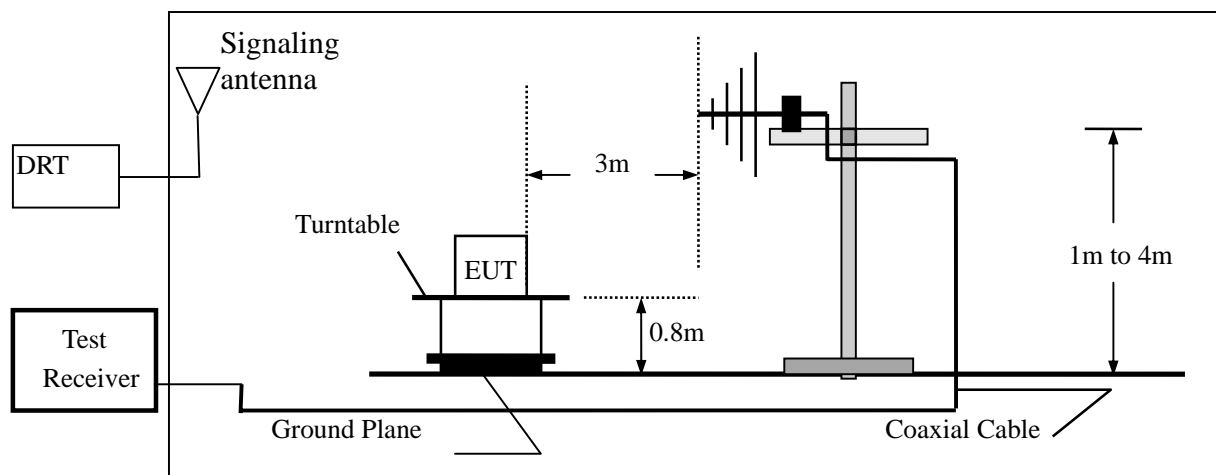
The power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by a factor of at least $43 + 10 \log (P)$ dB. The spectrum is scanned from 30 MHz up to a frequency including its 10th harmonic.

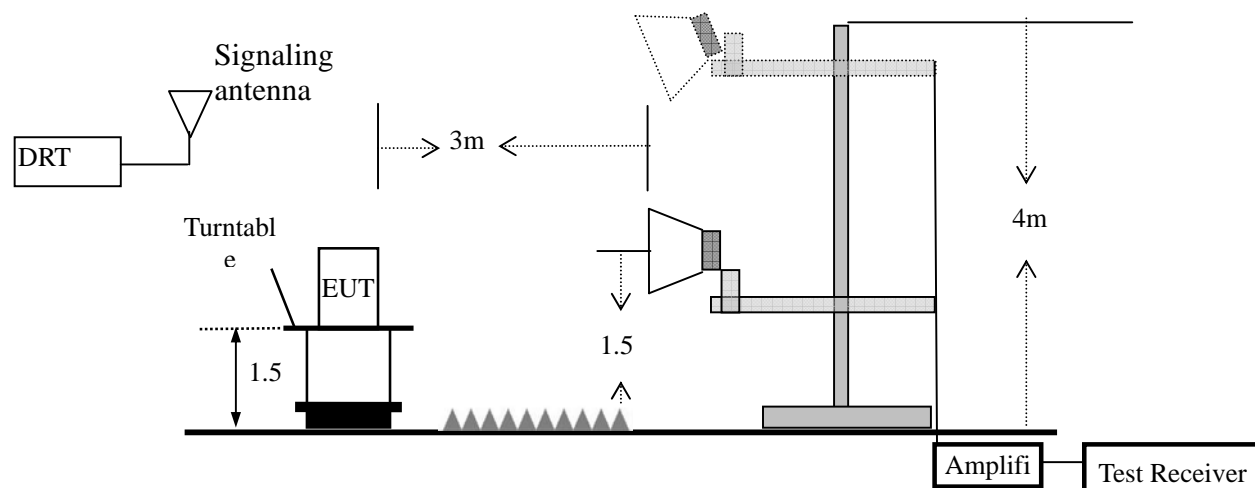

7.2.5 Test Procedure

The measurements procedures specified in TIA-603-D-2010 were used for testing. The spectrum was scanned from 30 MHz to the 10th harmonic of the highest frequency generated within the equipment. The resolution bandwidth is set 1MHz as outlined in Part 24.238. The measurements were performed on all modes(GSM 850, GSM1900) at 3 typical channels(the Top Channel, the Middle Channel and the Bottom Channel) for each band.Only shown the worst data.

The procedure of radiated spurious emissions is as follows:

1. Connect the equipment as shown in the above diagram with the EUT's antenna in a horizontal orientation.
2. Adjust the settings of the Digital Radiocommunication Tester (DRT) to set the EUT to its maximum power at the required channel.
3. Set the spectrum analyzer to measure peak hold with the required settings.
4. Place the measurement antenna in a horizontal orientation. Rotate the EUT 360°. Raise the measurement antenna up to 4 meters in 0.5 meters increments and rotate the EUT 360° at each height to maximize all emissions. Measure and record all spurious emissions (LVL) up to the tenth harmonic of the carrier frequency.
5. Replace the EUT with a horizontally polarized half wave dipole or known gain antenna. The center of the antenna should be at the same location as the center of the EUT's antenna.
6. Connect the antenna to a signal generator with known output power and record the path loss in dB (LOSS). $LOSS = \text{Generator Output Power (dBm)} - \text{Analyzer reading (dBm)}$.
7. Determine the level of spurious emissions using the following equation: $\text{Spurious (dBm)} = \text{LVL (dBm)} + \text{LOSS (dB)}$.
8. Repeat steps 4, 5 and 6 with all antennas vertically polarized.
9. Determine the level of spurious emissions using the following equation: $\text{Spurious (dBm)} = \text{LVL (dBm)} + \text{LOSS (dB)}$.
10. Measurements are to be performed with the EUT set to the low, middle and high channel of each frequency band.

(note: Steps 5 and 6 above are performed prior to testing and LOSS is recorded by test software.

Steps 3, 4 and 7 above are performed with test software.)

Spectrum analyzer settings:

Res B/W: 1 MHz

Vid B/W: 1 MHz

Radiated emissions measurements were made only at the upper, middle, and lower carrier frequencies of the PCS 1900 band (1850.2 MHz, 1880 MHz and 1909.8 MHz), GSM850 band (824.2MHz, 836.6MHz, 848.8MHz), It was decided that measurements at these three carrier frequencies would be sufficient to demonstrate compliance with emissions limits because it was seen that all the significant spurs occur well outside the band and no radiation was seen from a carrier in one block of any band into any of the other blocks.

The substitution method is used. Substitution values at each frequency are measured before and saved to the test software. A "reference path loss" is established and the ARpl is the attenuation of "reference path loss", and including the gain of receive antenna, the gain of the preamplifier, the cable loss and the air loss. The measurement results are obtained as described below: $\text{Power} = \text{PMea} + \text{ARpl}$

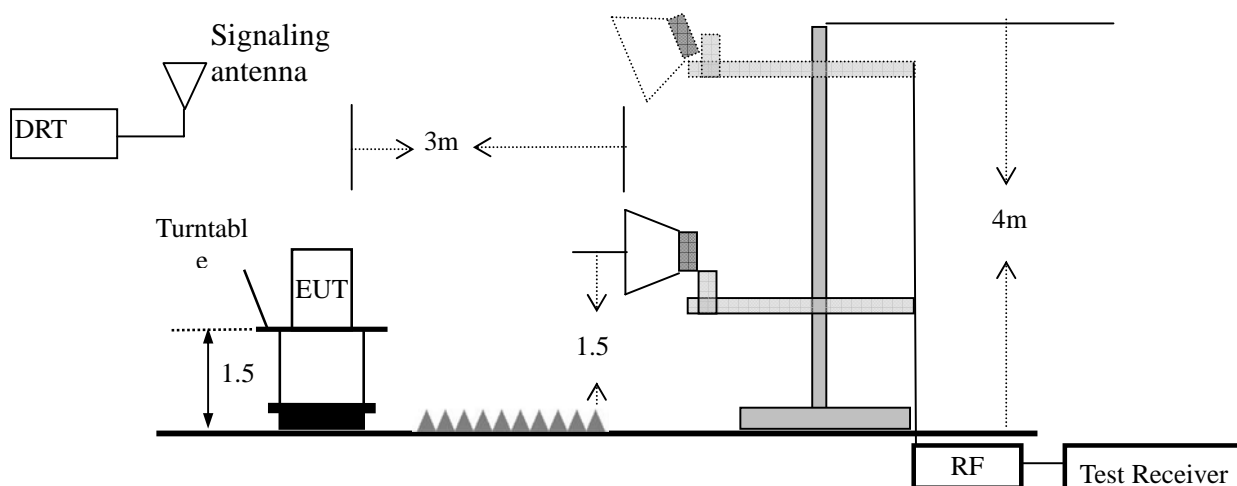
The substitution method, in ANSI / TIA / EIA-603-D-2010, was used for ERP/EIRP measurement, and the spectrum analyzer configuration follows KDB 971168 D01 Power Meas. License Digital Systems v02r02. The ERP of mobile transmitters must not exceed 7 Watts (Cellular Band) and the EIRP of mobile transmitters are limited to 2 Watts (PCS Band).

7.3.5 Test Procedure

The measurements procedures specified in TIA-603-D-2010 were applied.

In an anechoic antenna test chamber, a half-wave dipole antenna for the frequency band of interest is placed at the reference centre of the chamber. An RF Signal source for the frequency band of interest is connected to the dipole with a cable that has been constructed to not interfere with the radiation pattern of the antenna. A known (measured) power (P_{in}) is applied to the input of the dipole, and the power received (P_r) at the chamber's probe antenna is recorded.

1. Connect the equipment as shown in the above diagram with the EUT's antenna in a vertical orientation.
2. Adjust the settings of the Digital Radiocommunication Tester (DRT) to set the EUT to its maximum power at the required channel.
3. Set the spectrum analyzer to the channel frequency. Set the analyzer to measure peak hold with the required settings.

4. Rotate the EUT 360° . Record the peak level in dBm (LVL).
5. Replace the EUT with a vertically polarized half wave dipole or known gain antenna. The center of the antenna should be at the same location as the center of the EUT's antenna.
6. Connect the antenna to a signal generator with known output power and record the path loss in dB (LOSS). $LOSS = \text{Generator Output Power (dBm)} - \text{Analyzer reading (dBm)}$.
7. The substitution method is used. Substitution values at each frequency are measured before and saved to the test software. A "reference path loss" is established as $ARpl = Pin + 2.15 - Pr$. The ARpl is the attenuation of "reference path loss", and including the gain of receive antenna, the cable loss and the air loss. The measurement results are obtained as described below: $Power = P_{Mea} + ARpl$

8. The EUT is substituted for the dipole at the reference centre of the chamber and a scan is performed to obtain the radiation pattern.

From the radiation pattern, the co-ordinates where the maximum antenna gain occurs are identified.

9. The EUT is then put into continuously transmitting mode at its maximum power level.

Power mode measurements are performed with the receiving antenna placed at the coordinates determined in Step 3 to determine the output power as defined in Rule 24.232 (b) and (c). The "reference path loss" from Step 1 is added to this result.

10. This value is EIRP since the measurement is calibrated using a half-wave dipole antenna of known gain (2.15 dBi) and known input power (Pin).

ERP can be calculated from EIRP by subtracting the gain of the dipole, $ERP = EIRP - 2.15 \text{ dBi}$.

Both horizontal and vertical antenna polarities were tested and performed pretest to three orthogonal axis. The worst case emissions were reported.

Extend coverage on a secondary basis into cellular unserved areas, as those areas are defined in §22.949, the ERP of base transmitters and cellular repeaters of such systems must not exceed 1000 Watts. The ERP of mobile transmitters and auxiliary test transmitters must not exceed 7 Watts(38.5dBm).

Mobile and portable stations are limited to 2 watts (33dBm)EIRP and the equipment must employ a means for limiting power to the minimum necessary for successful communications..

Trace average at least 100 traces in power averaging (i.e., RMS) mode; however, the number of traces to be averaged shall be increased above 100 as needed such that the average accurately represents the true average over the on and off periods of the transmitter.

Compute power by integrating the spectrum across the OBW of the signal using the instrument's band power measurement function with band limits set equal to the OBW band edges. If the instrument does not have a band power function, sum the spectrum levels (in power units) at intervals equal to the RBW extending across the entire OBW of the spectrum.

Add $10 \log (1/x)$, where x is the duty cycle, to the measured power in order to compute the average power during the actual transmission times (because the measurement represents an average over both the on and off times of the transmission). For example, add $10 \log (1/0.25) = 6$ dB if the duty cycle is a constant 25%.

Measure lowest, middle, and highest channels for each bandwidth and different modulation.

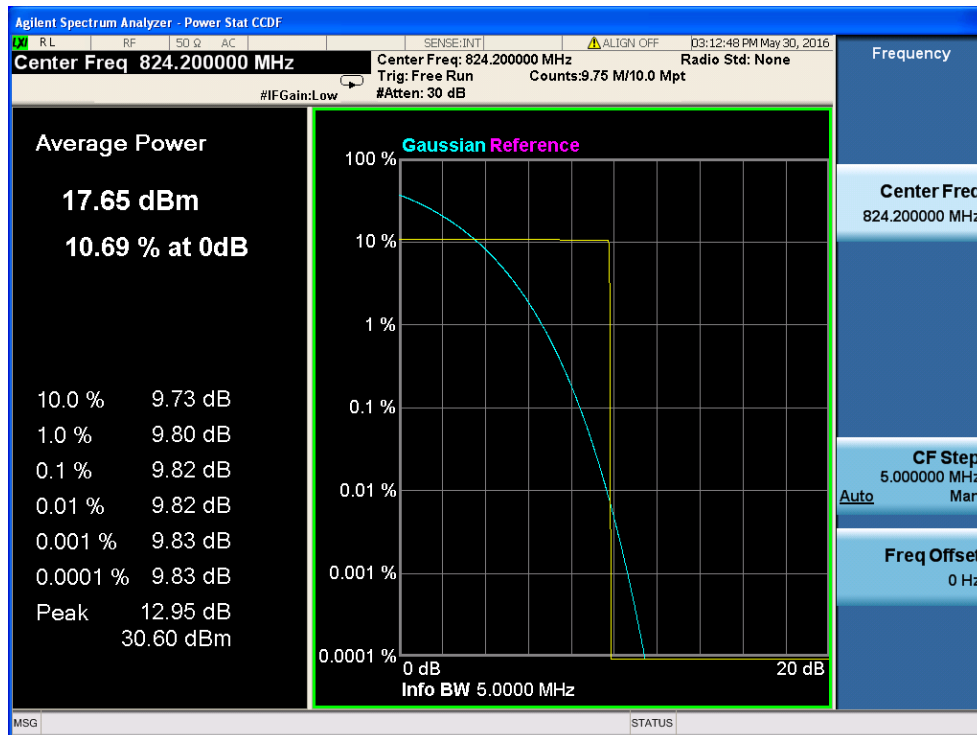

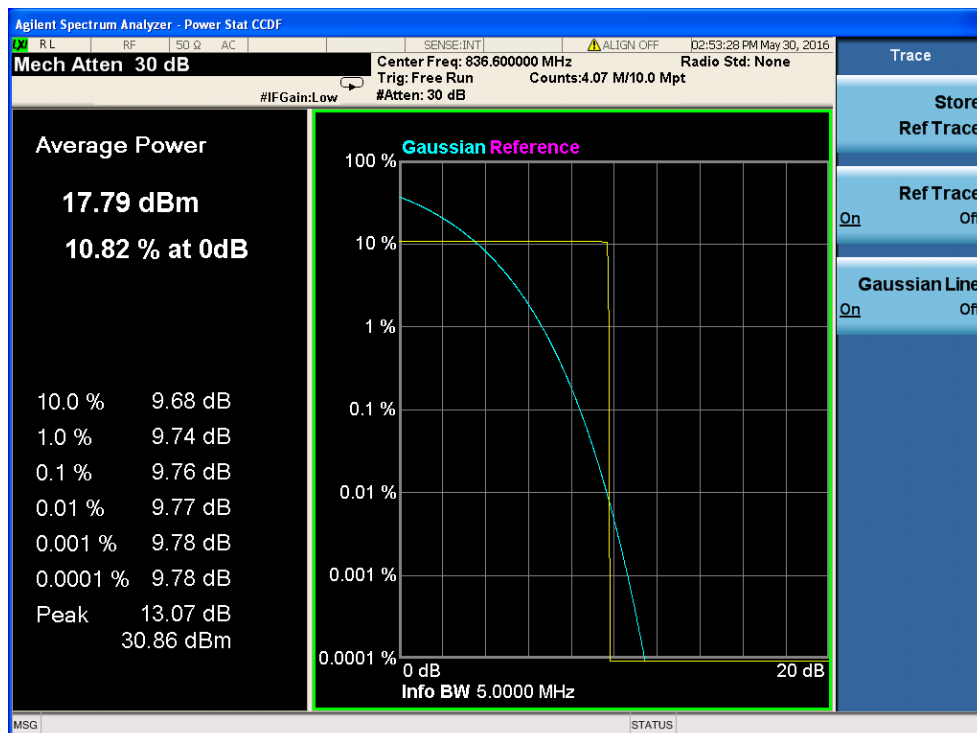
Peak-to-average power ratio plot on channel 128

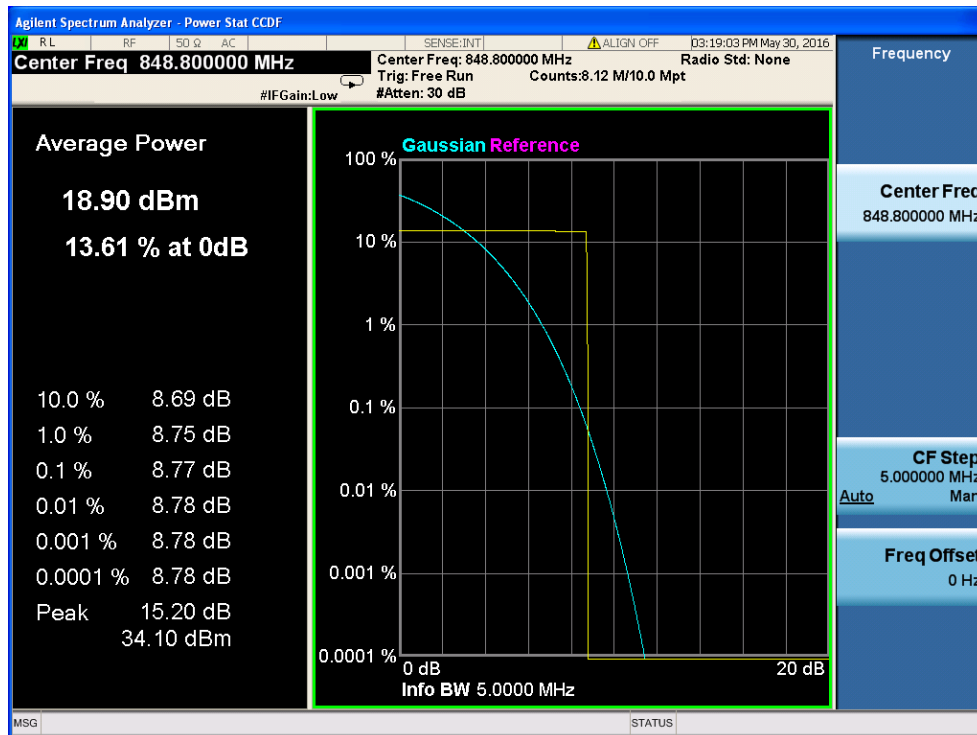
Peak-to-average power ratio plot on channel 190

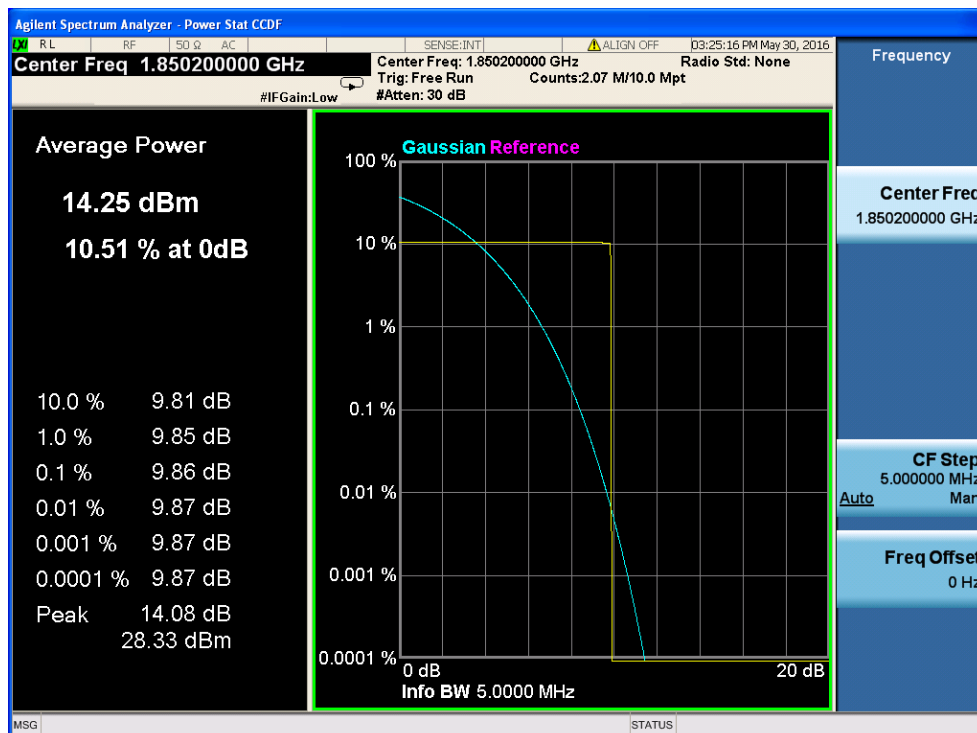
Peak-to-average power ratio plot on channel 251

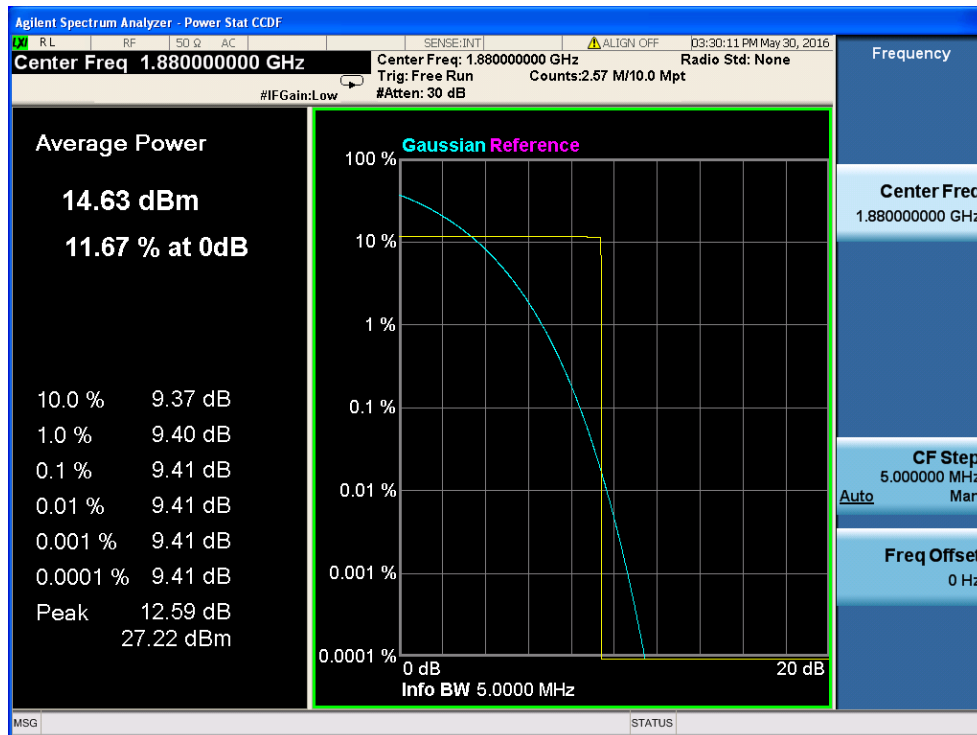
Peak-to-average power ratio plot on channel 512

7.7 26DB BANDWIDTH AND 99% OCCUPIED BANDWIDTH

7.7.1 Applicable Standard

According to FCC Part 2.1049 and FCC Part 22H and FCC Part 24E and FCC KDB 971168 D01 Section 4.0

7.7.2 Conformance Limit

The occupied bandwidth is the width of a frequency band such that, below the lower and above the upper frequency limits, the mean powers emitted are each equal to a specified percentage 0.5% of the total mean transmitted power.

The 26 dB emission bandwidth is defined as the frequency range between two points, one above and one below the carrier frequency, at which the spectral density of the emission is attenuated 26 dB below the maximum in-band spectral density of the modulated signal. Spectral density (power per unit bandwidth) is to be measured with a detector of resolution bandwidth equal to approximately 1.0% of the emission bandwidth.

Determine the reference value: Set the EUT to transmit a modulated signal. Allow the trace to stabilize. Set the spectrum analyzer marker to the highest level of the displayed trace.
(this is the reference value)

Determine the “-26 dB down amplitude” as equal to (Reference Value – X).

Place two markers, one at the lowest and the other at the highest frequency of the envelope of the spectral display such that each marker is at or slightly below the “-X dB down amplitude” determined in step 6. If a marker is below this “-X dB down amplitude” value it shall be placed as close as possible to this value. The OBW is the positive frequency difference between the two markers.

Use the 99 % power bandwidth function of the spectrum analyzer and report the measured bandwidth.

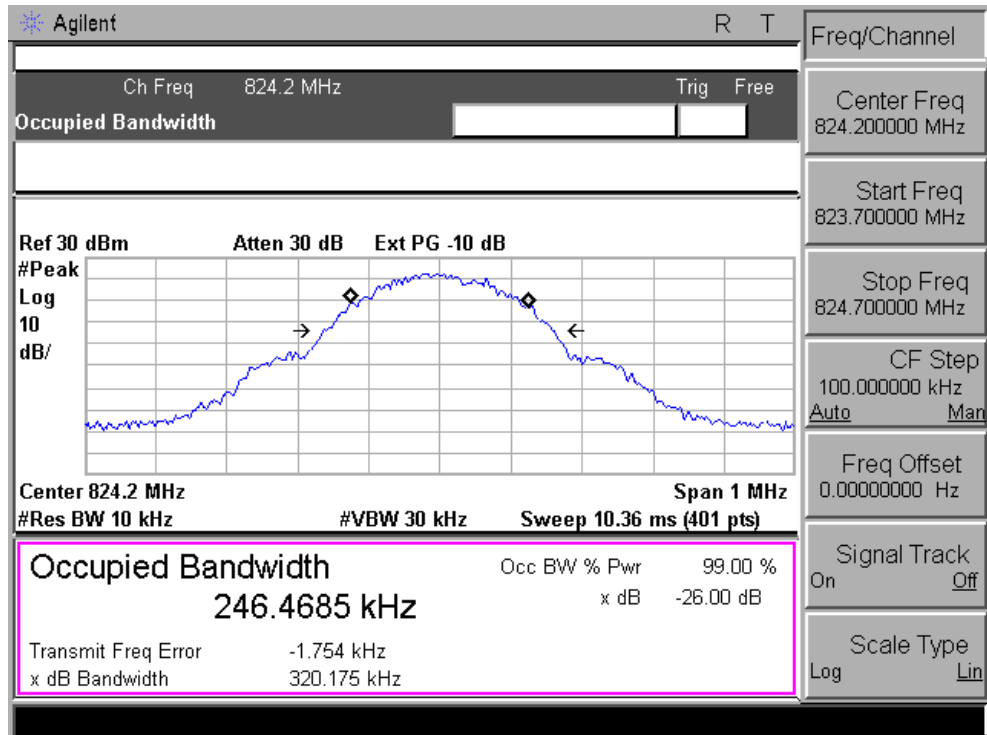

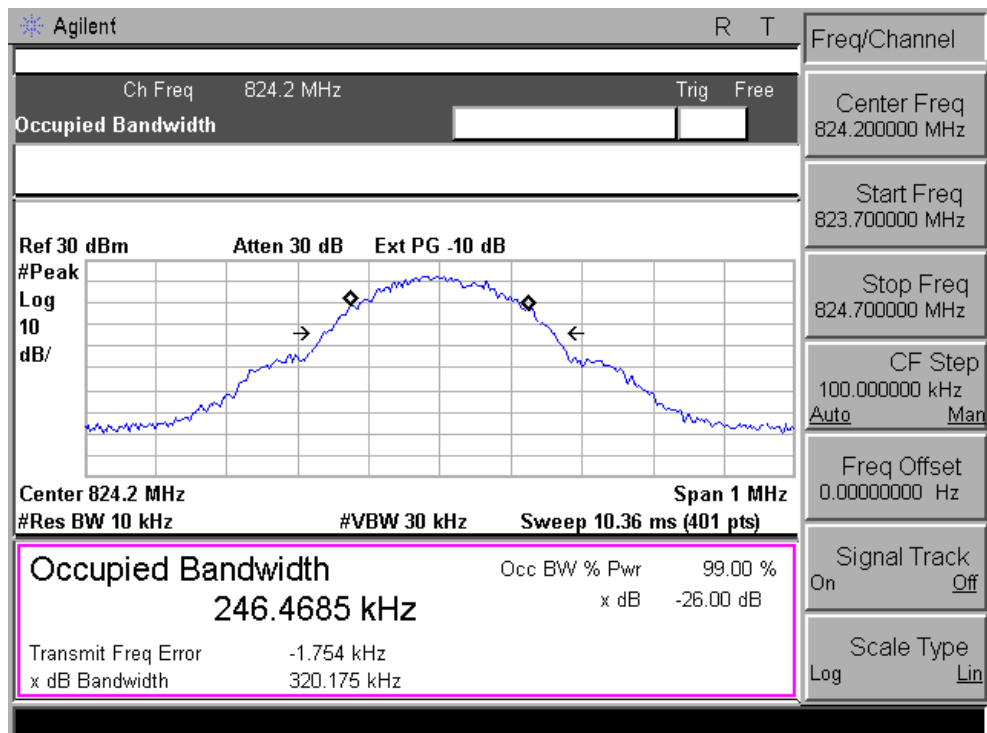
99% Occupied Bandwidth plot on channel 128

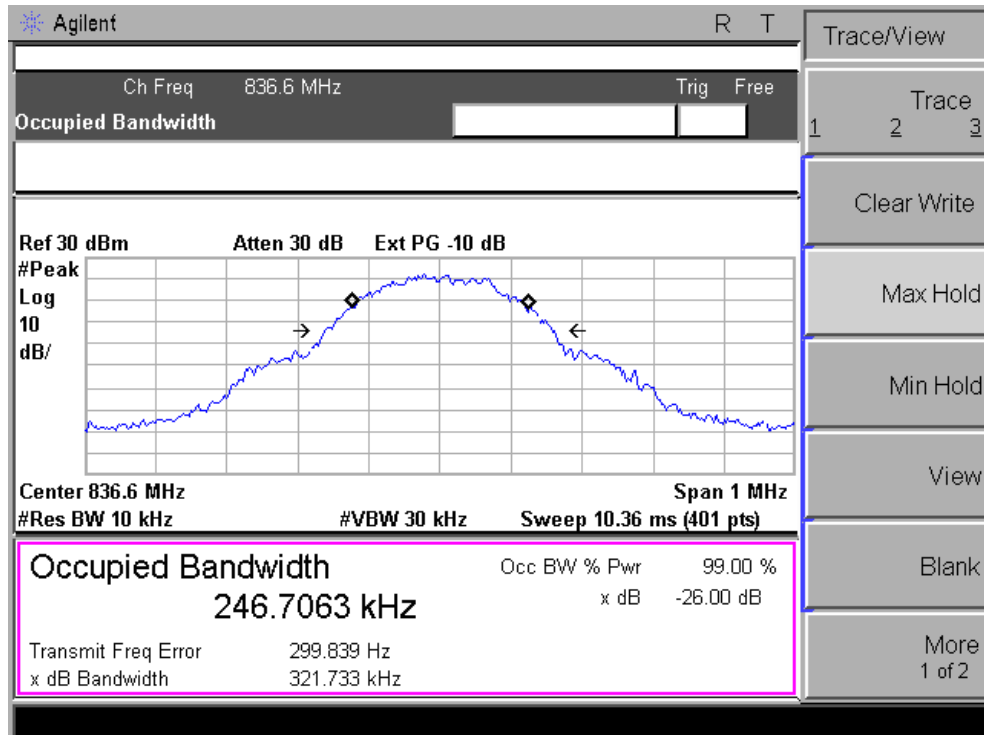
26dB Bandwidth plot on channel 128

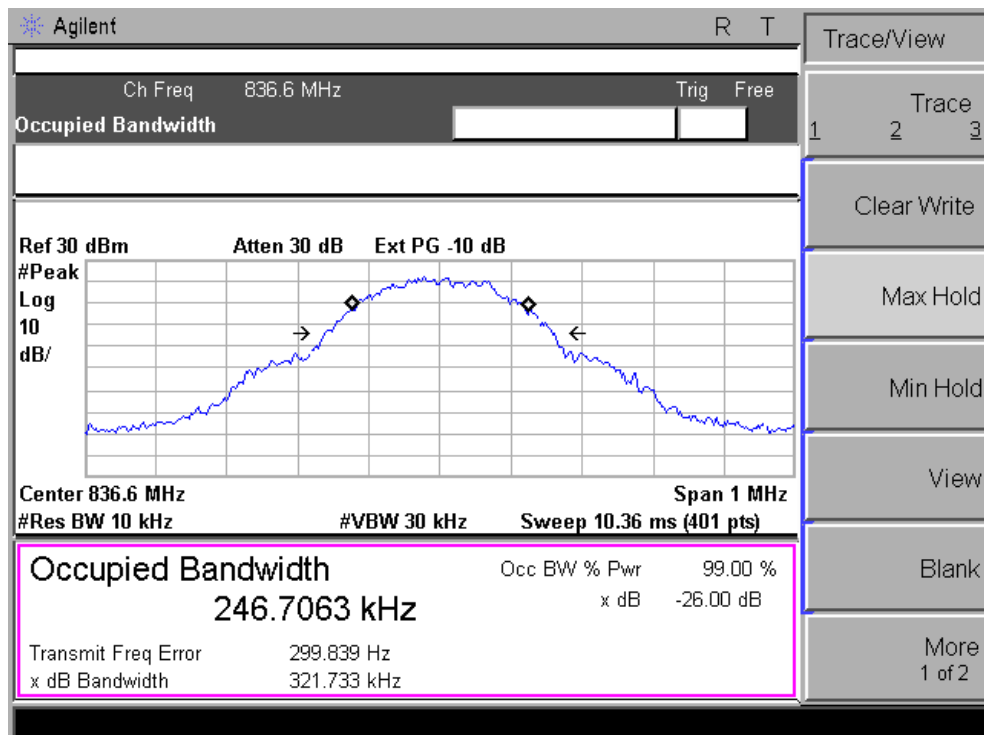
99% Occupied Bandwidth plot on channel 190

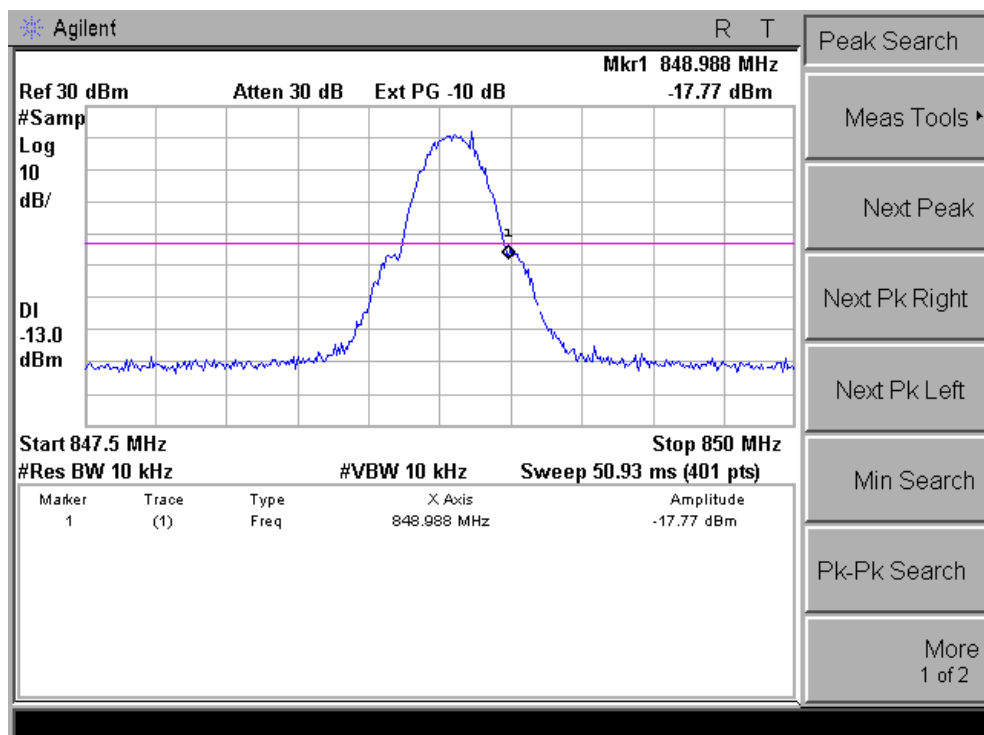
Conducted Band Edge plot on channel 128

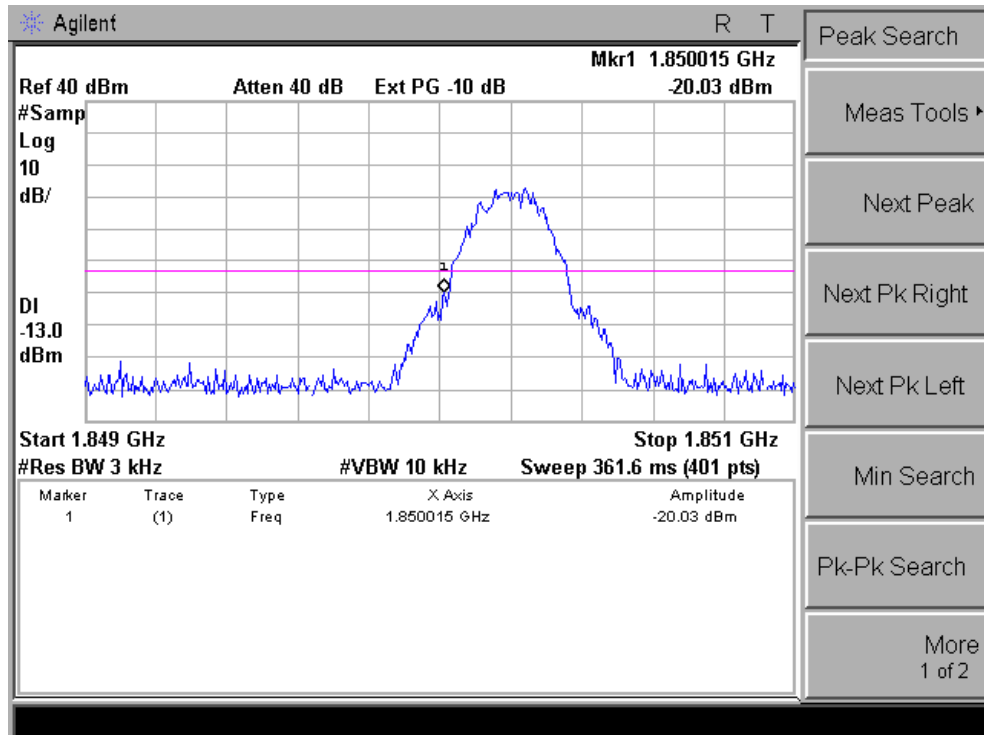
Conducted Band Edge plot on channel 251

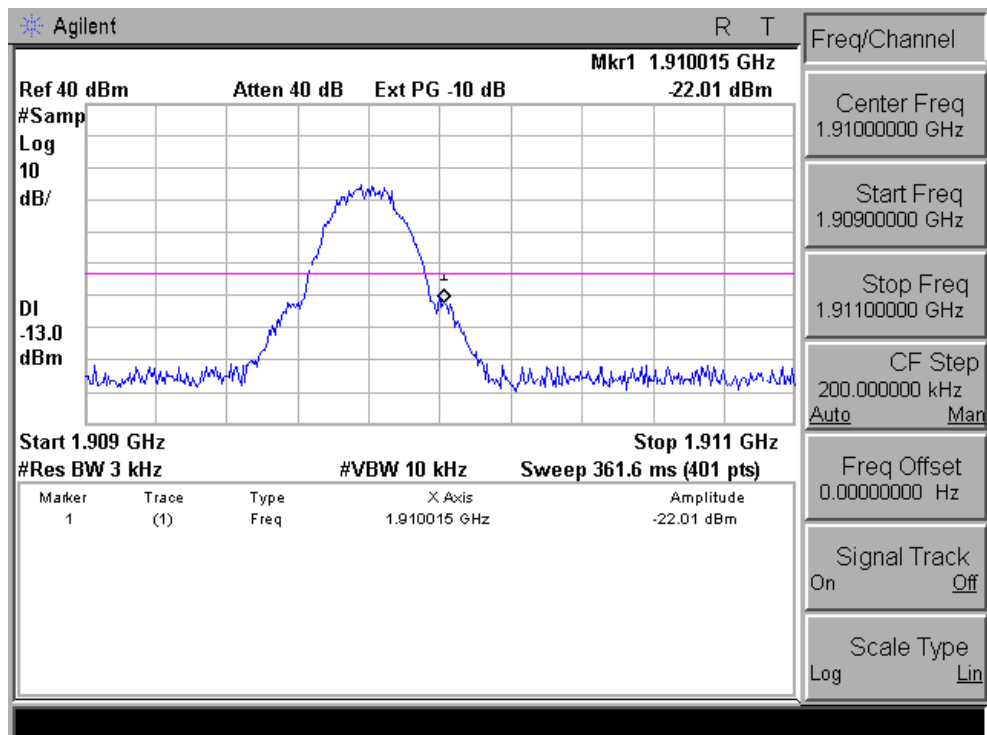
Conducted Band Edge plot on channel 512

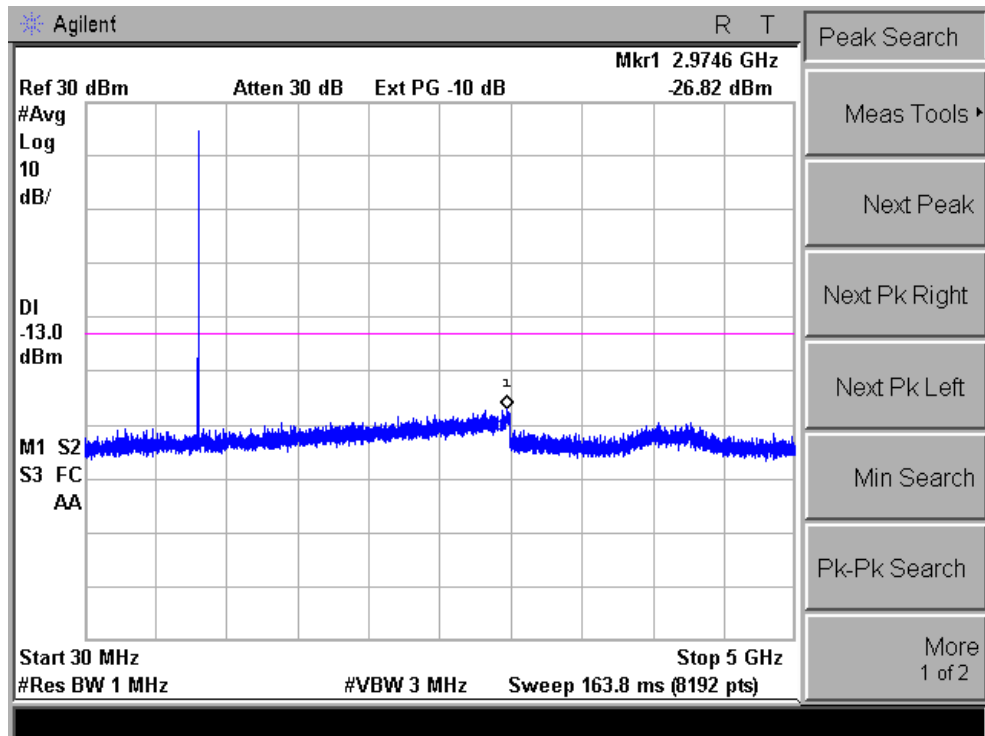

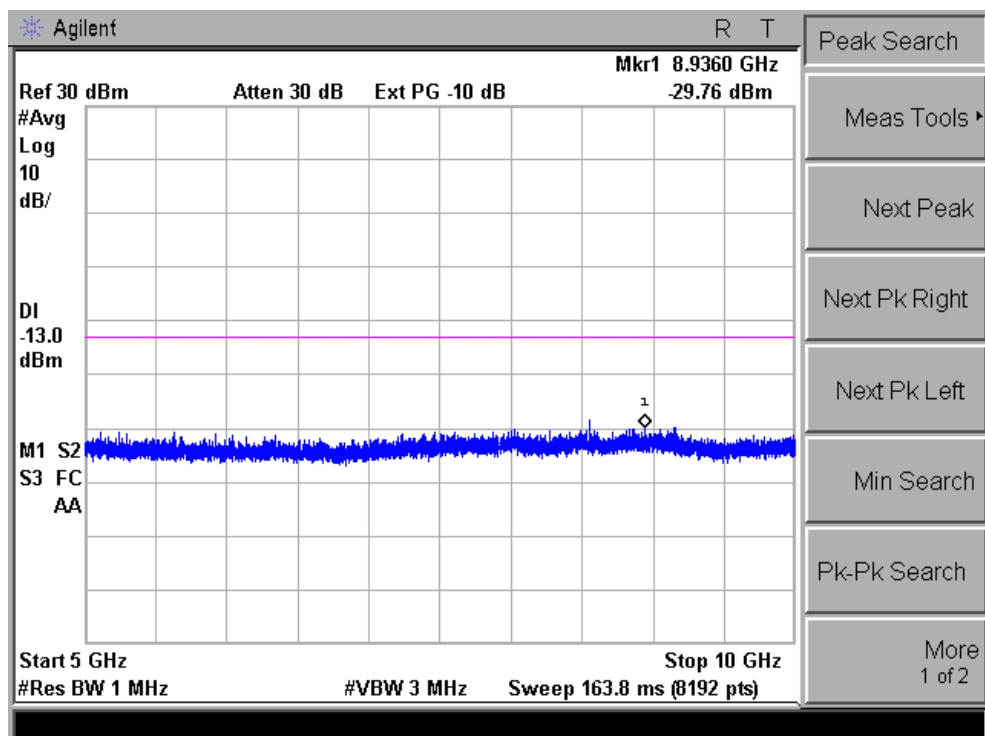

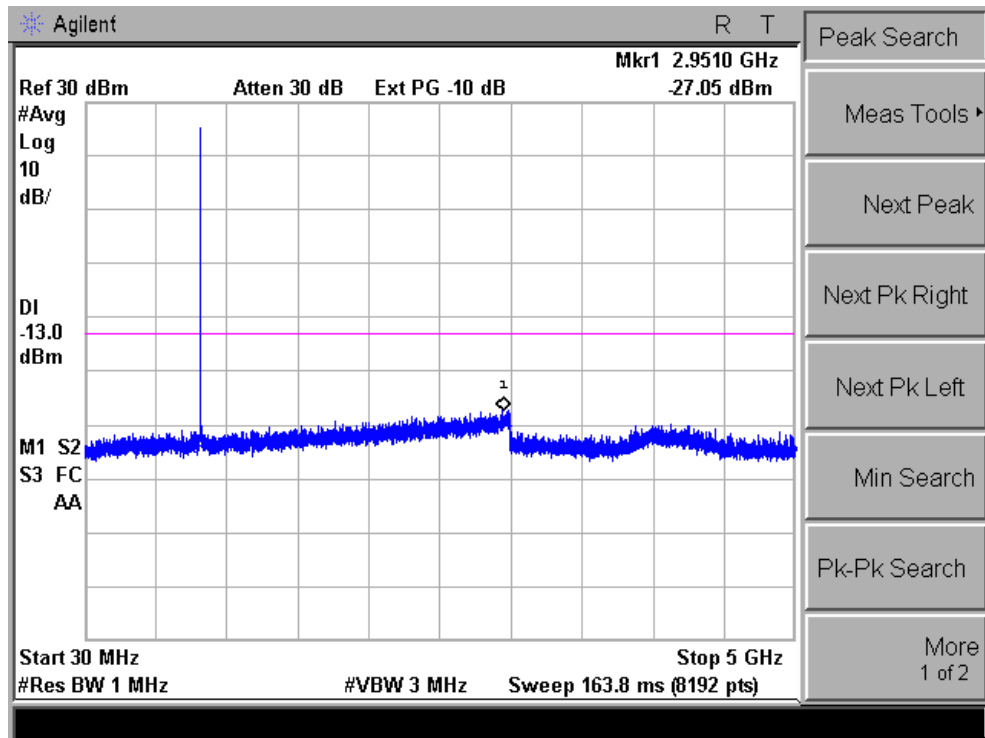
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 128 30MHz – 5GHz



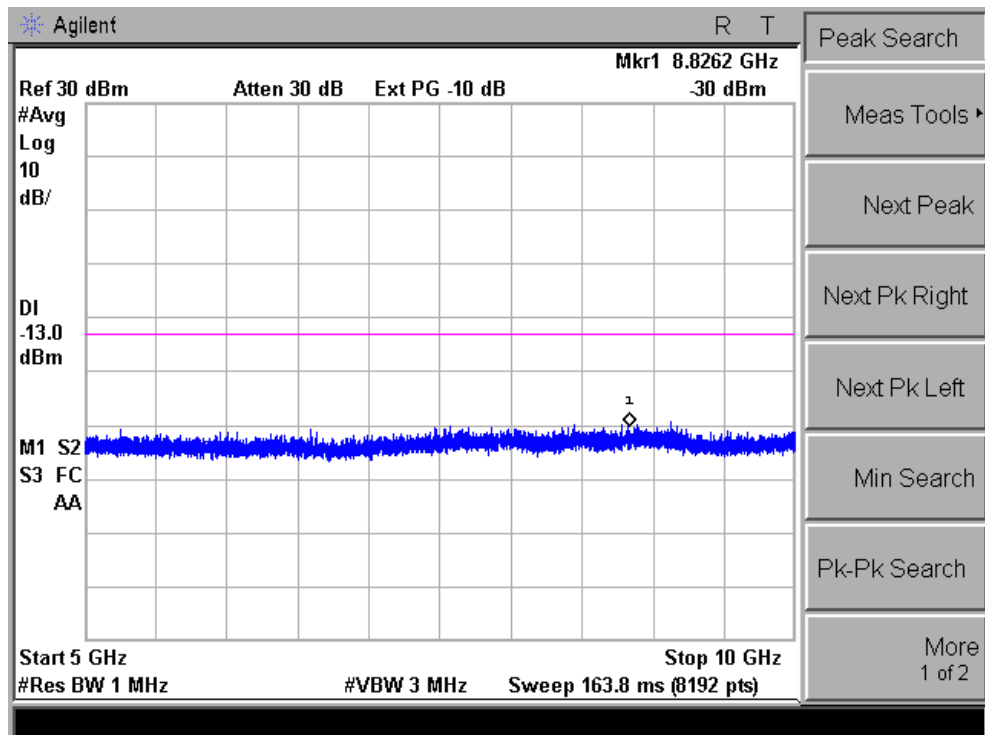
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 128 5GHz – 10GHz



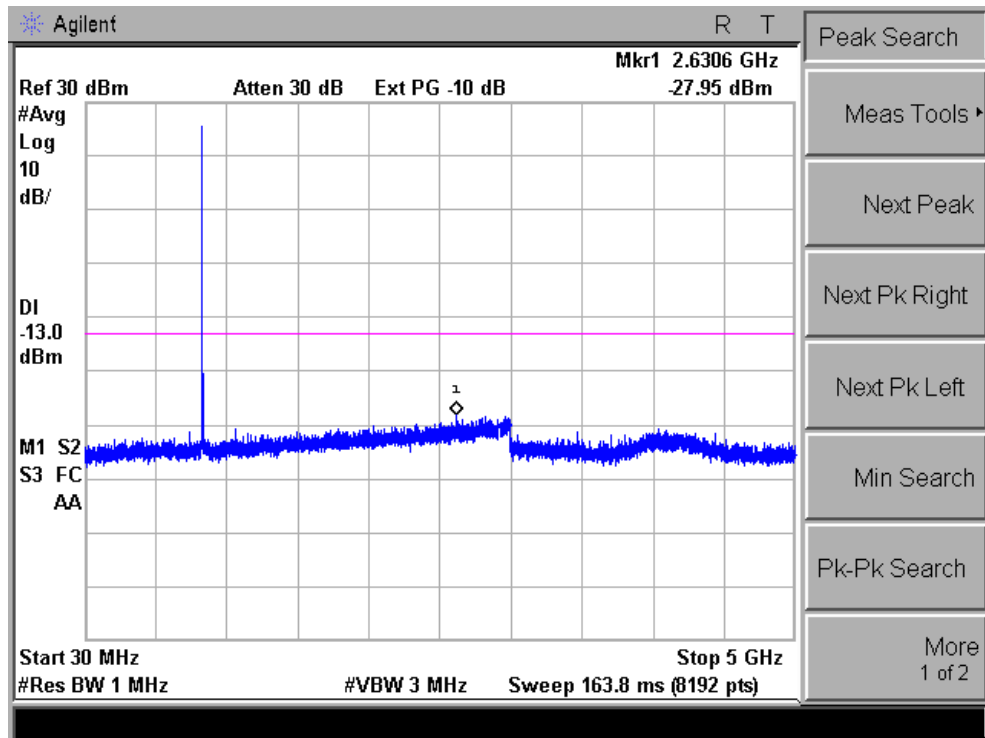
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 190 30MHz – 5GHz



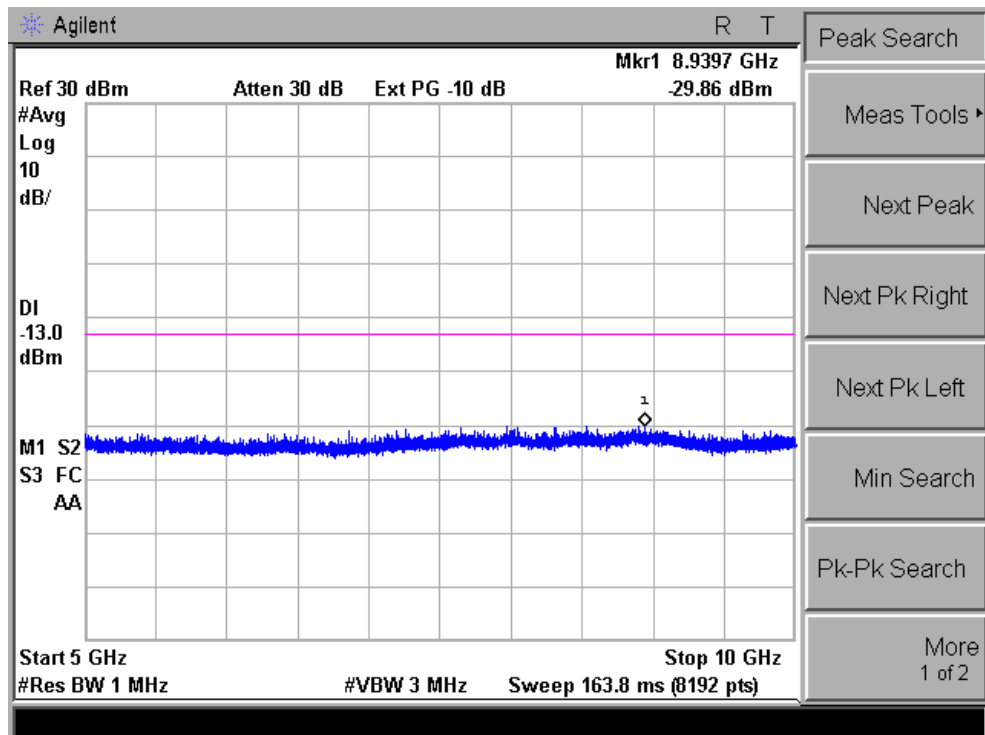
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 190 5GHz – 10GHz



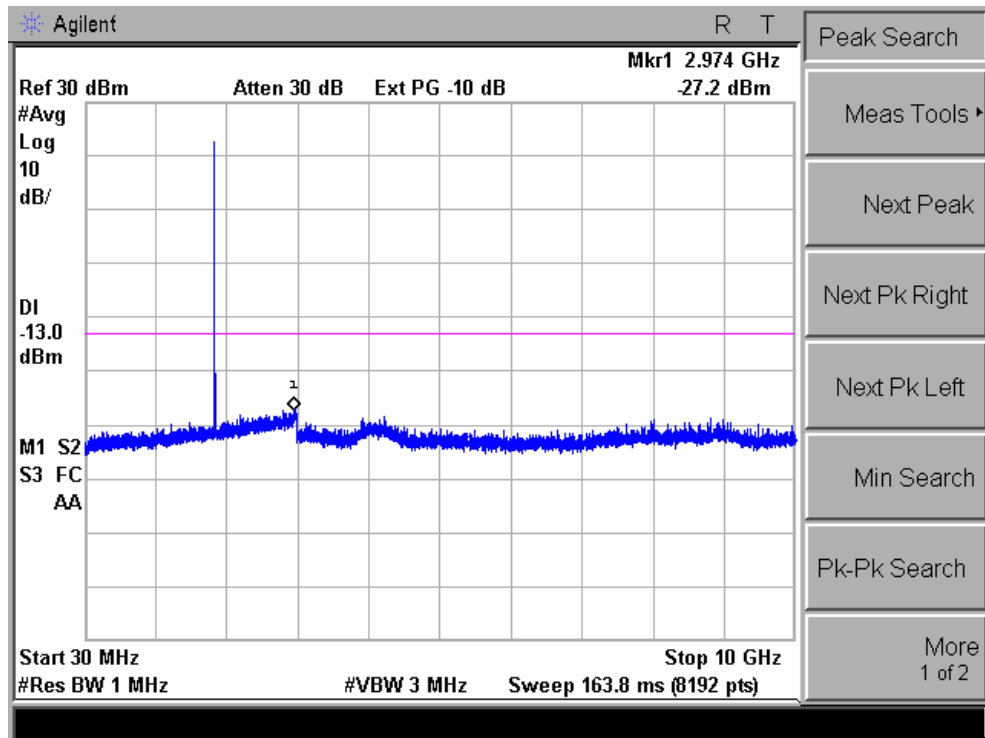
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 251 30MHz – 5GHz



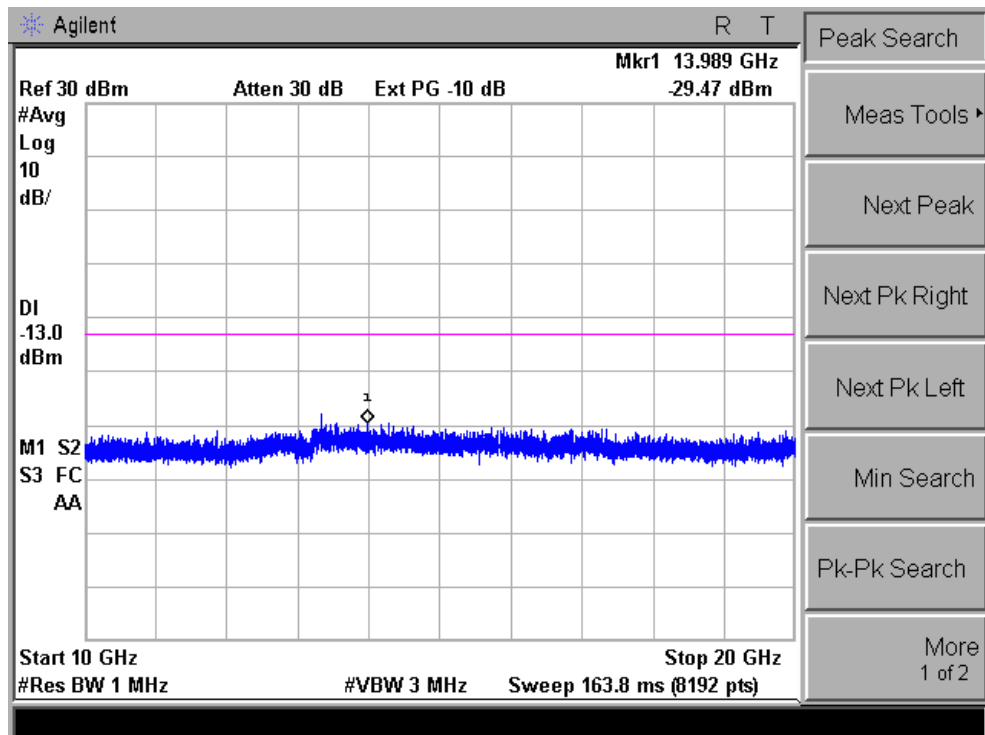

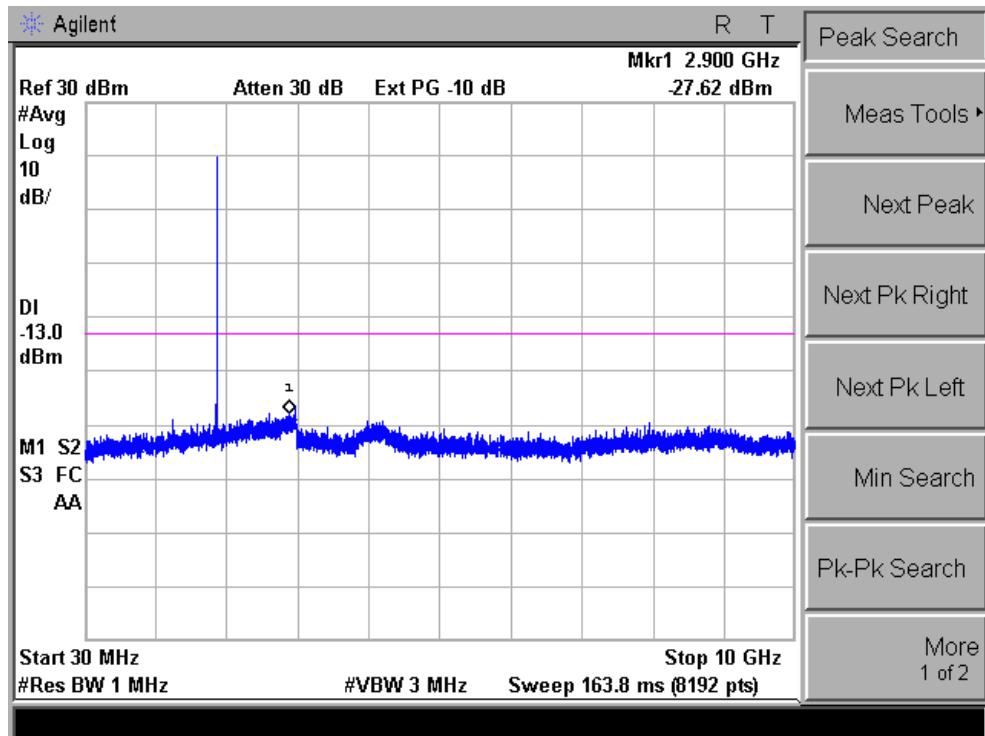

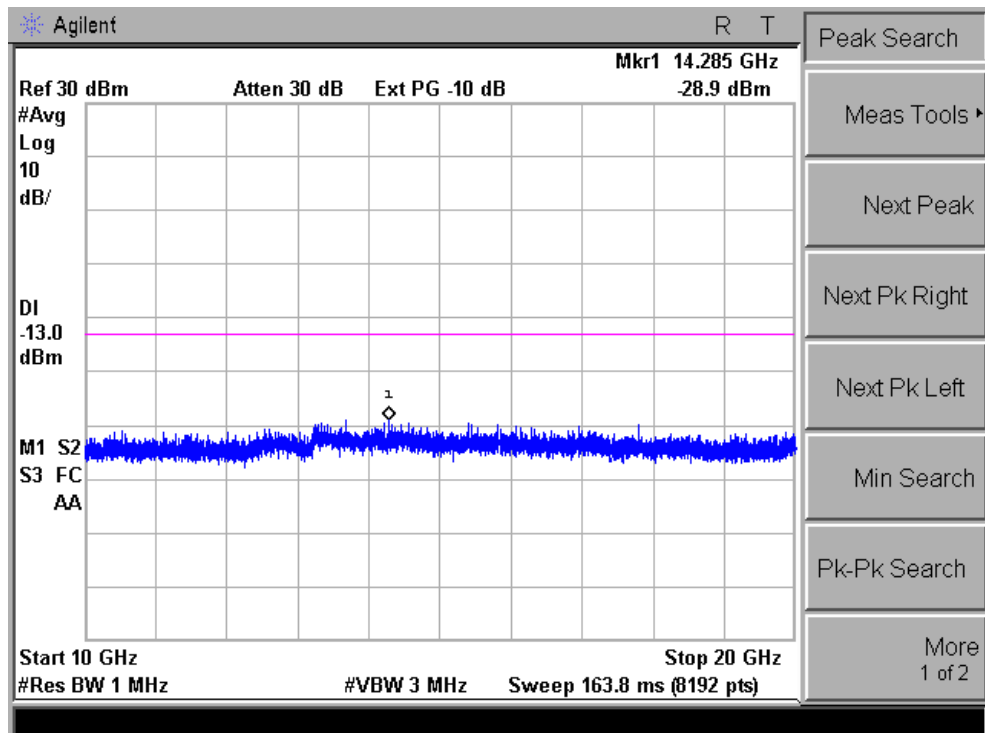
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 512 10GHz – 20GHz



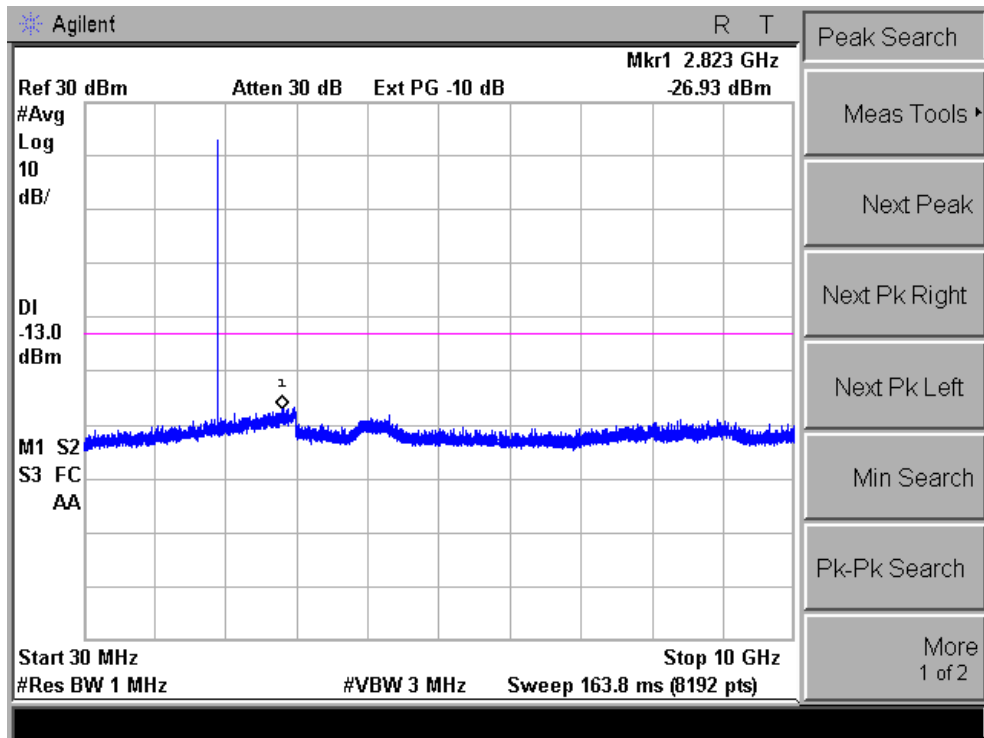
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 661 30MHz – 10GHz



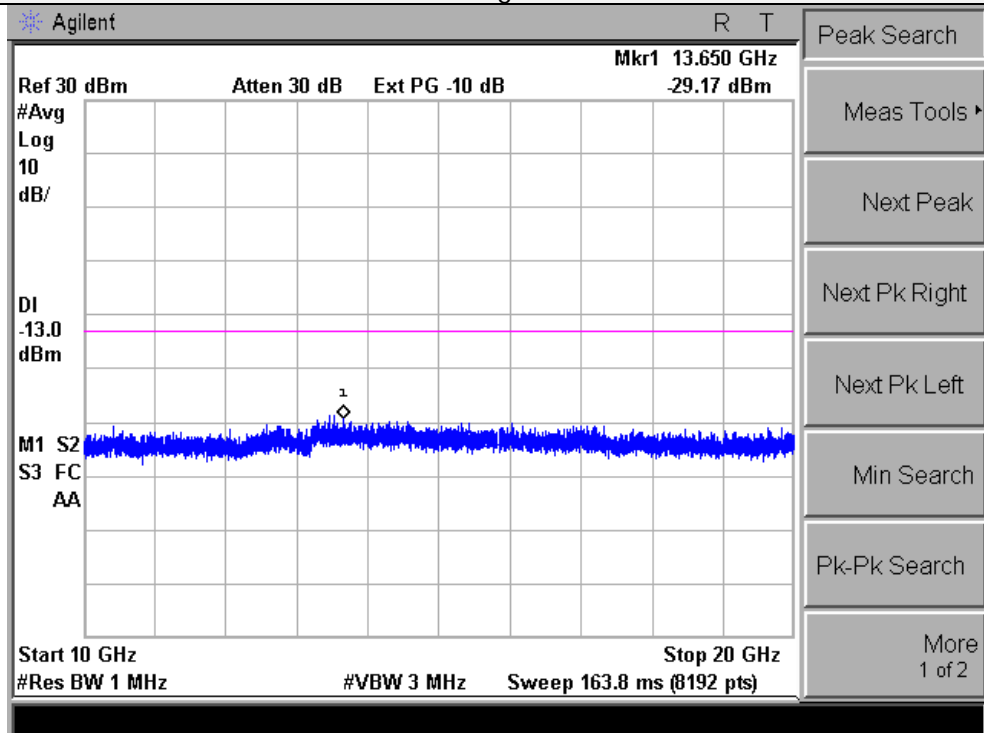
Conducted Emission Transmitting Mode CH 661 10GHz – 20GHz
