## Getting started with your PhotoSpring

Thank you for being part of the PhotoSpring community.

Please follow these steps to get your PhotoSpring ready for setup so you can start sending and enjoying your photos and videos every day.

- 1) Check receipt of all items
  - PhotoSpring Digital Photo Frame
  - Kickstand
  - AC power adapter
- 2) Place frame face down and attach the kickstand for your desired orientation
- 3) Stand up your PhotoSpring
- 4) Connect AC power adapter
- 5) Wait for PhotoSpring start-up and display the Welcome screen
- 6) Tap on the Welcome screen and follow on-screen instructions to set-up your PhotoSpring

## Ready for Setup

Have smartphone or computer ready to assist with setup. Tap on Welcome screen to start.

On-screen instructions will help you:

- 1) Connect to your WiFi
- 2) Download and install the latest version
- 3) Name your frame and connect email
- 4) Choose sending and other settings
- 5) Get ready to receive photos and videos

## Ways to send photos and videos:

Frame Email – Create Frame Email on PhotoSpring to send photos by email (no account required)

Smartphone / Tablet App – Use PhotoSpring app to send directly from smartphone or tablet

Web Browser – Web page allows you to send from your computer.

\* App and Web Browser requires free PhotoSpring account.

## PhotoSpring Screen Flow and Basic Features Overview

PhotoSpring will always default to **Slideshow**.

<p>From <b>Slideshow</b> tap on photo to enter <b>Photo Info</b> screen to see these options:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Go to Playlist screen</li><li>- Tap photo to resume Slideshow</li><li>- Show Menu dropdown</li><li>- Swipe left/right change photo</li><li>- Email photos</li><li>- Pause Slideshow</li><li>- Edit photo information</li><li>- Apply action to photo</li><li>- Set clock and WiFi</li></ul>	<p><b>Playlist</b> screen (enter from <b>Photo Info</b>):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Go to Albums screen</li><li>- Go to Select Items screen</li><li>- Tap photo to start Slideshow</li><li>- Show Menu dropdown</li><li>- Scroll up and down</li><li>- Select Filters options</li><li>- Select Sort options</li></ul>
<p><b>Albums</b> screen (enter from <b>Playlist</b>)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Tap album to select as Playlist</li><li>- Show Menu dropdown</li><li>- Scroll page up and down</li><li>- Swipe left/right in each row</li><li>- Manage album options</li><li>- Add new album</li></ul>	<p><b>Select Items</b> screen (enter from <b>Playlist</b>)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Select multiple items or Select All</li><li>- Apply action to selection<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Email photos</li><li>Add to Favorites</li><li>Add to Album (create new album)</li></ul></li></ul>
