

# **RF Exposure Evaluation**

### Limits

The criteria listed in the following table shall be used to evaluate the environment impact of human exposure to radio frequency (RF) radiation as specified in 1.1307(b)

f = frequency in MHz

Friis transmission formula:  $Pd = (Pout*G)/(4*pi*r^2)$ 

#### Where

**Pd** = power density in mW/cm<sup>2</sup>, **Pout** = output power to antenna in mW;

**G** = gain of antenna in linear scale, **Pi** = 3.1416;

**R** = distance between observation point and center of the radiator in cm

Pd id the limit of MPE, 1 mW/cm<sup>2</sup>. If we know the maximum gain of the antenna and the total power input to the antenna, through the calculation, we will know the distance r where the MPE limit is reached.

#### **Test Procedure**

Software provided by client enabled the EUT to transmit and receive data at lowest, middle and highest channel individually.

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## **Test Result of RF Exposure Evaluation**

For 2.4G WIFI

Note: Only one single wireless transmission mode can be used at the same time

Remark: antenna gain=2.0dBi

So a SAR test is not required

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
