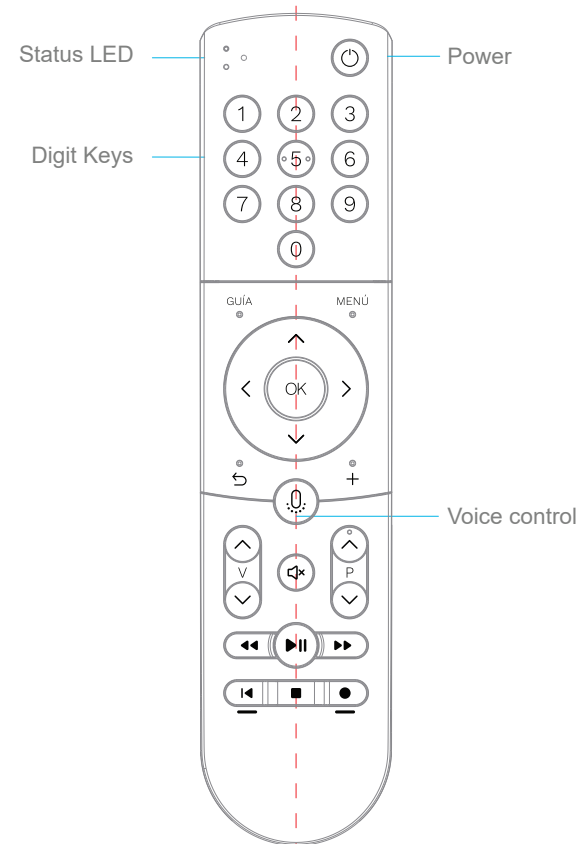

2 Turn On Caster

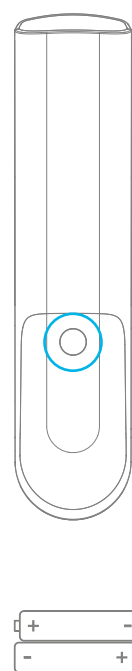
Caster remote control arrives with a 2 AAA batteries blister inside a polybag. To turn on your Caster remote control, please follow the instructions below.



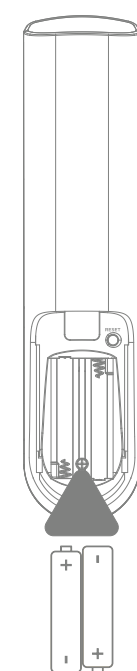
1. Turn ON your TV and your Set Top Box.



2. Remove your Caster remote control and the batteries from the plastic bag.



3. Remove the battery lid.



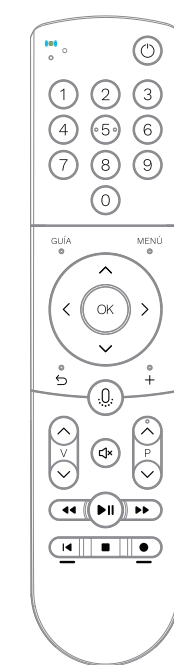
4. Place the batteries on the Caster remote control as indicated in the image above and close it with the battery lid.



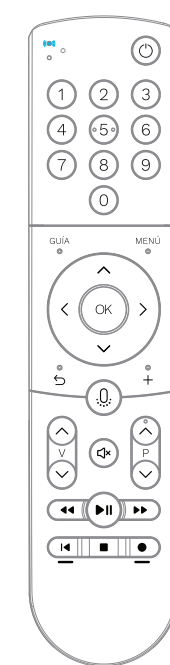
5. After place the batteries, wait a few seconds and the Caster is ready to operate.

3 Caster Control Your STB

Caster remote control is able to control your STB by IR or BLE connection. To perform this test, execute the following steps..

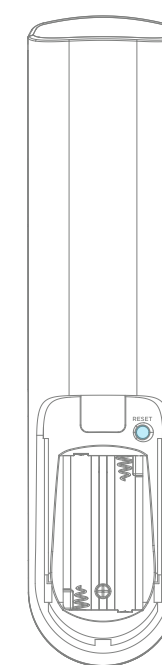


1. Press two keys simultaneously.



2. If the RCU is connected by IR, the LED will turn green.
3. If the RCU is connected by BLE, the LED will turn blue.

Note: If you change the function or have trouble operating the remote, open the battery cover and press the Reset button for more than three seconds to restore the command to the factory conditions.
