Programming with an existing working remote:

- Locate the included programming connector pin. Connect the currently working transmitter to the new transmitter.
- Press and hold the first button you wish to program. The LED will illuminate.
- Continue pressing the button from step 2. Now press and hold the same button on the new transmitter.
- 4. The LED will blink then turn solid when programming is complete.
- Repeat steps 2-4 for each button you wish to program.
