RSSI calibration <p>The Software/Firmware controls the RF parameters listed above so as to comply with the specific set of regulatory limits in accordance with the FCC grants issued for this device. The RF parameters are limited to comply with FCC rules and requirements during calibration of the device in the factory. Security keys (certification certificates) are in place to ensure that these parameters cannot be access by the User and/or a 3rd party.</p>
