## **Objective**

This test report is prepared on behalf of *Remote Tech LLC* All the test measurements were performed according to the measurement procedure described in ANSI C63.10 - 2013.

The tests were performed in order to determine compliance with FCC Part 15, Subpart C, section 15.203, 15.205, 15.209, 15.35(c) and 15.231 rules.

#### **Test Methodology**

All measurements contained in this report were conducted with ANSI C63.10 - 2013, American National Standard of Procedures for Compliance Testing of Unlicensed Wireless Devices.

All radiated and conducted emissions measurement was performed at Bay Area Compliance Laboratories Corp. (Kunshan). The radiated testing was performed at an antenna-to-EUT distance of 3 meters.



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
# **Block Diagram of Test Setup**

# FCC§15.203 - ANTENNA REQUIREMENT

### **Applicable Standard**

An intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section.

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#### **Antenna Connected Construction**

The EUT has a PCB antenna which was permanently attached and the antenna gain is 0.0dBi; fulfill the requirement of this section. Please refer to EUT photos.



- (1) The above field strength limits are specified at a distance of 3 meters. The tighter limits apply at the band edges.
- (2) Intentional radiators operating under the provisions of this section shall demonstrate compliance with the limits on the field strength of emissions, as shown in the above table, based on the average value of the measured emissions. As an alternative, compliance with the limits in the above table may be based on the use of measurement instrumentation with a CISPR quasi-peak detector. The specific method of measurement employed shall be specified in the application for equipment authorization. If average emission measurements are employed, the provisions in §15.35 for averaging pulsed emissions and for limiting peak emissions apply. Further, compliance with the provisions of §15.205 shall be demonstrated using the measurement instrumentation specified in that section.
- (3) The limits on the field strength of the spurious emissions in the above table are based on the fundamental frequency of the intentional radiator. Spurious emissions shall be attenuated to the average (or, alternatively, CISPR quasi-peak) limits shown in this table or to the general limits shown in §15.209, whichever limit permits a higher field strength.

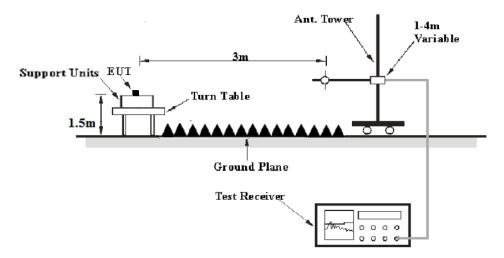
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## **EUT Setup**

The radiated emission tests were performed in the 3 meters test site, using the setup accordance with the ANSI C63.10 - 2013. The specification used was the FCC 15 § 15.209, 15.205 and 15.231.

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### **EMI Test Receiver Setup**

The system was investigated from 30 MHz to 4 GHz.

During the radiated emission test, the EMI test Receiver was set with the following configurations:

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#### **Test Procedure**

Maximizing procedure was performed on the highest emissions to ensure that the EUT complied with all installation combinations.

## **Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation**

The Corrected Amplitude is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and Cable Loss, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain from the Meter Reading. The basic equation is as follows:

Corrected Amplitude ( $dB\mu V/m$ ) = Meter Reading ( $dB\mu V$ ) + Antenna Factor (dB/m) + Cable Loss (dB) - Amplifier Gain (dB)

The "Margin" column of the following data tables indicates the degree of compliance with the applicable limit. For example, a margin of 7dB means the emission is 7dB below the limit. The equation for margin calculation is as follows:

Margin (dB) = Limit (dB $\mu$ V/m) – Corrected Amplitude (dB $\mu$ V/m)







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

**Duty Cycle-1** 





Zoom in Pulse Train N1=23, N2=66




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## **Duty Cycle Burst 1**

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# FCC §15.231(a) (1) - DEACTIVATION TESTING

## **Applicable Standard**

Per FCC §15.231(a) (1), A manually operated transmitter shall employ a switch that will automatically deactivate the transmitter within not more than 5 seconds of being released.

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#### **Test Procedure**

- 1. With the EUT's antenna attached, the waveform was received by the test antenna which was connected to the spectrum analyzer.
- 2. Set center frequency of spectrum analyzer=operating frequency.
- 3. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW=100k VBW=300k Span=0Hz.
- 4. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured was complete.



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# FCC §15.231(c) - 20dB EMISSION BANDWIDTH TESTING

## **Applicable Standard**

Per 15.231(c), The bandwidth of the emission shall be no wider than 0.25% of the center frequency for devices operating above 70 MHz and below 900 MHz. Bandwidth is determined at the points 20 dB down from the modulated carrier.

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#### **Test Procedure**

With the EUT's antenna attached, the waveform was received by the test antenna which was connected to the spectrum analyzer, plot the 20 dB bandwidth.


