SAFETY INFORMATION

Remember to obey the relevant rules and regulations each time you use your phone. This will avoid negative effects to you and the environment.

General Safety

- Do not make or answer phone calls when driving. Never write messages when driving.
- Do not use your phone at Gas stations.
- Keep your phone at least 15 mm apart from your ear or body when making calls.
- Your phone can produce bright lights or flashes.
- Small parts can cause suffocation.

- Do not disassemble your phone.
- Turn your phone off when near explosive materials or liquids.
- Use only approved accessories.
- Do not trust your mobile phone for emergency communications.

Warning: Risk of electrocution

To avoid serious injury, do not touch the charger connectors.

Unplug the charger when it is not in use.

To disconnect a charger or accessory, grasp and pull the plug, not the cord.

The power adapter is the device's disconnect device.

The socket outlet must be close to the equipment and easily accessible.




The accessories that are supplied offer better performance for your phone.

Keyboard

The following table gives you a brief description of the function of each telephone key:

KEY	FUNCTION
FUNCTION	Execute the action indicated in the lower part of the screen
NAVIGATION	In standby mode, it allows access to the functions defined by the user; In Menu mode, you can scroll through the menu options.
CENTRAL BUTTON	Allows access to the main menu of the mobile phone. In menu mode, you can select the highlighted menu option to confirm an action.
CALL	Open the list of recent calls or make a call to the number on the screen. Allows you to answer an incoming call.
HANG UP	Ends a call in progress or rejects an incoming call. Press and hold for 3 seconds to turn on or pay for the phone
1.....0	It allows entering numbers, text and / or special characters.

BEFORE STARTING


Start preparing your mobile phone to use it for the first time.

Installing the SIM card and the battery

When you hire a mobile phone service, you will receive a Subscriber Identification Module or SIM Card, which contains your subscription information such as your Personal Identification Number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and the battery,


- Remove the back cover

2. Insert the SIM Card

Your phone has two spaces that allow you to use two SIM cards and exchange them.



- Place the SIM card in the phone with the gold connectors facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM card, you can use the options of your phone that do not depend on an operator, as well as some menus.
- To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card.

3. Insert the battery and attach the back cover.

BASIC FUNCTIONS

Learn how to perform the basic operations of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn on your phone

- Press and Hold [*].
- Enter your PIN and press<OK> (if it is necessary).

To turn off your phone, repeat step one.

Acceder al menú

To access the menu of your phone

- In the standby mode, press left function key < Menu > to enter Menu Mode
- Use the navigation keys to move to another menu or option.
- Presione <Seleccionar>, <OK>, o la tecla de confirmación en la opción seleccionada.
- Press Key < Back > to go back one level Press [*] to go back to standby mode.

Basic functions of a call

To Make a call

- In the standby mode, enter the area code and the phone number.
- Press [*] to dial the number.
- To end a call, press [*].

To answer a call

- When you enter a call, press [*].
- To end a call, press [*].

Sending and Reading Text Message

In this section, learn how to send and read text messages (SMS).

To send a Text Message:

- In Menu mode, select Messages → write message → Text/ Multimedia.
- Insert destination number and then scroll down.
- Enter your text message
- Press < Options > → Send Message

Add contacts

Learn the basic details of how to add and find a contact.

Add a new contact:

- In the standby mode, enter the phone number and press <Options>.
- Select Add to contact → then select a location (phone, SIM1, or SIM2).
- Select the type of number (if necessary).
- Enter the contact information.
- Press <Options> → Save to add the contact.

Looking for a contact

- In menu mode, select Contract Book.
- Enter the first letters of the name you want to locate.
- Select the name of the contact in the search list. Once the contact is found, you can call contact by pressing the [*] key

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music using the player

Multimedia or Wireless FM Radio.

Listen to FM Radio:

- The use of headphones is not necessary.
- In Menu mode, select Multimedia → FM Radio.
- Press the "OK" key to start the Radio.
- Control the FM Radio using the following keys:

Listen to music files:

After transferring the music files to the "My" folder Music "of your phone or memory card,

- In Menu mode, select Multimedia →Audio.
- Enter a music category → file.
- Control playback using the following keys:

Navigate in Internet

Learn how to access your favorite web pages.

Navigate in Internet:

- In Menu mode, select Browser → Select a SIM card (if necessary) → Home page, for open the page of your service provider.
- Browse web pages using the following keys:

NAVIGATION	In standby mode, allows access the defined functions by the user; In Menu mode, allows you to scroll through menu options.

CAMERA

Learn how to use the camera to take pictures and see the same.

Take photos

- In Menu mode, select Multimedia → Camera.
- Point the lens at the objective of the photo and make the adjustments that want.
- Press the confirmation key (Center key) to take the picture (the photo will be saved automatically).
- Press <Back> to take another photo (step 2). See the photos taken Select File → image gallery, to access quickly to your photos.

By entering the options of the camera you can make several settings such as: exposure, contrast and use of the flash or mode night.

ACCESSING INTERNET

Learn the steps to set up your phone and connect to Internet.

Add a new connection

- In Menu mode, select Internet → Option → Settings → Network Account SIM 1 or SIM2
- Press <Options> then Add data account.
- Enter the parameters according to your operator.

The basic parameters are:

- Account name
- APN
- Username
- Password
- Select SIM (if necessary)

Some operators use Proxy servers, refer to the configuration of your operator for more information.

- Once the necessary parameters are configured, press <OK> and confirm the new connection by pressing <Yes>.

USING BT

Learn about the possibility of connecting your phone with other devices wirelessly to exchange data.

Turn on the BT

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Bluetooth
- Select the BT option and check "On".
- To allow other devices to locate your phone, scroll down to visibility and press the key of left function to turn it on.

Find and match other devices with BT

- In Menu mode, select Applications →BT → Paired Devices → Add new device.
- Scroll to the desired device and press <Match>.
- Enter the PIN for the BT device or PIN of the other device, if you have one, and press <OK>.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code or accept the connection, the pairing will be full.

Send data using BT

- Select the file or item of one of the applications of your phone you want to send.
- Press <Options> → Send → Via BT → Select the name of the device and then accept the file in the receiver.

Receive data using BT


- Enter or accept the BT device PIN press <OK> (if necessary).
- Press <Yes> to confirm that you want to receive the data of the other device (if necessary).

Rename the BT device

- In Menu mode, select Applications → BT → My name.
- Enter the name you want, then press OK
- In Menu mode, select Applications → BT → Storage and select phone or memory card if you have one.

For optimal operation, avoid touching or damaging it. Since mobile devices offer a wide range of functions, can be used in other positions that do not be next to his ear. In such circumstances the device will be in accordance with the guidelines when used with a cable of USB data or a headset. If you are using another accessory make sure that any product that is using is free of any metal and to place the phone at least 1.0 cm away from your body.

The SAR limit of USA (FCC) is 1.6 W/kg averaged over one gram of tissue. Device types S1 (FCC ID: 2A0QSV0ZS1) has also been tested against this SAR limit. The highest reported SAR values for head, body-worn accessory are 0.53 W/kg, 0.68 W/kg respectively.

The Max simultaneous SAR is 0.70W/kg. This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the handset kept 10mm from the body. To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure requirements, use accessories that maintain a 10mm separation distance between the user's body and the back of the handset. The use of belt clips, holsters and similar accessories should not contain metallic components in its assembly. The use of accessories that do not satisfy these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, and should be avoided. The antenna(s) used for this transmitter must not be co-located or operating in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter.
