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


Figure 2. 30MHz to 1GHz




Figure 1. 30MHz to 1GHz



	f. Place a marker at the end of the restricted band closest to the transmit frequency to show compliance. Also measure any emissions in the restricted bands. Save the spectrum analyzer plot. Repeat for each power and modulation for lowest and highest channel
	g. Test the EUT in the lowest channel , the Highest channel
	h. Repeat above procedures until all frequencies measured was complete.
