## Getting Started

### Overview


This unit can be controlled by using the buttons on the unit or the controls on the steering wheel. It also provides connections for media devices.

This section explains the buttons and functions that are available on the unit and the steering wheel and provides information about connecting media devices.

### ► A/V system unit



No./Name	Description
<b>1 POWER/VOL</b>	Turns power on or mute function off/on (press); turns power off (press and hold); adjusts volume (rotate).
<b>2 RADIO</b>	Enters/changes Radio mode (press: FM1 → FM2 → AM → FM1 → ...).
<b>3 MAP</b>	Enters Map screen for the current vehicle location and the direction of travel (press). <i>For more information about how to use the map feature, refer to the separate Navigation manual.</i>

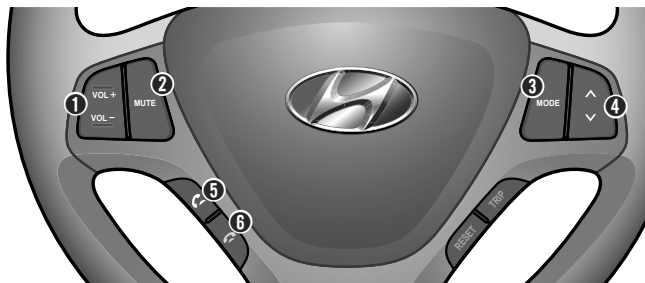
No./Name	Description
<b>4 PHONE</b>	Switches to Bluetooth Phone mode (optional: press).
<b>5 MEDIA</b>	Enters Media home mode (press).
<b>6 MIC</b>	Detects voice during phone conversations.
<b>7 Reset</b>	Resets System settings (press). • If the unit fails to operate properly, press this button with a pen tip or another pointed instrument. (Preset radio channels and other data will not be deleted)
<b>8 Siri</b>	When your iPhone is connected to the unit, activates Siri function (option: press).
<b>9 SETUP</b>	Enters Setup menu screen (press).
<b>10 USB/AUX port with cover</b>	Opens cover and connects USB/iPod or AUX device.  <b>USB:</b> Connect USB devices, iPods, and iPhones. <b>AUX:</b> Connect other external devices.
<b>11 FILE/TUNE ENTER</b>	Changes/selects item for setting/searching (press); finds a station manually, moves cursor for menu/item selection or zoom in/out on Map screen (rotate).



### Note

- The actual feature in the vehicle may differ from the illustration.
- Apple CarPlay may not be supported depending on your vehicle's options and which region the unit is being used in.

## ► Steering wheel remote control



### Note

- USB, iPod, AUX, Bluetooth Audio, Apple CarPlay modes are not available if there is no device connected.
- Apple CarPlay may not be supported depending on your vehicle's options and which region the unit is being used in.
- When your iPhone is connected to the unit for Apple CarPlay feature, deactivates Bluetooth Audio

No./Name	Description
<b>1 VOL + / VOL -</b>	Adjusts volume level (press/press and hold).
<b>2 MUTE</b>	Mutes/unmutes audio/call sound (press)
<b>3 MODE</b>	Changes unit's mode in the order: FM1 → FM2 → AM → USB or iPod → AUX → Bluetooth Audio or Apple CarPlay → FM1 → ... or turns power on unit (press) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• When your iPhone is connected to the unit for Apple CarPlay feature, activates Siri function (optional: press and hold).</li> </ul>
<b>4 ▲ / ▼</b>	Moves to previous/next file, track, or preset station (press: except for AUX); automatically searches for available stations or fast-forward/rewind the media file (press and hold: except for AUX and Bluetooth audio).
<b>5  (option)</b>	Enters Bluetooth Phone mode or receives an incoming call (press); makes a call via last call (press and hold).
<b>6  (option)</b>	Rejects or ends a call (press).



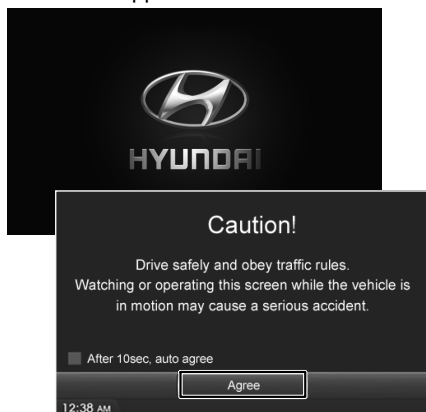
## Basic operation

This section explains basic operations such as switching to standby mode, adjusting the volume, quickly muting the sound, and using the touch screen.

### ► Turning the system on

Press the smart ignition [ENGINE START/STOP] button or place the ignition switch in the **ACC** or **IGN (ON)** position.

The unit will turn on and the following screen will appear.



Tap **Agree** to start the system.

The previously selected radio station or file is played.

To agree automatically, activate the checkbox.

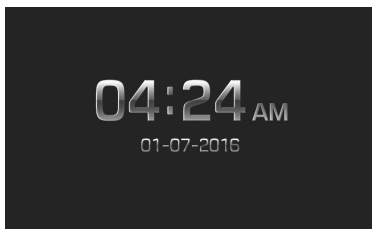


#### Note

- You can also change the language by referring to "**Selecting the language**" on page 31.

### ► Switching to the power off (Standby) mode

To turn the unit off (standby) mode while using the unit's functions, press and hold the **POWER** button.



When the unit is turned off, the clock and date screen appears, which means that the unit is in standby mode.

You can change the Power off mode by referring to "**Setting the power-off**

**display type**" on page 30.

To start for using the unit's functions, press **POWER** button on the unit or **MODE** or button on the steering wheel.



#### Note

- When a call is made to a Bluetooth-connected phone, the unit also turns on automatically for incoming call. Rejected an incoming call or end a call, the unit also turns off.

### ► Adjusting the volume

Rotate the **VOL** dial on the unit or press the **VOL +** or **VOL -** buttons on the steering wheel to increase or decrease the volume.

When the volume is adjusted, the volume level bar will appear as shown below.

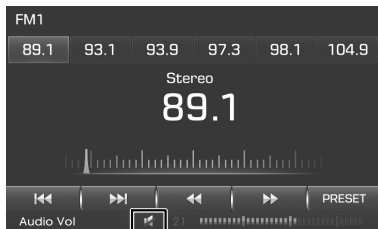


The volume level has the different ranges for each mode.

- Radio/Audio/Video: 0 to 35
- Phone: 0 to 15
- Navigation: 1 to 15

### ► Muting the sound quickly

Press the **POWER** button on the unit or the **MUTE** button on the steering wheel to activate the mute function.



When the mute function is activated, the mute icon (🔇) will appear next to the volume control bar.

To deactivate the mute function, press the **POWER** button or rotate the **VOL** dial on the unit, or press the **MUTE** button on the steering wheel.

### Using the rearview camera screen (optional)

If equipped, a rearview camera will display the area behind the vehicle on the screen when power is turned on and the reverse gear is selected.

The rearview camera display is not a substitute for proper and safe driving procedures. Always drive safely and use caution when backing up. The rearview camera display may not detect all objects behind the vehicle.



### ⚠ Caution

- The rearview camera's purpose is to prevent accidents or injuries. Do not use this function for entertainment purpose.
- Objects in the rearview camera's images may be closer or more distant than they actually appear.

### ✎ Note

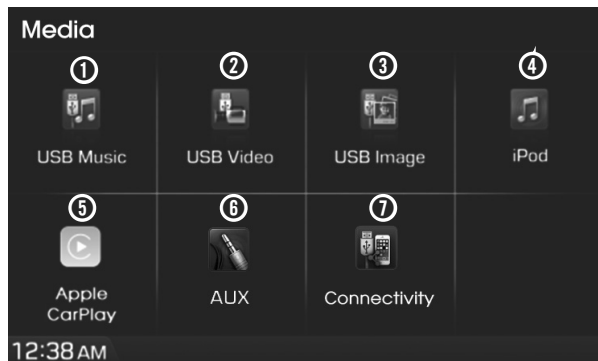
- The edges of images may differ slightly depending on whether full-screen images are displayed when reversing.

## Media Home menu screen

This section explains each menu on the Media Home screen.

To open Media Home, press the **MEDIA** button on the unit.

The following screen will be displayed. Select the desired menu from this screen.



No./Name	Description
<b>1 USB Music</b>	Plays music from an external USB device (tap).
<b>2 USB Video</b>	Plays video from an external USB device (tap).
<b>3 USB Image</b>	Shows images stored on an external USB device (tap).
<b>4 iPod</b>	When iOS device is connected to the USB port for iPod feature, the iPod music player feature opens (tap). Plays music from an iPod connected to the unit.
<b>5 Bluetooth Audio</b>	Plays audio from a Bluetooth-enabled device paired with the unit.

No./Name	Description
<b>6 AUX</b>	Plays an external device's output audio or video signal on the unit (tap).
<b>7 Connectivity &gt; Apple CarPlay</b>	When iPhone connects to the USB port for Apple CarPlay, the Apple CarPlay feature opens (tap). Provides directions, makes calls, send and receive messages, and, plays music from an iPhone connected to the unit.





### Note



- When you connected iOS device to USB port, you can select the iOS device connectivity feature to iPod or CarPlay by referring to **"Setting the Connectivity"** on page 31.




## Using the touch screen

### ► Touch gestures for built-in applications

Gesture	Description
[Tapping] 	Open an application, select a menu item, or activate an on-screen button.
[Tapping and holding] 	Tap and hold the preset station shortcut to store the current station. You can also quickly change a value by tapping and holding + or - when setting the time and date.

### ► Touch gestures for Apple CarPlay (optional)

Gesture	Description
[Tapping] 	Open an application, select a menu item, or activate an on-screen button.
[Tapping and holding] 	To rewind or fast-forward in a track, tap and hold ◀◀ or ▶▶.

Gesture	Description
[Dragging] 	Rewind or fast-forward a track. Drag the progress bar to the target position to rewind or fast-forward a track.
[Double-tapping] 	Double-tap on a page or an image to zoom in. Double-tap again to return to the previous view.
[Swiping] 	Swipe left, right, upwards or downwards on the screen to scroll through pages or a list of items.

#### Note

- Touch gesture for Apple CarPlay such as double-tapping, spreading, pinching, and swiping are not available with the built-in applications.

## Connectivity Display Audio

### Radio

This section explains how to use radio and access various radio frequencies (FM1, FM2, and AM). Also, it covers automatically or manually locating and storing your favorite radio stations.

#### ► Radio screen

To turn on the radio, press the **RADIO** button on the unit or press the **MODE** button on the steering wheel several times until the Radio screen appears.



No./Name	Description
5	Indicates station search mode is activated.
6 Frequency gauge	Indicates position of the current radio frequency in the frequency band.
7	Automatically search for radio stations above or below the current frequency (tap).
8	Fine-tune above and below the current frequency (tap); quickly adjust the frequency (tap and hold).
9 PRESET	Opens list of preset stations (tap).

No./Name	Description
1 Mode	Shows currently operating radio mode
2 Preset station shortcuts	Shows stored Presets for user selection. Recall the indicated frequency (tap); store the current station to Preset list (tap and hold). • Up to 6 Preset frequencies can be stored for each mode (FM1, FM2, and AM).
3 Stereo	Indicates when FM stereo reception is available.
4 Frequency	Shows current station's radio frequency.

## ► Listening to radio stations

### Changing the frequency band

Press the **RADIO** button on the unit to change the frequency band to FM1, FM2, or AM.

The current frequency band is displayed at the top left corner of the screen.

### Searching for a radio station automatically

Tap **◀▶** to search for a radio station automatically. When a station is detected, the unit stops searching.

### Searching for a radio station manually

Tap **◀▶** or rotate the **TUNE** dial to manually tune in a desired frequency.

### Storing radio stations manually

Up to six preset radio stations can be stored for each frequency band (FM1, FM2, and AM). Follow the instructions below to manually store radio stations.

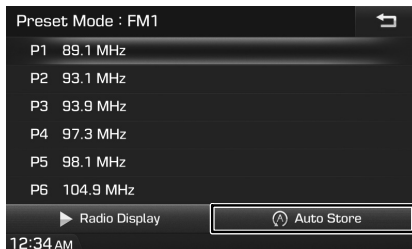
Tap and hold a **Preset station shortcut** to save the current radio station.

### Storing radio stations automatically

Tap **PRESET** from Radio screen, to show the list of preset stations.

Tap **Auto Store**.

The stations with the strongest signals are automatically stored in the list.



### Note

- The selected radio station is stored to the preset number. If a new station is stored using an existing preset number, the previously stored station will be deleted and the new station will be stored.

### Selecting a preset radio station

Tap **PRESET** from Radio screen, to show the list of preset stations.

Tap a station in the list.

To recall a preset station on the radio screen, tap the desired preset station shortcut.

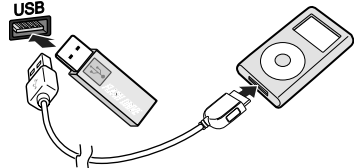
## USB/iPod music player

This section explains how to use the USB or iPod music player.

You can play MP3, WMA, WAV, OGG, and M4A files that are stored on a USB device, and any music files that are stored on an iPod.

### ▶ Connecting a USB device or iPod to the USB port

Connect a USB device or iPod to the iPod/USB port as shown below.



Music, video, or image playback will start automatically after the data on the USB device or iPod is recognized.

#### Note

- If a USB device with no music, video, or image files is connected, the USB music, video and image players cannot be opened.
- When using the iPod player, firstly check the System Connectivity is selected to BT/iPod for USB connection of iOS device, refer to **"Setting the Connectivity"** on page 31.

### ▶ USB/iPod Music player screen

- 1 Press the **MEDIA** button on the unit to display Media Home screen.
- 2 Tap **USB Music** to open the USB music player or **iPod** to open the iPod music player.



No./Name	Description
1 Progress bars	Shows progress bar for the current song; rewind or fast-forward a track (tap or drag).
2 Song information	Shows current album thumbnail, album, artist, song title, and file name.
3 ◀◀/▶▶	Skips to previous/next file (tap).
4   /▶	Pauses/resumes playback (tap).
5 RPT	Sets repeat mode (tap). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• : Repeats current file.</li> <li>• : Repeats all files in the current folder (USB only).</li> <li>• : Repeats all files on a device.</li> </ul>

No./Name	Description
6 RDM	Sets random mode (tap). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• : Plays randomly all files within the current folder. (only for USB)</li> <li>• : Plays randomly all files within the USB or iPod.</li> </ul>
7 List	Opens file list (tap).

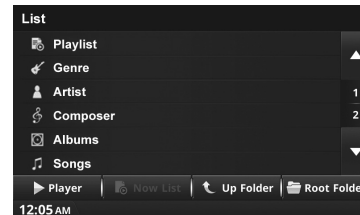
### ▶ Selecting a file from a list

- 1 From the music player screen, tap **List**.



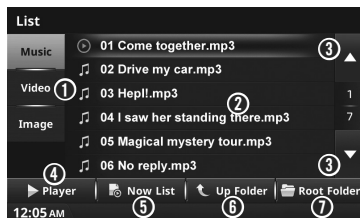
#### For iPods:

### For USB devices:

When a USB device is connected, the following file list will be displayed.



No./Name	Description
① <b>Music/Video/Image</b>	Indicates/selects media type (tap).
② <b>File list</b>	Shows/selects files list (tap). ⏮: currently playing file.
③ <b>▲/▼</b>	Navigates files in the playlist (tap).
④ <b>▶ Player</b>	Returns to Music playback screen (tap).
⑤ <b>📁 Now List</b>	Returns to current playlist. (tap).
⑥ <b>🔼 Up Folder</b>	Moves to parent folder (tap).
⑦ <b>📁 Root Folder</b>	Moves to root folder (tap).

- 2 Select the desired category and file to start playback.

### ⚠ Caution

- When using a USB device or iPod, make sure to disconnect the device when it is not in use. Do not connect the device until after you have started the vehicle.  
The device may be damaged if the device is already connected when the ignition is turned on.
- Do not allow the USB connector to come into contact with body parts or foreign substances.
- Repeatedly connecting or disconnecting a USB device over a short period may cause damage to the device.
- Abruptly disconnecting a USB device while it is in use may cause the device to be damaged or to function abnormally. Make sure to disconnect the USB device only when the unit is operating in a different mode.
- Do not use the USB I/F to charge batteries or USB accessories that generate heat. Doing so may reduce performance or damage the device.
- In some cases, iPods may be damaged if the ignition is turned off while it is connected to the unit. When the iPod is not being used, disconnect it before turning the ignition off.

### 📝 Note

- Some USB devices may not operate properly due to compatibility issues. Check that the device is supported before using it.
- When you format a USB device, the unit may not recognize a byte/sector selection other than 512 bytes or 2,048 bytes.
- The amount of time required to recognize a USB device may differ depending on the type, size, or file formats stored on the USB device. Such time differences are not the result of any malfunction. Please wait while the unit attempts to recognize the device.
- The unit supports only USB devices designed to play music and video files and images.
- When disconnecting a USB device, an abnormal sound may occur.
- The unit may not recognize the USB device if separately purchased USB hubs and extension cables are used.
- If high capacity USB devices are used, there may be situations that require the logical drive to be partitioned for user convenience. In these situations, it will only be possible to play music on a USB device from the top level of the drive. When using partitioned drives, save songs to play on the device only in the top level of the logical drive.



Also, certain USB devices are configured with a separate drive for installing application programs, playing music files from a separate drive may not be possible for the reasons described above.

- The unit may not operate properly when accessing files from HDD, CF, or SD memory.
- The unit will not support locked DRM (Digital Rights Management) files.
- iPod is a registered trademark of the Apple Corporation in the United States and other countries.
- The unit supports iPod Nano, iPod Touch, and iPhone models. Other devices are not supported.
- Some iPod and iPhone models may not be supported or provide compatible connection.
- Only connect the iPod and the unit using approved iPod cables. Other connection cables cannot be used.
- The playback functions and the displayed items on iPods may differ when they are connected to the unit. This can affect play order, method, and information displays on the iPod.

## USB Video player

This section explains how to use the USB video player.

You can play AVI, MP4, WMV, and MKV files that are stored on a USB device.

### ► USB Video player screen

- 1 Connect a USB device to the iPod/USB port.
- 2 Press the **MEDIA** button on the unit to display Media Home screen.
- 3 Tap **USB Video**.  
The USB video player screen will be displayed.

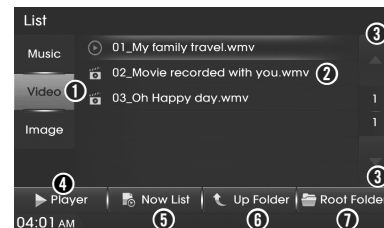


No./Name	Description
① Progress bars	Shows time elapsed and duration of the file being played; rewind or fast-forward the video (drag the progress bar to the target position).
② File name	Shows current file name.

No./Name	Description
③ Video screen	Hide/unhide Control panel on the video screen (tap).
④ ◀▶	Skips to previous or next file (tap).
⑤   ▶	Pause/resume playback (tap).
⑥ RPT	Sets repeat mode (tap). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 🔄: Repeats current file.</li> <li>• 🔄: Repeats all files in the current folder.</li> <li>• 🔄: Repeats all files on a device.</li> </ul>
⑦ 🗨 Sub.	Activates/deactivates subtitles (tap).

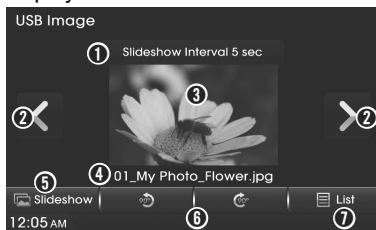
## USB Image player

This section explains how to use the USB image player.

You can view JPG, BMP, and PNG files that are stored on a USB device.

### ▶ USB Image player screen

- 1 Connect a USB device to the iPod/USB port.
- 2 Press the **MEDIA** button on the unit to display Media Home screen.
- 3 Tap **USB Image** to open the USB image player.  
The USB image player screen will be displayed.



No./Name	Description
❶ <b>Slideshow interval</b>	Sets time interval between slides (tap).
❷ <b>&lt;/&gt;</b>	Skips to previous/next file (tap).
❸ <b>Image screen</b>	Hide/unhide Control panel on the image screen (tap).

No./Name	Description
❹ <b>File name</b>	Shows current file name.
❺ <b>Slideshow</b>	Runs slideshow in full screen (tap).
❻ <b>↻ / ⌚</b>	Rotates image in a clockwise or counterclockwise direction (tap).
❼ <b>List</b>	Opens file list (tap).

### ▶ Selecting a file from a list

- 1 From the image player screen, tap **List**.  
The following file list will be displayed.

## AUX player

This section explains how to use the AUX player.

External audio devices can be connected to the AUX port (stereo mini jack).

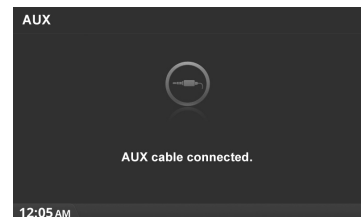
When a device is connected to the AUX port and the source is selected, you can listen to the device's audio through your car speakers. The volume level can be adjusted to allow for differences between the unit and the device.

### ► Connecting an external audio device to the AUX port

- 1 Turn off the external audio device.
- 2 Connect the audio output of the external device to the AUX port.

## ► Using the AUX player

- 1 Make sure the volume is adjusted properly both for the unit and for the connected device before starting playback.
- 2 Press the **MEDIA** button on the unit to display Media Home menu screen.
- 3 Tap **AUX** to open the AUX audio screen.



<AUX audio screen>

- 4 Start playback at the external device.
- 5 Set the desired volume at the unit and the external device.

## Bluetooth Audio player

This section explains how to use the Bluetooth audio player.

This unit supports the A2DP (Advanced Audio Distribution Profile). If your Bluetooth mobile phone or music player supports this profile, then music can be played through this unit and the car's speakers.

Also, this unit supports the AVRCP (Audio Video Remote Control Profile). If your Bluetooth mobile phone or music player supports this profile, then it is possible to advance to the next track or replay previous tracks by using the buttons on the unit or the steering wheel (if fitted).

### ► Pairing and connecting with a Bluetooth device

For information on how to pair and connect the unit with a Bluetooth device, refer to

**"Bluetooth connection"** on page 22.

### ► Bluetooth Audio player screen

To open the Bluetooth audio player screen:

Press the **MEDIA** button on the unit to display Home and then tap **Bluetooth Audio**.

The Bluetooth audio player screen will be displayed.



No./Name	Description
① Song information	• Shows album, artist, and song details.
② ◀◀ / ▶▶	• Skips to previous/next file (tap).
③ ▶▶	• Pause/resume playback (tap).

## Apple CarPlay (optional)

### About Apple CarPlay

Apple CarPlay integrates your iPhone's apps with your car's media system, allowing you to access the applications and your device more easily. You can get directions, make calls, send and receive messages, and listen to music.

Apple CarPlay is available for all Lightning-enabled iPhones (currently supported iPhones are 5, 5c, 5s, 6 (Plus), 6S (Plus), SE, 7 (Plus), 8 (Plus), X, or higher).

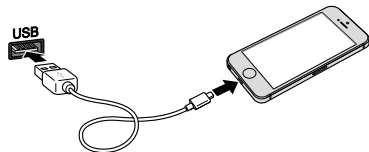
#### Note

- Apple CarPlay may not be supported depending on your vehicle's options and which region the unit is being used in.

### ► Accessing Apple CarPlay

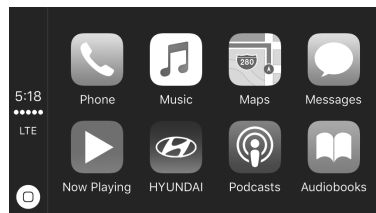
Firstly, check the **System Connectivity** is selected to **CarPlay** for USB connection of iOS device, refer to "**Setting the Connectivity**" on page 31.

Plug your iPhone into the USB port via a Lightning cable.

## Bluetooth Connectivity

### About the Bluetooth feature —

The Bluetooth feature enables you to wirelessly connect two devices that are near to each other. You can connect your unit and a wide variety of Bluetooth-enabled devices.

#### Note

- In some locations, there may be restrictions when using Bluetooth connections.
- Depending on the type and specifications of the Bluetooth device, your unit may respond differently when connected.
- Some devices, especially those that are not tested or approved by the Bluetooth SIG, may be incompatible with your unit.

### ► Pairing devices

Pairing is a process that enables mutual registration between two devices. The paired devices share and record the other's Bluetooth information.

When two devices are paired for the first time, you must enter a Bluetooth passkey. Once the devices are paired and an initial connection is established, the devices will recognize and automatically connect to each other each time they are in range.

#### Note

- Depending on the devices, you may need to enter a passkey each time they connect.
- Depending on the devices, the passkey may be referred to as "passcode", "PIN code", or "password".

### ► Connecting devices

After the devices are paired, subsequent Bluetooth connections for previously paired devices start automatically. You can connect to any of the devices on the paired device list. Once you are connected, you can access various Bluetooth functions, such as hands-free calling or playing music, depending on the device's specifications.

### ► Using the hands-free feature and listening to music

Once a Bluetooth connection is made, you can make or answer calls using hands-free features and listen to music from a Bluetooth-connected device.

For more information on how to use call functions using Bluetooth, refer to "**Phone functions**" on page 24 ~ 26.

For more information on how to play music using Bluetooth, refer to "**Bluetooth Audio player**" on page 17.

#### Note

- Some Bluetooth devices may not support all available functions.

### Bluetooth connection —

Connect your unit with other Bluetooth-enabled devices, such as smartphones and music players.

Before establishing a connection, ensure that the other device is ready to connect

using the Bluetooth feature.

The Bluetooth feature and the visibility option should be activated on the device so that it can be detected by other devices.

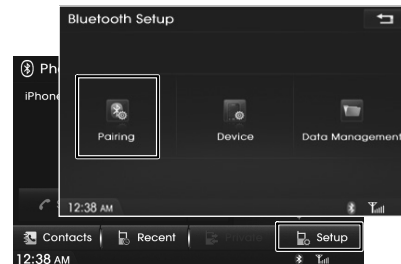
