#### **Objective**

This Type approval report is prepared on behalf of *Shenzhen Shuo Yu Technology co.,LTD* in accordance with Part 2, Subpart J, and Part 15, Subparts A and C of the Federal Communications Commission's rules.

#### **Test Methodology**

All measurements detailed in this Test Report were performed in accordance with ANSI C63.10-2013 "American National Standard of Procedures for Compliance Testing of Unlicensed Wireless Devices".

All emissions measurement was performed and Bay Area Compliance Laboratories Corp. (Dongguan). The radiated testing was performed at an antenna-to-EUT distance of 3 meters.







The setup of EUT is according with per ANSI C63.10-2013 measurement procedure. The specification used was with the FCC Part 15.207 limits.

The external I/O cables were draped along the test table and formed a bundle 30 to 40 cm long in the middle.

The spacing between the peripherals was 10 cm.

The adapter was connected to the main LISN with an AC 120V/60Hz power source.

#### **EMI Test Receiver Setup**

The EMI test receiver was set to investigate the spectrum from 150 kHz to 30 MHz.

#### **Test Procedure**

During the conducted emission test, the adapter was connected to the outlet of the LISN.

Maximizing procedure was performed on the six (6) highest emissions of the EUT.

All data was recorded in the Quasi-peak and average detection mode.

According FCC publication number 174176, for a device with a permanent antenna operating at or below 30 MHz, the measurements done with a suitable dummy load, in lieu of the permanent antenna under the following conditions: (1) perform the AC line conducted tests with the permanent antenna to determine compliance with the Section 15.207 limits outside the transmitter's fundamental emission band; (2) retest with a dummy load in lieu of the permanent antenna to determine compliance with the Section 15.207 limits within the transmitter's fundamental emission band.

#### **Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation**







#### **EUT Setup**



The radiated emission tests were performed in the 3-meter chamber test site, using the setup accordance with the ANSI C63.10-2013. The specification used was the FCC Part Subpart C limits.

The spacing between the peripherals was 10 cm.

#### **EMI Test Receiver Setup**

The system was investigated from 9 kHz to 1 GHz.

During the radiated emission test, the EMI test Receiver was set with the following configurations:

#### **Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation**

The Corrected Amplitude is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and Cable Loss, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain from the Amplitude reading. The basic equation is as follows:
