2.1 LIMITS

F= Frequency in MHz Friis Formula

Friis transmission formula: $P_d = (P_{out} * G) / (4 * \pi * R^2)$ Where

P_d = power density in mW/cm²

P_{out} = output power to antenna in mW

G = gain of antenna in linear scale

$P_i = 3.1416$

R = distance between observation point and center of the radiator in cm

P_d is the limit of MPE. If we know the maximum gain of the antenna and the total power input to the antenna, through the calculation, we will know the distance r where the MPE limit is reached.

2.2 EUT RF EXPOSURE EVALUATION

BT and WIFI ANT: 2.54dBi

Antenna Gain: The maximum Gain measured in fully anechoic chamber is 1.7947 in linear scale.

According to 865664D02 2.2 d) 1):

The sum of the ratios of the spatially averaged results to the applicable frequency dependent MPE limits :

2.4G WIFI + BT	0.0009 + 0.0284	0.0293	1.0

Conclusion: $0.0293 < 1.0$, So there is no sar requirement

NOTE:1. EUT RF module is more than 20cm away from the human body.

2.The sum of the ratios(2.4GWIFI + BT) is less than the limit value of 1.0, so there is no sar requirement.
