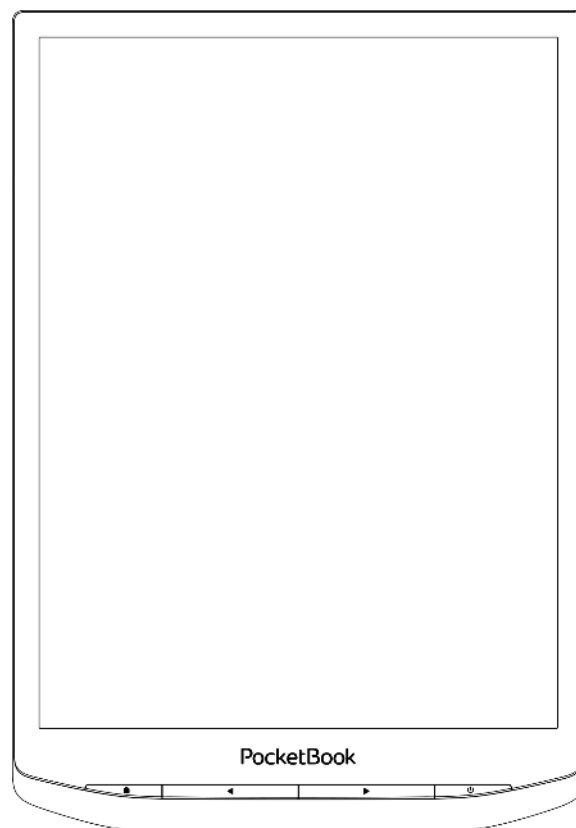

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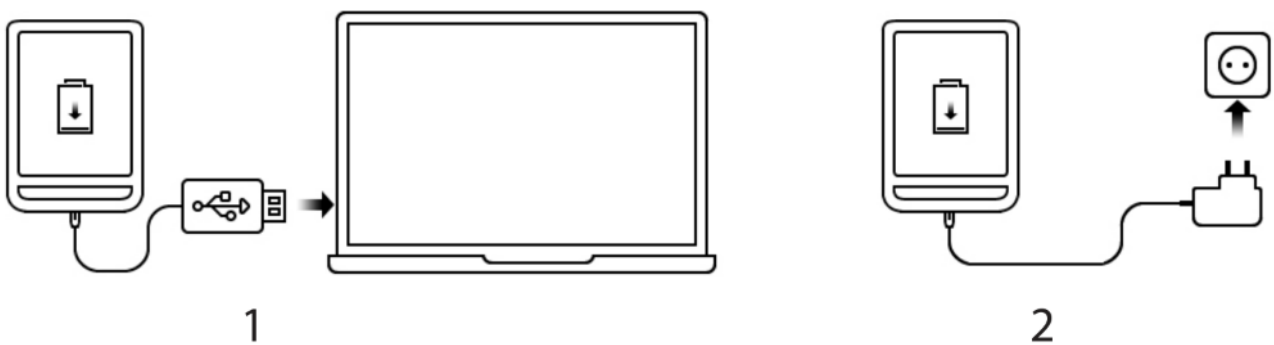
Getting Started

Thank you for purchasing the PocketBook InkPad X Pro! A few operations are required to get started. The schematic diagrams are only for reference, subject to the physical product!

Charging battery

To extend battery lifetime, it's recommended to charge the Device for the first time from 8 to 12 hours.

You can charge the battery from (1) PC using USB-cable or from (2) the power line using a charger (optional).



To charge the battery for the first time, do the following:

Connect the Device to a computer or charger with USB-cable. The device will turn on as soon as charging starts.

When the battery is fully charged, you can disconnect the cable from the Device which is ready for usage.

Safety precautions

Before start working with the Device, please, read this section carefully. Following these instructions will help you ensure your safety and extend service life of the Device.

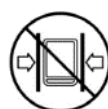
Storage, Carriage and Usage Conditions

Device operating temperature range is 0°C to 40°C, so don't expose the Device to excessively high or low temperatures. Never leave cables near heat sources. Heated cables or their insulation may become deformed or damaged, which could lead to fire or electric shock.

Try to avoid next impacts:



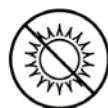

Maintenance

- ✓ Do not leave the Device for a long time in poorly ventilated environment, e.g. in a car or in closed tight boxes/packaging.
- ✓ Neither drop nor try to bend the Device.
- ✓ Do not disassemble or modify the book reader.
- ✓ Do not use the Device with a damaged battery or charger (broken case, poor contact, broken feed cable). If the battery is damaged (cracked case, leakage of electrolyte, off-shape etc.) it should be replaced by the authorized personnel. Usage of home-made or modified batteries may cause an explosion and/or damage the Device.
- ✓ Protect the screen from objects that may scratch or damage it. To ensure adequate protection of the screen, we recommend storing the Device in a protective and/or hard cover.
- ✓ Do not use organic or inorganic solvents (e.g. benzoyl etc.) to clean the screen/case.
- ✓ Keep away from children.
- ✓ Use a soft cloth to remove dust from the Device's surface. Apply a few drops of distilled water to remove dirt.

Up to five faulty pixels are acceptable in the screen and do not constitute a warrantable defect of the screen.

If the device has not been used for a long time, the battery charge indicator may not work when the charger is connected. In this case, connect the charger, let the device charge for 1 hour, then disconnect and reconnect the charging device or USB cable. The device can then be used as normal.

By the end of product guarantee term, please contact the nearest authorized service facility for examination on the subject of security is maintained.

Warning

The screen of the device has a fragile basis! To avoid damage, make sure not to drop, bend, or apply pressure to the device, do not allow point pressure on the screen surface and any other actions that might break or damage the glass base. Also, the screen does not have any special protective layer so please avoid any contact between its surface and objects that might leave marks or scratches on it. To decrease the risk of damaging the device and its screen it is recommended to keep and transport it in a PocketBook protection cover.

RF Safety

The Device receives and transmits radio frequencies and may interfere with radio communications and other electronic equipment. If you use personal medical Devices (e.g. a pacemaker or hearing aid) please contact your doctor or the manufacturer to learn whether or not such medical devices are protected against external RF signals.

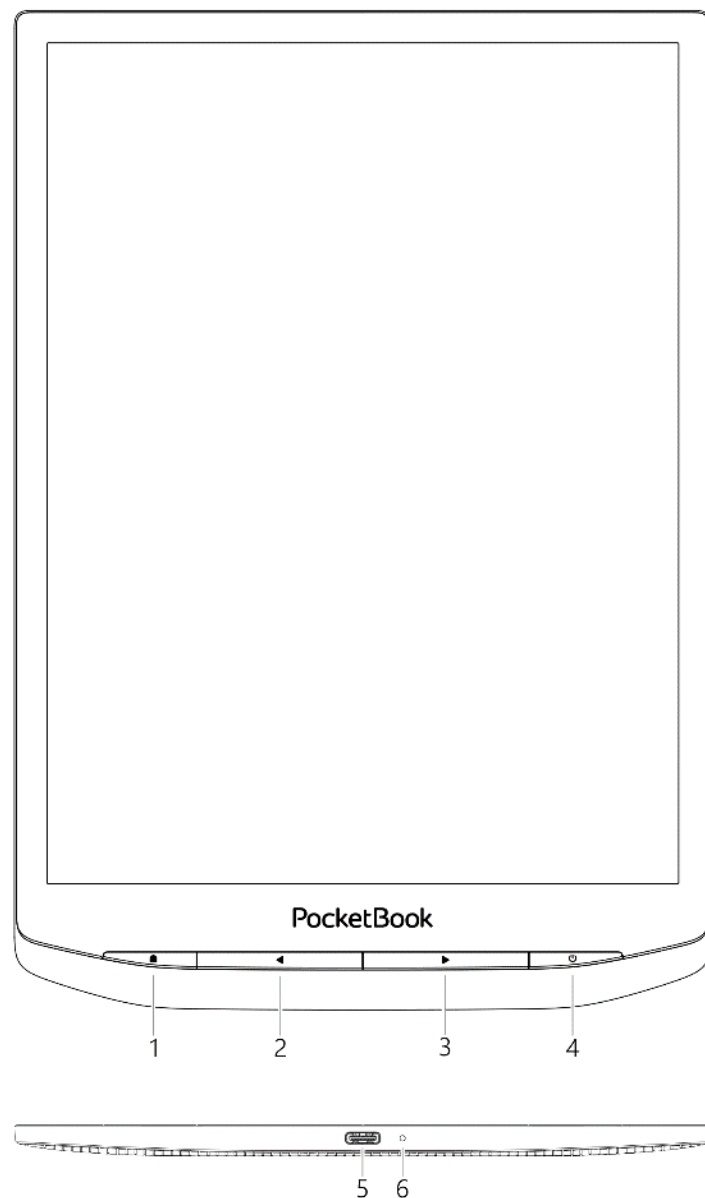

On/Off

Turning ON: Press and hold the On/Off button for 3 seconds to start the device.

Turning OFF: Press and hold the On/Off button for 1 second, wait for the screen to display the Off/Restart dialog box, then select to press the [Off] button to turn off the device.

Restarting: Press and hold the On/Off button for 1 second, wait for the screen to display the Off/Restart dialog box, then select to press the [Restart] button to restart the device.

Sleep/Wake up: Automatic sleep is supported, with the option to set your own sleep time. Press the On/Off button or press and hold the power button of the pen to switch to sleep/wake up.

Note: Press and hold the On/Off button for 5 seconds to force off the power. It can automatically turn on when charging in the off state. Press and hold the On/Off button for 16 seconds to force reset and turn on in abnormal state.

USB data transfer/charging port

Charging/data transfer: The Type-C USB data cable is supported to connect to the computer for charging/file transfer. The user who use a power adapter for charging must purchase a power adapter that has received CCC certification and meets the requirements of the standard.

Please connect the 5V-2A power adapter to an AC outlet for charging through the data cable [recommended].

Charging Tips: During charging, the indicator lights up to indicate that it is charging, and goes out when charged. If the indicator does not light up, it indicates that it is fully charged, otherwise, please check whether the Type-C USB cable is properly inserted.

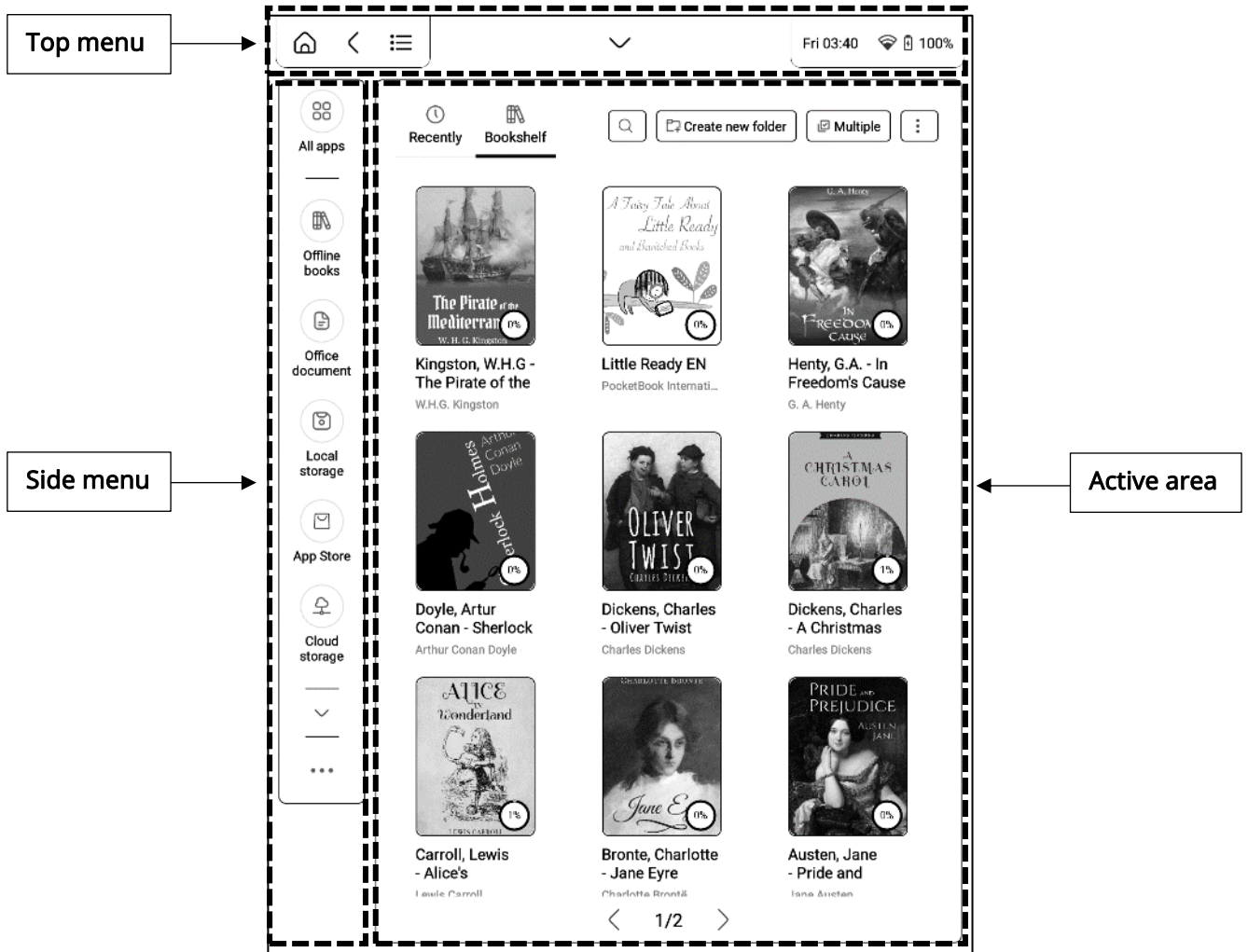
Audio support

Wired Headphones with Type-C port is supported, with built-in dual-channel speakers. Wireless headphones can be connected via Bluetooth 4.2 built-in module.

Exceptions: If no sound can be heard, please tap the status bar and check if the volume is too small or the mute mode is turned on in the [Volume] bar.

Main Menu


Device Main Menu consist of following major groups of elements:





Top Menu



Navigation buttons

Home  **button** – instantly returns you to Main Menu from any part of device Firmware.


Back  **button** – cancelling latest action and return back for one step

Task manager  **button** – allows you to observe and control launched applications.

Main control switch panel

Press  button to show major following switches and sliders:

- **Frontlight brightness slider** – controls screen brightness level

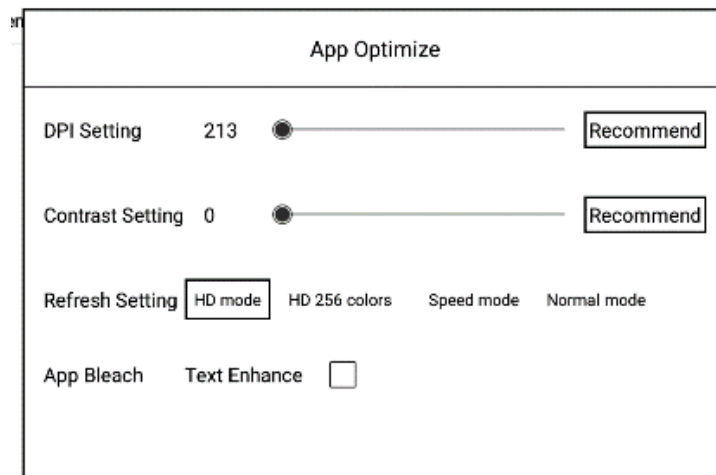


- **Frontlight color temperature slider** – controls screen color temperature



- **Frontlight button** – allows to turn frontlight ON and OFF
- **Sound button** – opens volume control panel
- **Wi-Fi network button** - allows to turn Wi-Fi connection ON and OFF
- **Bluetooth button** - allows to turn Bluetooth connection ON and OFF

- **Screenshots button** – allows to make instant screenshots and save them in device internal memory
- **App optimization** – allows to optimize 3-rd party applications performance. Contains such options as - [DPI Settings] [Contrast Settings] [Refresh Settings] [App Whitening] to optimize the adjustment of various parameters as follows:



App optimization menu appearance

[HD 256] 16-level grayscale algorithm simulates 256-level grayscale effect, displaying delicate, sharp edges.

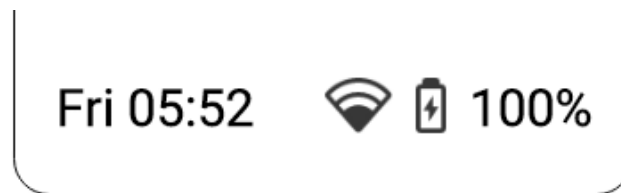
- **Turn OFF** – instantly turns OFF your device
- **Refresh** – allows you to control global E Ink screen refresh mode on your device. It consists of following elements:
 - **HD mode** – provide best image quality but might be slightly slower comparing to other modes.
 - **Normal mode** - provides best balance between image quality and E Ink screen refresh speed
 - **Speed mode** – provides best E Ink screen refresh speed but might lead to worse image quality.
- **Speed up** – instantly closes all applications and process in device firmware background.

- **Settings** – opens device Settings Menu.

Status panel

This element includes following elements:

1. Day/Time
2. Wi-Fi signal strength indicator
3. Battery level

Side Menu

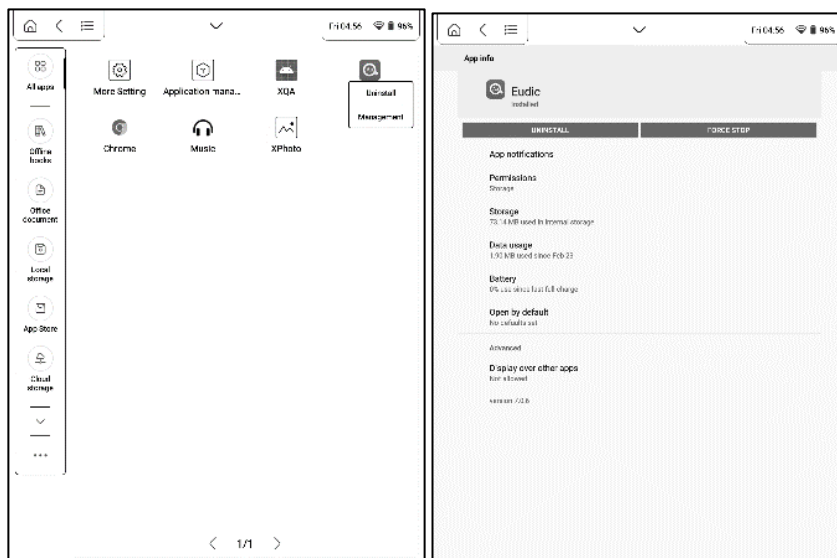
Side bar includes major Applications Menus in device firmware. You can add or remove any application from Side Bar by tapping on icon and selecting/deselecting particular applications from menu. By default, it includes following environments:

All apps

This environment includes all native and 3-rd party applications installed on to your device. Some apps cannot be deleted, such as: web browser, image viewers, music player etc. Third-party apps can be installed and uninstalled freely.

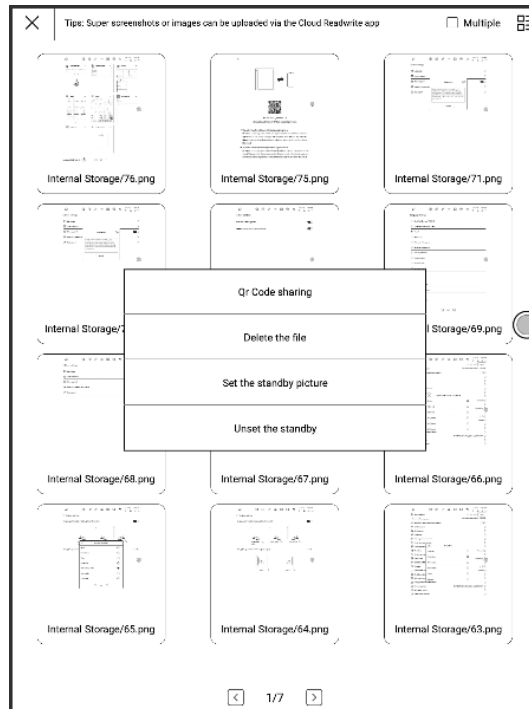
Note: You can use “Long press menu” in this environment to get access to following hidden control elements:

- **Uninstall:** Pre-installed apps can be uninstalled, and built-in apps cannot be uninstalled.
- **Management:** operations such as App Uninstall, Force Stop, App Notification, Permissions, Storage, Traffic Data, Battery, Default On, Advanced Settings, etc. can be performed.



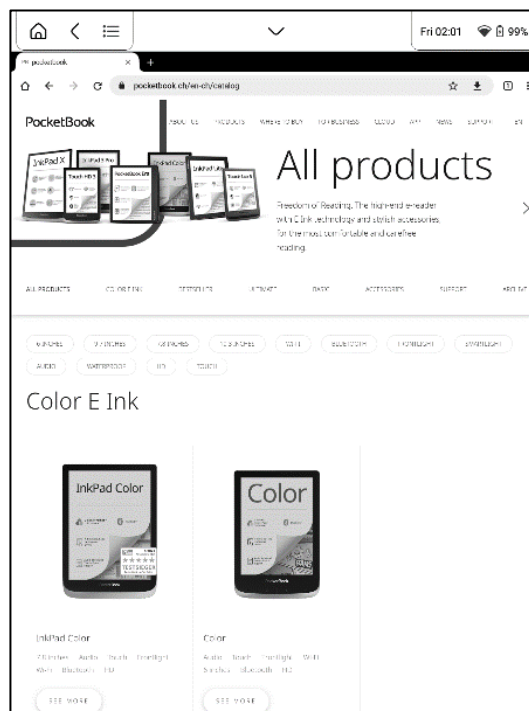
Long tap menu and Management menu appearance

Image browser (XPhoto) – application to view and manage images stored in device memory.

WEB browser – preinstalled browser is used to browse web sites and search for other necessary information in Internet.

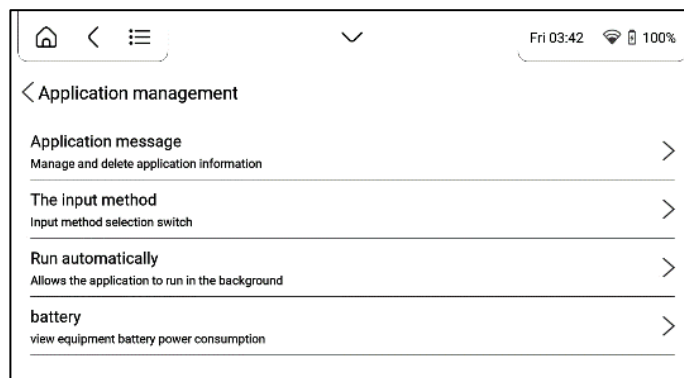


Web Browser appearance

Music – Application for reproducing of audio files in MP3 and WAV formats.

Application management - Allows to manage native and third-party applications. Consist of following elements:

- **Application message** – Manage and delete application information
- **The input method** – Input method selection switch
- **Run automatically** - To manage applications running automatically in the background.
- **Battery** – View device battery consumption

Offline books

This environment helps you to store and manage all of your eBook files loaded in device internal storage. You can search files, create new folders, select multiple files, import, sort and change view. When there are too many books more than one page, tap the page number for quick skips. When there are too many books in the bookshelf, the books can be searched by [Search]. Folders can be used to manage books in the bookshelf.



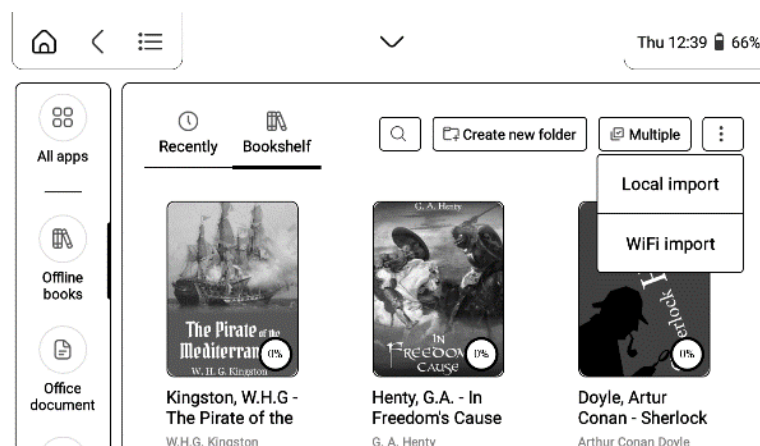
Offline books Menu appearance

Note: You can use “Long press menu” in this environment to get access to following hidden control elements:

- **Move** – move your files between different folders
- **Delete** – removing unnecessary files from device memory
- **Share** – send your files to other applications or share through Bluetooth
- **Open with** – select applications to open your files

Import - you can add books to the bookshelf, including importing local books.

E-books can be added in 2 ways:



Importing Menu appearance

USB transfer: Connect the reader to the computer with the Type-C USB cable, and find the [Books] folder on the computer disk or the /internal storage/root directory to add or delete e-book files in the folder, with formats such as pdf, epub, txt and mobi supported.

Wi-Fi transfer: tap Offline Books -> Import -> Wi-Fi Import, enter relevant address in the browser of PC as prompted, then transfer eBooks from PC to the reader with Wi-Fi.

PS: The reader and PC must be connected to the same Wi-Fi hotspot to add or delete eBook files in the folder, supporting pdf, epub, txt and mobi formats.

Office documents

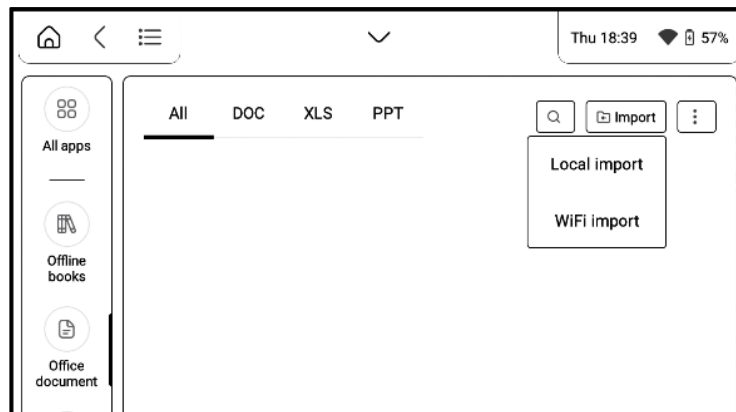
Office documents is a convenient tool for reading documents, allowing to view documents in doc, docx, ppt, pptx, xls, xlsx and other formats. Long press on the document to rename, delete, etc. as well as the use of folders to manage documents.

Importing the Office documents

Documents can be imported in 2 ways:

- **USB import:** Connect your PocketBook reader to your PC using a Type-C USB cable (Mac requires Android transfer tool pre-installed), find the directory / Internal Storage / Office or / Internal Storage /, and copy the document to complete the import.
- **WI-FI transfer:** tap Office documents->Import->WI-FI import, enter the address in the browser of PC as prompted, then transfer eBooks from PC to PocketBook by WI-FI. PS: PocketBook reader and PC are required

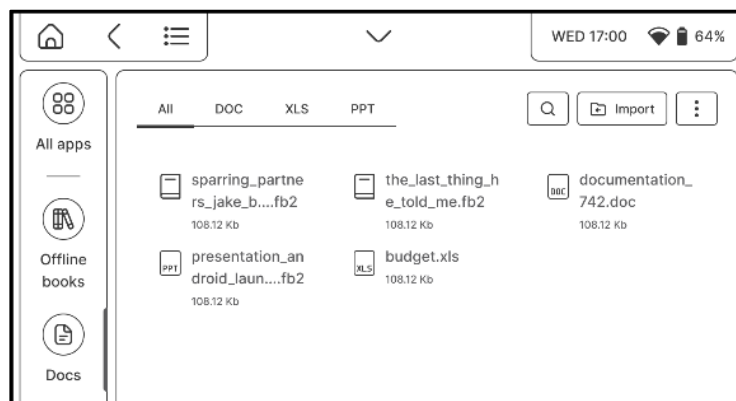
to connect to the same WI-FI hotspot to add or delete Office files in folders, supporting formats such as doc, docx, ppt, pptx, xls, xlsx, etc.

Reading office documents

Tap on the corresponding document in the page of the document list to enter the document details page to view as follows:

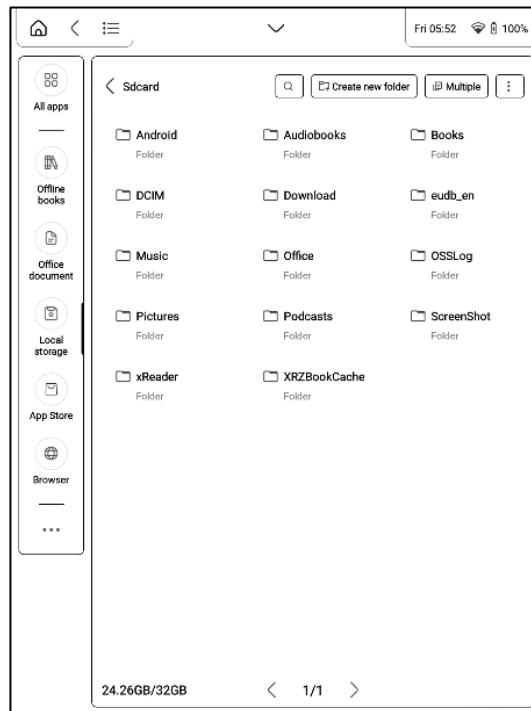

Manage and open any Office documents which you loaded or imported before in this Menu.

Local storage

This environment allows you to browse and manage all files loaded on to your device internal memory. You can search files, create new folders, select multiple files, import and change view.



Note: You can use “**Long press menu**” in this environment to get access to following hidden control elements:

- **Copy** – copy your files and folders
- **Crop** – cut your files and folders
- **Rename** –rename your files and folders
- **Delete** – delete files and folders

Reading eBooks

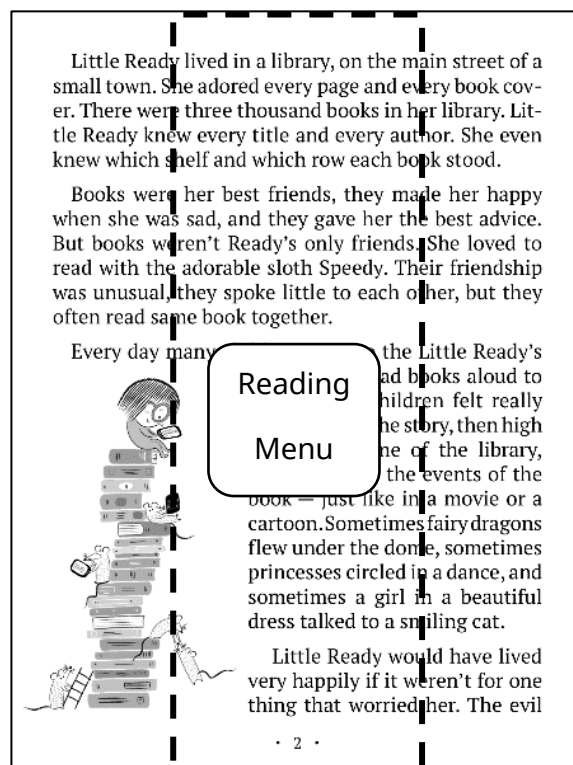
It is possible to read eBooks in following formats: TXT, EPUB, PDF, MOBI, FB2, ZIP, PRC, RTF, HTML, HTM, DOC, DOCX, AZW, AZW3. Just load or import your desired eBook files and open any of it by tapping on the book cover from **Offline books** menu.

Navigation and page turning

For eBook page turning you can use any of following methods:

1. **Swipe Left/Right** gestures with your fingers
2. **Tap Left/Right** part of the screen (this function can be disabled in Top Panel)
3. **Forward button** or **Backward button** located below the device screen

For calling onscreen **Reading Menu** you need to tap on central zone of the device screen as it shown on below image.

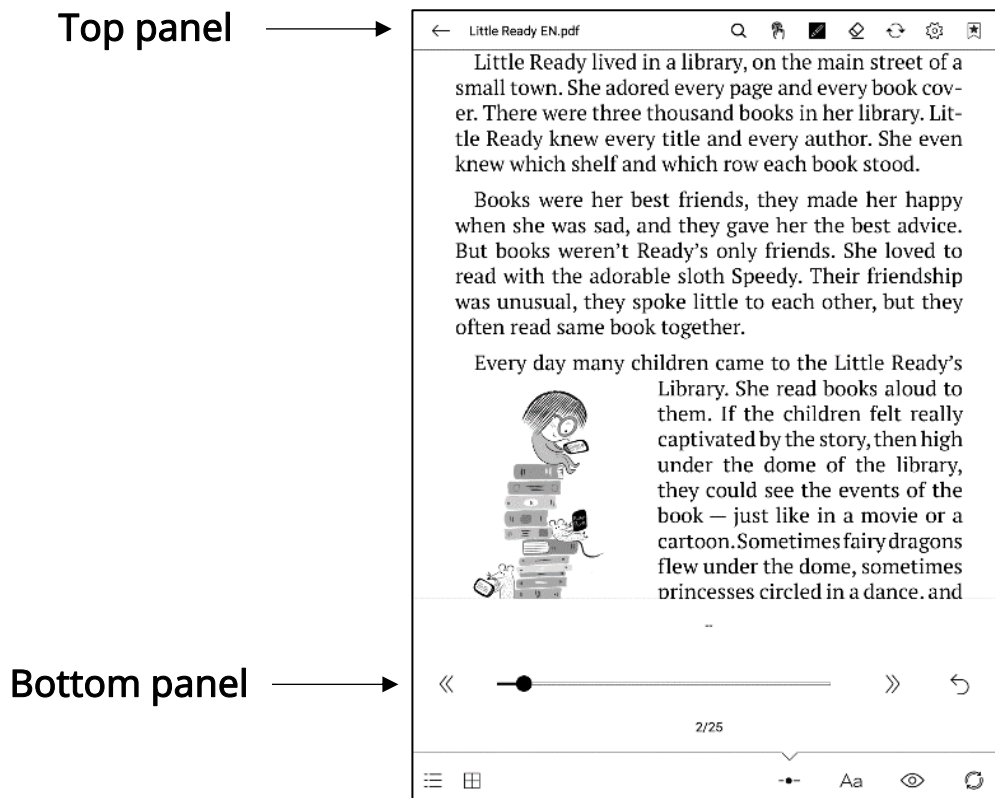


Reading Menu tap zone appearance

Device screen also supports **Pinch to Zoom In / Out** and **Long Tap** gestures.






Reading Menu

Reading Menu contains all necessary setting and navigation elements required for your comfort reading experience. There are Top and Bottom Panels of Reading Menu



Top and Bottom panels in Reading Menu

Top Panel consist of following icons and elements:

-  **Search/Find.** Tap on the upper right corner to find the corresponding keywords in the book.
-  **Disabling/Enabling** page turning by tap gesture.
-  **Line thickness.** Adjust thickness of the lines drawn with your Stylus.
-  **Eraser.** Allows to erase drawn lines. Please note that you can also use erase your written notes with your Stylus opposite side.
-  **Refresh.** Allows to refresh screen and remove possible residuals or ghosting effects left after your interaction with device.

⚙️ **Settings.** Here you can set following reading settings:

- *Long press menu* – allow to choose between launching Dictionary application or Long Press Menu when you're tap and hold on any word in eBook.
- *Dictionary settings* – choose which Dictionary should be used during reading.
- *Two finger zoom* – Enabling or disabling Pinch to Zoom In/Out gestures.

🔖 **Add/Remove bookmarks.** Allows to create or remove bookmarks on certain pages.

Bottom Panel consist of following icons and elements:

Paging slider. Allows you to quickly move to certain page of the book






⏪ ⏩ **Chapter switches.** Allows you to instantly navigate between chapters.

↶ **Return.** Returning you to previous page even if you used paging slider or chapter switches.

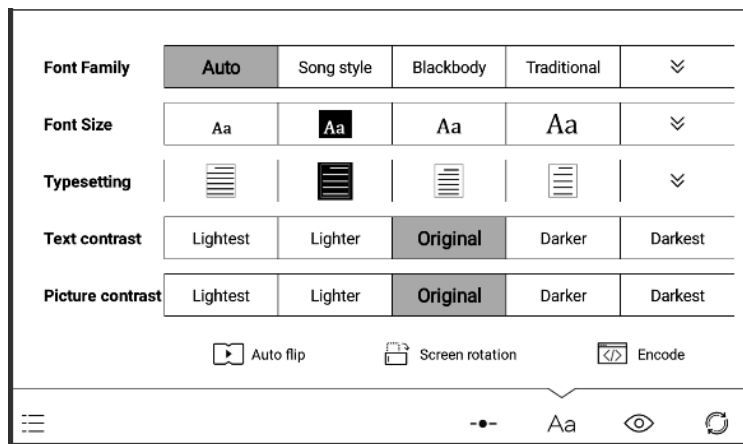
🎧 **Text-to-Speech.** Enabling Text-to-Speech function (not supported in PDF format).

☰ **Content.** Reveals content of the eBook as well as Bookmarks, Highlights&Notes and Handwritten notes. You can also Copy and Delete created Notes in part of the Menu.

📄 **PDF preview.** Allows to open preview screen for eBooks in PDF format. You can change preview pages layout by taping on several icons ,  and 

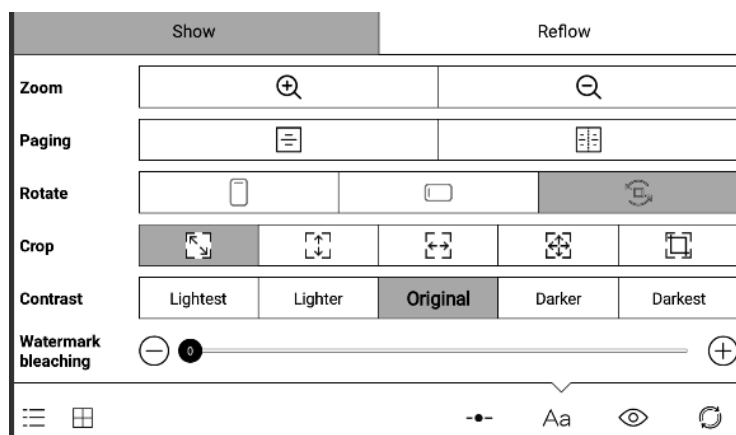
Aa eBook settings. In this menu you can choose settings for opened eBook file. Amount of settings and their type is different for different eBook formats:

- For AZW, AZW3, DOC, DOCX, EPUB, FB2, FB2.ZIP, HTM, HTML, MOBI, PRC, RTF, TXT formats you can choose **Font Family, Font Size, Type Settings, Text Contrast, Picture Contrast, Auto Flip, Screen Rotation and Encoding.**






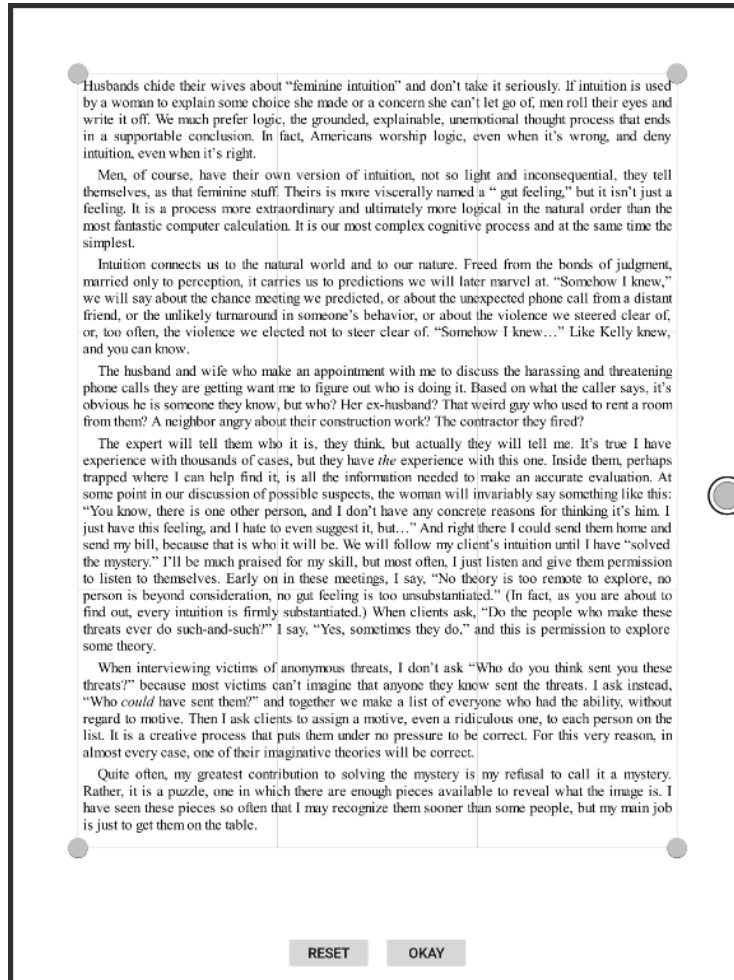

eBook Settings menu for PDF format

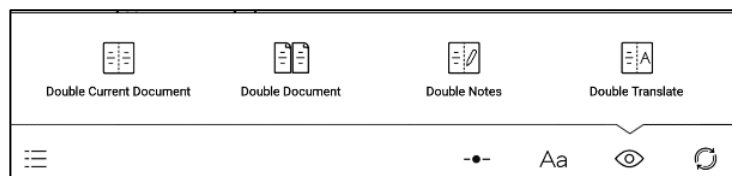

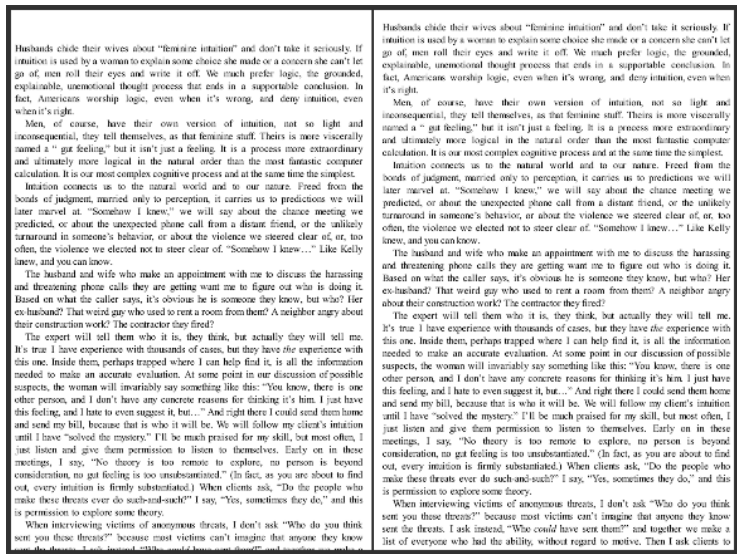

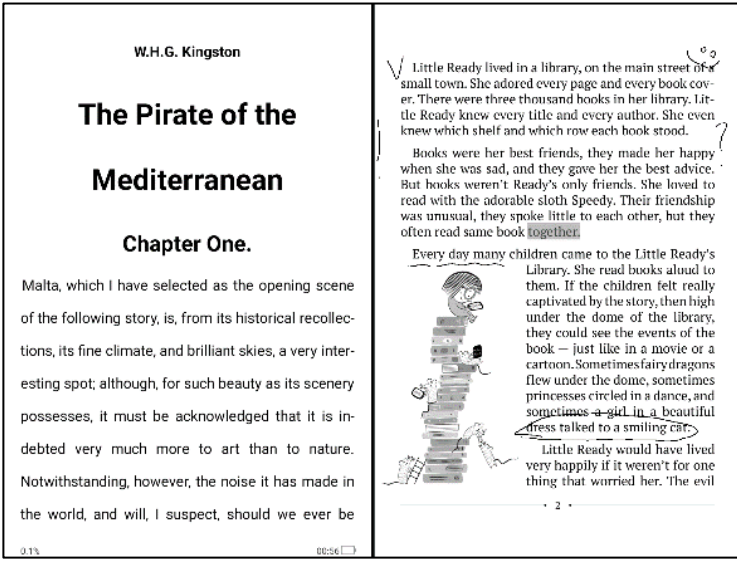

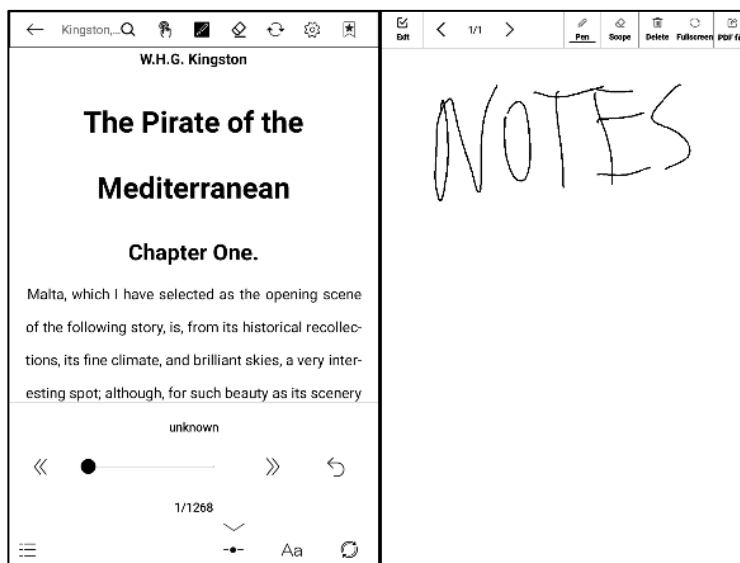




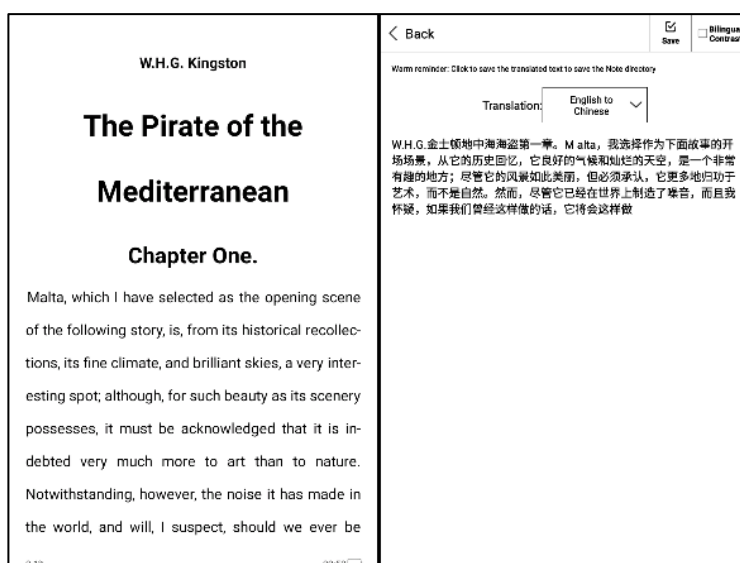

Double Notes visualization appearance

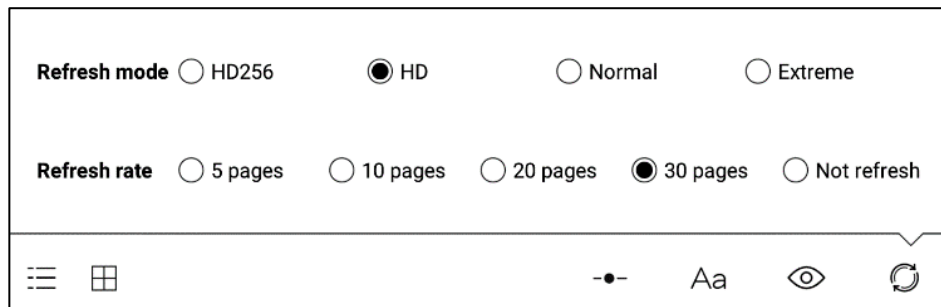

To Exit any of **Split Screen** mode - tap on the middle area of the reading page of the PDF e-book and tap on the ← icon that pops up at the top to exit.

Screen Refresh. Allows you to choose Screen Refresh Modes and Screen Refresh Rates

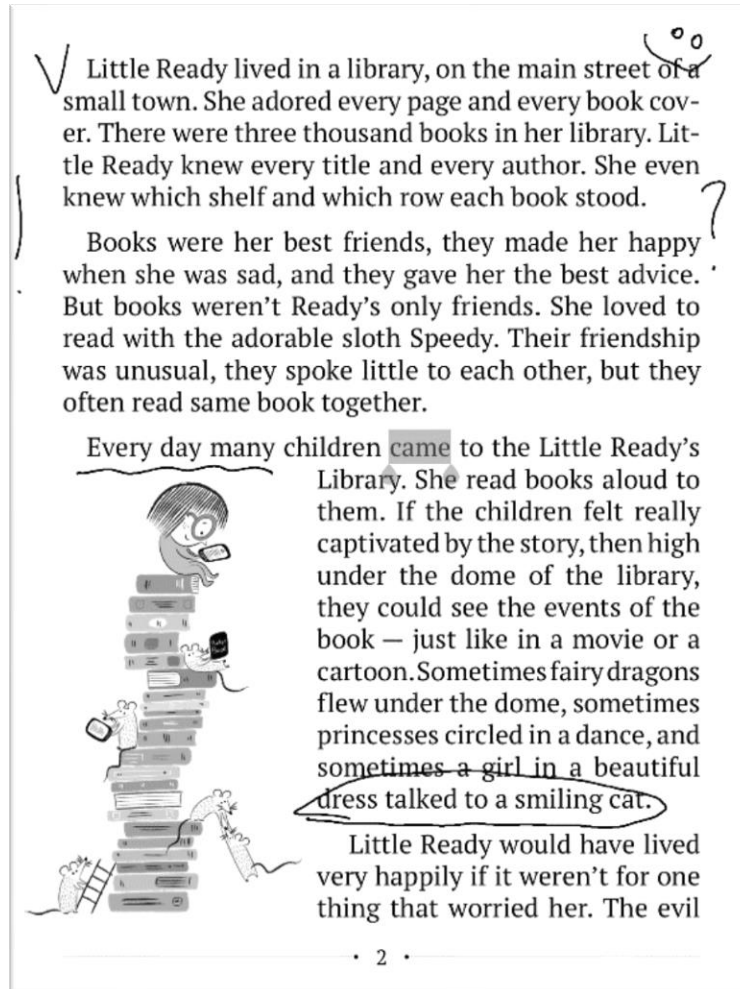


Screen Refresh menu appearance

- **HD256, HD, Normal** and **Extreme** Refresh Modes provides different combinations of E Ink image quality and speed. The better image quality you choose the slower E Ink screen response will be. For best quality choose **HD256** mode and for highest speed **Extreme** mode.
- **5, 10, 20, 30** and **Not Refresh** are frequencies which you can choose for Full Screen refresh. Please note that E Ink screens could have some slight residuals and ghosting while using for eBook reading. This is normal phenomena. In order to have clean screen we are suggesting to make Full Screen refresh at least each 10-20 pages.

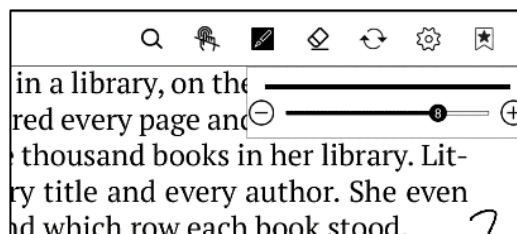
Handwritten notes

You can make your handwritten notes by drawing them directly in eBook with Wacom Stylus supplied with your device.



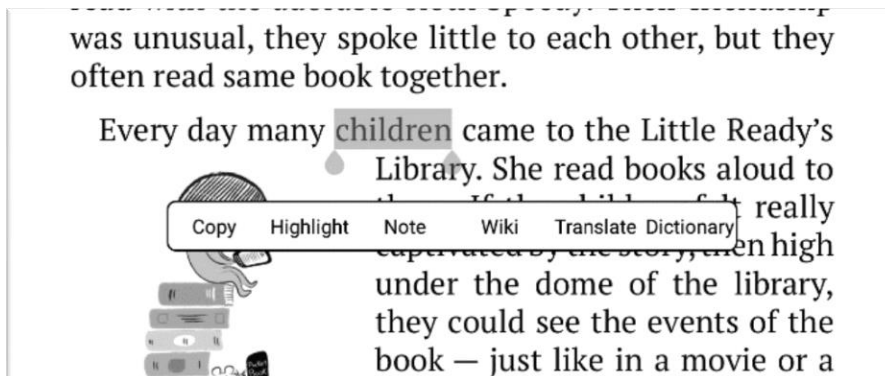
Example of handwritten notes

Long tap menu

Tap and hold your finger on any word or phrase while reading eBooks to call for long tap menu.

Tap [**Copy**] to copy the word or phrase.

Tap [**Highlight**] to highlight any selected word or phrase

Tap [**Note**] to type your notes with virtual keyboard

Tap [**Wikipedia**] to call Wikipedia page related to selected word.

Tap [**Translate**] to translate any selected word with built-in Dictionary.

Tap [**Dictionary**] to translate any selected word with built-in Eudic Dictionary.

Settings

Under Settings, a number of operations are available such as Wi-Fi network, Bluetooth, Display, Security, System, About device, etc., as follows:



Settings Menu appearance

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi network: tap [Wi-Fi Network] to enter the WI-FI setting page, turn on [Wi-Fi Connection Switch] to search for Wi-Fi signals nearby, tap [Wi-Fi List] to display the password verification box. Enter the password with the keyboard and tap the [Connect] button to verify the password, then you can connect to Wi-Fi after the password is verified successfully, which can be automatically

connected next time. Tap the [Ignore This Network] button to ignore this network, which will not be automatically reconnected next time.

Bluetooth

Tap the [Bluetooth Settings] to enter the Bluetooth settings page, turn on the [Bluetooth connection switch] to search the Bluetooth signal nearby can be connected, such as Bluetooth speakers / headphones. Tap search to display

Display

Under Display settings, a number of operations can be performed such as System Font Size, Sleep Time, Hoverball, Device Rotation, Display Management, Cancel Custom Screensaver, etc.

[System Font Size]: Small, Standard, Medium and Large are supported, and the Standard font size is used by default.

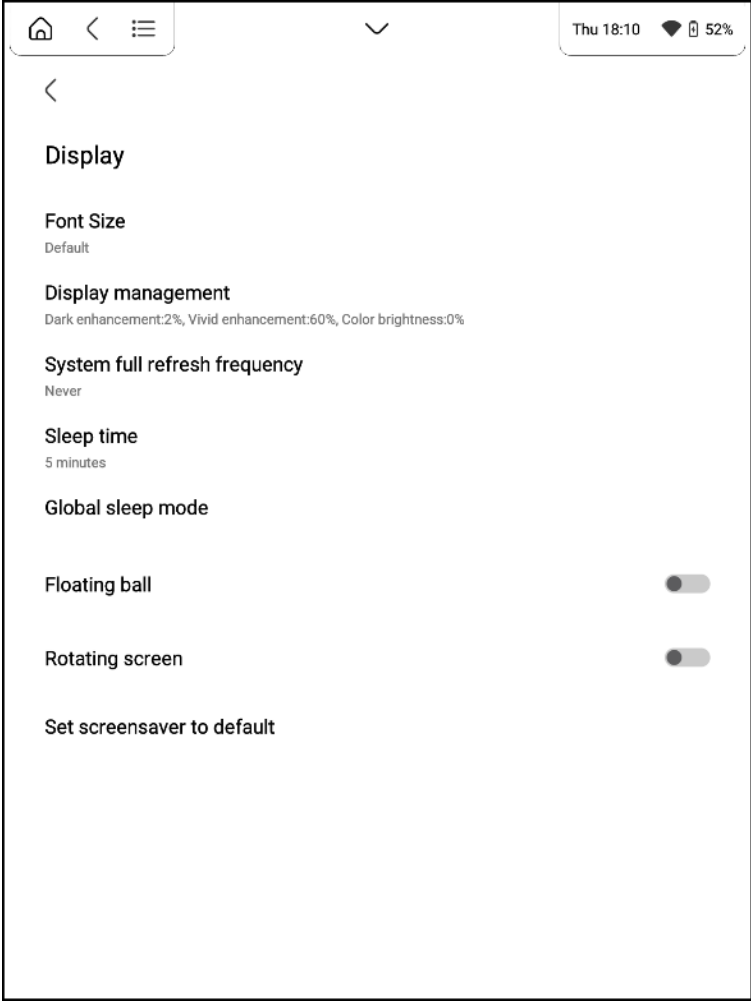
[Sleep Time]: the option to select the time for the device to enter the sleep state under no operation, with a default time of 5 minutes

[Floating ball]: The Floating ball can be used to enter shortcuts such as home, exit, multi-task management, global refresh, screenshot, settings, reboot or shutdown, which is convenient and simple. The Floating ball is on by default, but can be turned off manually.

[Device Rotation]: The reader provides support for gravity sensing, which turns off by default. Tap [on] to turn on the auto-rotation, and Tap [off] to turn off.

[Display Management]: The reader supports dark enhancement, brightness enhancement, color enhancement, and custom adjustment to fit different scenes.

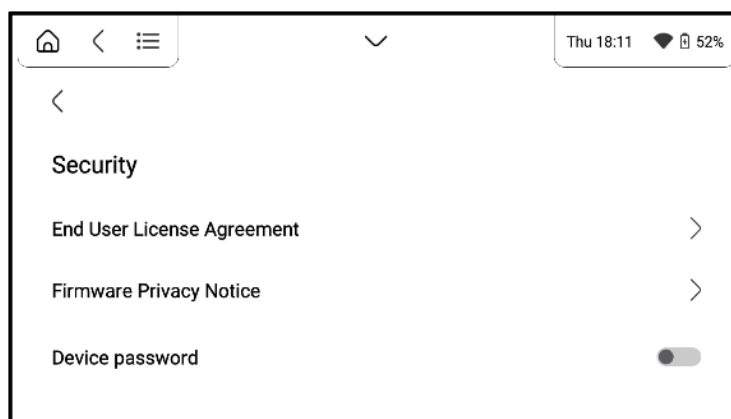
[Set screensaver to default]: When the screensaver interface is set manually, the custom screensaver can be canceled by this function.

Security

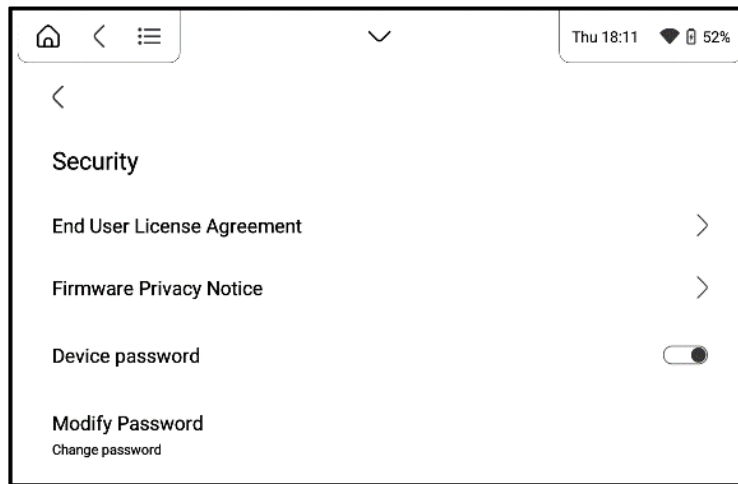
Device Password: You can tap the [Device Password] to turn on or off the device password.



Security menu appearance

Turn ON the device password: turning ON the device password helps to protect your privacy, and the password needs to be verified when locking the screen, or turning OFF the password. When tapping [Device Password Switch] for the first time, enter the four-digit password you set in the password setting screen, and then repeat it once for secondary verification, and the device password is successfully turned ON when the password is entered the same twice.

Turn OFF the device password: turning OFF the password is supported after the password is turned ON. Tap [Device Password Switch] to enter the password verification page. The password will be turned off successfully after entering the password and being verified.

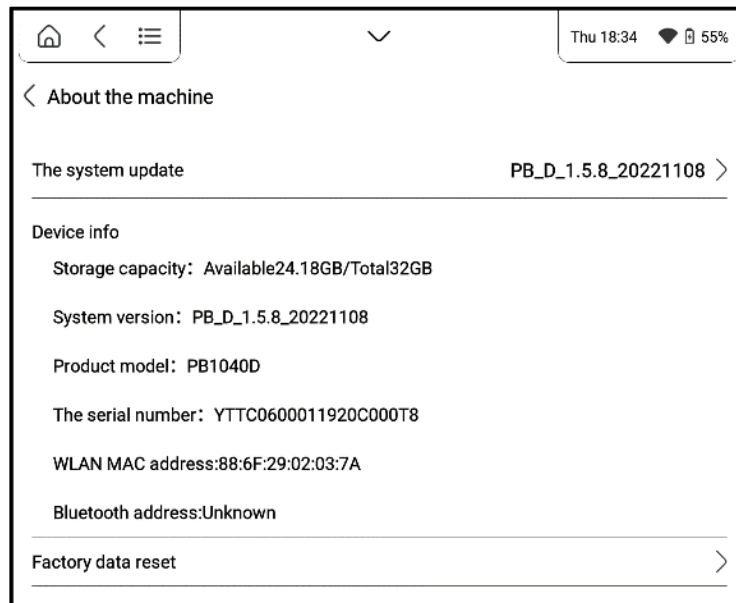
System

Language: Choose any Interface language from pre-installed list.

Date and time: You can select whether to set the date and time in 24-hour format, set automatic or manual setting of the date and time, and set the device time zone to the time in the local time zone when overseas under the Date and Time setting mode.

About device

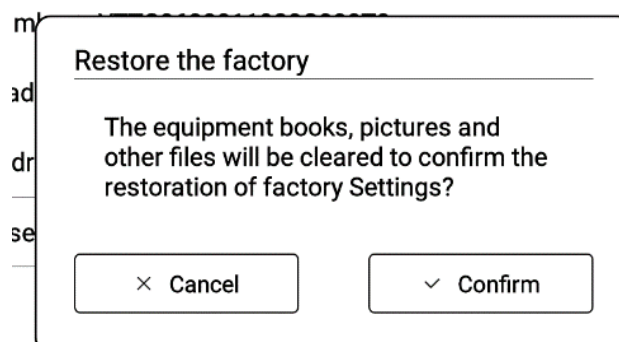
System update: When checking for updates, your device needs to be connected to WI-FI, with sufficient storage capacity and over 30% power once there is an update prompt to update the system.



About device menu appearance

About device: check the basic information of the device such as storage capacity, system version number, product model, device serial number etc.

Factory reset: Factory reset will clear all data on the reader, including account, system and application data. Factory reset is an irreversible and destructive operation, so please be careful.

Certification information (SAR)

The device meets guidelines for exposure to radio waves. Your device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure guidelines for devices employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate or SAR. The SAR limit stated in the ICNIRP guidelines is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over 10 grams of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency

bands. The actual SAR level of an operating device is lower than maximum value (2.0 W/kg) because the device is designed to use only the power required to reach the network.
