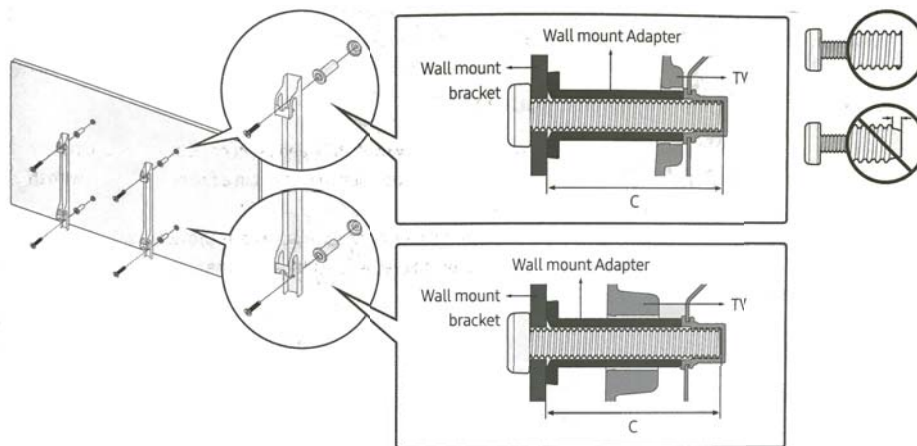
Connecting the Stand

Install Steps



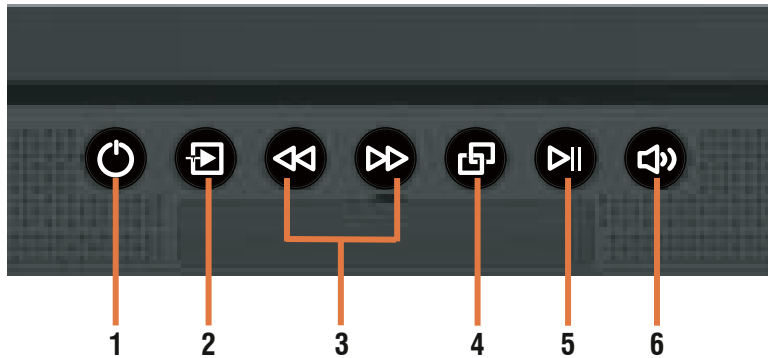
1. Assemble the wall mount adapter.
2. Install the wall mount adapter on a wall with screws.
3. Install the wall mount brackets onto rear cabinet with the VESA screws.
4. Buckle the brackets with TV into the wall mount adapter.

Front Panel

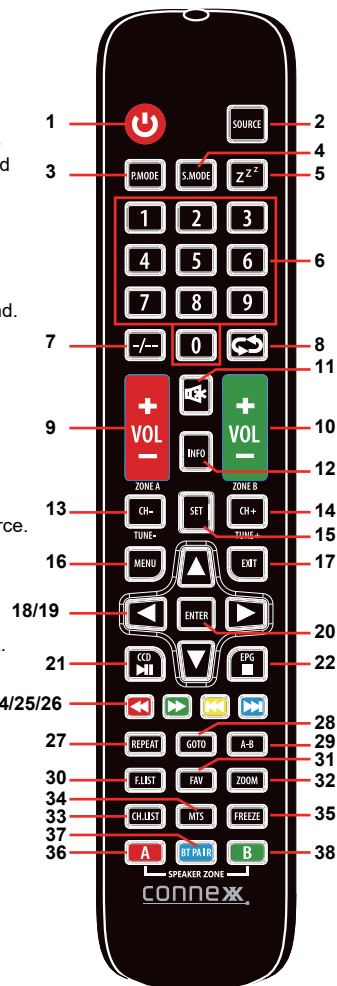


1. Power button: Press to Turn ON/OFF the TV.
2. Source button: Press repeatedly to select desired audio and/or video source.
3. Arrow buttons: Press to seek up and down radio stations and TV channels.
Also use with Virtual Sound button (6) for function selection.
4. Pair button: In Bluetooth Source, press to connect a Bluetooth compatible audio device.
5. Play button: In Bluetooth, Media and FM Source, press for play/pause selection.
6. Virtual Sound button:
 - Press to toggle through Zone A: ON/OFF - Zone A Volume - Zone B: ON/OFF - Zone B Volume.
 - Use the Arrow buttons (3) to select Zone ON/OFF and Volume levels

Trouble Shooting

Problem	Solution/Issue
TV does not operate	<p>Make sure the power cord is plugged in. Try another AC outlet. Power is off, check fuse or circuit breaker. Unplug unit for an hour, then plug it back in.</p>
Normal picture, but no sound	<p>Check the volume settings. Sound muted? Press MUTE button. Try another TV channel. Check audio cable connections.</p>
The remote control does not work	<p>Make sure the remote control is in range with no obstructions. Check the batteries.</p>
Poor sound or no sound	<p>Station or Cable TV experiencing problems, tune to another TV channel. Check sound adjustments (Volume or Mute). Check for sources of possible interference.</p>
Poor picture or no picture	<p>Station or Cable TV experiencing problems, tune to another TV channel. Make sure channels are set into memory. Perform Auto Scan, see channel menu. Check antenna or Cable TV connections, adjust antenna. Check for sources of possible interference. Check picture control adjustments.</p>
Poor TV reception	<p>Ensure the antenna amplifier is turned on for Antenna TV. Adjust the antenna position to a stronger signal receiving angle. Check the Antenna connection is tight to the TV. Check there is power supplied to the Antenna distribution box. Confirm your incoming cable is connected to the correct cable / antenna wall connection inside the RV. Ensure the internal RV coax jump cable is connected to the correct port.</p>
Poor Cable / Satellite TV Reception	<p>Ensure antenna amp is turned off for cable signal. Check incoming Cable is connected correctly to RV. Ensure cable splitter box has power. Confirm the incoming cable is connected to the correct cable / Satellite wall connection inside your RV. Ensure the internal RV coax jump cable is connected to the correct port. Check Dish has no obstruction.</p>
TV shuts off	<p>Sleep Timer is set. Power interrupted.</p>
