




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Test plot of Maximum Peak Conducted Output Power:

Bluetooth Communication mode (GFSK, 2402MHz)






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
Bluetooth Communication mode (GFSK, 2441MHz)





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
Bluetooth Communication mode (GFSK, 2480MHz)





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
Bluetooth Communication mode (π/4 DQPSK, 2402MHz)




Fig. A [Pulse duration of Lowest Channel]





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
Fig. B [Pulse duration of Middle Channel]





[Pulse duration of Lowest Channel]





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
Fig. E [Pulse duration of Middle Channel]





[Pulse duration of Lowest Channel]





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
Fig. H [Pulse duration of Middle Channel]

Requirements:

Frequency hopping system in the 2400-2483.5MHz band shall use at least 79 (Channel 1 to 79) non-overlapping channels.

The EUT operates in according with the Bluetooth system specification within the 2400 - 2483.5 MHz frequency band

RF channels for Bluetooth systems are spaced 1 MHz and are ordered in channel number k. In order to comply with out-of-band regulations, a lower frequency guard band of 2.0 MHz and a higher frequency guard band of 3.5MHz is used.

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

Measurement of Radiated Emission Test Set Up (9kHz - 30MHz)






