# **1.2 CHARGING THE BATTERY**


Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Connecting the charger incorrectly may cause serious damage to the device.

Any damage caused by improper use is not covered by the warranty.


- 2. The full battery icon is displayed when charging is complete, if the device is turned off.
- 3. Warning: Use only original batteries and chargers. Unapproved chargers or cables may cause batteries to explode or damage the device.

# **HOW TO INSTALL SIM AND MEMORY CARDS:**




- Inserte la una de su dedo

### **TURNING THE DEVICE ON AND OFF**

To turn on the device, press and hold the power button (red button).

To turn off the device, press and hold the power button and select "turn off."

# SMS:

Click on the SMS Key to access the messaging menu, where you can read, create, and send messages.

# **CAMERA:**

Click the central navigation key to activate the camera or press the camera key directly.

In the camera options, you can choose and change settings for taking photos or saving images.

### **FACTORY RESET:**

Go to Settings - Phone menu and select "Restore factory settings." Enter the code "1234."

Note: The RM25 must be charged with the main adapter included in the box to avoid any risk of fire or accidents. Using a different type of charger will void the warranty provided for the device.

#### **SAFETY**

Read the following guidelines:

- Use batteries, chargers, accessories, and supplies approved by the manufacturer to avoid the risk of injury, fire, or explosion.
- For plug-in equipment, the power outlet should be installed near the equipment and must be easily accessible.
- There is a risk of explosion if the battery is replaced with an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to these instructions.
- Do not expose the device to impacts or physical damage.
- Avoid allowing the charging connector and battery terminals to come into contact with conductive elements such as metals and liquids.

### **PHONE**

To use the calling features, tap Phone in the applications list.

# **♦** Making Calls

To make calls, you can use any of the three methods:

- Enter numbers using the numeric keypad; the numbers will be displayed on the screen.
- Make a call from the call log.

Make a call from contacts.

# **♦** Answering a Call

To answer a call, press the green key in the upper left corner of the numeric keypad.

# Rejecting or Ending a Call

To reject a call, press the key with the phone icon inside a circle in the upper right corner of the numeric keypad.

### **♦** Call Center

To change call settings, access the menu, go to Call Center, and press the central key to display options.

# 1. Call Logs

You can view: Missed calls, outgoing calls, incoming calls, all calls, and delete logs.

# 2. Call Settings

You can configure the following call settings: redial, call time alert, reject by SMS, connection alert, and response mode.

# **3.2 CONTACTS**

Select Contacts from the applications list to access your contacts.

**All:** Displays all your saved contacts in the device memory and SIM cards.

**Favorites:** Displays the contacts you have marked as favorites or those you have messaged or called.

### **◆** Add New Contact

- 1. Enter the contact number.
- 2. Click
- 3. Enter the contact name.
- 4. Click ✓.
- ◆ Editing a Contact
- 1. To edit a contact, select and click on the contact you wish to change.
- 2. Click the edit icon in the bottom right corner.
- 3. Change the necessary fields.
- 4. Click Save.

# **♦** Importing/Exporting Contacts

# 1. Import from SIM Card

To copy contacts from the SIM card, click the option button in the upper left corner, then select **Settings > Import > COPY CONTACTS FROM the SIM card or phone**.

# 2. Import from Memory Card

To import contact files (in .vcf format) from a memory card to your device, tap the option button in the upper left corner, then select Import > COPY CONTACTS FROM the MEMORY card or phone contacts.

### 3. Export to Memory Card

To export contacts from your device to a memory card, tap the option button in the upper left corner, then select Export > Export contacts > select Export to .vcf file > select MEMORY card > then click SAVE to export to the MEMORY card.

# Searching for Contacts

1. Click on the contacts list screen, enter the desired information, and your device will display the results.

#### 3.3 MESSAGING

Learn how to create and send a text or multimedia message, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.

# **♦** Viewing Messages

- 1. Click on Messages from the applications list.
- 2. Click on the message to view detailed information.

# Creating and Sending an SMS

- 1. Click on Start Chat and enter NEW MESSAGE.
- 2. In the Enter name or number field, manually input the recipient's mobile phone numbers.

  If entering more than one number, separate them with a comma.
- 3. In the Text message field, enter the message text.
- 4. Click on the send message icon to send the message.

### **◆** Default SMS

There is a list of default messages available as SMS templates; the messages are:

Call me now, how about we have lunch, I'll be back, I'm busy now, I'm sorry, thank you.

### 3.4 FILE MANAGER / CALENDAR

In the File Manager function, you can store and find files received from other users.

With the Calendar function, you can view the calendar by day, week, or month, create events, and set an alarm as a reminder if needed. To access the calendar, tap Calendar from the applications list.

1. To create an event, tap the option button in the bottom right corner and select **New Event.** 

Fill in the fields and set the category, date, time, and alarm. After finishing, select Save.

- 2. You can view the calendar in different views: Day, Week, Month, and All.
- 3. To delete an event, tap the event to open it, tap the option button in the upper right corner, then select Delete to remove the event.

#### 3.5 CALCULATOR

With this function, you can use the device as a calculator. The calculator provides basic arithmetic functions. Tap the numeric and calculation keys to perform a calculation.

# 3.6 FM RADIO

You can use the FM Radio by entering the menu and selecting the FM Radio icon.

To start listening to the FM Radio, it is necessary to connect the headphones, as they act as an antenna. Press the play button to begin tuning into available stations.

# 3.7 MULTIMEDIA

**IMAGE VIEWER:** This is the first function in the multimedia menu, allowing access to images taken with the phone's main camera.

**Audio Player:** Allows you to play MP3s stored in the phone's memory or in the inserted expandable memory.

**Video Recording:** This is the third function in the multimedia menu. Before attempting to record a video, an expandable memory must be inserted.

**Video Player:** From this function, you can play videos that have been recorded and stored.

**Voice Recorder:** From this function, you can activate the voice and sound recorder.

# 4. Safety Precautions

Read these simple instructions before using your device. Failure to follow them may be dangerous.

#### Vehicles

Never use your mobile device while driving. Place it in a safe location. Keep your device within reach, allowing access without taking your eyes off the road.

### **◆** Electronic Devices

# **♦** Potentially Explosive Environments

Upon receiving this notification with sound, you will be able to access the message sent in the alert. Make sure to have this function activated on your device. To do this, follow these steps:

- Go to the settings menu
- Select to enable "Alerts" / Click
- Option to turn off and on (select ON by pressing the OK key)

### 1. IMEI Number Information

The IMEI number of the device is a 15-digit number that identifies it.

To find the IMEI number of the device, tap 'Phone' in the applications list and dial the code \*#06#. The IMEI will automatically display on the screen.
