

## **HOW TO INSTALL PARTY LIGHT**

- (a) Before installing into the desired location fully uncoil the party light and connect it to the supplied adapter to ensure that it is operating correctly
- (b) Inspect your new party light to ensure there are no cuts in the insulation or exposed wires.
- (c) Ensure the partylight and the cable between the adapter and the party light does not present a tripping hazard when installed
- (d) Use cable ties or others to secure the party light in position. Never use nails or other sharp fasteners inserted through the party light orleadercable to secure in position.
- (e) The party light and cable should not be passed over any sharp objects that could wear through the insulation.
- (f) Once the party light is installed into position, plug the leader cable into the adapter.
- (g) Ensure the wired end cap is connected with the female connector of last set.
- (h) After ensuring power point is in OFF position, plug the adapter into the power point and turn on.
