### 3.2 Channel List

The Transmitter was operated in the normal operating mode. The TX frequency was fixed which was for the purpose of the measurements.

Test of channel included the lowest and middle and highest frequency to perform the test, then record on this report.

Those data rates (802.11b: 1 Mbps; 802.11g: 6 Mbps; 802.11n (HT20): MCS0;) were used for all test.

### 5.4 Measurement Procedure

1. The EUT was placed on a table, which is 0.8m above ground plane.
2. Maximum procedure was performed on the six highest emissions to ensure EUT compliance.
3. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured was complete.

### 5.6 Measurement Description

The maximised peak emissions from the EUT was scanned and measured for both the Live and Neutral Lines. Quasi-peak & average measurements were performed if peak emissions were within 6dB of the average limit line.

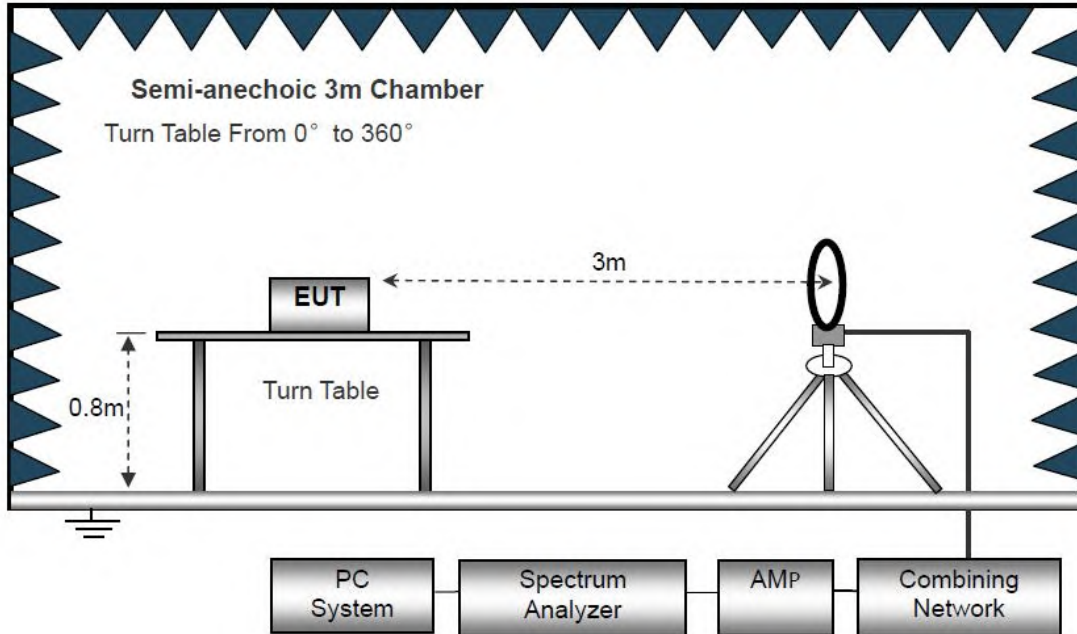

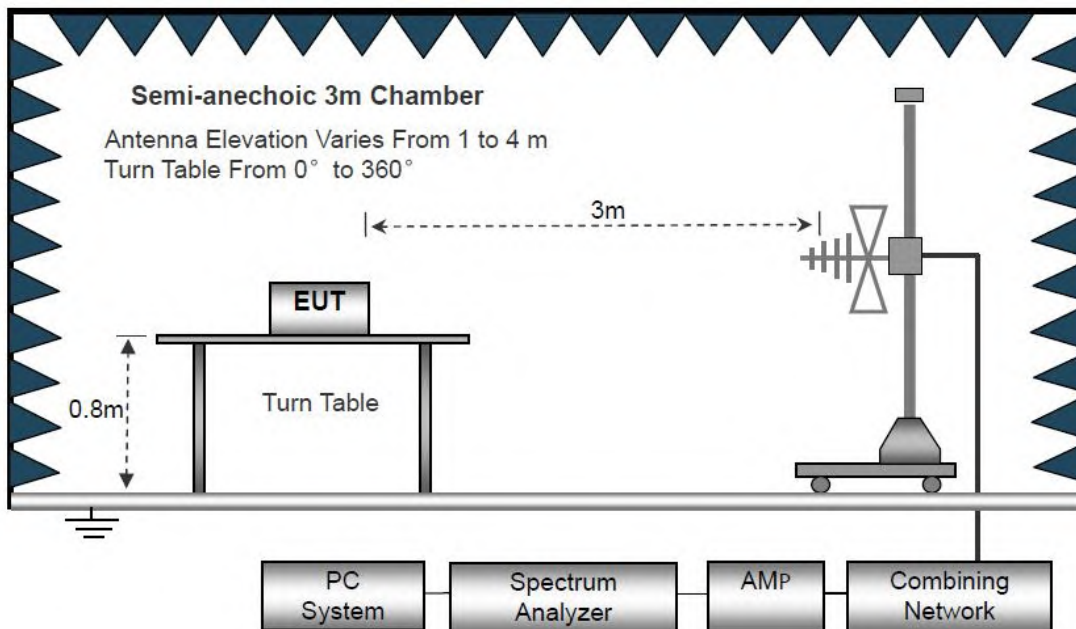

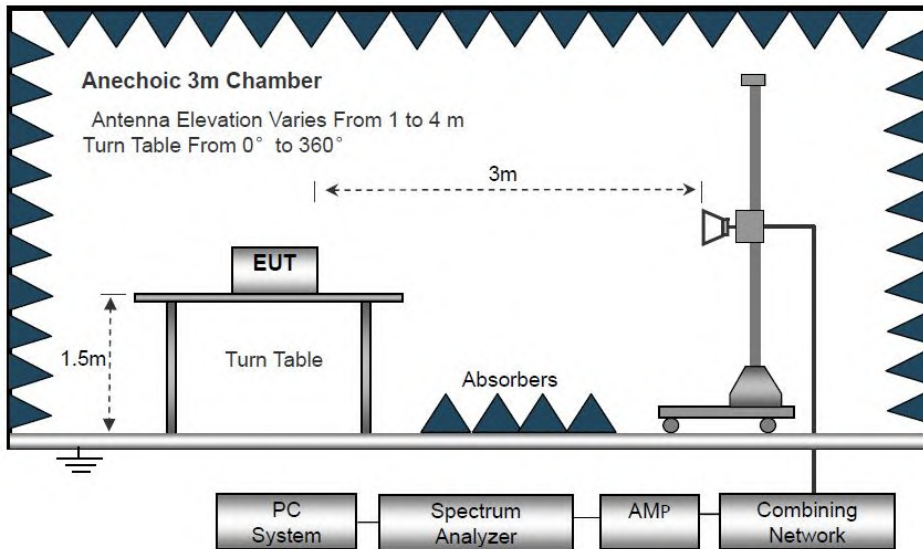
The test setup for emission measurement below 30MHz

## 6.4 Test Procedure

1. Below 1000MHz, The EUT was placed on a turn table which is 0.8m above ground plane, And above 1000MHz, The EUT was placed on a styrofoam table which is 1.5m above ground plane.
2. The turntable shall be rotated for 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level.
3. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna, which is moved from 1m to 4m to find out the maximum emissions. The spectrum was investigated from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device, without going below 9 kHz, up to the tenth harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or to 40 GHz, whichever is lower.
4. Maximum procedure was performed on the six highest emissions to ensure EUT compliance.
5. And also, each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical.
6. Repeat above procedures until the measurements for all frequencies are complete.
7. The radiation measurements are tested under 3-axes(X,Y,Z) position(X denotes lying on the table, Y denotes side stand and Z denotes vertical stand), After pre-test, It was found that the worse radiation emission was get at the X position. So the data shown was the X position only.
8. The test above 1GHz must be use the fully anechoic room, and the test below 1GHz use the half anechoic room

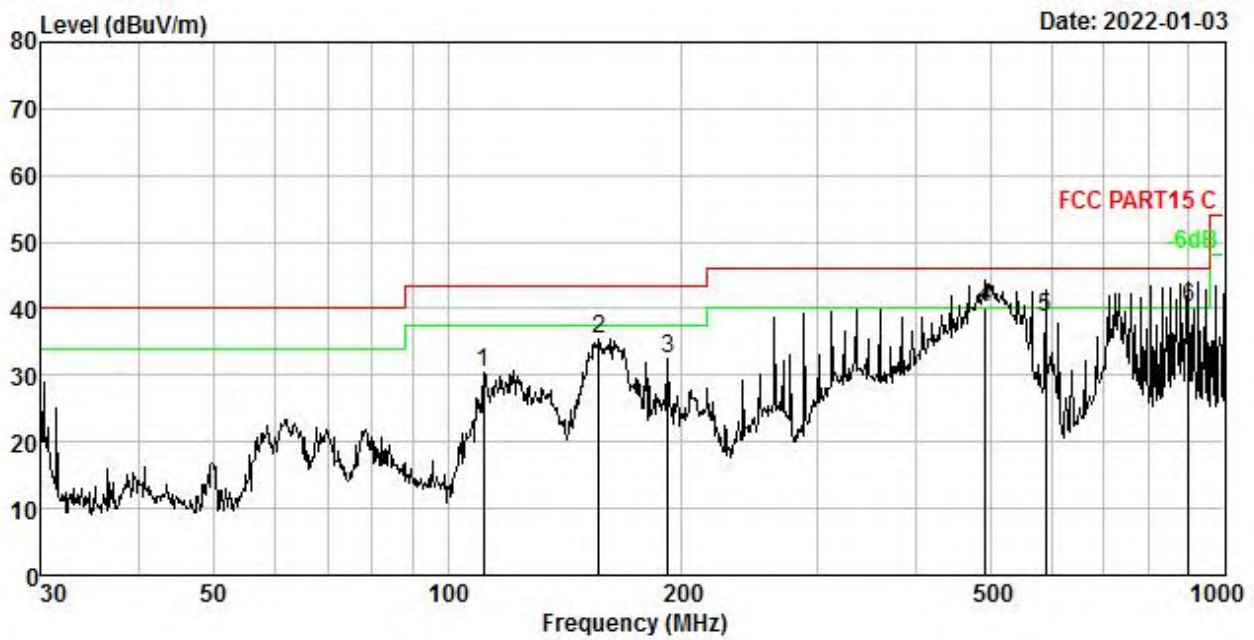

Antenna Polarization: Horizontal



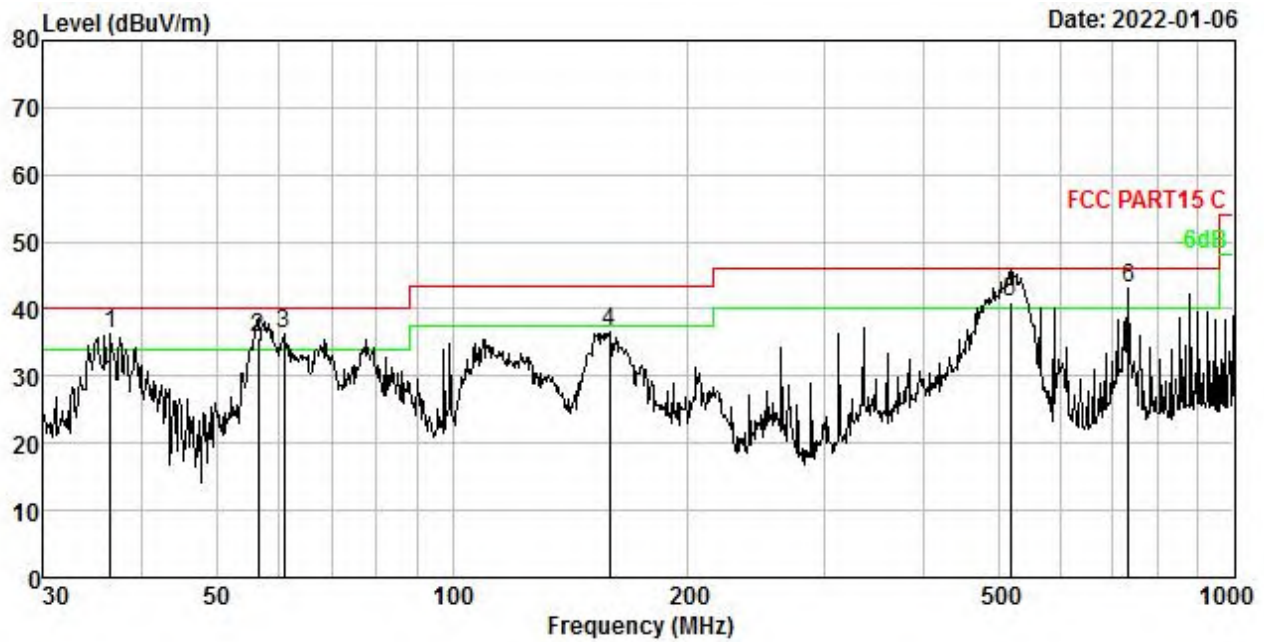

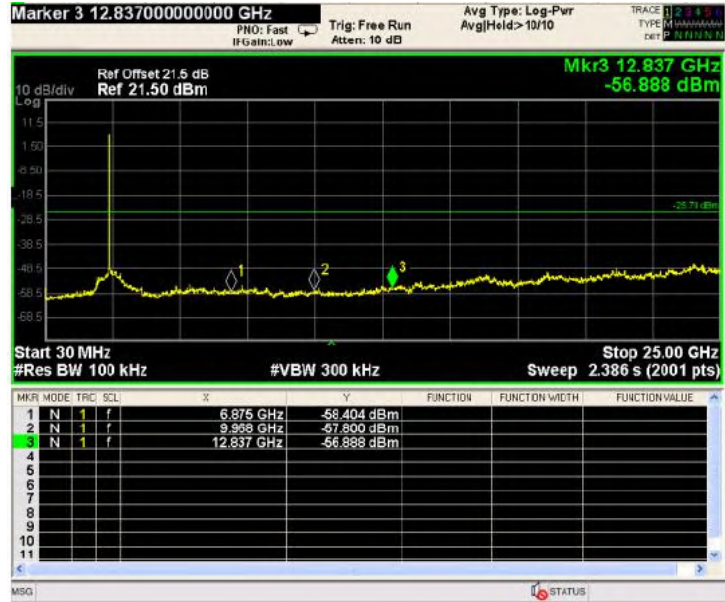

## 10 Maximum Peak Output Power

Test Requirement : FCC CFR47 Part 15 Section 15.247  
Test Method : ANSI C63.10:2013  
Test Limit : Regulation 15.247 (b)(3), For systems using digital modulation in the 902-928 MHz, 2400-2483.5 MHz, and 5725-5850 MHz bands: 1 Watt. As an alternative to a peak power measurement, compliance with the one Watt limit can be based on a measurement of the maximum conducted output power.

### 10.1 Test Procedure

1. The testing follows the Measurement Procedure of FCC KDB No. 558074 D01 15.247 Meas Guidance v05 section 8.3.1.
2. The RF output of EUT was connected to the power meter by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.
3. Set to the maximum power setting and enable the EUT transmit continuously.
4. Measure the conducted output power and record the results in the test report.

## 11 Power Spectral density

- Test Requirement : FCC CFR47 Part 15 Section 15.247
- Test Method : ANSI C63.10:2013
- Test Limit : Regulation 15.247(f) The power spectral density conducted from the intentional radiator to the antenna due to the digital modulation operation of the hybrid system, with the frequency hopping operation turned off, shall not be greater than 8 dBm in any 3 kHz band during any time interval of continuous transmission.

### 11.1 Test Procedure

1. Connect the antenna port(s) to the spectrum analyzer input.
2. Configure the spectrum analyzer as shown below:  
 Center frequency=DTS channel center frequency  
 Span = 1.5 times the DTS bandwidth  
 RBW = 10KHz, VBW = 30KHz  
 Sweep time = auto couple  
 Detector = peak  
 Trace mode =max hold
3. Place the radio in continuous transmit mode, allow the trace to stabilize, view the transmitter wave form on the spectrum analyzer.
4. Use the peak marker function to determine the maximum amplitude level within the RBW.
5. If measured value exceeds limit, reduce RBW(no less than 3KHz) and repeat.

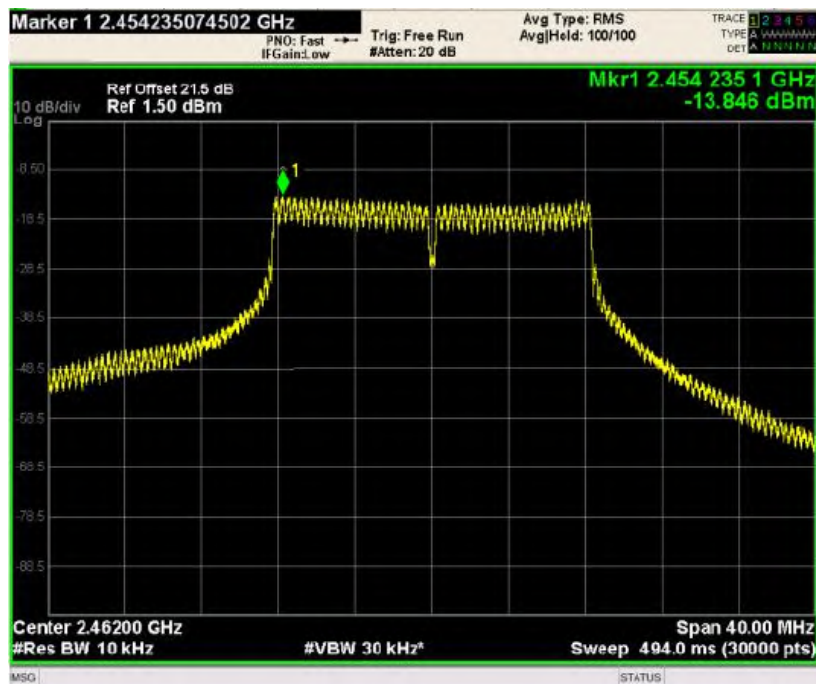

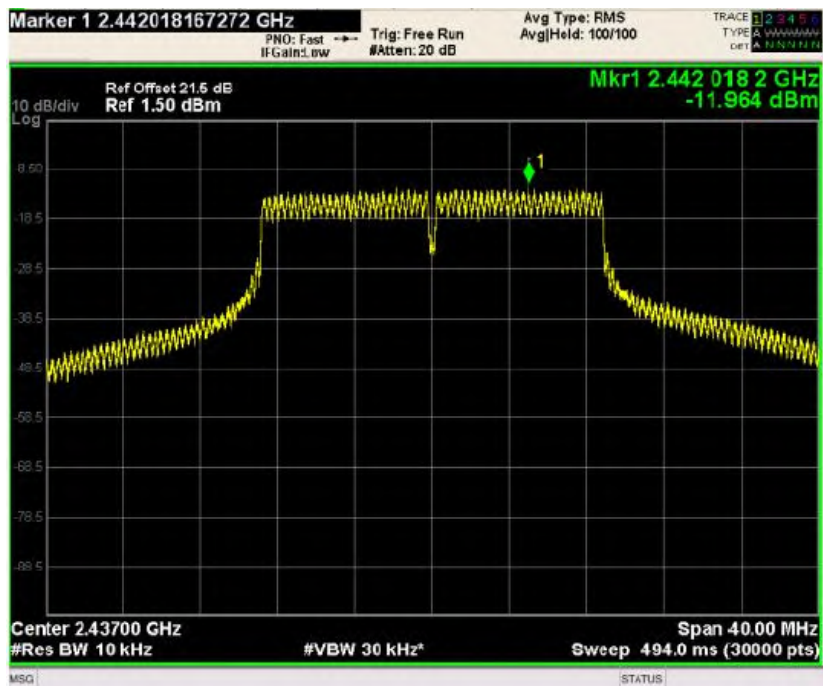

## **12 Antenna Application**

### **12.1 Antenna Requirement**

For intentional device, according to FCC 47 CFR Section 15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. And according to FCC 47 CFR Section 15.247 (b), if transmitting antennas of directional gain greater than 6dBi are used, the power shall be reduced by the amount in dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6dBi.

### **12.2 Result**

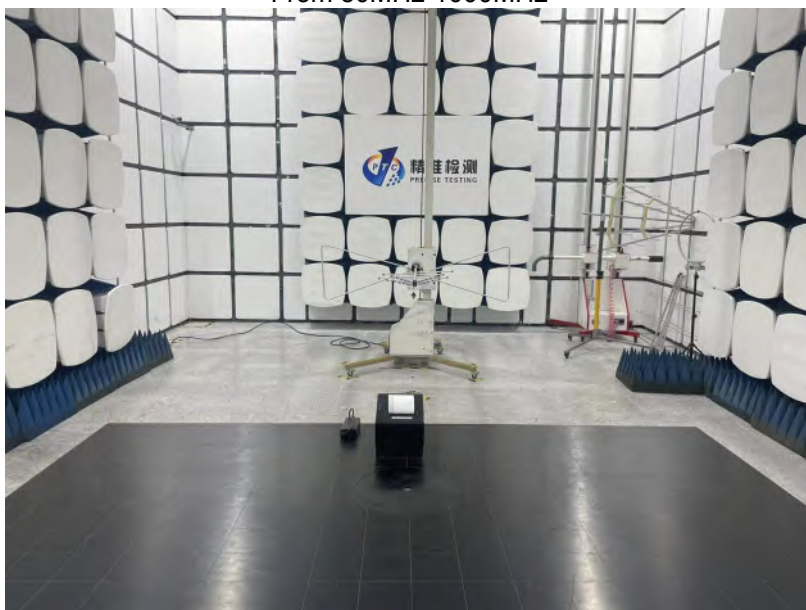
The EUT'S antenna, permanent attached antenna, is PCB Antenna. The antenna's gain is 0 dBi and meets the requirement.

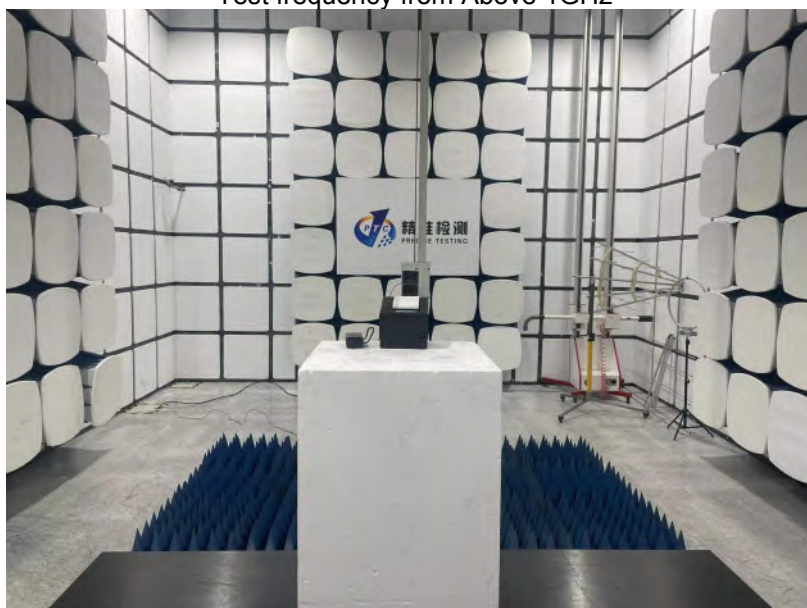
Conducted Emissions
