

Light in red: The unit is in STANDBY.


Light in blue: The unit is turned ON.




RF:Connect to receive the signal from your antenna or cable through a coaxial cable.



Installing the Stand



- 1. Lay the TV face down on a flat, cushioned surface to avoid damaging or scratching.
- 2. Fix the Left Base Stand to the main unit using 2pcs provided screws.
- 3. Fix the Right Base Stand to the main unit using 2pcs provided screws.

Removing the Stand for Wall-Mounting



- 1. Lay the TV face down on a flat, cushioned surface to avoid damaging or scratching.
- 2. Untighten the 4 pcs screws holding the stand assembly and remove them.
- Attach the wall-mount bracket to the TV using the mounting holes on the back of the TV. Mount this TV according to the instructions included in the wall-mount bracket.

Wall-Mounting Screws

• Mount the VESA bracket using 4*M8*15 isometric threaded screws (not included). WARNING: To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the floor/wall in accordance with the installation instruction.


CONNECTING A TV ANTENNA / CABLE / SATELLITE

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received from one of the following sources:

- An indoor or outdoor aerial antenna
- A cable system
- A satellite system

NOTE

For receiving over-the-air TV broadcasts, we recommend that you use an external fixed antenna. Should you require the use of a temporary antenna, please ensure that you purchase an antenna with sufficient ability to receive in weak signal areas. Only when you are in close proximity to a transmitter will a temporary antenna reproduce a signal as strongly as a fixed antenna.

CONNECTING AN A/V DEVICE

To connect to other equipment such as a VCR, camcorder, satellite system or cable, etc.

To connect AV devices such as a VCR, video game system or camcorder.



CONNECTING A HIGH-DEFINITION (HD) SOURCE USING COMPONENT CONNECTION

High-Definition (HD) Devices with component video output must be connected to the YPbPr input. Connect the component video cable and audio cable (not included) as shown.

Make sure you connect the component video cable and audio cable from the other equipment

(COMPONENT OUT and AUDIO OUT) to the unit COMPONENT IN.

NOTE

When connecting a DVD player to the television, the picture resolution is solely dependent upon the resolution supported by the DVD player attached. DVD player resolutions vary from 480i to 1080P. and this television can support DVD players up to a maximum resolution of 1080P.



HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) supports both video and audio on a single digital connection for use with DVD players, DTV, set-top boxes and other digital AV devices. HDMI was developed to provide the technologies of High Bandwidth Digital Content Protection (HDCP) as well as Digital Visual Interface (DVI) in one specification. HDCP is used to protect digital content transmitted and received by DVI-compliant or HDMI compliant displays.

HDMI has the capability to support standard, enhanced or high-definition video plus standard to multi-channel surround-sound audio. HDMI features include uncompressed digital video, a bandwidth of up to $2.2\,\mathrm{gigabytes}$ per second (with HDTV signals), one connector (instead of several cables and connectors), and communication between the AV source and AV devices such as DTVs.

CONNECTING THE POWER CORD


You can power on your TV unit before you make sure the power cord is inserted well. At the same time, please check that the rated voltage of your unit matches your local Voltage.

NOTE

- Insert the power plug fully into the socket outlet. (If the power plug is loose it could generate heat and cause fire .)
- Ensure that the power plug is easily accessible.
- Ensure the earth pin on the power plug is securely connected to prevent electrical shock.
- \bullet Do not touch the power plug with a wet hand.

(This may cause electrical shock.)

- Do not use any power cord other than that provided with this TV. (This may cause fire or electrical shock.)



Remote Control




- 1. POWER: Turn the TV on and off.
- Input: This button is used to switch among different sources, Select a source and press ENTER button to confirm.
- 3. **Digital Buttons(0-9, -)**: Directly select channel with digital buttons.
- 4. (): Switch to the previous program.
- 5. Q.MENU: Press this key to go to quick menu.
- 6. Menu: Display the main menu or exit the current menu.
- 7. Back: Return.
- 8. Exit: Exit the menu.
- 9. ENTER: Validation key.
- Arrow buttons ▲ ▼ ◀►: Use to select on-screen menu items and change menu values.
- 11. **NETFLIX**: If network connects, press this key to view NETFLIX directly.
- 12. HOME: Press it to go to App home page.
- 13. **pandora**: Press this button to select pandora application (for US only).
- VOL+F: Press these buttons to adjust the volume.
- 15. CH ✓/A: Press these buttons to change channel upward or downward.
- 16. Digital Media Player control button: Include play/ pause, stop,—previous, next, backward, forward isused in USB mode. Please refer to relevnat instructions in the section of multimed player.
- 17. CC: Press this button to adjust CC mode.
- 18. MTS/Audio:In USB modepress thisbutton to switch auto track when movie is playing. In TV mode press this button to switch MTS or Audio Language.
- 19. Color buttons: It's used as or Program Edit menu.
- 20. **TTS**: Pree this button to adjust TTS on or off or off (for US only).
- 21. INFO: Display the program information.
- 22. **YouTube**: If network connects, press this key to view YouTube directly.
- 23. **MUTE**: Press this button to cut off the sound of the TV set temporarily, press again to resume.

Basic Operations

Initial Setup

- Connect the power cord to the power socket after you have completed all the physical connections. At this stage, the TV will enter Standby Mode and the red LED indicator will illuminate.
- In Standby Mode, press the button on the main unit or on the remote control to turn the TV on. The red LED indicator will turn off.
- The first time you turn the TV on, it will go into the Setup Wizard. Press ◀/▶
 ▲/▼ buttons to select your desired mode and press ENTER confirm.















Home Mode: The picture mode will be Standard if you select this mode. **Retail Mode**: Select Dynamic Mode if you would like your picture to be brighter. At times this mode may use more energy to operate the Volume/Sound Mode and Picture Mode.

• The SLEEP-MODE Power should be less than 0.5 W.

Basic Operations

■ Menu Operation

1 Input Setup

Press **INPUT** key on the remote control to enter "INPUT SOURCE" menu. There are these options for you to select: "TV", "AV", "Component", "HDMI1", "HDMI2", "HDMI3", "USB".

Use **◄/▶**key to select a input source and press **ENTER** key to confirm.



2 Channels Selection

There are four ways to select channel:

 Using number keys, and ENTER keys on the remote control to select channel directly.

To select channel 90, press (9) → (0) → (1).

When you use the number buttons, you can directly select channels that were either erased or not memorized.

2) Using CH^/V key on the remote control or on your TV to select channel. When you press the CH^/V key, the TV changes channels in sequence. You will see all the channels that the TV has memorized.

You will not see channels that were either erased or not memorized.

3) Press 🖒 key to return to previous channel, press it again to return to current channel.

To quickly switch between two channels that are far apart, tune to one channel, then use the number keys to select the second channel. Then use the between them.

is not activated if no channel has been changed after TV turning on.

4) Select channels from "Channels List" or "Favorite List".

Press LIST key to choose from "Channel List" menu.

3 Volume Adjustment and Mute Setup

Volume adjustment

Press **VOL** +/— key on the remote control or the TV to display "Volume" menu, adjust the volume of TV between 0 to 100 by using **VOL** +/—key:

- To increase the volume, press VOL + key;
- To decrease the volume, press **VOL** key;



Mute

Press "MUTE" and the sound cuts off. The MUTE icon will appear in the lower-right corner of the screen.

To resume sound, press the "MUTE" button again, or simply press the VOL + key.

4 Current Channel Information

Press "INFO" key on the remote control to view current channel information, the indications of channel information are listed in the following table.



Press "EXIT" key on the remote control to exit this OSD.



- 1. Press **MENU** key to display the main menu on the screen.
- Press ▲/▼ key to select "Picture" option.
- 3. Press ▶ key to enter "Picture" submenu.
- 4. You can also press the **PICTURE** key on the remote control to select one of the picture settings.

Picture Mode

Your TV has four picture settings (Vivid, Standard, Movie, Eco Save, User) that are preset at the factory. Only "User" mode can be set to your preference by adjusting particular items such as Contrast, Brightness, Color, Sharpness.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Picture Mode" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ key to select one picture mode.



Picture

User settings for PICTURE

(Contrast, Brightness, Color, Sharpness, Tint)

Your set has several settings which allow you to control picture quality.

- Press ▲/▼ key to select a particular item.
- Press ◀/▶ key to decrease or increase the value of a particular item.


Note: The adjusted values are stored according to the selected particular item.

Contrast: Adjusts the lightness and darkness between objects and the background. Brightness: Adjusts the brightness of the picture.

Color: Adjusts the colors, making them lighter or darker.

Sharpness: Adjusts the outline of objects to either sharpen them or make them more dull.

Tint: Adjusts the Tint of the picture.



Backlight

You can Change the brightness of the entire screen according to your preference.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Backlight" option.
- Press ◀/▶ key to increace or decreace the backlight value.

Backlight: Adjusts the brightness of the whole screen.

Color Temperature

You can change the color of the entire screen according to your preference.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Color Temperature" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- Press ▲/▼ key to select one color temp.

Cool: Makes whites bluish. Standard: Makes whites nature Warm: Makes whites reddish.

Sound

- Press MENU key to display the main menu on the screen.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Sound" option.
- 3. Press ▶ key to enter "Sound" submenu.
- You can also press the SOUND key on the remote control to select one of the sound.

Sound Mode

You can select the type of the special sound effect to be used when watching a given broadcast.

Your TV has five sound settings ("Standard", "Music", "Movie", "Sports", "User") that are preset at the factory.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Sound Mode" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ key to select one sound mode.
 - Standard: Selects the normal sound mode.
 - Music: Provides clear and live sound for music.
 - Movie: Provides live and full sound for movies.
 - Sports: Emphasizes bass over other sounds.
 - User: Selects your custom sound settings.



Balance

If the volumes of the left speaker and the right speaker are not the same, you can adjust the "Balance" to suit your personal preference.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Balance" option.
- 2. Press **◄/▶** key to decrease or increase the value of the item.

AVL

Each broadcasting station has its own signal conditions, and it is inconvenient to adjust the volume every time the channel is changed. "AVL" automatically adjusts the volume of the desired channel by lowering the sound output when the modulation signal is high or by raising the sound output whenthe modulation signal is low.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "AVL" option.
- Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- Press ▲/▼ key to select "On" or "Off".

Surround Sound

This is used to turn on surround sound to gain better sound effect.

- Press ▲/▼ key to select "Surround sound" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- Press ▲/▼ key to select "Surround" or "Off".

Video Description

- Press ▲/▼ key to select "Video Description" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ key to select "On" or "Off".

SOUND

Digital Audio Output

This is used to set digital audio output.

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Digital Audio Output" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Auto" or "PCM".

Audio Language

You can set the primary and secondary language for audio.

Dolby Audio Process

You can set Dolby Audio Process on the Dolby Audio Process submenu.

HDMI-ARC

Turn on or turn off the HDMI-ARC function.

Function 1

- 1. Press MENU key to display the main menu on the screen.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Function" option.
- 3. Press ▶ key to enter "Function" submenu.

Noise Reduction

Press ▲/▼ key to select the Noise Reduction mode. You can select the right mode to match the pictures.

MPEG Noise Reduction

Press ▲/▼ key to select the Mpeg Noise Rdeuction mode: off/low/middle/high. The picture will be better when it is in "high" mode.

Aspect Ratio

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Aspect Ratio" option.
- Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ key to change the size of the picture on the size of the picture on the screen.





Function

Link Setup

- 1. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Link Setup" option.
- 2. Press ENTER or ▶key to enter "Link Setup" submenu

Enable Link: Press **◄/▶** to turn on/off the link setup.

Auto Power On: When this option is "On" and the TV is in standby mode. To turn on the DVD or other supporting CEC function devices can also turn the TV at the same time.

Auto Standby: When this Option is "On" and the TV is on, to turn off TV can also turn the DVD or other supporting CEC function devices into standby mode.



HDMI EDID

This function is only used in HDMI mode.

- 1. Press "▲/▼" key to select "HDMI EDID" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/ ▼ key to select " 2K", " 4K" or " AUTO".

Netflix Deactivate

- Press "▲/▼" key to select "Netflix Deactivate" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press "Yes" to confirm again, the Netflix will be activated.

Netflix ESN

Display the Netflix Esn information.

Netflix Version


Display the Netflix version.

VUDU Deactivate

- Press "▲/▼" key to select "VUDU Deactivate" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.

TTS

You can set TTS information in the TTS menu.



Time

- 1. Press **MENU** key to display the main menu on the screen.
- 2. Press ▲/▼ key to select "Time" option.
- 3. Press ▶ kev to enter "Time" submenu.

Off Time

In "Off Time" item, press ▶button or ENTER button to enter the submenu, set the day & time to turn off the TV set.

On Time

In "On Time" item, press ▶button or ENTER button to enter the submenu, set the time to turn on the TV set, when the TV set is in the standby mode. You can also choose which day to control you TV set in a week.



Sleep Timer

- Press ▲/▼ key to select "Sleep Timer" option.
- 2. Press "▶" or "ENTER" key to confirm.
- 3. Press ▲/▼ key repeatedly until the desired time appears (Off, 10mins, 20mins, 30mins, 60mins, 90mins, 120mins, 180mins, 240mins).

Notes: The sleep timer you have set will be cancelled when the TV turns off or if a power failure occurs.

Notes: When the time is less than 60 seconds, remind information will be displayed on the screen. Press any key button to cancel timer function.

Auto Sleep

Press ▲/▼ key to select whether to open the No signal Power off features. If this function is opened, the TV will power off in ten minutes when there is no signal.

Auto Svnc

You can modify the time of your TV set in Manual mode. In Auto mode, the "clock" is decided by the DTV signal.

Clock






