1 GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

The AGM Rattler LRF is a compact thermal imaging scope developed for 24-hour operation under any weather and environmental conditions. Available in multiple configurations: 384x288 or 640x512 thermal detector, and 35mm or 50mm objective lens. These options allow the customer to choose the perfect unit for their needs. The 35mm lens is designed for medium-range applications, while the 50mm lens will be better suited for long-range engagements.

Equipped with a highly sensitive, 12μm thermal detector and 1024×768 OLED monitor, the AGM Rattler LRF provides a clear image under harsh environment conditions including darkness, fog, smoke, dust, rain, snow, brush, camouflage, etc. The device can be used as a thermal riflescope or handheld monocular, and can be applied to scenarios such as patrolling, hunting, static observation, and more.

The built-in laser range finder of the AGM Rattler LRF is designed to determine the exact distance between the observer and the target. Measurement results are displayed on the scopes monitor. One 18650 rechargeable battery gives the device up to 4.5 hours of continuous operation time. An external 5V power bank (battery pack) can be easily connected via a USB to USB-C connector for a significant increase of operating time. The device is equipped with fast EMMC storage for on-board video recording and image capturing. An internal Wi-Fi module for live video streaming and video/image recording via application are also included.




FIGURE 1-1. MAIN PARTS




FIGURE 1-2. STANDARD COMPONENTS




FIGURE 1-3. OPTIONAL EQUIPMENT

2 OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. BASIC OPERATIONS

2.1.1 UNPACKING

The following steps must be completed prior to each mission.

- Open the carrying case, remove the device, and verify that all components are included.
- Inspect the device for any obvious evidence of damage to the optical surfaces, body, eyecup, operation buttons, etc. Ensure that all optical surfaces are clean and ready for use. Clean all optical surfaces with a lens tissue.

2.1.2 BATTERY INSTALLATION

- 1. Turn the battery cover (A) anticlockwise to loosen it.
- 2. Make sure the battery is fully charged. Insert the battery (B) into the battery compartment (C) with the positive mark inward.
- 3. Turn the battery cover clockwise to tighten it.




FIGURE 2-1. BATTERY INSTALLATION

NOTE:

Remove the battery from the battery compartment if the device is not used for a long time.

2.1.3 CONNECTING THE DEVICE

1. Open the USB interface cover.

2. Connect the device and power adapter with a Type-C cable to power on the device. Alternatively, connect the device and PC to copy/delete files.




FIGURE 2-2. CABLE INTERFACE

2.1.4 CONTROL BUTTONS




FIGURE 2-3. RATTLER LRF CONTROLS

The Rattler LRF controls are shown in Figures 2-3 and are defined in Tables 2-1. Each button is responsible for some functions selected by short press or long press (hold) the button. Pushing a button for 2+ second is considered "long press" (hold).

NOTE:

Press the MEASURE button 🏵 and operation wheel button 🗎 at the same time to start or stop recording.

Hold the MEASURE button and operation wheel button at the same time to correct the nonuniformity of display manually (manual FFC).

2.1.5 POWER ON AND OFF

Power On

When the battery is enough, hold the POWER button (1) to power on the device. Refer to the figure below for the main view of the display.




FIGURE 2-4. THE DISPLAY MAIN VIEW

Power Off

When the device is turned on, hold the POWER BUTTON (1) to power off the device.

NOTE

See the battery icon on the device display for the electricity quantity. Icon means the battery is fully charged, and icon means that the battery is low. When the low power note shows, charge the battery.

In the "Auto Power Off" menu you can set the time for the automatic shutdown of the device as required (OFF / 30 min. / 45 min.).

2.1.6 STANDBY MODE

Standby mode is used to save battery power. In the view mode, press the **b**utton. After a few seconds, the display will turn off. Press the **b**utton again to exit the Standby mode.

2.1.7 THERMAL VIEW OBSERVATION

- 1. Power on the device.
- 2. Hold the device and make sure the eyepiece covers your eye.
- 3. Adjust the diopter adjustment ring until the OSD text or image is clear.
- 4. Point the device towards the target of the view. Bring the object into focus by rotate the objective focus ring.

NOTE:

You must perform the focus adjustment before any further use of the riflescope.

Set palette, brightness, contrast, scene mode and FFC (Flat Field Correction), to display the best image effect.

2.1.8 PALETTE SETTINGS

You can select different palettes to display the same scene in different effects. Press operation wheel button in live view interface to switch palettes.

TABLE 2-2. PALETTE SETTINGS

PALETTE	DESCRIPTION
OPTICAL	The image of optical channel is displayed in this mode.
WHITE HOT	The hot part is white-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the lighter the color is.
BLACK HOT	The hot part is black-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the more black the color is.
RED HOT	The hot part is red-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the redder the color is.
FUSION	From high temperature to low temperature, the image is colored in from white, yellow, red, pink to purple.

2.1.9 DIGITAL ZOOM

In the live view interface, rotate the operation wheel to switch the digital zoom of the device between $1\times$, $2\times$, $4\times$ and $8\times$. The image magnification value is displayed on the screen:

- Rattler LRF TS35-384: 3x, 6x, 12x, 24x
- Rattler LRF TS50-384: 4.5x, 9x, 18x, 36x
- Rattler LRF TS35-640: 2x, 4x, 8x, 16x
- Rattler LRF TS50-640: 2.5x, 5x, 10x, 20x

2.1.10 VIDEO RECORDING / IMAGE CAPTURE

Video Recording

In the live view interface, press MEASURE button $\textcircled{\blacksquare}$ and operation wheel button $\textcircled{\blacksquare}$ at the same time to start recording.

The left top of image displays the information of recording time.

Press (*) and (iii) buttons at the same time again to stop recording.

Snapshot Capturing

In the main live view interface, press *\bullet button to capture picture.

NOTE:

- When capturing succeeds, the image freezes for 1 second and a prompt shows on the display.
- · For exporting captured pictures, refer to Files Export.

2.1.11 FILE EXPORT

- Connect the thermal riflescope to your PC with USB cable and open the detected disk.
- Open computer disk and select the disk of device. Go to the DCIM folder and find the folder named after the capture year and month. For example, if you capture a picture or record a video on June 2021, go to DCIM -> 202106 to find the picture or video.
 - Select and copy the videos to PC and play the file with the player.
 - Select and copy the snapshots to PC and view the files.
- 3. Disconnect the device from your PC.

NOTE:


- The device displays images when you connect it to PC. But functions such as recording, capturing and hot spot are disabled.
- When you connect the device to PC for the first time, it installs the drive program automatically.

2.1.12 INSTALLING THE RATTLER ON A PICATINNY/WEAVER RAIL

WARNING:

Always make sure your firearm is unloaded before you place the scope on the firearm. Reconfirm that the chamber is empty if you stop the procedure then resume later. Safe firearms handling rules should be followed at all times.

The Rattler LRF comes fully-assembled with a Picatinny/Weaver mount. The mount is attached to the scope with two screws.



To install the Rattler LRF on a Picatinny/Weaver rail, perform the following (Figure 2-6):

- 1. Unlock the clamping device of the scope mount by pushing down on the lever holder (A) and unlocking the lever (B).
- 2. Install the scope on the Picatinny/ Weaver rail so that the stop (C) slides into the transverse slot on the rail.
- 3. Affix the scope to the rail by locking the lever (B).
- 4. Verify that the clamping device is firmly holding the Rattler LRF. If necessary, adjust the clamping device's lever-cam lock as detailed in part 2.1.13 (Clamping Device Adjustment).

2.1.13 CLAMPING DEVICE ADJUSTMENT

To adjust the mount's clamping device, do the following:

- 1. Remove the Rattler LRF from the weapon.
- 2. With the clamping device unlocked (as shown in Figure 2-6), push the cam (E) towards the arrow, which will cause the nut (D) to slide out of its hole.
- 3. To tighten/ loosen the clamping device, push down on the cam (E) and turn the nut (D) CW/ CCW respectively, in one-two increments (see note below). Much like when the cam (E) is released, backward-moving spring will cause the nut (D) to slide back into its hole.

NOTE:

The eight-sided nut of the mount lever-cam lock will only fit into their hole if turned in one of the discrete positions, using increments equal to 360°/8.

4. Verify that the adjusted lever-cam lock securely holds the weapon mounting rail.

2.2 MAIN FUNCTIONS

2.2.1 MENU OPERATION

When the device is turned on, hold the 🗎 button to display the menu.

Rotate the operation wheel to move between menu items. The active element is highlighted in orange. Press the button to select menu item or change an option. Hold button to exit the menu.

2.2.2 CONTRAST ADJUSTMENT

- 1. Hold 📵 button to go to the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select ① Contrast menu item and press 🗎 button to adjust the image contrast.

You can select one of five levels of the contrast.

2.2.3 BRIGHTNESS ADJUSTMENT

- 1. Hold 🗎 button to go to the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select D Brightness menu item and press button to adjust the brightness.

You can select one of five levels of the brightness to adjust the image lighter or darker.

2.2.4 SCENE MODE

You can select proper Scene Mode according to environment temperature to improve the display effect.

- 1. Hold (button to go to the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select ◆ / ▲ Scene Mode menu item (◆ is default option) and press (to switch scene.

Recognition mode () improves an image so that the object edge is more distinct.

Jungle mode (\triangle) is more suitable for hunting environment because of the highlight function of small objects.

3. Hold (a) to save settings and exit.

2.2.5 TRIGGER CALIBRATION

Trigger Calibration performs the correction of nonuniformity of display in the mode preset in the FFC menu.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select \bigcirc menu item and press \equiv to trigger the calibration.
- 3. Hold (a) button to exit.

2.2.6 FFC (FLAT FIELD CORRECTION)

Flat Field Correction (FFC) function can correct nonuniformity of display.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select (+) menu item and press (=) to switch the FFC mode between Manual, Auto and External.

Manual: Enter Trigger Calibration in the menu and press (button to correct the nonuniformity of display (refer to section 2.2.5).

Auto: The riflescope performs FFC automatically when switching on or rebooting the camera.

External: Cover the lens cap, then enter Trigger Calibration in the menu and press (a) button to correct the nonuniformity of display (section 2.2.5).

3. Hold (button to exit.

2.2.7 CVBS OUTPUT

You can view the video on CVBS monitor, to get a better and clear image, more convenient to check the detail.

 Connect the USB-CVBS cable to USB port of thermal riflescope and to monitor's CVBS port.

NOTE:

USB-CVBS cable need to be purchase separately.

NOTE:

CVBS Output function doesn't support hot plug, so please connect the cable before power on.

- 2. Hold 📵 button to show the menu.
- 3. Select CVBS menu item and press 🖨 button to turn on or turn off the CVBS video output.

2.2.8 PICTURE IN PICTURE MODE

- 1. Hold (button to show the menu.
- 2. Select PIP menu item and enter Picture In Picture (PIP) mode. The details show in the upper part of screen.

NOTE:

When Reticle is enabled, the PIP view is the detail of crosshair. When Reticle is not enabled, the PIP view is the detail of central part.

- 3. Press the wheel (a) to switch the PIP type. Up-Left, Center, Up-Right, and Close are selectable.
- 4. Hold (a) button to exit.

If digital zoom is enabled, the PIP view also zooms. If the digital zoom ratio exceeds 4, the PIP does not zoom.

2.2.9 DEFECTIVE PIXELS CORRECTION

Defective Pixels Correction (DPC) function can correct the defective pixels on the screen which are not performed as expected.

Before you start switch the palettes mode to White Hot mode.

- 1. Hold 🗐 button to show the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select DDDPC menu item, and press to enter the DPC setting interface.
- Press (a) to correct the defective pixel.

NOTE:

The selected defective pixel can be magnified and displayed at the bottom right of the interface.

2.2.10 BURNING PREVENTION

This function can prevent damage to the thermal sensor from the sun or other high temperature bright light source. When enabling this function, the shield will close until the environment turns to normal.

- 1. Hold 🖨 button to go to the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select 🖰 menu item and press 🗐 button to enable or disable the Burn Prevention function.

NOTE:

When the burn-prevention function is disabled, the shield won't be forced to close in such conditions.

2.2.11 RETICLE AND BORESIGHTING

Enable the reticle to aim at the target.

- 1. Hold (button to show the menu.
- 2. Select 🛱 Reticle menu item. A reticle shows in the center of the view.




FIGURE 2-8. RETICLE PATTERNS

3. Press the wheel to select the Freeze function (Optional).


NOTE:

When enabling the Freeze function in reticle, you can adjust the position of the cursor on a frozen image. This function can prevent image flutter.

4. Rotate the wheel to select the reticle type. Then press the wheel button 🖨 to confirm.

NOTE:

The scale intervals of the Reticle 4 changes synchronously under the current digital zoom. The value of one scale interval of the Reticle 4 is 2 mil (6.75 MOA).






FIGURE 2-9. RETICLE AND BORESIGHTING

You can boresight the scope by moving the reticle on screen:

- 1. Press the wheel to select the coordinates. The coordinate shows the current position of the reticle.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to move the cursor, and press (**) to switch the moving direction.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

2.2.12 RETICLE COLOR

You can change the color of the reticle.

Enable reticle first.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu.
- 2. Select [C] Color menu item and press (a) button to switch the color of reticle. White, Green, Red, and Black colors are selectable.
- 3. Hold 🗐 button to save and exit.

2.2.13 TRAJECTORY CORRECTION

Enable the trajectory correction to shot the target with high accuracy by marking the offset between the big crosshair and small crosshair.

Trajectory correction available only with Reticle 1 type. Select Reticle 1 in the Reticle menu.

- 1. In the live view mode, hold the wheel (a) to show the menu.
- 2. Select ► Trajectory menu item. Two crosshairs show in the view. The big one is reticle crosshair, and the small one is trajectory correction crosshair.






FIGURE 2-10. TRAJECTORY CORRECTION

- 3. Set the distance.
 - 1) Press the wheel button (a) to select the distance, and then rotate the wheel to adjust the distance between the target and the device.
 - 2) Press (**) to switch the selected distance value.
 - Press the wheel (=) to save the distance settings.
- 4. Set the crosshair position of trajectory correction.
 - 1) Aim the big crosshair at the target.
 - 2) Shot and mark the actual drop point of the bullet.
 - 3) Rotate the wheel (a) to move the small cursor to the position of the actual drop point. Press (b) to switch the moving direction of the small cursor. You can view the coordinate of the cursor in the view.
- 5. Press the wheel button (a) to save the coordinates of the current position.
- 6. Rotate the wheel to switch to the next distance.
- 7. Repeat step 3 to 5 to set another trajectory correction position.

You can save up to five corrections for different distances. Corrective aiming points will be displayed with short lines on the reticle.

8. Hold (button to exit.

2.2.14 LANGUAGE SETTING

You can select different languages of user interface.

- 1. Hold (button to show the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select Aa Language menu item and press button to select the language.
- Rotate the wheel to select the language as required, and press (to confirm.

2.2.15 VIEW DEVICE INFORMATION

- Hold button to show the menu of device.
- 2. Select (i) Version menu item and press (iii) button. You can view the device information such as firmware version, and serial number.

2.2.16 RESTORE DEVICE

You can reset the settings of device.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu of device.
- 2. Select Restore menu item and press button to restore the device to defaults according to the prompt.

2.2.17 TIME SYNCHRONIZATION

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu.
- Rotate the wheel to select menu and press button to enter the Time Sync.
- 3. Press (a) to switch the time system, and rotate the wheel to select the time and date to be synchronized.
- 4. Press (a) and rotate the wheel to set the time and date, and press (a) again to finish the setting.
- 5. Hold (a) to save settings and exit.

2.2.18 OSD

- 1. Hold (a) button to go to the menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select / menu item and press button to switch the OSD mode.

When OSD (On-Screen Display) is on the information such as time, date, Wi-Fi hotspot activation, digital zoom, storage memory status, and battery status displays in top right corner of viewfinder.

2.2.19 DISTANCE MEASUREMENT

The device can detect the distance between the target and the observation position with laser.

NOTE:

When measuring the distance, keep the hand and the position steady. Otherwise, the accuracy may be affected.

1. Hold the wheel 🗐 to show the menu.

- 2. Rotate the wheel to select ⇒ menu item and press button to enable Laser Ranging.
- 3. Hold (a) to return to the live view interface.
- Aim the cursor at the target and hold the button to measure the target distance.

The distance measurement result is displayed at the upper right of the image.

2.2.20 AUTO POWER OFF

You can set the time for the automatic shutdown of the device as required.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu of device.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select () Auto Power Off menu item and press () button to select OFF, 30 min or 45 min.

2.2.21 HOT TRACKING

The device can detect the highest temperature spot in the scene and mark it on display.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu.
- 2. Select \(\int \) / \(\cdot \) and press \(\exists \) button to enable/disable hot spot mark (marking the spot of highest temperature).

When the hot spot mark is enabled, the -'- mark displays in the spot of the highest temperature. When the scene changes, the -'- mark moves.

2.2.22 NETWORK CONFIGURATION

Connect your phone to the Wi-Fi hotspot of the riflescope, you can configure the parameters and realize functions of the device.

- 1. Hold (a) button to show the menu.
- 2. Select nmenu item to enable Wi-Fi hotspot function.
- 3. Turn on the WLAN and connect to the Wi-Fi hotspot.
 - Hotspot Name: Wlan-IPTS Serial No.
 - Hotspot Password: Last 9 digits of Serial No.
- Search the client software on App Store (iOS System) or Google Play[™] (Android System) to download and install the app. T-Vision APP is recommend.
- Open the APP and connect your phone with the device. You can view the interface of riflescope on your phone.

NOTE:

When the power is less than 15%, the Wi-Fi hotspot function will be turned off automatically.

2.3 CLIENT SOFTWARE INTRODUCTION

We recommend using T-Vision software. Install the client software on your mobile phone first, and then connect your phone to the hotspot of the riflescope. Refer to section 2.2.22 for details of hotspot connection.

NOTE:

The device password is set by user at first activation. If the password was lost or forgotten, it can be reset. To make a reset, provide the following action:

- Hold button to show the menu of device.
- 2. Move the cursor to menu item and press the button to restore all parameters to default settings.
- 1. Run the app and connect the phone or tablet with the device.
- 2. If the device is inactivated, set the password and activate it. If the device is activated, enter the password to add it to the app.
- 3. When the device is added, the live view can be seen. You can view the interface of the riflescope on the software. User can change such image parameters as brightness, contrast, zoom, palettes directly via phone or tablet as well as record video on phone/tablet memory.




FIGURE 2-11, CLIENT SOFTWARE

3 MAINTENANCE

3.1 MAINTENANCE

3.1.1 CLEANING PROCEDURES

- 1. Gently brush off any dirt from the body of the device using a clean, soft cloth.
- 2. Moisten the cloth with fresh water and gently wipe down the external surfaces (except lenses).
- 3. Dry any wet surfaces (except lenses) using another dry, clean, soft cloth.
- 4. Using a lens brush, carefully remove all loose dirt from the lenses.
- 5. Dampen a cotton swab with ethanol and slowly, gently wipe down the lenses. Clean the glass surfaces using circular movements, starting from the center of the lens and moving out towards the edge, without touching the lens holder. Change the cotton swab after each circular stroke. Repeat this step until the glass surfaces are clean.
- 6. Clean the accessories with a soft brush (or cloth) dampened with soap and water.

3.1.2 LASER MAINTENANCE

It is not necessary to maintain the laser regularly. If the laser does not work, the laser assembly needs to be replaced in the factory under warranty.

CAUTION:

Use of controls or adjustments or performance of procedures other than those specified herein may result in hazardous radiation exposure.

3.1.3 PREPARING FOR EXTENDED STORAGE

CAUTION:

Thoroughly dry each item before placing them into the storage case.

To prepare the riflescope for extended storage:

- 1. Clean the riflescope and accessories.
- 2. Place all items into the storage case.

3.1.4 UPDATING THE DEVICE FIRMWARE

- 1. Download the firmware update package to your PC and unzip it.
- 2. Connect the thermal device to your PC with USB cable.
- 3. Turn on the thermal device.
- 4. Open the detected disk (USB drive) in file manager program. Copy the unzipped .day file and paste it to the root directory of the device.

- 5. Turn off the device.
- 6. Turn on the device. After a while, the firmware update process will start automatically. During the update, the screen will display the inscription "Upgrading ...". The update process will be completed when the inscription "Upgrading ..." goes out.

Repeat steps 4-6 for each updating file.

7. Turn off the device and disconnect it from your PC.

3.2 TROUBLESHOOTING

Table 3-1 lists the most common malfunctions that may occur with your equipment. Perform the tests, inspections, and corrective actions in the order they appear in the table.

This table does not list all the malfunctions that may occur with your device, or all of the tests, inspections, and corrective actions that may be necessary to fix them. If the equipment malfunction is not corrected by the suggested actions, or a problem occurs that is not listed in this table, please contact AGM Global Vision's Customer Support center or your retailer.
