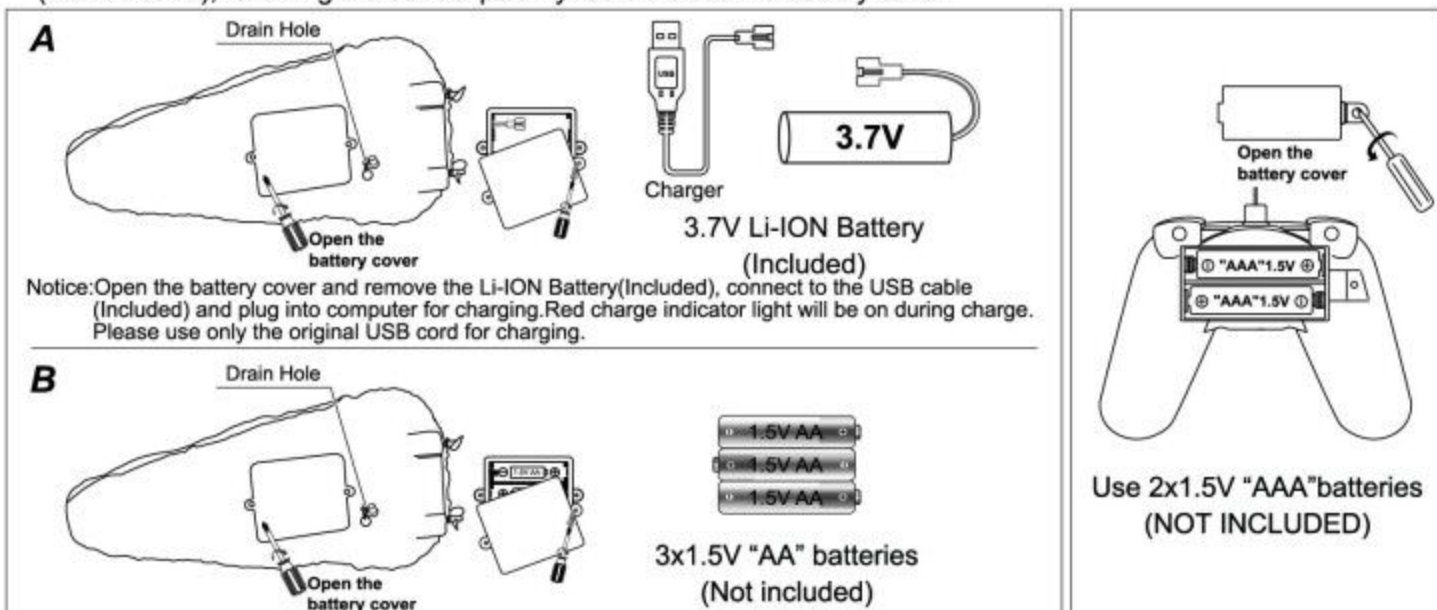


# MX-SERIES R/C BOAT INSTRUCTION MANUAL

## Battery Installation

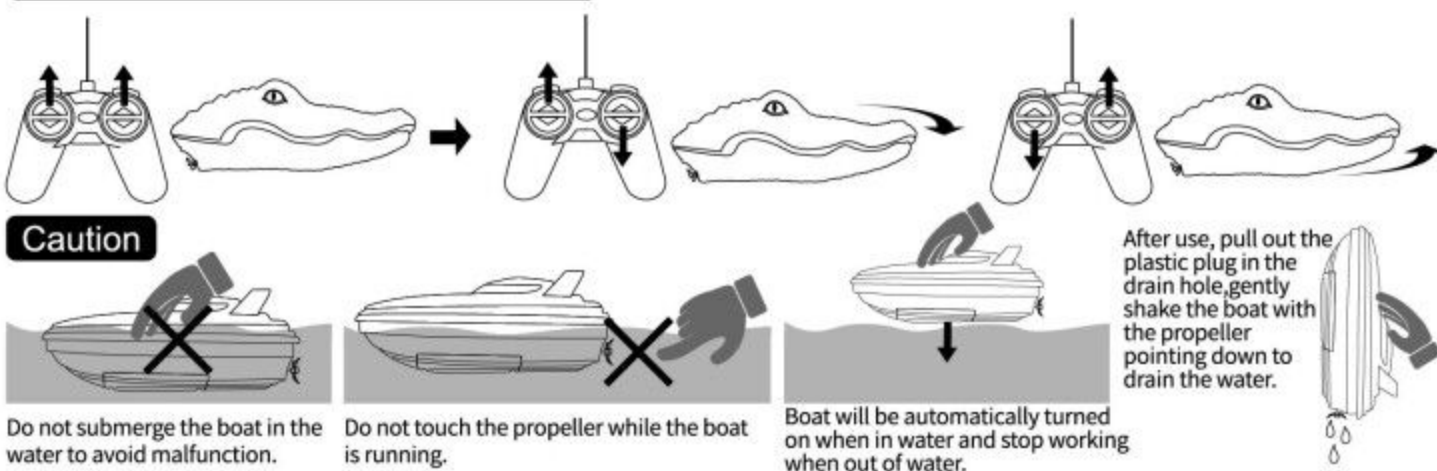
1. Screw open the battery compartment cover from the boat, insert 3 pieces of 1.5V "AA" batteries (Not included), following the correct polarity. Screw close the battery cover.
2. Screw open the battery compartment cover from the remote control, insert 2 pieces of 1.5V "AAA" batteries (Not included), following the correct polarity. Screw close the battery cover.



- ①. Do not mix new and used batteries or batteries of different types.
- ②. Only batteries of the same or equivalent types as recommended are to be used.
- ③. Do not mix alkaline batteries with rechargeable batteries.
- ④. Gently pull out the battery lid when the screw is loosened, battery lid is more difficult to be removed due to water-proof ring inside.

Operation Instructions: After use, pull out the plastic plug in the drain hole to drain the water.

## Operation Manual of Remote Control



- ❌ Don't operate your boat where there are water plants, rubbish, or other obstacles in the pond. This could impair propeller and cause damage.
- ❌ Don't play when there is a strong water current or when the wind is blowing strongly on the pond.
- ❌ Never play in ocean (salt) water. This will cause rusting of parts.
- ❌ Don't play outdoors during thunderstorms.



CAUTION: Please take out the batteries when not in use.
