




Figure 1: Measurement setup for the carrier frequency separation

3.2.4 Band Edge

3.2.6 Radiated Spurious Emissions

Procedure:

Radiated emissions from 30 MHz to 25 GHz were measured according to the methods defines in ANSI C63.10-2013.

The EUT is a placed on as turn table. For emissions testing at or below 1 GHz, the table height shall be 0.8 m above the reference ground plane. For emission measurements above 1 GHz, the table height shall be 1.5 m. The turn table shall rotate 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna which varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emission.
