# 4.1 Statement of the measurement uncertainty

The data and results referenced in this document are true and accurate. It is noted that the expanded measurement uncertainty corresponds to the measurement results from the standard measurement uncertainty multiplied by the coverage factor k = 2. The true value is located in the corresponding interval with a probability of 95 % The measurement uncertainty was calculated for all measurements listed in this test report acc. to CISPR 16-4-2 / 2011 + A1 / 2014 "Uncertainties, statistics and limit modelling – Uncertainty in EMC measurements" and is documented in the quality system acc. to DIN EN ISO/IEC 17025. For all measurements shown in this report, the measurement uncertainty of the test laboratory, CSA Group Bayern GmbH, is below the measurement uncertainty as defined by CISPR. Therefore, no special measures must be taken into consideration with regard to the limits according to CISPR. Furthermore, component and process variability of devices similar to that tested may result in additional deviation. The manufacturer has the sole responsibility of continued compliance of the device.

# 5 HUMAN EXPOSURE

### 5.1 SAR test exclusion considerations

### 5.1.1 Applicable standard

According to RF exposure guidance:

Systems operating under the provisions of this section shall be operated in a manner that the public is not exposed to radio frequency energy levels in excess of the Commission's guidelines.

### 5.1.2 Determination of the standalone SAR test exclusion threshold

The minimum separation distance results from the application of the SunSense Pro which is worn on the body. This distance is assumed to be  $\leq 50$  mm from antenna to the body of the user.

The hand of the user is the nearest extremity of a human being therefore the threshold for 1-g is determined.

The formula under 4.3.1 1) for the threshold level for 100 MHz to 6 GHz for standalone equipment is used:  $[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW)/(min. test separation distance, mm)]*[<math>\sqrt{f(GHz)}] \le 3.0$ 

The max conducted average power is according the equipment (WLAN module):

Rated output power: 0.6 mW -2.0 dBm

Tune-up tolerance: 3.0 dB

Maximum output power: 1.0 dBm 1.3 mW

Antenna gain max: -25 dBi

Maximum EIRP: -24.0 dBm 0.004 mW

### 5.1 Exemption limits for routine evaluation - SAR evaluation

### 5.1.1 Applicable standard

According to RSS-102, item 2.5.1:

SAR evaluation is required if the separation distance between the user and/or bystander and the antenna and/or radiating element of the device is less than or equal to 20 cm, except when the device operates at or below the applicable output power level (adjusted for tune-up tolerance) for the specified separation distance defined in Table 1.
