

ON PLACEMENT


- Do not use the unit in places which are extremely hot, cold, dusty or humid.






Placing of Your Projector

Your projector can be installed in four different configurations (see picture below):



Front Table:


Select this location with the projector placed near the floor in front of the screen. This is the most common way to position the projector for quick setup and portability.



Rear Table:

Select this location with the projector placed near the floor behind the screen.

NOTE: That a special rear projection screen is required.



Front Ceiling:

Select this location with the projector suspended upside-down from the ceiling in front of the screen.

NOTE: A projector mount is required to install the projector in a ceiling.



Rear Ceiling:


Select this location with the projector suspended upside-down from the ceiling behind the screen.

NOTE:

A projector mount is required to install the projector in a ceiling. A special rear projection screen is required.


To Reduce Image Distortion

- Move the projector as close to the center of the screen as possible.
- The light beam from the projector should be perpendicular to the screen for a rectangular or square image.



Projection Distance and Screen Size

Measure the distance between the projector and where you want to position the screen. This is the projection distance for reference..






Installing your Projector in the Ceiling

When installing the projector in the ceiling, please purchase a projector mount recommended by an installation professional and follow the instructions that come with the mount.

Before installing the projector in the ceiling, please check to make sure the ceiling structure can support the weight of the projector and the mount. If in doubt, please ask the advice from an installation professorial.



Adjust The Vertical Location

Follow below picture to adjust the vertical location.




Adjust The Focus And Keystone

Follow below picture to adjust the focus and trapezoidal screen.

Adjust the focus by turning the knob while observing the image pixels near the center of the screen. Optimal focus is obtained when the pixels are clearly visible. Depending on the projected screen size, the focus near the screen edges may be less sharp than the screen center.



Keystone image is created when the projector beam is projected at an angle on the screen. Keystone correction restores the distorted image to a rectangular or square shape.




Clean the air filter screen

The air filter screen should be cleaned every 1500 hours. Please use a vacuum cleaner to remove dust from the outside of the vent hole

When the accumulated dust on the filter screen becomes difficult to remove with a vacuum cleaner, please remove the air filter screen and clean it


- 1. Turn off the power and unplug the power cord
- Put the bottom of the projector upward and pry up the air filter cover at the groove by hand, as shown in the figure
- 3. Remove the air filter screen
- 4. Clean the air net with a neutral detergent solution and dry it outside in a cool place.
- 5. The ventilation openings around the projector should also be cleaned with a vacuum cleaner
- 6. Put the air filter back into the slot of the air filter cover, and then insert it back into the projector



Note:

If you neglect to clean the air filter screen, it may lead to dust accumulation, resulting in poor internal heat dissipation (heat accumulation), leading to unit failure

Controls of Remote




Install / Remove Batteries of Remote

Remove the battery compartment cover on the back of your remote by carefully sliding to open. The battery cover can then be lifted away. Fit the correct batteries (not included), referring to the polarity markings. Finally, replace the cover.


NOTES:


- Batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as placing under the sunlight or near a fire.

- Do not recharge a non-rechargeable battery.









Install Power Adapter

Follow below picture to connect power adapter

Connect small end of adapter to DC IN jack on the side of the unit first and then plug the adapter body to power outlet.

Main Operation

U - Press the button to switch on unit, press again to standby mode.

SOURCE - Press the button to home screen to select input source.

DVD MENU - Press the button to enter DVD menu.

DVD SETUP – Press the button to access the title screen on a loaded DVD.


TITLE – In DVD mode, press the button to entert DVD Title

Connect HDMI Show The Image On Projector Screen

Refer to the following picture to connect a set top box, a BD/DVD player or a streaming player to the HDMI input.

- 1. Turn off the unit before connect HDMI cable.
- 2. After connection, press the **U** button to turn on unit and power indicator will light GREEN
- 3. Press the **SOURCE** button to select HDMI and press button. The video from the connected device will be shown on projector screen.
- 4. Press the **U** button to turn unit to standby.



Connect AV Show The Image On Projector Screen

Follow below picture to connect AV cable and device.

- 1. Turn off the unit before connect AV cable.
- 2. After connect, press the U button to turn on unit and power indicator will light GREEN
- 3. Press the **SOURCE** button to select AV mode and press ob button. The video of AV device will show on projector screen.
- 4. Press the **U** button to turn the unit to standby.



Connect Audio Output (Aux Out / Line Out / Earphones)

Follow the below picture to connect audio cable and device.

- Turn off the unit before connect an audio cable.
- 2. After connect and turn on both units. Your projector sound from external device now.
- 3. After using, turn off both unit





Install USB Device and TF card (Micro SD Card)

Follow the below picture to install USB / TF card

Turn off the unit before connect USB / TF card.



Note: This USB port is only used to read USB flash disk. DO NOT use it to charge any external equipment.

Using TF Card (Micro SD Card) and USB Playback (Media Player)


Install USB / TF device:

- Press the U button to turn off the unit before install USB / TF card.
- Install the USB device into USB port / Install the TF device into TF slot.
- After connect, press the U button to turn on unit and the power indicator light GREEN.
- In home screen, use buttons to select MOVIE / PHOTO / MUSIC / TEXT icon and press the ok button to enter.

Note: if not on the home screen, press the SOURCE buttons to return home screen.

- After selection, press the button to select C and press button. Note: if both USB device and TF card install, unit will assign first install device as C and second install device as D.
- buttons to search the correct file to wait for a while for preview playback and press the ok button to playback file.
- Press button to fast search forward and rewind. 7.
- Press button to search next or previous file.
- During playback, press the button to pause and press again to resume.

NOTE: Remove USB / TF device, press the U button to standby mode FIRST.



Note: If hot plug cause the unit hang up or malfunction, reset the unit by unplug the DC IN power jack from the rear right side of the unit. Wait for 10 seconds before reconnecting the power and turning the unit back on.

Using Bluetooth Playback (Transmitter)

Pairing is the term used when two Bluetooth devices are connected wirelessly for the first time. This allows the devices to see each other and sets up a one to one communication channel between both devices.

Bluetooth Connection

- 1. Turn on your External Bluetooth Speaker and select to Bluetooth pairing mode. Note: The effective distance between your external device and projector is within 10 meters (30 feet).
- 2. Press the **b**utton to turn on unit.
- 3. Press MENU button to enter the projector menu screen on the unit panel.

Or in home screen, select **MENU** icon to enter the projector menu screen on remote.




- 4. Use the **◄**/▶ button to select **Sound** menu.
- 5. Use the ▲ / ▼ button to select **BT Setting** column as figure 1.
- Press the \bigcirc button to enter BT Setting menu and use \triangle / ∇ button to select **On**. (If BT Setting is On, press the OK objection to enter BT Setting menu.)
- 10. Unit will try to reconnect the previous Bluetooth device, if it is connected before. If not, select Search BT and press (9) button to search device.
- 11. Wait a while, the available Bluetooth speaker device name will show in a list as figure 2.

(For example: XXXXXX, YYYYYY, ZZZZZZ and etc.)



- 12. Use the ▲/▼ button to select your desired Bluetooth speaker device and press button to connect.
- 10. A few seconds, an indicator sound will be heard that your projector and external Bluetooth speaker connected. At the same time, there is "C:XXXXXX" to indicate the connected device on the BT Setting menu. Then press Dutton to exit.
- 11. After connection completed, you can listen to music by your Bluetooth receiver device such as a headphone or speaker wirelessly.
- 12. If you want to change to pair with another Bluetooth Enabled Device, please repeat above step 3 to step 10.

Notes:

- 1) After connecting, Bluetooth device's name will be stored and will automatically connect for next time.
- 2) Projector Bluetooth (Transmitter) function can only pair with Bluetooth receiver such as headphone or speaker for music streaming wirelessly. Use your Bluetooth device volume control if necessary.

Disconnect the Bluetooth


- 1. Press the **MENU** button to enter the projector menu screen on the unit panel. Or in home screen, select **MENU** icon to enter the projector menu screen on remote.
- 2. Use the **◄/▶** button to select **Sound** menu.

- 4. Use the ▲ / ▼ button to select Off and press the button to disconnect the Bluetooth function. Then press ⊃ button to exit.





Using DVD playback

PLEASE READ THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

DVD mechanisms used in devices like this are designed to fully read all commercial DVDs. They will also read self-compiled DVD-R/DVDVD-RW discs but it may take up to 10 seconds for playback to start. If playback does not start, it is likely due to the quality of the DVD-R/RW disc and/or the compatibility of the CD compilation software. Manufacturer is not responsible for the playback quality of CD-R/RW discs.

Do not attach a label or seal to either side of the DVD-R/RW disc. It may cause a malfunction.

- 1. Press the **b** button to turn on unit and the power indicator light GREEN.
- 2. Unit default in home page, use buttons to select the DVD mode.
 (if not, press the SOURCE button to enter and use ▲ / ▼ buttons to select DVD mode and press button.)

- 3. Open the disc cover and insert a playable

 DVD or CD disc, make sure the label side is facing up, and then close disc cover.
- 4. The player will scan the disc, and then the playback will start automatically. If a disc menu appears on the screen, see "Using the disc menu" for details.

- Press ◀/▶ button to fast search forward and rewind.
- 6. Press

 √ ▶ button to search next or previous file.
- 7. During playback, press the **M** button to pause and press again to resume

Disc handling:

- Do not leave discs near heat sources, in direct sunlight, or in high humidity.
- Store discs in their cases when they are not being used.
- Stacking discs or standing them at an angle without putting them in the case can cause the disc to warp.
- Do not touch the disc surface when handling a disc; hold it by the edges.
- Fingerprints, dust, dirt or scratches on the disc can distort the picture or reduce sound quality. Always handle carefully and make sure discs are clean before use.
- Do not stick paper or tape onto the disc.
- Do not write on the disc with a marker ,etc. Clean discs using a soft cloth, lightly wiping from the center outwards.
- Do not use solvents such as benzene, commercially available cleaner snot intended for CDs or anti-static spray intended for vinyl, as these may damage your disc.







You must pay attention to the following points:

- 1. Place the DVD on the projector before turning it on.
- 2. Do not place the projector upright, as it will damage the DVD.
- 3. Do not support Blu-ray DVD.

Note: This DVD player has the function of direct continuous playback. However there are also situations where the playback stop reading, you can refer to the following question to troubleshoot. There are many reasons why they stop reading, mainly due to disc problems:


- 1. The disc is scratched, the disc is not burned well, and the disc is not flat, which may cause the disc to stop reading. It is necessary for you to try to replace other DVD discs to test whether the same situation occurs
- 2. The error correction function of the DVD player is impaired. DVDs have an automatic error correction function, which can make the discs with slight scratches and unevenness automatically correct and play normally, but the discs with serious problems cannot be corrected. If there is a problem with the error correction function, there may also be a problem with reading the disc. The error correction function alone is less likely to have a problem, because it makes the function on the motherboard chip, if the motherboard has a problem, the whole machine may not be able to play at all.

- 3. The DVD is not placed steadily. After a period of operation, the internal parts are worn out and cannot be played normally
- 4. The projector can only be connected to a Bluetooth speaker not a smartphone.
- 5. Due to copyright issues, Netflix / Disney / Amazon prohibits playing movies directly from the projector. You can use a TV Stick to connect the projector to watch movies from Netflix, Hulu and other similar services
- 6. When using HDMI to connect a TV or laptop to a projector you need to select the input Source as HDMI in the projector. If you use an HDMI cable to connect to the projectors HDMI1 port, you need to select the corresponding HDMI1 Source interface in the projector.
- 7. If there is no sound from the stereo audio output when playing media contents from a set top box, BD/DVD or streaming players connecting to the HDMI input please check the set top box or the players digital audio settings and make sure it is set to "PCM Stereo" Mode.
- 8. Please take out the protection card inside before using the DVD.
