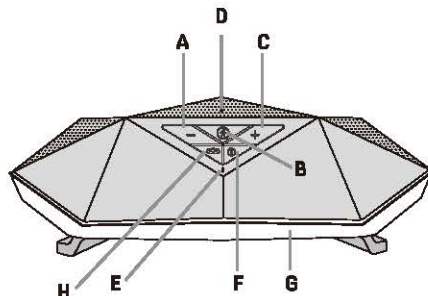

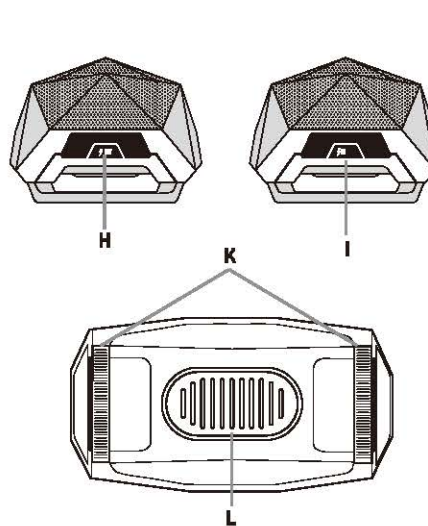


## ANATOMY

## POWER UP



### TO CHARGE

For best results, fully charge your Range before use!

1. Connect the included USB-C cord to a power source and the charging port on the Range
2. The red LED stays solid until charged, then shuts off. (Full charge time is about 4 hours.)

### Battery Notifications

Voice prompts:

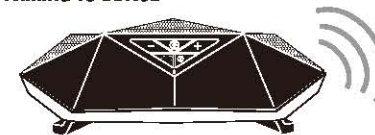

Battery High	"battery high" 1x	No Light

answer call/end call/reject call		Short press once
Siri/voice activation		Short press 2 times
Lantern on/change mode		Short press once
EQ swift Outdoor/Indoor		Long press once

## PAIRING TO DEVICE



### Enter Pairing Mode (Automatic)

When powered on the blue LED light will flash every second, this indicates that the speaker is in pairing mode. Then it will shut off when connected. Voice Prompt: "Pairing".

### Pairing The Range to Device

Open the Bluetooth settings on your device. If you have put your Range into pairing mode, it should be listed as "ODT Range" as an available device to pair. Connect with the Range. The voice prompt will state "Paired" when the "ODT Range" and your device are connected.

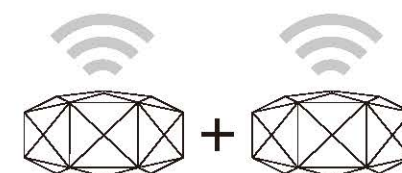
### Hi-Jack Mode

Press the Plus and Minus buttons at the same time, (press and hold for 2 seconds) voice prompt: "pairing". Blue LED flashes every 1 second. LED Light will shut off when connected.

### Connection Lost

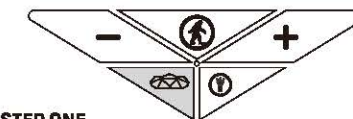
When speaker loses connection, voice prompt: "disconnected". Blue LED stays on until auto connection or auto shut down occurs.

## SPEAKER TO SPEAKER PAIRING



The Range #1

The Range #2



### STEP ONE

#### Power On

Hold the Power Button for 2 seconds blue LED light will be solid then shuts off. The voice prompt states "Power on".

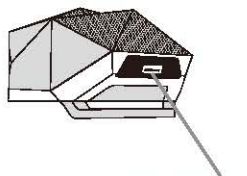
### STEP TWO

#### Pairing to another speaker

Press the Pairing button (short press 1x). Blue LED flashes 2x, pauses 1 sec, then repeats. LED Light will shut off when connected.

After a few seconds both speakers will state "Paired."

## TO CHARGE YOUR DEVICES

1. Connect the USB-C cable to the Range's output port.
2. Connect the other port to your device.
3. Your device should automatically start charging.
4. When the your device is fully charged, disconnect the Range

## LISTEN



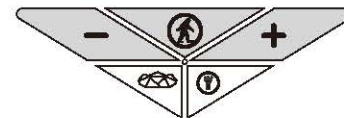
The Range is built to go anywhere, but for optimal sound quality follow the steps below:

- Make sure the Range is resting on its base and facing upwards.
- When connected wirelessly via Bluetooth, it's best to turn the volume on your phone/device fully up and when you use the volume control (-/+ ) on the Range

## MUSIC FUNCTION



Music/Device Controls



FUNCTION	BUTTON	ACTION
Play / Pause		Short press once
Volume up		Short press once
Volume down		Short press once
Skip forward		Press & hold for 2 sec
Skip backward		Press & hold for 2 sec

When user reaches max volume by pressing the Volume Up (+) button, voice prompt will state "maximum volume".

(Volume increments 0-15)

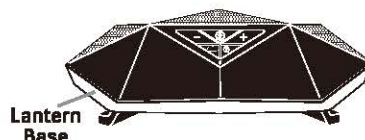

- LANTERN BASE FEATURE:**
- Short Press 1x ON/ Solid white
  - Short Press 1x brighter solid white
  - Short Press 1x solid red
  - Short Press 1x solid blue
  - Short Press 1x solid green
  - Short Press 1x multicolor beating
  - Short Press 1x OFF/no light
  - Long Press 1x to change EQ mode

## TROUBLESHOOTING

- Distortion**
- Lower the volume on your Range and/or phone/device.
- Make sure its charged up. Check for low battery, then charge if necessary.
- Not Loud Enough**
- Turn up the volume on your phone/device or your Range
  - Make sure it's charged up.
- Unable to Pair**
- Confirm your phone/device is Bluetooth compatible.
  - Re-pair: Follow pairing instructions in this guide.

## Signal Loss or Dropouts via Bluetooth

- Move Range closer to your phone/device.
- Make sure it's charged up.
- Turn off your Range and phone/device, then power up and reconnect.
