

## RF Exposure Report

**FCC ID: 2BDK9-BS002**

The EUT is a Dangles in the 2402 ~ 2480MHz frequency band.

According to FCC 1.1310: The criteria listed in the following table shall be used to evaluate the environment impact of human exposure to radio frequency (RF) radiation as specified in 1.1307(b)

Note: f = frequency in MHz

### MPE calculation method

Calculation Method of RF Safety Distance:

$$S = \frac{PG}{4\pi r^2}$$

S: power density mW/ cm<sup>2</sup>;

P: power input to the antenna in mW;

g: numeric gain of antenna;

r: distance to centre of radiation in cm

### Unit dbuv/m@3m to mW calculation method

$$E = EIRP - 20\log(d) + 104.8$$

E: is the electric field strength in dBuv/m;

EIRP: is the equivalent isotropically radiated power in dBm;

d: is the specified measurement distance in m

### Calculated result

### For BT mode

Field strength = 95.13dBuV/m @3m

$EIRP = E + 20\log(d) - 104.8 = 95.13 + 20\log 3 - 104.8 = -0.127\text{dbm} = 0.971\text{Mw}$

### For BLEmode

Field strength = 94.43dBuV/m @3m

$EIRP = E + 20\log(d) - 104.8 = 94.43 + 20\log 3 - 104.8 = -0.827\text{dbm} = 0.827\text{mW}$

Note1: the antenna gain is 0dBi;

Note2: Calculated distance is 20cm, which is declared by the manufacture.
