








The keyboard connects to the Laptop via the Connector. When the connection is successful:

 will display on the bottom of the screen. Choose "Yes" or "No" to proceed.






Charging your Laptop





We recommend fully charging your Laptop before using it for the first time. For optimum performance, please connect the provided AC adaptor to your Laptop when it falls below 20% charge.





The Laptop can be used only the provided AC Adaptor (Zhuzhou Dachuan Electronic Technology Co., Ltd., model no. DCT18W120150US-AO or Debom Technology Co., Ltd with model no. DBS018A-1201500U) to charge the battery.

In order to keep the battery working in best condition, please pay attention to the following:

- The included AC adaptor is for use with this unit only. Do not use it with other equipment.
- Please do not charge the battery in high temperatures.
- Do not wait for the battery to be fully depleted before charging again. Keep the battery charged as needed.
- If your Laptop has not been used for a long period of time, the battery might be in over discharge protection mode and may take longer to charge.

Charging time will vary depending on remaining battery level. Charging from 0% to 70% will take approximately 1.5 hours. You may not be able to turn on your Laptop within a few minutes if the battery was fully drained.

Turning on your Laptop

Starting for the first time

When using the Laptop for the first time, you will be required to setup the following:

- 1. Press and hold the Power button on your Laptop until the ONN logo appears.
- 2. Select your desired language, then tap Yes.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to configure your Laptop.

Turning on your Laptop in standby mode

- 1. Press the **Power** button to turn on the Laptop screen.
- 2. Swipe up from the bottom to unlock screen.



Turning off your Laptop

a: In PC mode:

Tap the ■ icon in the lower-left corner of the screen or click ■ Start key on the keyboard to go to the Start menu.
b: In Tablet mode:

- 2. Tap **O** Power icon in the lower-left corner of the screen, it will display 3 options (Sleep, Shut down and Restart).
- 3. Select Shut down to power the Laptop off.



NOTE

- · Save all data before turning your Laptop off.
- If your Laptop is unresponsive, press and hold the Power button until the Slide to shut down your PC" message appears, then slide it to the bottom edge of the display and the Laptop will be powered off.
- Press & hold the Power button for 10 seconds to force SHUT DOWN the unit.

Put your Laptop to sleep

You can put your Laptop to Sleep mode by doing either of the following:

- Go to the Windows start menu or the Tablet mode and tap Power in lower-left screen, select Sleep and tap it.
- Briefly press the **Power** button to put the Laptop in sleep mode. If you don't
 operate for some time, the Laptop will enter sleep mode automatically.

Tip: You can go to **Settings -> System -> Power & sleep** to set the screen and sleep timeout.

About Windows Activation

Windows will be active automatically once you connect your Laptop to a Wi-Fi network.

Windows 10 Home in S mode

Streamlined for security and performance, Windows 10 Home in S mode works exclusively with apps from the Windows Store. Some accessories and apps that are compatible with other Windows 10 version might not work with Windows 10 Home in S mode, and performance can vary. Certain default settings, features, and apps cannot be changed. If needed, you can easily switch to a Windows 10 Home configuration.

Basics

Gestures for the Touchscreen

Here are some basic procedures for interacting with the touchscreen.

Left edge swipe



Swipe from the left edge of the screen to shuffle your running apps.

Finger slide



Slide your finger to scroll up or down; pan the screen left or right.

Right edge swipe



Swipe from the right edge of the screen to launch the Action Center screen.

Zoom



By placing two fingers on the screen, you can slide them apart to "Zoom In", or pinch them together to "Zoom Out".

Tap/Double tap



To select an item on the touchscreen, lightly tap it.

On the File Explorer desktop, double tap an application to launch it.

Touch & Hold



To move an app, touch and hold the app tile and drag it to a new position;

Touch and hold an app to customize it.

Using the Trackpad

Use the Trackpad to move the cursor or select an item. The left and right buttons of the Trackpad act the same as the left and right buttons of a mouse.

Left-click

- In the Start menu, click an app to launch it.
- On the File Explorer desktop, double click an application to launch it.



Moving

Slide your finger on the Trackpad to move the cursor.



Right-click

- In the Start menu, click an app to select it and launch the Setting bar.
- On the File Explorer desktop, click an application to open the right-click menu.



Dragging and dropping

Press and hold the left button. Select an item using your other finger then drag and drop it to a new position.



Two-finger scroll (up/down)

Slide two fingers to scroll up or down.



Two-finger scroll (left/right)

Slide two fingers to scroll left or right.



Zoom out

Pinch two fingers while viewing a website, map, or image.



Zoom in

Spread two fingers apart while viewing a website, map, or image.



Start Menu

Microsoft Windows 10 is a new operating system that is used to control a computer. Tap the ## icon in the lower-left corner of the screen to get to the Start menu. You can also open the Start menu by pressing the ## Start key on the keyboard.

Action Center

It allows you to receive system notifications, such as updates. It also has a really useful Quick Actions on the bottom.

Checking notifications

- Tap the icon in the lower-right corner of the screen to launch the ACTION CENTER screen.
- All messages appears in the Action Center and you can select and tap them to read.



Tip: You can go to **Settings -> System -> Notifications & actions** to set the Notifications and Actions.



• Select **Expand** or **Collapse** to expand or minimize the **Quick Actions** menu.

Power Management

When the apparatus is not connected power adaptor and not providing the main function or when other energy-using products are not dependent on its function, the default system settings and its characteristics enable the apparatus to activate display sleep mode within 5 minutes of user inactivity, and to activate a distinct sleep mode within 10 minutes of user inactivity. In the same scenario, when the apparatus is connected to power adaptor, will activate display sleep mode within 15 minutes of user inactivity, and activate a distinct sleep mode within 25 minutes of user inactivity. When in sleep mode, the system becomes fully usable within 5 seconds via network connections or user interface devices. The power management function is automatically switched on by the default system settings.

Go to **Settings -> System -> Power & sleep** to manage how your Laptop use power.



Connections and Setup

Inserting a microSD card

Insert the microSD card into the Laptop's microSD slot until it clicks.



To check the storage of the microSD card, go to **Settings -> System -> Storage**.

Remove the microSD card by pushing in on the card's edge. The card will pop out and can be removed.


You can use microSD™card and microSDHC™card (up to 128GB, SD card not included).

External display

You can connect the Laptop to an external display device. The cables required to connect an external display are sold separately.

Connecting to a display

 Connect the Laptop to a TV or other display device using an HDMI cable (not cluded) through the Mini HDMI port.




HDMI cable (not cluded)

2. Turn on your TV or other display device and select its input mode.

3. Go to Action Center menu, select and tap Project.



4. Select your desired mode as following:



PC screen only

Shows the screen on the Laptop only.


Duplicate Shows the screen on both the Laptop and the external display.
Extend Extends the screen to the external display.
Second screen only Shows the screen on the external display only.

Tip: You can also select the dual view (extend) mode. Go to **Settings -> System -> Display**, and select **Detect** on the **Multiple displays** option.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

Connect the Laptop to a wireless network to use the Internet.

1. On the Taskbar, select and tap *6.



Select a network from the list of detected wireless networks and select Connect automatically -> Connect



3. Enter the Access Point's password, if necessary, and select Next.

Tip: You can also go to Settings -> Network & Internet -> Wi-Fi, tap it to On.

NOTE

- If the device finds a network that you connected to previously, it will connect to it automatically.
- If the Wi-Fi network does not appear in the list, it maybe a hidden network, please tap "Hidden Network" and input SSID name of network along with password for a connection.

Airplane mode

The Airplane mode disables the wireless connection, allowing you to use your Laptop safely while in-flight.

If you see 🖟 icon displayed in the lower-right corner of the screen, the Airplane mode is on. You should turn off the Airplane mode to enable the wireless network.

1. On the Taskbar, select and tap *(.



2. Select and tap Airplane mode.

Tip: You can also go to Settings -> Network & Internet -> Airplane mode, tap it to On.

Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to communicate between the Laptop and other Bluetooth devices, such as a smartphone.

1. Go to Action Center menu, select and tap Bluetooth to turn it on.



Then the Laptop will be a discoverable bluetooth device and you can scan it on your other bluetooth device.

Tip: You can also go to **Settings -> Devices -> Bluetooth,** tap it to **On**.

Brightness

You can adjust the brightness level of the screen accroding to your requirements.


Using the keyboard to adjust brightness

Press the F2 key on the keyboard to decrease the brightness of the computer screen.

Press the F3 key on the keyboard to increase the brightness of the computer screen.

Using the taskbar to adjust brightness

Tap the \square icon in the lower-right corner of the screen to launch the ACTION CENTER menu. Drag the bar to adjust the brightness.



Volume

You can adjust the system volume or sound volume when playing music or video.


Using the keyboard to control volume

Press the **F5** key on the keyboard to decrease the sound volume.

Press the F6 key on the keyboard to increase the sound volume.

Using the taskbar to control volume

Tap (1)) on the Taskbar, then drag the adjustment bar to your desired volume.



Troubleshooting

When a problem occurs with the Laptop, it is easy to restore the Laptop to the factory default settings. Back up important data regularly before a problem occurs with the Laptop.

You can go to **Settings** -> **Update & security** -> **Recovery** to recover your Laptop.

Reset this PC

If your PC isn't running well, resetting it might help. This lets you choose to keep your personal files or remove them, and then reinstalls Windows. Tap **Get started** and then choose an option.

Keep my files

Removes apps and settings, but keeps your personal files.

Remove everything

Removes all of your personal files, apps, and settings.

Advanced startup

Start up from a device or disc (such as a USB drive), change your PC's firmware settings, change Windows startup settings, or restore Windows from the system image. This will restart your PC.

If you want to perform this action, tap **Restart Now**.

NOTE: Third-party applications will be removed.

FAQs

1. Do I need to charge my tablet before first use?

Yes, it's highly recommended to fully charge the tablet before the initial use. Using the provided AC adapter connect the cable end to the tablet, and then plug the charger in to a standard wall outlet. Allow the tablet to charge for a minimum of 20 minutes before use.

2. What do the charging lights indicate?

The charge light indicator has some settings as below.

- Off, or no light displayed means the tablet's AC adapter is either not plugged in or has a poor connection.
- Flashing Red color means low battery, plug in AC adapter to charge your tablet.
 Red color light means the tablet is charging.
- · Green color light means the tablet is fully charged.

Note: Leaving your tablet plugged in after it's fully charged will not harm your device or the battery.

3. How do I connect to WiFi?

Navigate to your tablet's settings and then click 'Network & Internet". Select WiFi and use your finger to slide the bar to "ON". Next, simply choose your network from the list of choices and enter your password. Once your password is entered click "Connect". To turn WiFi off, simply slide the bar to the "OFF" position.

4. How do I change the displayed language?

Navigate to your tablet's settings () and select "Time and Language". Then, choose your region and language. You may also "Add a language" and scroll through a list of available languages. Once selected, the language will be added to the system automatically.

5. How do I change the font size?

From your settings menu select "Ease of Access". To make just the text on your screen larger, adjust the slider under Make text bigger. To make everything larger, including images and apps, choose an option from the drop-down menu under Make everything bigger.

6. How do I change screen brightness?

To find the brightness slider, navigate to Settings 🐑 System and then select Display. You may then move the "Change brightness" slider to adjust the brightness.

7. How can I turn the Narrator On or Off.

There are a couple of ways you can turn Narrator On or Off.

- On the sign-in screen, select the Ease of access button in the lower-right corner, and use the toggle under Narrator.
- 2. Click on Settings, Ease of Access and then Narrator. Use the toggle to turn Narrator On or Off.

8. How do I insert and remove the tablet from the keyboard case?

To remove the tablet, simply hold the keyboard portion of the case and lift the tablet from either the top right or top left edge. It should come apart very easily. To reattach the tablet, align the pin connectors on the keyboard to the bottom edge of the tablet.

9. What's the battery life expectancy.

Battery life expectancy is approximately six hours but may vary based on use and the types of applications running on your tablet.

Quick tip: Keeping your screen brightness down can conserve battery life.

10. How often should I update my tablet?

It's always a good idea to make sure you're operating your tablet with the latest updates. To do so, head to settings and click on "Update and Security". Once there you can select "Check for Updates".
