## **Front View**



#### · Proximity sensor

- Turns off the screen and disables touch functionality during a call when the device is in close proximity to the body.
- Turns the screen back on and enables touch functionality during a call when the device is outside a specific range from the body.

#### · Power key

- Press to turn the screen on or off.
- Press and hold to select a power control option.
- Press twice quickly to launch the camera.

#### Volume keys

- Adjust the volume for ringtones, media, notifications, and system sounds. For more information, see "Volume" on page 156.
- In the camera app, press a volume key to take a photo.

#### Bixby key

Launch Bixby. For more information, see

# Set Up Your Device

Learn how to set up your device for the first time.

## **Assemble Your Device**

Install a SIM card and an optional memory card (not included), and charge your device before using.

#### Install a SIM Card and Memory Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a SIM card. You may be able to use your previous SIM card. Contact your service provider for more details.

**Warning**: Small components such as SIM cards and memory cards can pose a choking risk. Please be careful when handling these cards to avoid damaging them.

You can install an optional microSD<sup>™</sup> memory card (not included) to add more memory space to your device. A memory card can be installed at any time. It is not necessary to install it prior to using the device.

**Caution**: Be careful when using the removal tool to eject an internal card tray.

- Insert the removal tool into the hole on the SIM card/Memory card tray, and then push until the tray pops out.
- Place the SIM card on the tray with the gold contacts facing down.
- 3. Place the memory card on the tray with the gold contacts facing down.



 Slide the SIM card/Memory card tray back into the slot.

**Note**: Your device is IP68 rated for dust and water resistance. To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure that the SIM card/Memory card tray openings are maintained free of dust and water, and the tray is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids. #### Charge the Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. A charger (charging head and USB Type-C cable) is included with the device for charging the battery from any standard outlet.

**Note**: You should dry the inside of the charging port before inserting a power connector to charge your device. If the charging port is not fully dry, your device may operate abnormally. For example, it may charge more slowly or overheat. For more information, see "Maintaining Water and Dust Resistance" on page 219.

The battery comes partially charged. You can use the device while charging.

**Caution**: Use only charging devices that are approved by Samsung. Samsung accessories are designed for your device to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may void your warranty and may cause damage.

I. Insert the USB Type-C cable into the USB charger/Accessory port.



- 2. Connect the USB cable to the charging head, and then plug the charging head into a standard outlet.
- Unplug the charging head from the outlet and remove the USB cable from the device when charging is complete.

While charging, the device and the charger may become hot when using wireless charging or fast charging. This does not affect the device's lifespan or performance and is in the device's normal range of operation.

The charger may stop charging if the battery becomes too hot.

If the device heats up while charging the battery:

- 1. Disconnect the charger from the device and close any running apps.
- 2. Wait for the device to cool down, and then begin charging the device again.
  - If the lower part of the device overheats, check for damage to the connected USB cable. Replace the damaged USB cable with a new Samsung-approved cable.
  - If using a wireless charger, do not place foreign materials between the device and the wireless charger.

# Start Using Your Device

#### Turn Your Device On or Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your device on or off.

#### To turn the device on:

 Press and hold the Power key until the device turns on.

#### To turn the device off:

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** key.
- 2. Tap **Power off**, and confirm when prompted.

#### Use the Setup Wizard

The first time you turn your device on, the Setup Wizard guides you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, connect to a Wi-Fi® network, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more

#### Lock or Unlock Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device. By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out.

#### To lock the device:

▶ Press the Power key.

#### To unlock the device:

Press the **Power** key or double-tap Home, and then drag your finger across the screen.

The default Screen lock on your device is Swipe.
To choose a secure screen lock, see <u>"Set a Secure Screen Lock" on page 186</u>.

#### Add a Google Account

Your new device uses your Google <sup>™</sup> Account to fully utilize its Android <sup>™</sup> features.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🞯 **Settings > Cloud and accounts > Accounts**.
- 3. Tap + Add account > Google.

**Note**: When you sign in to a Google Account, Factory Reset Protection (FRP) is activated. FRP requires your Google Account information when resetting to factory settings. For more information, see <u>"Factory Reset Protection" on page 182</u>.

#### Add a Samsung Account

Create a Samsung account for access to Samsung content and apps on your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Samsung account.


#### Add an Email Account

View and manage all of your email accounts.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Cloud and accounts > Accounts.
- 3. Tap + Add account > Email.

#### Transfer Data from Your Old Device

Use Smart Switch to transfer contacts, photos, and other content from your old device. You can also use the included On-the-Go adapter to transfer content quickly and easily from your old device, without installing the Smart Switch app. For more information, visit samsung.com/us/support/owners/app/smartswitch.



**Note**: The USB option must be set to Media device (MTP) on the other device. Transferring content with a USB cable may increase battery consumption. Make sure your battery is fully charged.

#### To use Smart Switch:

- From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps, and then tap Settings > Cloud and accounts > Smart Switch.
- Follow the prompts and select the content to transfer.

#### Set Up Your Voicemail

You can access your voicemail from a Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone.
- 2. Touch and hold 🗓 **Voicemail**.
- 3. Follow the tutorial to create a password, record a greeting, and record your name.

# Learn About Your Device

Learn some of the key features of your mobile device, including the screens and icons, as well as how to navigate the device and enter text using the keyboard.

# **Navigation**

Please note that a touchscreen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a capacitive stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object on the touchscreen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty.

#### Tap

Lightly tap items to select or launch them.

- Tap the keyboard to enter characters or text.
- · Tap an item to select it.
- Tap an app shortcut to launch the app.

#### Double-Tap

Lightly tap items twice to select or launch them.

• Double-tap an image to zoom in or out.

#### Touch and Hold

Touch and hold items to activate them.

 Touch and hold a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

#### **Swipe**

Lightly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

- Swipe the screen to unlock the device.
- Swipe the screen to scroll through the Home screens or menu options.

#### Drag

Touch and hold an item, and then move it to a new location.

- Drag an app shortcut to add it to a Home screen.
- Drag a widget to place it in a new location on a Home screen.

#### **Pinch and Spread**

Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger or spread by moving your fingers apart.

- Pinch the screen to zoom out while viewing a picture or a web page.
- Spread your fingers on the screen to zoom in while viewing a picture or a web page.

#### Touch Sensitivity

Increase the touch sensitivity of the screen for use with screen protectors.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Advanced features.
- 3. Tap **Touch sensitivity** to enable.


#### **Common Options**

The device uses basic command options to perform common actions.

- More options: Tap to view more menu options for a screen.
- Delete: Tap to select items to delete.
- Share: Tap to select items to share, and then choose a sharing method.
- CEdit: Tap to customize the screen.
- On/Off: Tap to turn the option on ( ) or off ( ).
- Menu: Tap to view available options for the field.

# **Navigation Bar**

The Navigation bar, at the bottom of the screen, displays the navigation keys.



#### Full Screen Mode

The navigation keys are hidden in full screen mode. When hidden, you can still use **Home** by touching and holding the area of the screen where the icon is normally displayed.

To enter or exit full screen mode:

► Double-tap the **Hide/Show** icon to the left of the navigation keys.

To view the navigation keys in full screen mode:

► Swipe up from the bottom of the screen to display the Navigation bar.

#### **Navigation Bar Settings**

You can configure the Navigation bar background color and button layout.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap Settings > Display > Navigation bar for the following settings:
  - Show and hide button: Add a button on the left side of the navigation bar to show or hide the Navigation bar.
  - **Background color**: Choose a color for the background of the Navigation bar.

- Hard press Home button: Adjust the amount of pressure needed to touch and hold
   Home by moving the slider.
- Button layout: Choose the order of the navigation keys.

# Customize Your Home Screen

#### Screens

Your device has multiple Home screens to hold app shortcuts and widgets. You can add, remove, change the order of screens, as well as choose a different main Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Use these options to manage screens:
  - To align shortcuts into a line at the top of a screen, tap Align top.
  - To align shortcuts into a line at the bottom of a screen, tap ... Align bottom.
  - To remove a Home screen, tap **Remove**.

- To set a screen as the main Home screen, tap
   Main. This screen is displayed when you tap Home.
- To change the order of screens, touch and hold a screen, and then drag it to a new position.
- To add a screen, swipe to the end of the screens, and then tap — Add.
- To enable Bixby Home, swipe right, and then tap On/Off.

#### **App Shortcuts**

You can use app shortcuts to launch an app from any Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Touch and hold an app shortcut to open the options menu.
- Tap Add to Home.

To remove a shortcut:

- Touch and hold an app shortcut to open the options menu.
- Tap Remove from Home.
  - Removing a shortcut does not delete the app, it just removes the shortcut from a Home screen.

To move a shortcut from one Home screen to another:

- 1. Touch and hold an app shortcut to release it.
- Drag the app shortcut to a new Home screen, and then release it.

#### **Use Folders**

You can organize App shortcuts in folders on an Apps list screen and Home screen.

#### Wallpapers

Change the look of the Home and Lock screens with wallpaper. You can display a favorite picture or choose from preloaded wallpapers.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap **Wallpapers** to customize.
- 3. Tap View all to see all available wallpapers.
- 4. Tap an image to choose it.
  - Infinity wallpapers are applied to all screens.
  - Other wallpapers prompt you to select which screen you want to use it for.
  - If available, tap Motion effect to add movement to your screens.
- 5. Tap **Set as wallpaper**, and confirm when prompted.

#### Themes

Set the theme to be applied to your Home and Lock screens, wallpapers, and app icons.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap **Themes** to customize.
  - Tap a theme to preview and download it to My themes.
- 3. Tap View all to see downloaded themes.
- 4. Tap a theme, and then tap **Apply** to apply the selected theme.

#### Icons

Apply custom icons to replace built-in app icons.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Wallpapers > Icons to customize.
- Tap an icon set to preview and download it to My icons.
  - Tap View all to see downloaded icons.
- Tap an icon, and then tap Apply to apply the selected icon set.

#### **Icon Frames**

You can show icons with shaded frames to make them stand out on the Home screen and Apps list screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Display > Icon frames and choose one of the following options:
  - Icons only: Show icons only.
  - Icons with frames: Show icons with shaded frames.
- 3. Tap **Done**, and confirm when prompted.

#### Widgets

Widgets are simple application extensions that run on a Home screen.

To add a widget to a Home screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Widgets.
- Touch and hold a widget, drag it to a Home screen, and release it.

To remove a widget from a Home screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch and hold a widget to open the options menu.
- 2. Tap Remove from Home screen.

#### **Home Screen Settings**

Customize your Home and Apps screens.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- Tap Home screen settings to customize:
  - Home screen layout: Set your device to have a
    Home and Apps screen, or only a Home screen
    where all apps are located.
  - Home screen grid: Choose a dimension option to determine how icons are arranged on the Home screen.
  - Apps screen grid: Choose a dimension option to determine how icons are arranged on the Apps screen.
  - Apps button: Add an apps button to the Home screen for easy access to the Apps screen.

- App icon badges: Select how to show icon badges when apps receive notifications.
- Add apps to Home screen: Automatically add newly downloaded apps to the Home screen.
- Quick-open notification panel: Enable this feature to open the Notification panel from the Home screen by swiping down.
- Portrait mode only: Prevent the Home screen from rotating to Landscape mode.
- Hide apps: Select apps to hide.
- About Home screen: View version information.

#### Easy Mode

Switch between the default screen layout and a simpler layout. The Easy mode layout has larger text and icons, making for a more straightforward visual experience.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Display > Easy mode.
- 3. Tap **Easy mode** to enable this feature.
- 4. Tap **Apply** to confirm.

To disable Easy mode:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Display > Easy mode > Standard mode.
- 3. Tap **Apply** to exit Easy mode.

The Status bar provides device information on the right side and notification alerts on the left.



### **Status Bar Display**

 $Configure\ display\ options\ for\ the\ Status\ bar.$ 

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings > Display > Status bar**.
  - Tap Show recent notifications only to display only the three most recent notification icons on the Status bar.
  - Tap Show battery percentage to display the battery charge percentage next to the battery icon on the Status bar.

# **Notification Panel**



### View the Notification Panel

You can access the Notification panel from any screen.

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Swipe down the list to see notification details.
  - · To open an item, tap it.
  - To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right.
  - To clear all notifications, tap Clear.
- Drag upward from the bottom of the screen or tap Back to close the Notification panel.

You can also open or close the Notification panel by swiping up or down on the fingerprint sensor.

#### To enable this feature:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Advanced features > Finger sensor gestures.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable this feature.

### **Quick Settings**

The Notification panel also provides quick access to device functions, allowing you to quickly turn them on or off.

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Drag = View all downward.
  - Tap a setting to turn it on or off.
  - Tap More options to reorder Quick settings or to change the button layout.
- 3. Drag = View all upward to close Quick settings.

# Edge Screen

The Edge screen provides a variety of useful tools for notifications, information feeds, and timekeeping.

### **Edge Panels**

Edge panels can be used to access apps, tasks, and contacts, as well as view news, sports, and other information on the Edge screen.

From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen. Swipe left or right to view other panels.

### To configure Edge panels:

 From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen, and then tap
 Edge panel settings.

- Tap **On/Off** to enable the feature. The following options are available:
  - Checkbox: Enable or disable each panel.
  - Edit (if available): Configure individual panels by tapping.
  - Download: Search for and download more Edge panels from Galaxy Apps.
  - More options > Reorder: Change the order of the panels by dragging them to the left or right.
  - More options > Uninstall: Remove an Edge panel from your device.
  - More options > Edge panel handle:
    - Move: Drag to change the position of the Edge panel handle along the edge of the screen.

- Position: Choose either Right or Left to set which side the Edge screen appears on.
- Move from any screen: Touch and hold the Edge panel handle to change its position from any screen.
- Size: Drag the slider to adjust the size of the Edge panel handle.
- Transparency: Drag the slider to adjust the transparency of the Edge panel handle.
- 3. Tap  $\leftarrow$  **Back** to save changes.

### Apps Edge

You can add up to ten apps in two columns to the Apps edge panel.

- From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen. Swipe until the Apps edge panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap an app or app pair to open it.

To configure Apps edge:

- From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen. Swipe until the Apps edge panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap  $\bigoplus$  **Add app** to add other apps to the Apps edge.
  - To add an app to the Apps edge, find it on the left side of the screen and tap it to add it to an available space on the right column.

- To create a shortcut for two apps to open in Multi window<sup>™</sup>, tap Create app pair.
- To create a folder shortcut, drag an app from the left side of the screen on top of an app in the columns on the right.
- To change the order of the apps on the Edge panel, drag each app to the desired location.
- To remove an app, tap Remove.
- Tap Back to save changes.

### People Edge

People edge allows you to quickly communicate with contacts in your My people list.

- From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen. Swipe until the People edge panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap a contact, and tap  $\bigcirc$  Call or  $\bigcirc$  Message.

To configure People edge:

- From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen. Swipe until the People edge panel is displayed.
- Tap Add contact.
  - To add a contact, tap Select contacts.
  - To remove a contact, tap **Delete**.
  - To change the order of the contacts, drag each contact to the desired location.
- 3. Tap **\( \subseteq Back** to save changes.

#### Smart Select

The Smart select feature captures an area of the screen as an image or animation that you can share or pin to the screen.

- From any screen, drag the Edge panel handle to the center of the screen. Swipe until the Smart select panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap a Smart select tool to use:
  - a Rectangle: Capture a rectangular area of the screen.
  - Oval: Capture an oval area of the screen.
  - Animation: Record activity on the screen as an animated GIF.
  - Pin to screen: Capture an area and pin it to the screen.

### **Edge Lighting**

Set the Edge screen to light up when you receive calls or notifications while the device is turned over.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Display > Edge screen > Edge lighting.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable the feature.
- 4. Choose one of the following options:
  - When screen is on: Show Edge lighting only when the screen is on.
  - When screen is off: Show Edge lighting only when the screen is off.
  - Always: Show Edge lighting at all times.

### **Edge Lighting Advanced Settings**

Customize the color, width, and transparency of the Edge lighting feature.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Display > Edge screen >
  Edge lighting.
- 3. Tap **Edge lighting style** to customize:
  - Effect: Choose an edge effect.
  - **Color**: Choose a preset or custom color, and enable app colors.
  - Transparency: Drag the Transparency slider to adjust the transparency of the Edge lighting.
  - Width: Drag the Width slider to adjust the width of the Edge lighting.
- 4. Tap Apply when finished.

### Manage Edge Lighting Notifications

Choose which notifications will light up the Edge screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Display > Edge screen >
  Edge lighting.
- Tap Manage notifications to choose the apps that can activate Edge lighting when a notification is received.

### Quick Reply

Reject an incoming phone call with a text message by placing your finger on the heart rate sensor for two seconds. The call is rejected, and a preset message is sent to the caller.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap Settings > Display > Edge screen.
- 3. Tap Edge lighting > More options > Quick reply.
  - To edit the text reply, tap the default message.

### **About Edge Screen**

You can view the current software version and license information for the Edge screen feature.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Display > Edge screen >
   About Edge screen.

# **Bixby**

Bixby is a virtual assistant that learns, evolves, and adapts to you. It learns your routines, helps you set up reminders based on time and location, and is built in to your favorite apps. For more information, visit samsung.com/us/support/owners/app/Bixby.

You can customize Bixby's chat responses, quick commands, and more from the Bixby Home page.

# **Bixby Home**

The Bixby Home page displays customized content based on your interactions. Bixby learns from your usage patterns and will suggest content you may like.

▶ From a Home screen, swipe right.

- or -

Press the **Bixby** key.

### **Bixby Vision**

Bixby is integrated with your Camera, Gallery, and Internet apps to give you a deeper understanding of what you see. It provides contextual icons for translation, QR code detection, landmark recognition, or shopping.

#### Camera

Bixby Vision is available on the Camera viewfinder to help understand what you see.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (a) Camera > (b) Bixby Vision and follow the prompts.

### Gallery

Bixby Vision can be used on pictures and images saved in the Gallery app.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap 🝪 **Gallery**, and then tap a picture to view it.
- 3. Tap O Bixby Vision and follow the prompts.

#### Internet

Bixby Vision can help you find out more about an image you find in the Internet app.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Samsung** folder > **Internet**.
- Touch and hold an image until a pop-up menu is displayed.
- 4. Tap **Bixby Vision** and follow the prompts.

# Always On Display

View missed calls and message alerts, check the time and date, and view other customized information without unlocking your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Lock screen and security > Always On Display.
- 3. Tap On/Off to enable the feature, and then set the following options:
  - Content to show: Choose to show Home button and clock, Clock or information, or Home button.
  - Always on Display alerts: Show alerts from selected apps about upcoming events on the AOD.
  - Auto brightness: Automatically adjust the brightness of Always On Display.

- Show always: Enable to show the Always On Display at all times.
  - Set schedule: If Show always is disabled, then set a schedule for when to start and end Always On Display.
- About Always On Display: View the current software version and license information.

Some display settings can appear on both the Lock screen and Always On Display (AOD). For more information, see <u>"Lock Screen and AOD Settings" on page 187.</u>

#### **AOD Themes**

Apply custom themes for Always On Display.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap **Wallpapers** > **AOD** to customize.
  - Tap an AOD to preview and download it to My Always On Display.
- 3. Tap View all to see downloaded AODs.
- Tap an AOD, and then tap **Apply** to apply the selected AOD.

# Face Recognition

  - Remove face data: Delete existing faces.
  - Samsung Pass: Access your online accounts using face recognition.
  - Face unlock: Enable or disable face recognition security.
  - Face unlock when screen turns on: Unlock your device with face recognition as soon as the screen turns on.
  - Faster recognition: Turn on for faster face recognition. Turn off to increase security and make it harder to unlock using an image or video of your likeness.

# Iris Scanner

Use iris recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can also use your irises to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account.

  - To rename a fingerprint, tap the fingerprint, enter a new name, and then tap Rename.
  - To add a fingerprint, tap + Add fingerprint and follow the prompts to register a fingerprint.
  - To delete a fingerprint, touch and hold the fingerprint, and then tap Remove.

Use fingerprint recognition to verify your identity in supported apps and actions.

   Fingerprint scanner for the following options:

  - Fingerprint unlock: Use your fingerprint for identification when unlocking your device.

  - Samsung Pass: Access your online accounts using Intelligent scan verification.
  - Intelligent scan unlock: Unlock your device using both iris and face scanning.
  - Screen-on intelligent scan: Unlock your device with Intelligent scan as soon as the screen turns on.

# **Multi Window**

Multitask by using two apps at the same time. Apps that support Multi window can be displayed together on a split screen. You can switch between the apps and adjust the size of their windows.

- About Samsung keyboard: View version and legal information for the Samsung keyboard.

### **Use Samsung Voice Input**

Instead of typing, enter text by speaking.

# **Emergency Mode**

- Emergency alarm: Sound an audible siren.
- Share my location: Send your location information to your emergency contacts.
- Phone: Launch the call screen.
- Internet: Launch the web browser.
- (±) Add: Add other available apps.
  - Email: Launch the Email app.
  - Facebook: Launch the Facebook<sup>™</sup> app.
  - Maps: Launch Google Maps<sup>™</sup>.
- Battery charge: Display estimated battery charge remaining.

- Estimated usage time remaining: Display estimated standby time that can be reached based on current battery charge and usage.
- Emergency call: Dial the emergency telephone number (for example, 911). This kind of call can be made even without activated cellular service.
- More options:
  - Turn off Emergency mode: Disable Emergency mode and return to standard mode.
  - Remove: Choose apps to remove from the screen.
  - Manage emergency contacts: Manage your medical profile and ICE (In Case of Emergency) group contacts.
  - Settings: Configure the available settings.
     Only a limited number of settings are enabled in Emergency mode.

### **Turn Off Emergency Mode**

When emergency mode is turned off, the device returns to standard mode.

- 1. Press and hold the **Power** key.
- Tap Emergency mode.

**Note:** When Emergency mode is activated, Locating method is set to Battery saving. After Emergency mode is turned off, check your location settings. For more information, see "Location" on page 147.

# **Use Apps**

The Apps list displays all preloaded and downloaded apps. You can uninstall, disable, or hide apps from view

### **Access Apps**

Access and launch all apps from the Apps list.

- From a Home screen, swipe up or down to access Apps.
- 2. Tap an app's shortcut to launch it.
  - To return to the main Home screen, tap Home.

### Add an Apps Shortcut

In addition to swiping to access apps, you can add an Apps button to the Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap More options > Home screen settings > Apps button.
- Tap Show Apps button > Apply.

### Search for Apps

If you are not sure exactly where to find a certain setting, you can use the Search feature.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Q Search phone.
- Enter a word or words in the Search phone field. As you type, apps that match are displayed on the screen.
- 4. Tap an entry to go to that app.
  - To customize the Finder search settings, tap
     More options > Settings.

### **Galaxy Essentials**

View and download Samsung apps that are optimized for use with Galaxy devices.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap More options > Galaxy Essentials.

### **Uninstall or Disable Apps**

Uninstall or disable apps you have download.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Touch and hold an app to open the options menu.
  - To uninstall an app, tap Uninstall.
  - To disable an app, tap **Disable**.

**Note**: Some preloaded apps can only be disabled, not uninstalled. Apps that are disabled are turned off and hidden from view.

### **Sort Apps**

App shortcuts can be listed alphabetically or in your own custom order.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap More options > Sort.
  - Custom order: Arrange apps manually.
    - To remove empty spaces between apps, tap
       More options > Clean up pages.
  - Alphabetical order: Sort apps alphabetically.

#### Create and Use Folders

Create a folder to organize App shortcuts on an Apps list screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Touch and hold an app shortcut, and then drag it on top of another app shortcut until it is highlighted.
- 3. Release the app shortcut to create the folder.
  - Enter folder name: Name the folder.
  - Palette: Change the folder color.
  - Add apps: Place more apps in the folder.
     Tap apps to select them, and then tap Add.
- 4. Tap  $\leftarrow$  Back to close the folder.

### Copy a Folder to a Home Screen

Create a folder and copy it to a Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.

#### Delete a Folder

### App Settings

Manage your downloaded and preloaded apps.

- Tap Menu to set which apps to view, and then choose All apps, Enabled, or Disabled.
- 4. Tap More options for the following options:
  - Sort by size/name: Sort the apps by size or name
  - Default apps: Choose or change apps that are used by default for certain features, like email or browsing the Internet.
  - App permissions: Control which apps have permissions to use certain features of your device.
  - Show/Hide system apps: Show or hide system (background) apps.

- Special access: Select which apps can have special access permissions to features on your device.
- Reset app preferences: Reset options that have been changed. Existing app data is not deleted
- Tap an app to view and update information about the app. The following options may be displayed:
  - Uninstall/Disable: Uninstall or disable the app. Preloaded apps can only be disabled.
  - Force stop: Stop an app that is not working correctly.
  - Mobile data: View mobile data usage.
  - Battery: View battery usage since the last full charge.
  - **Storage**: Manage the app's storage usage.
  - **Memory**: View memory usage.

- **Notifications**: Configure notifications from the app.
- **Permissions**: View permissions granted to the app for access to your device's information.
- Set as default: Set the app as a default for a certain category of apps.

**Note**: Options vary by apps.

# Calculator

The Calculator provides basic and advanced arithmetic functions.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Calculator**, and enter the first number.
- Tap an arithmetic function key, and enter the next number.
- 4. Tap **Equals** to view the result.
- 5. Tap Clear to clear the results.

### **View Calculator History**

View and clear your Calculator history.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- 2. Tap **Calculator** > **History**.
  - To return to the calculator, tap Keypad.
  - To clear the calculator history, tap Clear history.

# Convert Units of Measurement

Quickly convert units of measurement using the unit converter.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Calculator** > " Unit converter.
- Select a category and use the drop-down menus to choose units of measurement.
- 4. Enter a numeric value to view the conversion.

# Scientific Calculator

The Calculator app also provides advanced arithmetic functions

- Tap Calculator, and turn the device to landscape view.

#### Calendar View



  - To focus the shot, tap the screen. When you tap the screen, a brightness scale is displayed.
     Slide the light bulb to adjust the brightness.
  - To change the shooting mode, swipe the screen right or left.
  - To quickly switch between the front and rear cameras, swipe the screen up or down.
  - To change a camera setting, tap  $\mathackset{\begin{tabular}{l} \end{tabular}}$  Settings.
- 4. Tap Take a picture.

#### Record Videos

Record high-quality videos using your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap a Camera, and aim the camera at your subject.
- 3. Tap Record to begin recording a video.
  - To take a picture while recording, tap
     Capture.
    - To temporarily stop recording, tap **①** Pause.

      To continue recording, tap **②** Resume.
- 4. Tap Stop when you are finished recording.

# **Configure Shooting Mode**

Allow the camera to determine the ideal mode for your pictures or choose from several shooting modes.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.

#### Rear camera

- Food: Take pictures that emphasize the vivid colors of food.
- Panorama: Create a linear image by taking pictures in either a horizontal or vertical direction.
- Pro: Manually adjust the ISO sensitivity, exposure value, white balance, and color tone while taking pictures.

- Selective focus: Change the focus of pictures after they have been taken. You can focus on subjects near to the camera, far away from the camera, or both. This mode is available on the Galaxy S9 only.
  - **Live focus**: Take artistic pictures by adjusting the depth of field. This mode is available on the Galaxy S9+ only.
- Auto: Allow the camera to determine the ideal mode for the picture.
- Super slow-mo: Record videos at a high frame rate for viewing in slow motion. You can play a specific section of each video in slow motion after recording it.
- AR Emoji: Create an emoji of yourself or add animations, frames, and stickers using augmented reality.

- Hyperlapse: Create a time lapse video by recording at various frame rates. The frame rate is adjusted depending on the scene being recorded and the movement of the device.
- **Slow motion**: Record videos at a high frame rate which can be played in slow motion.
- Sports: Take clearer pictures of fast moving subjects.

#### Front camera

- Selfie focus: Enhance the focus of a selfie by adding blur to the background.
- Selfie: Take selfie shots and apply various effects, such as an airbrushed effect.
- AR Emoji: Create an emoji of yourself or add animations, frames, and stickers using augmented reality.

- HDR (rich tone): Enables the light sensitivity and color depth features of the device to produce a brighter and richer picture.

- Tracking AF: Focus on and track a subject selected on the preview screen.
- Super slow-mo: Record videos at a high frame rate for viewing in slow motion. You can play a specific section of each video in slow motion after recording it.
  - Multi-take: Catch multiple moments in super slow motion while recording a video.
  - Single-take: Record a single action in super slow motion.

#### Front camera

- Picture size: Select a resolution. Selecting a higher resolution for higher quality requires more memory.
- Video size: Select a resolution. Selecting a higher resolution for higher quality requires more memory.
- Timer: Take time-delayed pictures or videos.

- HDR (rich tone): Enables the light sensitivity and color depth features of the device to produce a brighter and richer picture.
- Save pictures as previewed: Save self-portraits or self-recordings as viewed on the camera screen, not as flipped images.
- Shooting methods:
  - Tap screen: Tap the screen to take selfies.
  - Show palm: Hold your hand out with your palm facing the camera to have your picture taken in a few seconds.
  - Tap heart rate sensor: Once your face has been recognized, tap the heart rate sensor to take a selfie.
- Face shape correction: Reduce the effects of camera lens distortion on faces.

#### Common

- Edit camera modes: Enable, disable, and rearrange shooting modes.
- Motion photo: Create a short video by taking pictures.
- Video stabilization: Activate anti-shake to keep the focus steady when the camera is moving.
- Grid lines: Display viewfinder grid lines to help compose a picture or video.
- Location tags: Attach a GPS location tag to the picture.
- Review pictures: Review pictures after taking them.
- Quick launch: Press the Power key twice in quick succession to open the camera.

- Storage location: Select a memory location.
  - A memory card (not included) must be installed to view Storage location. For more information, see "Install a SIM Card and Memory Card" on page 9.
- Voice control: Take pictures using key words.
- Floating Camera button: Add an extra camera button that you can move anywhere on the screen in Auto and Selfie modes.
- Hold Camera button to: Choose an action for when the Camera button is touched and held.
- Press Volume key to: Use the Volume key to take pictures, record video, zoom, or control system volume.
- **Reset settings**: Reset the camera settings.

# Clock

The Clock app offers features for keeping track of time and setting alarms.

# Alarm

Use the Alarm tab to set one-time or recurring alarms, and choose options for how to be notified.

- 3. Tap the following items to configure an alarm:
  - **Date**: Choose the day for this alarm.
  - Time: Set a time for the alarm.
  - Repeat: Choose when to repeat the alarm.
  - · Alarm name: Enter a name for the alarm.

- Snooze: Allow snoozing. Set interval and repeat values for the alarm while snoozing.
- Alarm sound: Choose a sound to play for the alarm, and drag the slider to set the volume of the alarm.
- **Vibration**: Choose whether the alarm uses vibration alert.
- Read time aloud: Read the time aloud when the alarm rings.
- 4. Tap **Save** to save the alarm.

#### Turn Off Alarm

At the set alarm time, the phone sounds the alarm and/or vibrates.

- To stop an alarm, tap **Dismiss**, or swipe
   Dismiss to the left or right.
- 2. To postpone the alarm, tap **Snooze**.

#### Delete an Alarm

You can delete an alarm that you created.

# Stopwatch

The Stopwatch lets you time events down to a hundredth of a second.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap (a) Clock > Stopwatch.
- 3. Tap **Start** to begin timing.
  - To keep track of lap times, tap Lap.
- 4. Tap **Stop** to end timing.

  - To reset the Stopwatch to zero, tap Reset.

#### Timer



By adding a caller to your Block list, future calls from this number are sent directly to your voicemail, and messages are not received.

- Tap an entry under Recent location requests to view the app's settings.

#### Location Services

Location services store and use your device's most recent location data. Google apps can use this data to improve your search results based on places that you have visited.

- Tap an entry under Location services to use as a location service.

# Nearby Device Scanning

Scan for nearby devices to connect to and set them up easily. You receive a notification when there are available devices to connect to.

- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > Nearby device scanning.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable the feature.

#### Connect to a Printer

Connect your device to a printer on the same Wi-Fi network.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > Printing.
- Tap Add service and follow the prompts to add a print service.
- Tap the print service, and then tap More options >
   Add printer.

#### MirrorLink

Mirror your device's display on your car's entertainment and information screen using a USB connection.

To use this feature, your car system must support MirrorLink <sup>™</sup>. For more information, visit <u>mirrorlink.com</u>.

- Connect your device to your car's system using the USB cable.
- 2. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > MirrorLink.
- Tap Connect to car via USB, and follow the prompts.

#### **Download Booster**

Download booster improves download speed by using both Wi-Fi and 4G LTE<sup>™</sup> networks at the same time when downloading files over 30 MB in size.

**Note**: Download booster uses mobile data services.

To turn on Download booster:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > Download booster.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable Download booster.

# Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

Set up and manage your Virtual Private Networks (VPNs). You must set a secured screen lock before setting up a VPN. For more information, see <u>"Set a Secure Screen Lock" on page 186</u>.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > VPN.
- Tap + Add VPN profile and follow the prompts to set up your VPN.

#### Manage a VPN

Use the VPN settings menu to edit or delete a VPN connection

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > VPN.
- Tap Settings next to a VPN.
- 4. Edit the VPN and tap Save.

- or -

Tap **Delete** to delete the VPN.

#### Connect to a VPN

Once you have set up a VPN connection, connecting to and disconnecting from a VPN is easy.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > VPN.
- Tap a VPN, enter your log in information, and tap Connect.
  - To disconnect, tap the VPN, and then tap Disconnect.

#### **Ethernet**

Connect to a network using an Ethernet connection.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Connections > More connection settings > Ethernet, and follow the prompts.

# Sounds and Vibration

Configure the sounds and vibrations used to indicate notifications, screen touches, and other interactions.

    - Temporary mute: Set a time limit for muting the device.

#### Easy Mute

Mute sounds and videos by covering the screen or turning over the device.

- Tap Settings > Advanced features > Easy mute, and tap On/Off to enable.

#### **Vibrations**

Configure your device's vibrations.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > Sounds and vibration.
- 3. Tap options to customize:
  - Vibrate while ringing: Set your device to vibrate in addition to ringing when you receive a call
  - Vibration intensity: Set vibration intensity levels for calls, notifications, and feedback by dragging the sliders.
  - Vibration pattern: Choose from preset vibration patterns or create your own pattern.

#### Volume

Set the volume level for call ringtones, notifications, and other audio.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > Sounds and vibration > Volume, and drag the sliders.

**Note**: You can also use the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. Tap **More** to customize all volume options.

#### Use Volume Keys for Media

# Ringtone

Choose from preset ringtones or add your own.

- 3. Tap a ringtone to hear a preview and select it.

- or -

Tap **Add** to use an audio file as a ringtone.

#### **Notification Sounds**

Customize notification sounds for certain apps or choose a default for all notifications.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Sounds and vibration >
   Notification sounds and tap an option to customize notifications.

#### Do Not Disturb

Set your device to mute all or some notifications and sounds during specific time periods.

- Tap Settings > Sounds and vibration >
   Do not disturb and configure the following:
  - Turn on now: Enable this option.
  - Turn on as scheduled: Configure Days, Start time, and End time to set up a do not disturb schedule.
  - Allow exceptions: Customize which notifications are allowed while your device is in Do not disturb mode.
  - App rules: Manage rules set by apps.
  - Hide visual notifications: Select options for preventing visual notifications for apps silenced by Do not disturb.

# System Sounds

- Concert hall: Simulate the reverb of a concert hall.
- Adapt Sound: Customize your sound settings.

# Separate App Sound

You can choose to have an app play sound on a speaker or headphones separate from the rest of the sounds on your device.

- Tap Settings > Sounds and vibration > Separate app sound.
- 3. Tap On/Off to enable Separate app sound, and then set the following options:
  - App: Choose an app to play its sound on a separate audio device.
  - Audio device: Choose the audio device that you want the app's sound to be played on.

# **Notifications**

Select which apps you want to receive alerts from. Alerts include notifications, sounds, and vibrations.

# Manage Notifications

Allow or block notifications from apps and services.

  - To customize App icon badges, tap App icon badges.
  - To enable notifications, tap All apps, or tap On/Off next to an app.

#### **Smart Alert**

Set the device to vibrate when you pick it up to notify you about missed calls and messages.

- Tap Settings > Advanced features >
   Smart alert, and tap On/Off to enable.

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# Display

Configure your display's brightness, screen timeout delay, and other settings.

# Screen Off Settings

Customize when the screen turns off.

- 3. Tap an option to customize:
  - Screen timeout: Turn the screen off after a set amount of time

  - Drag the Screen zoom slider to adjust the zoom level.
  - Drag the Font size slider to adjust the size of text.

- 3. Tap **Apply** to set the screen zoom and font.

   Smart stay, and tap On/Off to enable the feature.

#### One-Handed Mode

Change the screen layout to accommodate operating your device with one hand.

   One-handed mode.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to enable the following:
  - Gesture: Swipe up diagonally from either bottom corner to reduce the display size.

  - App power monitor: View power usage by app.
  - Unmonitored apps: Select apps to exclude from being put to sleep by the App power monitor.
  - Always sleeping apps: Select apps to put to sleep immediately when not being used.
  - More options > Advanced settings: Configure advanced battery settings and notifications.

## Performance Mode

Optimize your device's performance features to best fit your usage.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > Device maintenance >
  Performance mode.
  - Optimized (recommended): Balance battery life and screen resolution for everyday use.
  - Game: Enhance your gaming experience by making games run more smoothly.
  - Entertainment: Enjoy music and videos with ultra high quality sound and enhanced images.
  - High performance: Experience the highest quality display settings.

# Storage

View the device memory and usage. Mount, unmount, or format an optional memory card (not included).

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > Device maintenance > Storage.
  - To increase available memory, tap Clean now.

#### Memory Card (SD Card)

Once an optional memory card (not included) has been installed in your device, the card memory is displayed in the Storage setting.

For more information, see "Install a SIM Card and Memory Card" on page 9.

#### Mount a Memory Card

When you install an optional memory card, it is automatically mounted (connected to the device) and prepared for use. However, should you unmount the card without removing it from the device, you need to mount it before it can be accessed.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **Settings** > **Device maintenance** > **Storage**.
- 3. Tap More options > Storage settings.
- Under Portable storage, tap your SD card, and then tap Mount.

#### Remove a Memory Card

**Warning**: To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- 2. Tap **③ Settings > Device maintenance > Storage**.
- 3. Tap More options > Storage settings.
- 4. Under **Portable storage**, tap your SD card, and then tap **Unmount**.
- 5. Remove your memory card from the device.

#### Format a Memory Card

**Warning**: When formatting an SD card, you should back up your music and photo files that are stored on the card because formatting the SD card deletes all the stored data.

  - Languages: Select languages for Google voice typing.

  - Hands-free: Allow requests with the device locked
  - Speech output: Select options for spoken feedback.

- Offline speech recognition: Download and install speech recognition engines, allowing you to use voice input while not connected to the network.
- Block offensive words: Hide search results that contain offensive words.
- Bluetooth headset: Records audio through a Bluetooth headset, if available.

### Manage On-Screen Keyboards

Enable or disable on-screen keyboards.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > General management > Language and input.
- 3. Tap On-screen keyboard > Manage keyboards.
- 4. Tap each keyboard to enable or disable.

### **Physical Keyboards**

Customize options when you have a physical keyboard connected to your device (sold separately).

- Tap Settings > General management > Language and input.
- Tap Physical keyboard, and then choose an option:
  - Show on-screen keyboard: Show the on-screen keyboard while a physical keyboard is also being used.
  - Keyboard shortcuts: Show explanations of the keyboard shortcuts on the screen.

### **Show Keyboard Button**

Show a button the navigation bar to quickly switch between keyboards.

#### **Autofill Service**

Save time entering information using autofill services.

### Text-to-Speech Options

Configure your Text-to-Speech (TTS) options. TTS is used for various accessibility features, such as Voice Assistant.

- Tap Settings > General management >
   Language and input > Text-to-speech for options:
  - Preferred engine: Choose either the Samsung or Google Text-to-speech engine.
     Tap Settings for options.
  - Language: Select a default language.
  - Speech rate: Set the speed at which the text is spoken.
  - Pitch: Set the pitch of the speech.
  - Play: Tap to play a short demonstration of speech synthesis.
  - Reset: Reset the speech rate and pitch.

#### **Pointer Speed**

Configure pointer speed for an optional mouse or trackpad (not included).

- Tap Settings > General management > Language and input.
- 3. Under **Pointer speed**, drag the slider to the right to go faster or to the left to go slower.

### Date and Time

  - Use 24-hour format: Set the format for displaying time.

# Report Diagnostic Information

This feature sends diagnostic information about your device when you are having technical problems.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > General management > Report diagnostic information.
- 3. Read and accept the consent information to enable this feature.

### Reset

Reset device and network settings. You can also reset your device to its factory defaults.

### **Reset Settings**

You can reset your device to its factory default settings, which resets everything except the security, language, and account settings. Personal data is not affected.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access Apps.
- Tap Settings > General management > Reset > Reset settings.
- 3. Tap **Reset settings**, and confirm when prompted.

### **Reset Network Settings**

You can reset Wi-Fi, Mobile data, and Bluetooth settings with Reset network settings.

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings General Management > Reset > Reset network settings.
- 3. Tap **Reset settings**, and confirm when prompted.

# Factory Data Reset

You can reset your device to factory defaults, erasing all data from your device.

This action permanently erases ALL data from the device, including Google or other account settings, system and application data and settings, downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files. Any data stored on an external SD card is not affected.

**Note**: When you sign in to a Google Account on your device, Factory Reset Protection is activated. This protects your device in the event it is lost or stolen. For more information, see <u>"Factory Reset Protection" on the next page</u>.

If you reset your device to factory default settings with the Factory Reset Protection (FRP) feature activated, you must enter the user name and password for a registered Google Account to regain access to the device. You will not be able to access the device without the correct credentials.

**Warning**: If you reset your Google Account password, it can take 24 hours for the password reset to sync with all devices registered to the account.

#### Before resetting your device:

- Verify that the information you want to keep has transferred to your storage area.
- Log in to your Google Account and confirm your user name and password.

#### To reset your device:

- 1. From a Home screen, swipe up to access **Apps**.
- Tap Settings > General management > Reset > Factory data reset.
- Tap Reset and follow the prompts to perform the reset.
- When the device restarts, follow the prompts to set up your device.

### Factory Reset Protection

When you sign in to a Google Account on your device, Factory Reset Protection is activated. Factory Reset Protection (FRP) prevents other people from using your device if it is reset to factory settings without your permission. For example, if your device is lost or stolen and a factory data reset is performed, only someone with your Google Account username and password can use the device.

You will not be able to access the device after a factory data reset if you do not have your Google Account username and password. For more information, see "Factory Data Reset" on the previous page.

  - Time: Set the time of day to restart your device.

  - Download updates manually: Check for software updates.
  - Download updates automatically: Update software automatically.

# Screen Lock Types

The various Screen lock types offer high, medium, or no security. Choose from the following: Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password, and None.

#### Set a Secure Screen Lock

It is recommended that you secure your device using a secure screen lock (Pattern, PIN, or Password).

This device is rated IP68 using the Ingress Protection rating system. The device has been tested in a controlled environment and shown to be water and dust resistant in certain circumstances (meets requirements of classification IP68 as described by the international standard IEC 60529 - Degrees of Protection provided by Enclosures [IP Code]; test conditions: 15-35°C, 86-106 kPa, 5.0 feet, for 30 minutes). Despite this classification, the device is not impervious to water damage in any situation. It is important that all compartments are closed tightly.



**Note:** If any liquid is found to have entered device components or an internally sealed system, this condition will void your device warranty.

Follow these tips carefully to prevent damage to the device:

## Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). 

## FCC Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) Regulations for Wireless Devices

The U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has established requirements for digital wireless mobile devices to be compatible with hearing aids and other assistive hearing devices.

When individuals employing some assistive hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants) use wireless mobile devices, they may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and mobile devices also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless mobile devices to assist hearing device users find mobile devices that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all mobile devices have been rated. Mobile devices that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss.



If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated mobile device successfully. Trying out the mobile device with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

**M-Ratings:** Wireless mobile devices rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than mobile devices that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. M-ratings refer to enabling acoustic coupling with hearing aids that do not operate in telecoil mode.

T-Ratings: Mobile devices rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than mobile devices that are not labeled. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. T-ratings refer to enabling inductive coupling with hearing aids operating in telecoil mode.

Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing aid manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise. Under the current industry standard, American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19, the hearing aid and wireless mobile device rating values are added together to indicate how usable they are together. For example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless mobile device meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equals M5.





Under the standard, this should provide the hearing aid user with normal use while using the hearing aid with the particular wireless mobile device. A sum of M6 or more would indicate excellent performance.

However, these are not guarantees that all users will be satisfied. T-ratings work similarly.



The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

## **HAC for Newer Technologies**

This device has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this device that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids.

It is important to try the different features of this device thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this device for information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or device retailer.






## Sound and Hearing
