#### 2.2 Test Mode

- a. The EUT has been associated with peripherals and configuration operated in a manner tended to maximize its emission characteristics in a typical application. Frequency range investigated: conduction emission (150 kHz to 30 MHz), radiation emission (9 kHz to the 10th harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or to 40 GHz, whichever is lower). For radiated measurement, the measured emission level of the EUT was maximized by rotating the EUT on a turntable, adjusting the orientation of the EUT and EUT antenna in three orthogonal axis (X: flat, Y: portrait, Z: landscape), and adjusting the measurement antenna orientation, following C63.10 exploratory test procedures and find X plane with Adapter as worst plane, and the worst mode of radiated spurious emissions is Bluetooth 1Mbps mode, and recorded in this report.
- b. AC power line Conducted Emission was tested under maximum output power.





### 2.5 EUT Operation Test Setup

The RF test items, utility "QRCT Version 4.0.00158.0" was installed in Notebook which was programmed in order to make the EUT get into the engineering modes to provide channel selection, power level, data rate and the application type and for continuous transmitting signals.

### 2.6 Measurement Results Explanation Example

#### For all conducted test items:

The offset level is set in the spectrum analyzer to compensate the RF cable loss and attenuator factor between EUT conducted output port and spectrum analyzer. With the offset compensation, the spectrum analyzer reading level is exactly the EUT RF output level.

Example:

The spectrum analyzer offset is derived from RF cable loss and attenuator factor.

Offset = RF cable loss + attenuator factor.

Following shows an offset computation example with cable loss 4.2 dB and 10 dB attenuator.

 $Offset(dB) = RF \ cable \ loss(dB) + attenuator \ factor(dB).$ = 4.2 + 10 = 14.2 (dB)

### 3.1 Number of Channel Measurement



- 2. The RF output of EUT is connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss is compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 3. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- 4. Enable the EUT hopping function.
- Use the following spectrum analyzer settings: Span = the frequency band of operation;
   RBW = 300 kHz; VBW ≥ RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold.
- 6. The number of hopping frequency used is defined as the number of total channel.
- 7. Record the measurement data derived from spectrum analyzer.

### **3.2 Hopping Channel Separation Measurement**

#### 3.2.1 Limit of Hopping Channel Separation

Frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band may have hopping channel carrier frequencies that are separated by 25 kHz or two-thirds of the 20 dB bandwidth of the hopping channel, whichever is greater.

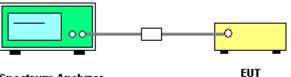

- 2. The RF output of EUT is connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss is compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 3. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- 4. Enable the EUT hopping function.
- Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:
   Span = wide enough to capture the peaks of two adjacent channels;
   RBW = 300 kHz; VBW ≥ RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold.
- 6. Measure and record the results in the test report.



- 2. The RF output of EUT is connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss is compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 3. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- 4. Enable the EUT hopping function.
- 5. Use the following spectrum analyzer settings: Span = zero span, centered on a hopping channel; RBW = 1 MHz; VBW ≥ RBW; Sweep = as necessary to capture the entire dwell time per hopping channel; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold.
- 6. Measure and record the results in the test report.

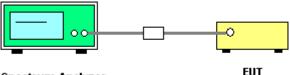

- 2. The RF output of EUT is connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss is compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 3. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- Use the following spectrum analyzer settings for 20 dB Bandwidth measurement.
  Span = approximately 2 to 5 times the 20 dB bandwidth, centered on a hopping channel;
  RBW ≥ 1% of the 20 dB bandwidth; VBW ≥ RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak;
  Trace = max hold.
- Use the following spectrum analyzer settings for 99 % Bandwidth measurement.
   Span = approximately 1.5 to 5 times the 99% bandwidth, centered on a hopping channel;
   RBW ≥ 1-5% of the 99% bandwidth; VBW ≥ 3 \* RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak;
   Trace = max hold.

#### 3.5 Output Power Measurement

#### 3.5.1 Limit of Output Power

The maximum peak conducted output power of the intentional radiator shall not exceed the following: For frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band employing at least 75 non-overlapping hopping channels, and all frequency hopping systems in the 5725-5850 MHz band: 1 watt. For all other frequency hopping systems in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band 0.125 watts. If directional gain of transmitting antennas is greater than 6 dBi, the power shall be reduced by the same level in dB comparing to gain minus 6 dBi.

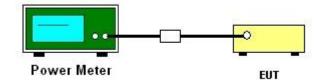

In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the intentional radiation frequency band, the radio frequency power shall be at least 20 dB below the highest level of the radiated power. In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands must also comply with the radiated emission limits.



- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.10-2013 clause 7.8.6.
- 2. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- 3. Set RBW = 100 kHz, VBW = 300 kHz. Band edge emissions must be at least 20 dB down from the highest emission level within the authorized band as measured with a 100 kHz RBW. The attenuation shall be 30 dB instead of 20 dB when RMS conducted output power procedure is used.
- 4. Enable hopping function of the EUT and then repeat step 2 and 3.
- 5. Measure and record the results in the test report.

In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the intentional radiation frequency band, the radio frequency power shall be at least 20 dB below the highest level of the radiated power. In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands must also comply with the radiated emission limits.



#### 3.7.3 Test Procedure

- 1. The testing follows ANSI C63.10-2013 clause 7.8.8.
- 2. The RF output of EUT is connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The path loss is compensated to the results for each measurement.
- 3. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- Set RBW = 100 kHz, VBW = 300 kHz, scan up through 10th harmonic. All harmonics / spurious must be at least 20 dB down from the highest emission level within the authorized band as measured with a 100 kHz RBW.
- 5. Measure and record the results in the test report.
- 6. The RF fundamental frequency should be excluded against the limit line in the operating frequency band.

### 3.8 Radiated Band Edges and Spurious Emission Measurement

#### 3.8.1 Limit of Radiated Band Edges and Spurious Emission

In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the intentional radiator frequency band, all harmonics / spurious must be at least 20 dB below the highest emission level within the authorized band. In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands must also comply with the limits as below.

#### 3.8.3 Test Procedures


- 1. The EUT is placed on a turntable with 0.8 meter for frequency below 1 GHz and 1.5 meter for frequency above 1 GHz respectively above ground.
- 2. The EUT is set 3 meters away from the receiving antenna, which is mounted on the top of a variable height antenna tower.
- 3. For each suspected emission, the EUT is arranged to its worst case and then tune the Antenna tower (from 1 m to 4 m) and turntable (from 0 degree to 360 degrees) to find the maximum reading. A pre-amp and a high pass filter are used for the test in order to get better signal level to comply with the guidelines.
- 4. Set the maximum power setting and enable the EUT to transmit continuously.
- 5. Use the following spectrum analyzer settings:
  - (1) Span shall wide enough to fully capture the emission being measured;
  - (2) Set RBW = 100 kHz for f < 1 GHz, RBW = 1 MHz for f>1 GHz; VBW RBW; Sweep = auto; Detector function = peak; Trace = max hold for peak
  - (3) For average measurement: use duty cycle correction factor method per 15.35(c). Duty cycle = On time/100 milliseconds On time = N<sub>1</sub>\*L<sub>1</sub>+N<sub>2</sub>\*L<sub>2</sub>+...+N<sub>n-1</sub>\*LN<sub>n-1</sub>+N<sub>n</sub>\*L<sub>n</sub> Where N<sub>1</sub> is number of type 1 pulses, L<sub>1</sub> is length of type 1 pulses, etc. Average Emission Level = Peak Emission Level + 20\*log (Duty cycle)
- 6. Corrected Reading: Antenna Factor + Cable Loss + Read Level Preamp Factor = Level
- 7. Radiated testing below 1 GHz is performed by adjusting the antenna tower from 1 m to 4 m and by rotating the turn table from 0 degree to 360 degrees to find the peak maximum hold reading. When there is no suspected emission found and the emission level is with at least 6 dB margin against QP limit line, the position is marked as "-".
- 8. Radiated testing above 1 GHz is performed by adjusting the antenna tower from 1 m to 4 m and by rotating the turn table from 0 degree to 360 degrees to find the peak maximum hold reading for scanning all frequencies. When there is no suspected emission found and the harmonic emission level is with at least 6 dB margin against average limit line, the position is marked as "-".

Note: The average levels are calculated from the peak level corrected with duty cycle correction factor (-24.79dB) derived from 20log (dwell time/100ms). This correction is only for signals that hop with the fundamental signal, such as band-edge and harmonic. Other spurious signals that are independent of the hopping signal would not use this correction.



#### 3.8.5 Test Results of Radiated Spurious Emissions (9 kHz ~ 30 MHz)

The low frequency, which starts from 9 kHz to 30 MHz, is pre-scanned and the result which is 20 dB lower than the limit line is not reported.

There is adequate comparison measurement of both open-field test site and alternative test site - semi-Anechoic chamber according to 414788 D01 Radiated Test Site v01r01, and the result comes out very similar.



#### 3.9.3 Test Procedures

- 1. The EUT is placed 0.4 meter away from the conducting wall of the shielding room, and is kept at least 80 centimeters from any other grounded conducting surface.
- 2. Connect EUT to the power mains through a line impedance stabilization network (LISN).
- 3. All the support units are connecting to the other LISN.
- 4. The LISN provides 50 ohm coupling impedance for the measuring instrument.
- 5. The FCC states that a 50 ohm, 50 microhenry LISN shall be used.
- 6. Both Line and Neutral shall be tested in order to find out the maximum conducted emission.
- 7. The frequency range from 150 kHz to 30 MHz is scanned.
- Set the test-receiver system to Peak Detect Function and specified bandwidth (IF Bandwidth = 9 kHz) with Maximum Hold Mode. Then measurement is also conducted by Average Detector and Quasi-Peak Detector Function respectively.
