



## Frequency Response of E-Field (TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)





Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ± 6.3% (k=2)


## Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$









Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ± 0.5% (k=2)


## Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>) (TEM cell , f = 900 MHz)






Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ± 0.6% (k=2)




## Frequency Response of E-Field (TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)




Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ± 6.3% (k=2)


## Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$






Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ± 0.5% (k=2)


## Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>) (TEM cell , f = 900 MHz)











## Frequency Response of E-Field (TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)













Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ± 0.5% (k=2)


## Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>) (TEM cell , f = 900 MHz)












Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ± 6.3% (k=2)








Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ± 0.5% (k=2)





The dipole is made of standard semirigid coaxial cable. The center conductor of the feeding line is directly connected to the second arm of the dipole. The antenna is therefore short-circuited for DC-signals. On some of the dipoles, small end caps are added to the dipole arms in order to improve matching when loaded according to the position as explained in the "Measurement Conditions" paragraph. The SAR data are not affected by this change. The overall dipole length is still according to the Standard.

No excessive force must be applied to the dipole arms, because they might bend or the soldered connections near the feedpoint may be damaged.









### APPENDIX D: SAR TISSUE SPECIFICATIONS

Measurement Procedure for Tissue Verification:

- 1) The network analyzer and probe system was configured and calibrated.
- 2) The probe was immersed in the tissue. The tissue was placed in a nonmetallic container. Trapped air bubbles beneath the flange were minimized by placing the probe at a slight angle.





### APPENDIX E: SAR SYSTEM VALIDATION

Per FCC KDB 865664 D02v01, SAR system validation status should be documented to confirm measurement accuracy. Reference dipoles were used with the required tissue- equivalent media for system validation, according to the procedures outlined in IEEE 1528-2003 and FCC KDB 865664 D01 v01. Since SAR probe calibrations are frequency dependent, each probe calibration point was validated at a frequency within the valid frequency range of the probe calibration point, using the system that normally operates with the probe for routine SAR measurements and according to the required tissue-equivalent media.
