This transmitter was design to operate in the following frequency ranges:

To aid equipment authorization in other countries that accept the United States FCC Grant for Certification, Motorola (Motorola Solutions Inc) is requesting that the FCC list the above frequency/frequencies under FCC Rule Parts 22, 74, 80 and 90 on the Grant.

For the FCC's Rule Parts 22, 74, 80 and 90 applications, this radio is used in systems by Federal and Public Safety agencies including Police, Fire, and Emergency Medical Services, etc. as indicated in the table below. Equipment programming is the responsibility of Authorized Service Personnel. Also, the radio complies with 47 CFR Part 90.203(e), in that the operator cannot directly program the transmit frequencies using the normally accessible external controls.

Per the FCC's KDB634817 guidance, as an alternative to listing the exact frequencies, we acknowledge that it's a violation of the FCC Rules if this device operates on unauthorized frequencies.
