

For your safety

To prevent severe injury and loss of life/property, read this section carefully before using the product to ensure proper and safe operation of your product.

Power connection

- Use only the power source marked on the product.
- Do not overload power outlets and extension cords. This can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- Completely insert the AC adaptor/ power plug into the power outlet.
 Failure to do so may cause electric shock and/or excessive heat resulting in a fire.
- Regularly remove any dust, etc. from the AC adaptor/power plug by pulling it from the power outlet, then wiping with a dry cloth. Accumulated dust may cause an insulation defect from moisture, etc. resulting in a fire.
- Unplug the product from power outlets if it emits smoke, an abnormal smell, or makes an unusual noise. These conditions can cause fire or electric shock. Confirm that smoke has stopped emitting and contact us at http://shop.panasonic.com/support
- Unplug from power outlets and never touch the inside of the product if its casing has been broken open.

 Never touch the plug with wet hands. Danger of electric shock exists.

Installation

- To prevent the risk of fire or electrical shock, do not expose the product to rain or any type of moisture.
- Do not place or use this product near automatically controlled devices such as automatic doors and fire alarms. Radio waves emitted from this product may cause such devices to malfunction resulting in an accident.
- Do not allow the AC adaptor or telephone line cord to be excessively pulled, bent or placed under heavy objects.

Operating safeguards

- Unplug the product from power outlets before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.
- Do not disassemble the product.
- Do not spill liquids (detergents, cleansers, etc.) onto the telephone line cord plug, or allow it to become wet at all. This may cause a fire. If the telephone line cord plug becomes wet, immediately pull it from the telephone wall jack, and do not use.
- Do not place the corded or cordless handset on the base unit when battery cover is removed.

Medical

• Consult the manufacturer of any

personal medical devices, such as pacemakers or hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF (radio frequency) energy. (The product operates in the frequency range of 1.92 GHz to 1.93 GHz, and the RF transmission power is 115 mW (max.).)

Installation and location

- Never install telephone wiring during an electrical storm.
- Never install telephone line jacks in wet locations unless the jack is specifically designed for wet locations.
- Never touch uninsulated telephone wires or terminals unless the telephone line has been disconnected at the network interface.
- Use caution when installing or modifying telephone lines.
- Disconnect the telephone line before replacing batteries.
- The AC adaptor is used as the main disconnect device. Ensure that the AC outlet is installed near the product and is easily accessible.

• The product is only use for mounting at heights ≤ 2 m.

Note:

- This height is not guaranteed for product reliability.
- To prevent serious injuries due to the product unexpectedly falling, the product must be installed at a height of 1.5 m or lower.
- This product is unable to make calls when:
 - the handset batteries need
 - recharging or have failed.
 - there is a power failure.

Battery

- We recommend using the batteries noted on page 4.
 USE ONLY rechargeable Ni-MH batteries AAA (R03) size.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Do not open or damage the batteries. Released electrolyte from the batteries is corrosive and may cause burns or injury to the eyes or skin. The electrolyte is toxic and may be harmful if swallowed.
- Exercise care when handling the batteries. Do not allow conductive materials such as rings, bracelets, or keys to touch the batteries, otherwise a short circuit may cause the batteries and/or the conductive material to overheat and cause burns.

- Charge the batteries provided with or identified for use with this product only, in accordance with the instructions and limitations specified in this manual.
- Only use a compatible base unit (or charger) to charge the batteries. Do not tamper with the base unit (or charger). Failure to follow these instructions may cause the batteries to swell or explode.
- Avoid the use in the following conditions

 High or low extreme temperatures during use, storage or transportation.

 Replacement of a battery with an incorrect type that can defeat a safeguard.

Base unit location/ avoiding noise

The base unit and other compatible Panasonic units use radio waves to communicate with each other.

• For maximum coverage and noise-free communications, place your base unit:

 at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.

 away from electronic appliances such as TVs, radios, personal computers, wireless devices, or other phones.

facing away from radio
 frequency transmitters, such as
 external antennas of mobile phone
 cell stations. (Avoid putting the
 base unit on a bay window or near

- Coverage and voice quality depends on the local environmental conditions.
- If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move the base unit to another location for better reception.

Environment

- Keep the product away from electrical noise generating devices, such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The product should be kept free from excessive smoke, dust, high temperature, and vibration.
- The product should not be exposed to direct sunlight.
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the product.

- When you leave the product unused for a long period of time, unplug the product from the power outlet.

Setting up

Connections


Base unit

Connect the telephone line cord to the unit until you hear a click. Connect the AC adaptor to the unit by pressing the plug firmly. Fasten the cord by hooking it. Connect the AC adaptor to the power outlet.

Connect the telephone line cord to the single-line telephone jack (RJ11) until you hear a click. A DSL/ADSL filter (not supplied) is required if you have a DSL/ ADSL service.

• Use only the supplied AC adaptor AT-332A-060045A.




Charger

Connect the AC adaptor to the unit by pressing the plug firmly. Fasten the cord by hooking it. Connect the AC adaptor to the power outlet.



Battery installation

- 1 Press down at 1.
- 2 Slide the handset cover **2**.
- **3** Insert the batteries, then close the handset cover.
- Use only the supplied GPI International Ltd. rechargeable Ni-MH batteries 30AAAHC (A).
- Do NOT use alkaline/ manganese/Ni-Cd batteries.
- Confirm correct polarities.



Battery charging

Charge for at least 8 hours.

When the handset needs charging, the display shows "**Low battery**" and there is a warning beep every 2 minutes during a call, recharge the handset before using it again. When charging, **III**) will scroll on the display.



Note when setting up

Note for connections

- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)
- The AC adaptor should be connected to a vertically oriented or floor-mounted AC outlet. Do not connect the AC adaptor to a horizontally oriented AC outlet that faces the floor, such as an AC outlet installed on a ceiling or under a table, as the weight of the adaptor may cause it to become disconnected.

Power failure

The unit cannot be used to make or receive calls during a power failure. We recommend connecting a cordedtype telephone that does not use an AC adaptor to your telephone line.

Note for battery installation

• Use the supplied rechargeable batteries. For replacement, we recommend using the rechargeable batteries noted on page 4 and 7.

Note for battery charging

- It is normal for the handset to feel warm during charging.
- Clean the charge contacts of the handset, base unit and charger with a soft and dry cloth once a month. Before cleaning the unit, disconnect from power outlets and any telephone line cords. Clean more often if the unit is exposed to grease, dust, or high humidity.

Navigating the menus

The phone has an easy to use menu system. Each menu has a list of options, which can be seen on the menu map on page 16.

When the handset is in standby:

- 1 [MENU/OK] to open the main menu.
- 2 $[\blacktriangle] or [\lor] : \rightarrow$ available options.
- **3 [MENU/OK]** to select an option.
- **4** To return to the previous menu level, press **(MUTE/BACK)**.
- **5** To exit the menu and return to standby, press **(OFF)**.

Note:

If no buttons are pressed for 30 seconds, the handset returns to standby automatically.

Date and time

- 1 [MENU/OK], → [▼] "Clock/ Alarm", press [MENU/OK].
- 2 "Date & time".
- 3 [MENU/OK] to select.
- 4 Enter the date using the keypad (e.g. 08-12-20 for August 12th 2020) and press [MENU/OK] to confirm.
- 5 Enter the time (12-hour clock format) using the keypad (e.g. 09:00) then press [▲] or [▼] to select "AM" or "PM" and press [MENU/OK] to save.

Other settings

Dial mode

If you cannot make calls, change this setting according to your telephone line service. the default setting is **"Tone"**, to change this setting, see page 27.

"Tone": For tone dial service.

"Pulse": For rotary/pulse dial service.



Making calls

- 1 Lift the handset and then dial the phone number. To correct a digit, press [MUTE/BACK].
- 2 Press **(TALK/SP-PHONE)** to make a call. To make the call using the speakerphone, press **(TALK/SP-PHONE)**.
- 3 When you finish talking, press [OFF] or place the handset on the base unit or charger.

Note:

While talking, you can switch between the receiver and the speakerphone by pressing **[TALK/SP-PHONE]**. In step 1, you can store the dialed phone number to the phonebook by pressing **[MENU/OK]**.

Auto hang-up: You can end a call simply by placing the handset on the base unit or charger (page 29).

Adjusting the receiver or speaker volume

Press $[\blacktriangle]$ or $[\blacktriangledown]$ to select the desired volume while talking.

Pause (for PBX/long distance service users)

A pause is sometimes required when making calls using a PBX or long distance service.

When storing a calling card access number and/or PIN in the phonebook, a pause is also needed (page 21). **Example:**

If you need to dial the line access number "9" when making outside calls with a PBX:

- [9] → Press and hold [#]. "P" (Pause) will be displayed.
- 2 Dial the phone number → (TALK/SP-PHONE).

Note:

A 3.5 second pause is inserted each time you press and hold [#] (Pause) on the handset.

Answering calls

When an outside call is received, the phone rings and **C** flashes on the display.

- 1 Lift the handset and press (TALK/SP-PHONE) when the unit rings.
- When you finish talking, press[OFF] or place the handset on the base unit or charger.

Auto answer: You can answer calls simply by lifting the handset (page 29).

Temporary ringer off: You can turn the ringer off temporarily by pressing [MUTE/BACK].

Adjusting the ringer volume Press [▲] or [▼] to select the

desired volume while ringing.

Useful features during a call

Mute

- 1 Press [MUTE/BACK]. The display shows "Mute on".
- 2 To return to the call, press [MUTE/BACK].

Flash

(FLASH) allows you to use the special features of your host PBX such as transferring an extension call, or accessing optional telephone services.

Note:

To change the flash time, see page 27.

For call waiting or Call Waiting Caller ID service users

To use call waiting or Call Waiting Caller ID, you must first subscribe with your phone service provider.

This feature allows you to receive calls while you are already talking on the phone. If you receive a call while on the phone, you will hear a call waiting tone.

If you subscribe to both Caller ID and Call Waiting with Caller ID services, the 2nd caller's information is displayed on the handset that is in use after you hear the call waiting tone.

- 1 Press **(FLASH)** to answer the 2nd call.
- 2 To switch between calls, press [FLASH].

Temporary tone dialing (for rotary/pulse service users)

Press [] before entering access numbers which require tone dialing.

Intercom, transferring calls and conference calls

Available for: KX-TGB812

Making an intercom call

If 2 or more handsets are registered to the base unit, intercom calls can be made between two handsets. **C** flashes and the display shows the handset number you are calling.

1 Press **[INTERCOM]** and the other handset rings automatically.

Receiving an intercom call

When an intercom call is received, **C** flashes and the handset number that is calling is displayed.

1 **[TALK/SP-PHONE]** to answer the call.

Transferring calls

Outside calls can be transferred or a conference call with an outside party can be made between 2 handsets.

During an outside call:

- 1 Press **(INTERCOM)** and the other handset rings automatically.
- 2 When the other handset answers, press **(OFF)** to complete the transfer.

Note:

If there is no answer from the other handset, press **(MUTE/BACK)** to return to the outside caller. The outside call resumes automatically after 60 seconds if there is no answer.

3-way conference call

To hold a 3-way conference call between 2 intercom callers and 1 outside caller.

During a call with an outside caller:

- 1 Press **(INTERCOM)** and the other handset rings automatically.
- 2 Once the second handset answers, press [MENU/OK] to join all 3 callers.
- **3** Press **(OFF)** to end the call.

Redial

Making a call using the redial list

The last 10 phone numbers dialed are stored in the redial list (each 24 digits max.)

- 1 (REDIAL)
- 2 (▲) or (▼): Select the desired entry.
- 3 [TALK/SP-PHONE].

Note:

If the caller's number exactly matches an entry stored in the phonebook, the name is displayed.

Storing a redial list number to the phonebook

- 1 [REDIAL].
- 2 [▲] or [▼]: Select the desired entry.
- 3 [MENU/OK] "Save number".
- 4 [MENU/OK] "Enter name".

- 5 Enter the name and press (MENU/OK). The number is displayed.
- 6 Edit the number if necessary, then press (MENU/OK). The number is stored.

Note:

See 'Entering names and writing tips' on page 20.

Deleting an entry

- 1 (REDIAL).
- 2 [▲] or [▼]: Select the desired entry.
- 3 [MENU/OK] "Delete", press [MENU/OK].
- 4 [MENU/OK] to confirm or [MUTE/BACK] to cancel.

Deleting the entire redial list

- 1 (REDIAL), press (MENU/OK).
- 2 【▼】"Delete all", press [MENU/OK].
- 3 [MENU/OK] to confirm or [MUTE/BACK] to cancel.

Handset locator

The handset locator can be used to alert a handset user that they are wanted or locate a missing handset. Locator calls cannot be answered by a handset.

- 1 (•))) on the base unit. The handset will ring.
- **2** To stop the ringing, press any button.

Phonebook

The phonebook can store up to 50 names and numbers. Names can be up to 16 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits.

Storing a name and number

When subscribed to Caller ID, to display the name of the caller instead of the number, save the full telephone number including the area code to the phonebook.

Multiple entries can be stored with the same name. However, to prevent unnecessary duplicated entries, the number can be stored only once.

- 1 [MENU/OK] "Phonebook".
- 2 [MENU/OK], \rightarrow [\bigtriangledown] "Add new".
- 3 [MENU/OK]. "Enter name".
- 4 Enter the name and press [MENU/OK]. "Enter number" is displayed.
- 5 Enter the number and press [MENU/OK]. The entry is saved.
- 6 [OFF] to return to standby.

Entering names and writing tips

Use the keypad letters to enter names, e.g. to store Tom:

(8) once to enter T.

- (6) three times to enter o.
- (6) once to enter m.

Press and hold **[#]** to change the case from Abc to abc or ABC mode.

(MUTE/BACK) to delete the last character or digit.

Press and hold **[MUTE/BACK]** for 1 second to delete all characters or digits.

[▲] or [▼] to move between characters/digits.

 $[0_{-}]$ to insert a space.

Viewing or dialing an entry **1** Press $[\blacktriangle]$

2 [▲] or [▼]: Select the required entry.

OR

Enter the first letter of the name to search alphabetically. The first name that starts with this letter or the nearest letter in the alphabet will be displayed.

Editing a name and number

Phonebook name display

When caller information is received and it matches a phone number stored in the phonebook, the stored name in the phonebook is displayed and logged in the caller list.

To ensure that the caller's name is displayed, make sure the full telephone number, including the area code is stored in the phonebook.

Area code

Phone numbers stored automatically in the caller list will include area codes. If you do not want to dial the area code when making calls from the caller list, you can store the area code which you want the unit to delete automatically. The area code must be 3-digit long.

Voicemail

Voicemail is an automatic answering service offered by your phone service provider. This service can also record calls when you are unavailable to answer the phone or when your line is busy. Messages are recorded on the phone company system. When you have new messages **OO** is displayed if message indication service is available. Please contact your phone service provider for details of this service.

To listen to your voice mail messages, you have to dial your voicemail access number manually.

Important:


