Panasonic also acknowledges that we will provide appropriate notice to ULVS should either of the following occur.

- If we require additional 45 day extension period, we will notify ULVS with a new request letter at least seven days prior to the short-term confidentiality expiration date [Note: up to a maximum of 3 extensions only allowed], or
- We will immediately notify ULVS in the event the information regarding the product or the product is made available to the public. ULVS will then release the documents listed above for public disclosure, pursuant to FCC Public Notice DA 04-1705.
