Getting started



Installing the SIM/USIM card and the battery

The USIM card is a type of SIM card for 3rd generation phones which you get from your operator. It must be installed first, followed by the battery.

Handle the SIM/USIM card carefully because it has metal contacts which can be easily damaged by scratching or bending. Ensure the SIM/USIM card is kept out of the reach of small children.

1. Remove the battery as indicated in the diagram.



- 2. Insert your
 SIM/USIM
 Card by sliding
 it into the card
 slot until it clicks into place.
 Make sure that the gold
 contacts are face down.
- Ensure that the gold contacts on the battery are meeting the gold contacts on the phone.
 Slide the battery onto the contact points using the guides and press it down until it clicks into place.
- 4. Slide the upper part of the phone upwards so you can see the LCD display and keypad.
- Press and hold for more than 2 seconds to turn the power On. The message "PIN1?" appears.
- 6. Enter the PIN1 of your SIM/ USIM card and press (**).

Note: SIM/USIM cards are sold with a PIN1 (Personal Identity Number) already set. Although you can use the card with the preset PIN1, if you want to protect the card from unauthorized use you should change the number to one of your own choice. (See p. XX.)

Caution: If you repeatedly enter an incorrect PIN1 three times, the correct PIN will become locked. Enter the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) when requested and then enter a new PIN twice to activate the SIM/USIM card. (Please contact your retailer for details about PIN and PUK.)

Removing the battery and the SIM/USIM card

- 1. Turn the power Off by pressing and holding **3**.
- 2. While pressing down and holding the battery open/close latch, remove the battery.
- Push in the SIM/USIM card slightly and on release the card will spring out from the card slot.
- 4. Pull out the SIM/USIM card.

Charging the battery

The battery is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Be sure to charge the battery until the charge indicator light goes out on the initial charge.

- 1. Insert the AC plug into an AC power socket.
- 2. Insert the connector into the recharging/USB terminal on the bottom of the phone.

Note: To remove the AC Adaptor, press the release buttons on both sides of the connector of the AC Adaptor and pull it out from the phone.



Using the main menu

The main menu is displayed when (3) is pressed from the Standby display.

Use the navigation pad keys (◀/► and ▲/▼), then press [Select] or
(★) to select a function. The cursor is initially placed in the middle of the icons and if you press (★) again, the phone accesses the Camera menu.

Basic operations

Making a voice call or video call

- 1 Slide open the phone and enter the phone number you want to call using the numeric keys.
- 2 Press to make a voice call or press to make a video call.
- 3 Press of to end the call.

Making a call by pressing a numeric key once (Speed dial)

To make a call, just press a singledigit corresponding to the Quick Dial Number between 2-9 in the Phonebook.

- 1 Enter the Quick Dial Number (from 2 to 9) in the Phonebook.
- 2 Press and hold to make a voice call, or press and hold to make a video call.

Basic operations

Receiving a call

- 1 When you are alerted to a call press (7) or (8) to answer.
- 2 Press so to end the call.

Operations just before you answer

Before answering the phone, you can decrease or mute the ringer volume, or disconnect the call when the phone rings.

- To adjust the ringer volume, press ▲ / ▼ when the phone rings. To mute the ringer, press
- To disconnect the incoming call if you do not want to answer it, press sol.
- To divert your calls to another number, press [Divert] when an incoming call is detected. See p. XX for how to set the destination number.

Operations during a call

You can adjust the speaker volume, change the sensitivity of the microphone, or take a note during a call.

- To adjust the volume, press ▲ / **▼** while on the phone.
- To access the Main menu, press (iii) while on the phone.
- To access other function options such as whisper or mute etc. press [Options].

Activating/Releasing call hold

This service enables you to hold the call until you are ready to resume talking.

• Press [Hold] to put the call on hold. To resume the call, press [Answer].

Whisper Mode

You can raise the microphone sensitivity to enable yourself to speak in a soft voice and still be heard.

 Press [Options] and select Whisper and press (%). To cancel the Whisper Mode, press [Cancel].

Notes: Whisper Mode is automatically cancelled after a call. This function is not available for video calls and when using a

headset or hands-free car kit.

Muting your voice

This function enables you to speak to another person close by while listening in on a phone conversation at the same time.

• Press [Options], select **Mute** and press (%). To release mute, press [Options] and select **Unmute**.

Anti-Nuisance function

This function enables you to reject the incoming call by sending the caller's voice back.

• Press [Options], select Echo Party Voice and press (%).

Note: An empty black screen is transmitted when you use this function during a video call.

Entering a phone number in Dial Note or Phonebook

Basic operations

You can directly enter a phone number and store it in Dial Note or Phonebook during a call.

- 1 Directly enter a number using the numeric keys.
- 2 Press (N), select **Phonebook** or Dial Note, and press (%).

Notes: Up to five numbers can be stored in Dial Note.

> For details about storing numbers in the Phonebook, see p. XX.

For retrieving the stored numbers, see p. XX.

Call Log

The following instructions explain how to redial or return calls using the Call Log.

Opening the Call Log

Redialling or calling back using the Call Log

In Standby mode, press

, select the number you want to redial or call back and press

 to make a voice call.

Call Log options

 Press [Options] from the Call Log display, select the option you want to perform and press
 Note that menu options vary according to the Call Log menu type.

Profiles

When in public areas set up your profiles so you can receive incoming calls or messages without disturbing others with loud ringer sounds. This phone has six types of Profiles, and the one called Silent is selected at the time of purchase. You can easily mute the ringer sound or change the keypad tone volume to suit your surroundings. For example, "Loud" and "Activity" are useful when in noisy surroundings.

Activating or deactivating Profiles

Press and hold ←

Basic operations

Selecting the Profile type

- 1 Open the Profile display.
- 2 Select **On** and press (**W**), and then select the profile to use and press (**W**).

Normal Ringtone volume, key pad tone volume, sound effects volume and melody volume can be customised.

Press [Edit] and select settings for each option.

Meeting All incoming call or message tones are set to the quietest. Beep sounds are generated when an incoming voice call or video call arrives.

Activity : Caller's voice volume is set to the loudest.

Car 🚍:

Ringers and vibration are Off.



All tone volumes are set to the loudest. Vibration is On, and all

incoming call or message tones are Off.

Hands-free function

This function raises the sensitivity of the microphone and the volume of the speaker so that you can talk hands-

Activating the Hands-free function

- 1 Press [Options] on the phone while talking on the phone.
- 2 Select Hands-free On and press (0K).
 - To deactivate hands-free, repeat step 1 and select Hands-free Off.

Text entry

You can enter Traditional Chinese, Simplified Chinese and English with your S103. There are 5 input methods - Standard, T9 English, T9 Stroke, T9 PinYin, and Numeric. The Standard and T9 are used for entering text, and the Numeric is used for entering numbers. The indicators at the bottom left of the display show the language and the input mode you are currently using, except in the numeric mode. For key assignment, see the table on p. XX.

Changing the display language

- 1 In Standby mode, press (R), highlight and press (%).
- 2 Select **Phone Settings** and press (%).

Basic operations

- 3 Select **Language** and press (%).
- 4 Select the language you want to use from Automatic, Traditional Chinese, Simplified Chinese or English.

Changing the Input Language

It is possible to enter text in another language without changing the current language mode setting default.

 Press [Options] in the text input mode, select Input Language, select the desired language, and then press (%).

Changing the font size

· Press [Options] in text input mode, select Character Size and press (%), select the desired font size and press (%)

Changing the input mode

Press 👀 to change the input mode. The input mode changes as follows according to the input

Entering Chinese text

T9 Stroke method

The S103 supports a predictive text input (T9) system that automatically searches for and predicts the best appropriate word by frequency of use. You can thereby enter words much faster and easier.

T9 Stroke is available in Traditional Chinese and Simplified Chinese. Press the to keys on which the stroke is labeled and the corresponding Chinese characters appear. Use the navigations keys to search for the desired charac-

ter. Press (**) to input the character, and the related character list to the entered character are shown. To delete the character list, you can either press (**) or press the numeric key for the next stroke.

For example:

(Change the input method to T9 Stroke)

- To enter "部署": Press (季)(重), and (⑥). Search for "部", press (⑥), then press ▼. Confirm the character by pressing (⑥).
- To enter "認定": Press (图) (19), and press (19) twice to confirm "言". Search for "認", press (19) select "定" and press (19) to confirm.

T9 PinYin method

In Simplified Chinese, use the to see keys on which alphabets are labeled. When you press the numeric key, the corresponding PinYin is displayed according to the frequency of use. Search for the desired PinYin using the navigation keys. When you enter a character, the related character list to the entered character are shown.

For example:

(Change the input method to T9 PinYin)

- To enter " ":
- To enter " ":

Tip: You can press [Tone] while in T9 PinYin method, to use four tones to enter a character.

Entering English text

Standard method

You can enter a letter in Standard text input mode by pressing the numeric key on which the letter is printed. To enter the first letter indicated on the numeric key, press the key once. To enter the second letter, press the key twice, and so on. If you want to enter letters that are on the same numeric key, wait for a second until the bar cursor appears before entering the next letter so that your phone can process the previous letter.

For example:

(Change the input method to Standard input.)

• To enter the letter "o," press (59)

- To enter the word "dog," press
- To enter the word "cat," press

 \(\bar{2}\) \(\bar{2}\) \(\bar{2}\) wait for a second,
 press \(\bar{2}\) and then press \(\bar{8}\) \(\bar{2}\).

T9 method

When you are in T9 mode, just press each numeric key once that contains the letters you want to form a word. T9 then analyses your key presses and attempts to complete the word.

For example:

(Change the input mode to T9.)

To enter the word "Home", press
 ♠, ♠, ♠, ஹ. If your desired word does not appear, press
 ▼ or ♠ to display the word selection window. Use the navigation keys to select "home," and press ♠.

Basic operations

Notes: To accept the word as it is before the word selection window appears, the most common way is to enter a space by pressing

If you do not see the right word after pressing ▼ from the T9 word selection window, press the right Soft key [Spell] to add the word to the T9 dictionary. See below for details.

Adding a word to the T9 dictionary

If you cannot find the right word in T9 mode use the following procedures to enter the word. The word is added to the T9 dictionary at the same time so that you can find it the next time you perform the same keystrokes.

- 1 After pressing ▼ to display the word selection window in T9 mode, press [Spell]. The Add New Word window appears and the input mode is changed to Standard text input mode.
- 2 Enter the word following the Standard text input procedure.
- 3 Press [Insert]. The word is entered and also stored in the T9 dictionary.

Tip: It is also possible to add a word to the T9 dictionary after the word is entered. Placing the cursor at the beginning or end of the word you want to add to the T9 dictionary, press [Range], highlight the word using the navigation keys, and press [End]. Select Save to Dictionary and press (**). Press the left soft key (**) to confirm.

Tip: You can re-select the accepted word. Move the cursor backward and the word becomes underlined. Press ▼ while underlined and the word selection window re-appears.

Entering numbers

The following indicate three different methods of number entry.

- Press and hold repeatedly until the numeric mode indicator, 123, appears. To enter numbers in Numeric mode, just press the corresponding numeric key(s).
- In Standard text input mode, press the desired numeric key repeatedly until it appears.
- You can also enter numbers by pressing and holding the numeric keys both in Standard text input or in T9 modes.

Basic operations

Entering symbols

- Press and hold
 in text input mode. The symbol selection window appears.
- 2 Select the symbol and press (X) to accept it and return to the message entry field. Or you can press [CONT] to enter the selected symbol and retain the symbol selection window to enter another symbol.
- Tip: From the window displaying a list of symbols, press

 to display emoticons. Emoticons are categorized and listed in another window. Press

 √ ➤ or [Next PG] to switch to a different emoticon category.

Deleting letters

- Press to backspace and delete a single letter.
- Press and hold to backspace and delete an entire text field

Tip: You have another option to delete letters. Place the cursor at the point to or from where you wish to delete letters. Then press [Options], select **Delete** and press (a), and then select **Delete before cursor**, **Delete after cursor** or **Delete All**.

Other key functions

Entering a space

 In Standard text input or T9 mode, press o_.

Starting a new line

• In Standard text input or T9 mode, press # twice.

Entering punctuation

 In Standard text input or T9 mode, press preparedly to scroll through commonly used punctuation.

Entering the plus (+) sign for international calls

• Press and hold (OL).

Copying and cutting

Copying or cutting a word

- 1 Place the cursor at where you want to start copying or cutting from, and press [Range].
- 2 Highlight the range you want to copy or cut using the navigation keys, and press [End]. A menu selection window appears.
- Select Copy or Cut and press
 The selected data is saved in the Paste List.

Pasting a word

- 1 After copying or cutting a word or sentence, place the cursor to where you want to paste the copied/cut part.
- 2 Press [Options], select Paste List, and press . The data you just copied or cut appears at the top of the Paste List.
- 3 Select the data and press **(S)**. The selected data is pasted.

Basic operations

Undo feature

Press [Undo] after you have performed a pasting or deleting operation. This cancels the operation and you are returned to the previous display.

Making a video call

- 1 Slide open the phone and enter the phone number you want to call using the numeric keys.
- 2 Press . When the other party answers the call, images of the other party and yourself appear on the display.
 - You may not receive an image of the other party if his or her phone is not correctly set for video calls even though their phone supports them.
- 3 Press so to end the call.

Tip: You can make a call from Phonebook (See p. XX.) or from the Call Log (See below.). When using Phonebook or a Call Log, you can call with the phone closed.

Note: If the other party's phone does not support video calls or the settings are incorrect, the video call can automatically or manually be switched to a voice call. You can set this beforehand by selecting Auto or Manual in Redial as voice call Settings. (See p. XX.)

Redialling or calling back using the Call Log

In Standby mode press , select the number and press

Making a call pressing a numeric key once (Speed Dial)

To make a video call, just press a single-digit corresponding to the Quick Dial Number between 2-9 in the Phonebook.

- 1 Enter the Quick Dial Number (from 2 to 9) in the Phonebook.
- 2 Press and hold **(a)** to make a video call.

Note: If you press and hold instead of we key in step 2, you can make a voice call. (See p. XX.)

Receiving a video call

- 1 When you are alerted to a video call, press ? or ® to answer.
 - It may take about 10 seconds for images of the other party and yourself to appear on the display.
- 2 Press so to end the call.

Operations just before you answer the video call

The same operations are available before you answer the video call as in the voice call.

- To adjust the ringer volume, press ▲ / ▼.
- To mute the ringer, press <u>□</u>.
- To disconnect the incoming call if you do not want to answer it, press s.
- To divert your calls to another number, press [Divert]. See p. XX for how to specify the destination number.

Video call Video call

Operations during a video call

During a video call, you can adjust brightness, white balance, and image quality. You can zoom and switch the sent image between your own-image and the available image as well as choose and send video images stored in the Gallery.

Switching the size and position of the images

The size and position of your ownimage can be switched to those of the other party.

 Press [Options], select Swap Images and press (%).

Muting your voice

This function deactivates the microphone to mute your voice. This enables you to speak with another person close by and still listen in on the conversation at the same time.

 Press [Options], select Mute and press (W). To release mute, repeat the same step above and select Unmute.

Adjusting the frame rate

You can adjust the image frame refresh rate as desired for display or when sending an image.

- 1 Press [Options], select **Video Call** and press (X)
- 2 Select **Frame Rate** and press **®**.

3 Select from **High**, **Medium** or **Low** and press **(M)**.

Note: Select a low frame rate for the best possible video image quality.

Cancelling image transmission

Although, by default, your image is sent in a video call, you have the choice not to send your ownimage. The alternate image set at Alternate Video is sent instead. See p. XX for setting the Alternate Image.

Press [Options], select Turn
 Camera Off / Turn Camera On
 and press to cancel image
 transmission or to resume image
 transmission.

Switching the front/rear camera

The camera can be switched from front to rear or vice versa.

 Press [Options], select Switch Camera and press ®.
 To reverse the setting, repeat the same step above.

Note: You cannot use this function when the phone is closed.

Zooming

You can zoom in or out on the image you are sending.

- 1 Press [Options], select **Settings** and press **®**.
- 2 Select **Zoom** and press **®**.
- 3 Select **Enlarge** or **Normal** and press **(W**).

Video call Video call

Adjusting the brightness or white balance

You can adjust the brightness or white balance of the image you are sending.

- 1 Press [Options], select **Settings** and press (**W**).
- 2 Select **Brightness** or **White Balance** and press **®**.
- Adjust the brightness using ▲ /
 ▼, or adjust the white balance by selecting Auto, Sunny,
 Cloudy, Electric Lamp,
 Fluorescent 1, or Fluorescent 2 and pressing ௵.

Reducing flicker

Occasionally the image may flicker due to less than optimal local frequency. You can use the "Flicker-free" function to reduce this problem. Flicker is likely to occur when you move between areas using different frequencies (50 hertz or 60 hertz).

The Call Manager consists of Phonebook entries, Call Logs and My Numbers (Personal information).

You can store information about people you frequently call in the Phonebook and your own information in My Numbers. In the Phonebook you can store multiple phone numbers, Email addresses, and so on. You can also use the Phonebook to dial phone numbers and compose Email, SMS or MMS directly. Phonebook entries on the SIM/USIM card are stored in the Contact Location (Quick Dial Numbers) 0 to 249. 

Setting the transition time for slides

By default, the transition time for slides is set to one second. You can change this duration.

Gallery

The Gallery is a data management function. It uses folders to manage various kinds of data stored in the phone or on the SD Card.

Accessed from the main menu, you can go to the Gallery to sort, preview, move, copy, or delete files, or edit file names. You can also associate an image with a Phonebook entry or attach it to a message from the Gallery.

Opening stored files

- 2 Select a folder from the list and press **(S)**.
- 3 Select a file you want to open and press **(R)**.

Creating a new folder

- 1 Press (**), highlight ** and press (**).
- 2 Press [Options], select **Create Folder** and press **(K)**.
- 3 Edit the folder name and press **(K)**.

Using files for other functions

You can set a file in the Gallery to be used as wallpaper, an incoming call notification, or a message arrival notification.

- From the Gallery display folder select and open the file you want to use for another function.
- 2 Press [Options], select **Settings** and press **®**.

3 Select the function item from Wallpaper, Ringtones, Hold Settings, Alternate Img/ Video, Phonebook, Calendar, Schedule, or Alarms and press (8).

Resizing a photo

This function enables you to resize a still photo in the Picture Gallery folder.

Using the SD memory card

A Secure Digital Memory card (SD Card) is a compact and portable memory storage device. The S103 enables you to use an SD Card to store photos, video images, sounds, phonebook entries, and downloaded data that does not have copyright restrictions. This is convenient for transferring to a personal computer as well as printing images directly from the SD Card using the DPOF printing function. You can also access the SD Card content by pressing the left soft key when using the Gallery.

Notes: An SD Card which has been formatted by another device such as a personal computer may not operate correctly with the S103. Try re-formatting from the handset. (See p. XX "Formatting the SD Card") The SD Card has a lock to prevent the overwriting of stored data.



To lock the card, move the tab down to the closed position.

Inserting the SD Card

- 1 Be sure that the phone is turned off.
- 2 Open the cover of the SD Card slot as shown in the diagram.
- 3 With the label side facing towards the front, insert the SD Card slowly into the card slot.

- 7 Check if the icon has appeared on the display to indicate that a card is inserted. If not, try inserting the card again from the beginning.

Removing the SD Card

- 4 Pull out the card and close the card cover.

Formatting the SD card

Before using a new SD Card which has not yet been formatted or a card which has been used in a PC or other device, use this function to format the card. Note that all the data stored on the card is deleted when you format it.

- 1 Press (%), highlight (\$\overline{\chi_{\infty}}\$) and press (\$\overline{\chi_{\infty}}\$).
- 2 Select **Memory Settings** and press **(R)**.
- 3 Select **Memory Card** and press (M), then select **Format** and press (M).
- 4 Enter your security code and select [YES] at the confirmation display.

DPOF Printing

Digital Print Order Format (DPOF) is a convenient print selection format which makes ordering prints at a print shop easy. Before you go to the print shop or use the DPOF compatible printer, you can specify which photos and how many of them you want to print from the photos you have stored on the card.

- 1 In Standby mode, press (%), highlight (\$\operations\$) and press (\$\overath{\mathbb{R}}\$).

Photos or videos that have been taken or downloaded pictures saved in the Gallery as well as preset pictures can be set as wallpaper.

- 1 Open the Wallpaper display.

The current wallpaper information is displayed. Press ® to proceed.

- 2 Select **Original** or **Gallery** and press **(K)**.
- 3 Select the desired image and press **(R)**.

Note: See p. XX for details about the Gallery.

Changing input modes and character size

- 1 Open the Character Input display.
- 2 Select an item and press (%).

Input Method: Selects input mode from **Traditional Chinese**, **Simplified Chinese**, or **English**.

Edit Text Templates: Enables the editing of text in 16 categories, Internet, Greeting, Message, Response, Business, and Free (a blank page to use as desired).

Edit Smileys: Enables the editing of various emoticons.

Character Size: Selects the size from **Small** or **Standard** for each of the Input Character, Phonebook, List and Input Phone.

Word List: Up to 160 words can be registered.

Setting the Display Saving mode

The S103 is set to turn off the display illumination after a set idle time. The default time is set to 30 seconds. The display illumination is restored if you press any key.

- 1 Open the Display Saving display.

- 2 Select Show Subdisplay or No Subdisplay and press (§).
- 3 Enter an idle time (30 to 300 seconds) and press (%).

Setting the display backlight and the keypad backlight

You can set the backlight for the display and the keypad separately.

- 1 Open the Light display.
 - Press $\textcircled{\mathbb{R}} \to \mathbf{Display} \to \mathbf{Light}$
- 2 Select from the following options and press **(R)**.

Backlight: Sets the illumination duration from 5 to 99 seconds. Selects the brightness from Minimum or Normal.

Key Light: Sets the illumination duration from 5 to 99 seconds if On is selected. Turns the keypad light off all the time if Off is selected. See below for **Auto Key Light**.

Notes: When setting Key Light to On, if you also set Auto Key Light to On, the phone will automatically determine if the keypad light should be turned on or off according to the brightness of the surroundings to save battery power.

The display backlight settings during a video call are defined separately from these settings. See p. XX.

Customising the Standby display

You can customise various settings for the Standby display: Wallpaper On/Off, Time On/Off, and Display Operator Name On/Off.

- 1 Open the Standby Display.
- 2 Select from the following options and press **(S)**.

Wallpaper: Displays wallpaper on the Standby display if On is selected. Changes to a default background if Off is selected. For how to select the wallpaper, see p. XX. Time: Displays the time in the 24-hour time system on the Standby display if On is selected.

Display Operator Name: Displays the name of the operator if On is

selected.

Changing LED illumination notification patterns

This function is used to select different LED colour patterns to notify you of missed calls, unread messages, or alarm time occurrence (Schedule alarm).

- 1 Open the LED display.
 - Press $\textcircled{\mathbb{R}} \to \mathbf{Display} \to \mathbf{LED}$

- 2 Select On and press (M), and then select from either Missed Calls (Voice Call, Video Call), Messages (SMS, MMS, and Email) or Alarm (Schedule alarm) and press (M).
- 3 Select a colour or **Off** and press **®**.
- 4 Press [Save] to finish the setting.

Phone settings

Setting the clock

It is recommended that you set the clock before starting to use the phone so that all time-related information is displayed correctly. You will need to set the clock to use the camera functions.

- 1 Open the Date & Time display.
 - Press $\textcircled{M} \rightarrow \textcircled{Phone}$ Settings \rightarrow Date & Time
- 2 Select from the following options and press **(S)**.

Set Date/Time: Enters or edits the year, day, and time.
Set Time Zone: Selects a city for your home area.

Time Difference: Selects a city for the time you want to display on the screen.

Daylight Saving: Displays the clock in Day Light Saving time.

<u>Setting home Time Zone and Time</u> Difference

This is an optional function for those who travel between countries or those who want to show the time in other cities without having to adjust the clock. You should set the Time Zone of your phone's clock first, and then set the city to display the time difference. Your Time Zone and the other area can be selected from 36 cities around the world.

- 1 Select **Set Time Zone** and press **®**.
- 2 Select the city for your home area and press [Set] or **(Set)**.
- 3 Select **Time Difference** and press **®**.
- 4 Select **On** and press **®**.
- 5 Select the city corresponding to the time you want to display on your screen, and then press [Set] or .

Adjusting the clock to Daylight Saving Time

If you set **Daylight Saving** to **On**, your phone will show Daylight Saving Time without having to adjust the clock. If you set this to **Off**, the time shown on the screen returns to the normal time.

- 1 Select **Daylight Saving** and press **®**.
- 2 Select **On** and press (**®**).

Setting Ringtones for incoming calls or messages

You can set ringtones for a notification of incoming voice calls or video calls, incoming messages or other notices such as incoming Delivery Report or incoming PUSH.

- 1 Open the Ringtones display.
 - Press $\textcircled{\mathbb{R}} \to \textcircled{\mathbb{R}} \to \mathsf{Phone}$ Settings $\to \mathsf{Ringtones}$
- 2 Select the notification for which to set the ringtone and pressW.
- 3 Set each item and press N.

Settings

Settings

 Press [Play] to play the sounds. Press [Set] after you finish the selection.

Example: To set a ringtone for a voice call

(Ringer Volume): Adjusts the ringtone volume for an incoming call.

(Assign Melody): Selects a sound or melody pattern to be heard when there is a call either from the Preset Melodies or by searching through the Gallery.

(Vibration): Selects a vibration pattern and its strength when there is a call.

(LED): Selects an LED pattern and colour to be displayed when there is a call.

Picture Display): Selects an image to be displayed on the screen when there is a call either from the preset (Original) patterns or by searching through the Gallery.

Tip: If you press [Options] in step 1 on the Ringtones display, you can select All Incomings or All Messages, which enables you to set the ringtone for all incoming voice and video calls, or for all incoming SMS, MMS and Emails.

Note: While setting the ringtone for an incoming message, the ringing time can also be set by selecting the icon (Call Time) in step 3 above. The choices

are **Ring** and **Set Time**. If Ring is selected, the entire piece of music plays; if Set Time is selected, you can specify how long to play the music when a message is received.

Setting the Melody Volume

You can set the melody volume to one of five levels for the following situations.

- When playing sound data saved in the Gallery.
- When playing sound data attached to MMS or Emails.
- When playing downloaded data.
- Open the Melody Volume display.

Adjust the melody volume using▲ / ▼ and press 函.

Setting the phone to offline (Flight Mode)

Flight Mode enables you to set the phone so that it will not receive or make calls although it is switched on. This function is useful for when you want to play a JavaTM application on an aircraft, where the phone should not generate a radio signal. When the mode is activated, appears on the display.

- 1 Open the Flight Mode display.
 - Press $\textcircled{R} \rightarrow \textcircled{Phone}$ Settings \rightarrow Flight Mode
- 2 Select On and press (8).
- To release the setting, select Off at this point.

Setting the display language or date format

- Open the Language display.
 Press (ℜ) → ♠ → Phone
 Settings → Language
- 2 Select the item from the following options and press (%).

Display Language: Enables you to select the language from Automatic, Traditional Chinese, Simplified Chinese, and English.

Date Format: Enables you to select from **DD/MM/ YYYY, DD.MM.YYYY**or **YYYY-MM-DD**.

Setting heightened audibility and better readability (Accessibility)

This function sets the character size to the largest for situations such as when you enter phone numbers, read messages, search in Phonebook, or browse web pages. Also, the speaker volume is set to the highest level so you can hear the other party's voice better.

- 1 Open the Accessibility display.
- 2 Press [Execute] or **®**.

Selecting network area (Select Network)

This function enables you to select the mobile phone network area. The S103 can roam dual network areas. So you can use the phone in the UMTS network area and/or the GSM network. Making a list of network operators and editing that list is also possible. While editing you can also prioritise the access order among these operators.

Opening the Network Settings display

Press
 ⊕ Phone Settings
 → Network Settings

Setting the network area

- Select Search Mode on the Network Settings display and press (**).
- 2 When the current network mode is displayed, press (%).
- 3 Select Automatic, 3G Preferred, GSM Only, or PCS Only and press (R).
 - If you select **3G Preferred**, the phone always goes to the UMTS network first.
- 4 Select **Auto** or **Manual** and press **(K)**.
 - If you select Manual, you will always be required to select a network service operator from the list. If you select Auto, selection of network service operators depends on the setting in the Set Preferred (See below).

Putting priority on the order of network operator access

- 1 Select **Set Preferred** on the Network Settings display and press **®**. A list of network operators appears.
- 2 Select an operator, press [Options], edit the list using the options Add, Insert, Change Order or Delete and press (R).

WAP Settings

Selecting the type of WAP profile

- Open the WAP Settings display.

 Settings → WAP Settings
- 2 Select the profile type and press (%).

Editing the profile

- Select the WAP profile you want to edit, press [Options], then select Edit Profile and press .
- 2 Select Browser Settings or MMS Settings and press ®.
- 3 Enter the following items to edit and press (**®**).
 - IP Address: Sets the IP address
 - Port Number: Sets the port number
 - Connectivity Set: Sets Access point name, User ID, Password, and Linger time.
 - Home Page: Sets the web site URL (Browser Settings Only)
 - Centre URL: Sets the MMS URL (MMS Settings Only)

Deleting the profile

- 1 Select the WAP profile you want to delete and press [Options].
- 2 Select **Delete** and press (%).

Setting the Sound Effects

You can customize an effect tone for each setting described below.

- 1 Open the Sound Effects display.
 - Press $\textcircled{M} \rightarrow \textcircled{Phone}$ Settings \rightarrow Sound Effects
- Select an occurrence for which to use the effect tone and press
 W. Use ▲ / ▼ to adjust the volume and press
 Y to set.
 Press [Tone] to select other available tone patterns.

- Keypad Tone: Selects the confirmation sound pattern and the volume on pressing keys.
- Completion: Selects the confirmation sound pattern and the volume on completing setting or registration.
- Warning Tone: Selects the warning sound pattern and the volume on performing a wrong operation.
- Side Opening: Selects the sound pattern and the volume on sliding open the phone.
- Side Closing: Selects the sound pattern and the volume on sliding the phone closed.

Tip: To set the tone volumes for all the situations above, press [Set All] in step 1 above.

Setting vibration to confirm the connection

This function enables the phone to vibrate when the other party's phone has detected your call. It is set to Off by default.

- 1 Open the Vibrate on Connection display.
- 2 Select **On** and press **®**.

Setting the melody played until your video call is connected

This function enables you to listen to a melody instead of a ringing tone until the other party answers your video call.

- 1 Open the Video Call Tone display.
 - Press $\textcircled{R} \rightarrow \textcircled{Phone}$ Settings \rightarrow Video Call Tone
- 2 Select **On** and press to activate the function. Two menu items appear with icons. Press [Set] after you finish completing the settings below.
- (Melody): Selects a sound or melody pattern for a Video Call Tone either from the preset (Original) patterns or by

searching through the Gallery.

(Volume): Adjusts the volume for the Video Call Tone.

Setting Auto Power On/Off

You can set your phone to be turned on or off automatically at a set time.

Caution: Please make sure that Auto Power On is deactivated before boarding an aircraft.

- 1 Open the Auto Power On/Off display.
- 2 Select **Auto Power On** or **Auto Power Off** and press **(M)**.
- 3 Select On and press (6), and

then enter the time to turn on or off.

4 Press [Set] or ® after you finish the setting.

Answering or ending a call with a sliding motion (Slide Activation)

This function enables you to answer a call by sliding the phone open or end a call by sliding the phone closed.

- 1 Open the Slide Activation display.
 - Press (ℜ) → Phone
 Settings → Slide Activation
- 2 Select Open to Talk or Close to End and press (K).
- 3 Select **On** and press **®**.
 - To release the setting, select **Off** at this point.

Call settings

Call diverting service

Subscribing to this service enables you to divert incoming calls to the numbers you have specified. Setting numbers for both video calls and voice calls is available.

- 1 Open the Diverts display.
 - Press (ℜ) → Call Settings → Diverts
- 2 Select **Voice** or **Video Call** and press **®**.
- 3 Select All Calls, When Busy, No Answer, or Not Reachable Status, and then select On and press (%).
- 4 Enter the destination number and press **(S)**.

Setting Reject Calls

You can reject calls according to the settings described below.

- 1 Open the Reject Calls display.
 - Press (№) → Call Settings → Reject Calls
- 2 Select **On** and press **®**.
- 3 Enter your security code.
- 4 Select a rejecting method and press **(X)**.

Specific Numbers: Rejects calls from the numbers registered in the list.
You can add or edit numbers to be rejected by pressing [List].

Anonymous: Rejects calls from the numbers intentionally set as No Caller ID number by the caller.

Payphone: Rejects calls from a pay phone.
Unidentified: Rejects callerunidentified calls.
Non-registered No: Rejects calls whose numbers are not stored in Phonebook.

Setting the Hold Settings

This function enables you to select a picture or video to display while you have someone on hold.

- 2 Select **Original** or **Gallery**, press **(M)**, and specify the location of the file.

Setting the Auto Answer (Video Call Auto Answer)

This function (available with the use of a headset) enables you to receive calls automatically without touching any keys after a preset ringing time. For setting the Auto Answer for the video call function, refer to "Auto Answer" under the Video Call settings section. (See p. XX.)

- 1 Open the Voice Call Auto Answer display.
 - Press (W) → (Doc) → Call
 Settings → Voice Call Auto
 Answer
- 2 Select On and press (8).
 - To release the setting, select Off.
- 3 Enter the answering time (1 to 29 seconds) and press **(S)**.

Setting Call Quality Alarm On

If this function is activated (it is set On by default), a beep sounds when the signal strength falls below the level suitable for communication

- Open the Call Quality Alarm display.
 - Press (ℜ) → ♠ → Call
 Settings → Call Quality

 Alarm
- 2 Select On and press (%).
 - To release the setting, select Off.

Ambient noise reduction

By activating this feature (it is set On by default), the phone tries to reduce ambient noise to make the other party's voice clearer. Note that when this function is activated, the volume of the other party's voice may become lower.

- 1 Open the Reduce Noise display.
 - Press (ℜ) → Call
 Settings → Reduce Noise
- 2 Select **On** and press **®**.
 - To release the setting, select Off.

Setting restrictions on calls

Restrict Calls enables blocking of outgoing and/or incoming calls. The Restrict Calls password is initially set to 1111. You can make an emergency call even if Restrict Calls is set to On. Subscribing to the service centre is required for the service.

- 1 Open the Restrict Calls display.
- Incoming Calls and press (®), and then select whether to block the following types of calls.

Outgoing Calls: Bar All Outgoing Calls, Only Local & Home, or Bar International Calls

Incoming Calls: Bar All Incoming
Calls or Bar if Abroad

Notes: If you want to confirm the current settings of both Restrict Calls services, select Check Setting in step 2 above.

If you want to set a new password for roaming another service network, select Set Password in step 2 above.

Call Waiting

This supplementary service notifies you of an incoming call from a third party while talking with a second party and enables you to answer the third party by putting the second party on hold.

- 1 Open the Call Waiting display.
 - Press
 ⊕ → Call
 Settings → Call Waiting
- 2 Select Voice or Video Call and press (**).
- 3 Select **On** and press **®**.
- To release the setting, select Off.

Tip: You can confirm the current settings by selecting "Status".

Checking your voicemail

- 1 Open the Voicemail display.
 - Press (ℜ) → Call Settings → Voicemail
- 2 Select **Get Voicemail** and press **(%)**.
- 3 Select Home Mailbox or Roam Mailbox.
- 4 Press or [Call]. The call is connected to the message centre after which you can listen to the answer phone messages.

Tip: You can access the service centre from the Standby display by pressing and holding . See also p. XX.

<u>Cancelling display of the answer phone icon</u>

- 1 Open the Voicemail display, select **Hide Voicemail Icon**, and press (N).
- 2 Select **YES** and press **®**.
 - To release the setting, select NO.

Fixed Dialling Number

When the Fixed Dialling Number is set to On, you can limit your calls to only the phone numbers registered on the SIM/USIM card. You can add or edit the phone numbers (up to 40 digits). You must subscribe for this service.

Activating or deactivating the Fixed Dialling Number function

- Open the Fixed Dialling Number display.
- 2 Select On or Off and press (%).
- 3 Enter the PIN if you are prompted to do so.

Note: If no Fixed Dialling Numbers are registered on the SIM/USIM card, this function is not available.

Adding a Fixed Dialling Number

Setting the Hands-free function

The Hands-free function enables you to talk with the phone placed on a flat and stable surface. The sound coming from the speaker is made louder and the microphone sensitivity increased.

- 2 Select **Voice Call** or **Video Call** and press **(%)**.
- 3 Select **On** and press **®**.

Note: If the Silent, Car, or Meeting Profile is set (see p. XX), you cannot activate the Hands-free setting.

Video calls

Setting the method to switch a video call to a voice call

If you have made a video call to a person whose phone does not have the function, you must switch to a voice call. You can set the switching method to automatic or manual.

- 1 Open the Redial as voice call display.
 - Press $\textcircled{R} \rightarrow \textcircled{O}_{\mathbb{R}} \rightarrow \text{Video}$ Call \rightarrow Redial as voice call
- 2 Select **Auto** or **Manual** and press **®**.
 - If you select Manual, you will be asked if you want to switch to a voice call. If you select Auto the call is automatically switched to a voice call.

Setting an image to send

- 1 Open the Image Settings display.
- 2 Select an image setting option and press **®**.

Frame Rate: Changes the image quality based on transmission options, High Speed, Normal or High Quality.

Send Own Image: Specifies if your own image is sent to callers.

Alternate Img/Video: Sets the alternative video to send instead of your own image.

Setting whether your voice is sent or not

- 1 Open the Voice Setting display.
 - Press $\textcircled{R} \rightarrow \textcircled{Voice} \rightarrow \textbf{Video}$ **Call** \rightarrow **Voice Setting**
- 2 Select an option and press ®.

On: Sends your voice to the other party.

Off: Cancels sending your voice to the other party.

Setting the Auto Answer for a video call

This function (available with the use of a headset) enables you to receive video calls without touching any keys after the preset ringing time. Registering callers' numbers is required before activating this function. Unless

registered, the incoming calls are treated as an ordinary voice call. For setting the Auto Answer for the voice call function, refer to "Setting the Auto Answer (Voice Call Auto Answer)" under the Call settings section. (See p. XX.)

- Open the Auto Answer display.
 Press (R) → (Video)
 - Press (w) → (w) → video
- 2 Press [List], select **New** and press **(S**).
- 3 You can copy phone numbers from the Call Log, Phonebook, and so on, by pressing [Options] and selecting Refer to.
- 4 When you finished entering a number, a list of the registered Auto Answer numbers appears.

- 5 Select the number you selected or entered previously and press [Done].
- 6 Select **On** and press (%).
- 7 Select Auto Answer Tone pattern icon , Tone Volume icon or Answer Time icon , and press to set each item.
- 8 Press [Set] to finish the setting.

Using camera functions during a video call

Look & Feel: Sets the character

Linger time: Selects the time to wait for the internet connection from No Wait Time, 60 seconds, or 90 seconds. Sets the following Security: various security settings for browsing. Secure Prompt: Select On or Off if you want or don't want the phone to notify you with a prompt when the connection turns from a protected one to an unprotected one. Authentication: Select On or Off to save or not save authentication to cache (temporary memory storage used by the phone).

Cookies: Select On or Off to save or not save cookies. A cookie is text file containing user information that a web server automatically sends to your phone when you access a web site. This file may be retrieved by the server at a later point. Send Referrer: Select On or Off if you want or don't want to send HTTP Referrer header information when using the browser. Certificate: Select to display the current certificate or root certificate.

Current Certificate: Select to display the current certificate.

Root Certificate: Select to display the CA certificate details.

Advanced: Select to display page titles while browsing.
Select to accept or reject WAP based service inquiries.

View Title Region: Select On or Off to display or not display the title of page while browsing.

WAP Push: Select **Confirm** to convert service messages that load automatically into requests for service messages, or select **Ignore** to ignore any

WAP based service inquiries.

Security settings

Locking the phone

The S103 provides several locking modes which are described below. When the restriction is set, you will have to enter your security code to proceed. This is so you can prevent others from using your phone.

Note: As for Restrict Calls on the network service, see p. XX.

- 1 Open the Restriction Settings display.
 - Press (𝔻) → Security
 → Restriction Settings

2 Select a restriction option and press **®**.

Key Lock: Locks all the keys and restricts use of the phone except for receiving calls, making emergency calls and diverting calls.

Lock Phonebook: Locks use of the Phonebook or other related functions.

Restrict Dial: Restricts use of Call Logs or direct number input to make outgoing calls. Use of the Phonebook is available.

Auto Keypad Lock: Sets Dial Lock automatically every time you turn the power on.

Setting the Secret mode

You can assign "Secret" status to a phonebook entry and make the entry secret, preventing others from seeing the information. First, you have to set Secret Mode On. Then you must make the entry in the Phonebook (or Schedule) a secret entry. Finally, if you set Secret Mode Off, the secret entries will not be shown on the display.

Setting the Secret mode On

- 1 Open the Secret Mode display.
- 2 Select **On** and press (%).

- When this setting is On, secret entries become accessible. When this setting is Off, secret entries are not displayed on the screen.
- 3 Enter your security code.

Making a phonebook entry a secret data item

- 1 Display the phonebook entry you want to keep secret.
- 2 Select the secret setting icon and press (x).
- 3 Select **On** and press **®**.

Setting your own code

The phone's security code is essential to protect your phone from unauthorised use or to avoid accidental operation. At the time of purchase the security code is set to "9999". We strongly advise you to change the initial security code to one of your own choosing to keep your secret data secure in case the phone is lost or stolen. Keep your new security code secret and if you make a note of it, store that in a safe place separate from your phone.

- 1 Open the Change Handset Code display.
 - Press (ℜ) → (ℜ) → Security
 → Change Handset Code
- 2 Select **YES** and press **®**.

- 3 Enter your security code (initially 9999).
- 4 Enter a new 4-digit security code and press (**). Your security code is changed.

Setting your own PIN code

This function enables you to change the preset PIN. SIM/USIM cards that are sold with a preset PIN. You can use the card with the preset PIN. However, it is recommended that you change it to a PIN you have chosen yourself to protect the card from unauthorized use. There are two types of PIN codes, the PIN1 Code and the PIN2 Code. The PIN1 Code is used for locking use of the SIM/USIM card while the PIN2 code is used for restricting some network services.

- 1 Open the PIN display.
 - Press $\textcircled{N} \rightarrow \textcircled{Security}$ $\rightarrow \textbf{PIN}$
- 2 Select **Change PIN** and press (0K).

Infrared technology enables your phone to send and receive phonebook entries, your phone's information (My Numbers), calendar events, To Do tasks, pictures and videos, etc.

Cautions: Video files in the Video folder can only be received. SD Card data cannot be transmitted.

No incoming calls or messages can be received during Infrared transmission.

Infrared transmission is possible when:

- The two devices are turned on and set to transmittable.
- The infrared ports of the devices are pointing at each other and are within 1 metre of each other.
- There are no line of sight obstructions between the devices.

Precautions when using the SD card and the USB Storage Mode

 Disconnecting the USB cable or removing the SD card while the SD card is being accessed may cause serious damage to the SD card, S103 and computer. There may be some cases on Windows Me/98SE computers in which the S103 device is not indicated in the task tray but it is connected and being accessed. Make sure the SD card is not being accessed before removing either the USB cable or SD card.

- Do not remove the battery pack while transferring data.
- Do not use a computer to modify, move, or add data on the SD card.
- Ensure there is ample battery charge remaining before using. Not doing so may result in data errors or damage, as well as possible problems with your \$103.
- Use an SD card that has been formatted on your S103. SD cards that have been formatted on a computer etc. may not be recognizable on your S103.

 Do not turn off the computer's power switch or change to the standby mode when using USB Storage Mode. Doing so may result in not being able to perform data transfer even after rebooting your computer.

Connectivity

Do not use near medical devices or on board aircraft
