General Notes for Handling

■ Handset

- As V801SA uses radio waves, you cannot make or receive calls where radio waves do not reach such as: indoors, underground or inside a tunnel. Also, your call may suddenly be cut off if during a call.
- When using V801SA in public places, take care not to disturb people around you.
- V801SA is a radio station specified by Japanese radio law. You may be requested to submit the phone for inspection based on this law.
- If you use the phone near a regular phone, TV or radio, the equipment may be affected.
- J-Phone takes no responsibility for loss or corruption of data (such as memory dialing, image or sound data) that has been registered in your V801SA due to accidents or equipment malfunctions. It is recommended that you always make a separate record of important data such as memory dial data.
- 3G (Japan) mode can be used only in Japan.

■ Using Handset in Automobiles

- It is dangerous to use V801SA while driving a car and should be avoided.
- Do not stop your car in a prohibited place to use V801SA.
- If you use V801SA in a car, in rare cases it may affect the electronic equipment in the car, depending on the type of car.

■ Aboard Aircraft

Never use your phone or switch it on in an aircraft.

■ Maintenance

- Do not use V801SA in extremely high or low temperatures or where exposed to direct sunlight.

■ General care

The handset contains delicate electronic circuitry, magnets and battery systems. You should treat it with care and give particular attention to the following points:

- Do not allow the handset or its accessories to come into contact with liquids or moisture at anytime.
- Do not paint the handset.
- Do not drop or subject the handset to rough treatment.
- Do not place the handset alongside computer disks, credit cards, travel cards and other magnetic media. The information contained on disks or cards may be affected by the handset.
- Do not leave the handset or the battery in places where the temperature could exceed 60°C, e.g. on a car dashboard or a window sill, behind glass in direct sunlight, etc.
- Do not remove the handset's battery while the handset is switched on.
- Take care not to allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

- Do not dispose of battery packs in a fire. The handset's Li-ION batteries may be safely disposed at a Li-ION recycling point.
- Do not put the handset's battery in your mouth, as battery electrolytes may be toxic if swallowed.
- Do not attempt to dismantle the handset or any of its accessories.
- This equipment is fitted with an internal battery that can only be replaced by a qualified service engineer. There is a risk of explosion if the battery is replaced with an incorrect type battery. Dispose of the used battery in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- When charging the battery, use dedicated chargers. Using any battery pack, or mains charger not specified by the manufacturer for use with this handset creates a potential safety hazard.
- Do not put battery into a microwave oven, dryer or high-pressure container.

- Stop using the battery if abnormal heat, odor, discoloration, deformation or abnormal condition is detected during use, charge or storage.
- Keep away from fire immediately when battery leakage or foul odors are detected.
- If battery fluid leaks onto your skin or clothes, wash well with fresh water immediately.
- If fluid leaking from the battery gets into your eyes, do not rub your eyes.
 Wash them well with clean water and consult a doctor immediately.
- Remove the battery whose life cycle has expired from equipment immediately.

- While the battery is charged, used and stored, keep it away from objects or materials with static electric chargers.
- The earpiece may become warm during normal use. Also, the handset itself may become warm while the battery is being charged.
- Use a damp or anti-static cloth to clean the handset. Do not use a dry cloth or electrostatically charged cloth. Do not use chemical or abrasive cleaners as these could damage the case.
- Remember to recycle: the cardboard packing supplied with this handset is ideal for recycling.
- Remember to make backup copies of all important data on your handset.

■ Aircraft safety

- Switch off the handset when inside or near aircraft.

The handset is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it intermittently receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) energy (radio waves). The system that handles the call controls the power level at which the handset transmits.


The handset has been designed, and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to electromagnetic fields recommended by The Council of the European Union. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of the handset user and others and to take into account variations in age and health, individual sensitivities and environmental conditions. European expose standards for mobile phone provide for the amount of radio frequency electromagnetic energy absorbed by the body when using a mobile phone to be measured by reference to the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit recommended by The Council of the European Union for mobile phones used by the public is 2.0 watts/ kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The handset SAR value is 0.49 watts per kilogram. This has been tested to ensure that this limit is not exceeded even when the handset is operating at its highest certified power. In use, however, the handset may operate at less than full power because it is designed to use only sufficient power to communicate with the network.

USIM Card

Vodafone Global Standard USIM Card is an IC card that contains customer information such as the phone number. The USIM Card must be installed before using a USIM Card compatible mobile phone. The USIM Card cannot be used with a network other than specified by J-Phone.

USIM stands for Universal Subscriber Identity Module.



Using USIM Card

Install USIM Card before using the V801SA handset. The following functions are unavailable if USIM Card is not installed or the data on USIM Card cannot be read.

Charging the Battery

- Charge the battery before using the handset, for the first time or if the handset has not been used for a long time. Charging time may take longer than usual.
- Keep the battery terminal clean. The battery may not be charged properly if dust has accumulated on the terminal. Periodically wipe the battery terminal using a soft clean cloth.
- During charging, the battery may become warm. This is normal.
- The battery is a consumable item. If operating time becomes extremely short for practice use, replace the battery with a new one.
- Do not dispose of exhausted batteries with municipal waste. Tape over charger terminals beforehand and send it to a specified recycle collection or take it to a Vodafone shop.
- A lithium-ion battery is used in the V801SA handset. The battery cannot be fully charged in high or low temperatures. Charge the battery in temperature between 5-35°C.
- When a TV set or radio experiences interference or signal noise while the charger is being used, move the charger to another outlet away from the TV set or radio antenna.
- If the charging indicator does not appear while charging, a bad electrical contact or battery failure is the likely cause. Use a clean cloth to clean the battery terminal and then try again. If the charging indicator still does not appear, contact your nearest Vodafone shop.
- If you do not use the handset for a long time or you charge the battery that was left without charge after the battery replacement alarm sounds, **Crg** on Display may not blink. In this case, charging will start in several minutes unless the battery strength is exhausted or the battery does not work.








Center Access Code

- Release the shutter after framing the subject. To prevent blurred images, hold handset still when releasing shutter.
- Bright light may cause streaks to appear in a picture. Use *Brightness* to avoid streaks. Streaks may not completely disappear.
- Maintain a distance of at least 30 cm from the subject.
- Make sure not to block the lens with your finger or hand strap.
- Shutter tone and video start/end tones sound even in Manner Mode. The volume cannot be altered.
- When Video Priority is on for Incoming Call Priority, (Off-line Mode) appears and calls or Mail/SMS cannot be received until shooting ends.
- Do not flash directly into someone's eyes. Doing so may cause damage to the eyes. The flash is intended only as a supplement in dark places and is not as bright as a strobe light.
- Do not point the light close to someone's eyes. Avoid staring at the light when lit. Doing so may cause a loss of visual acuity.



Memory Cards

SD memory cards can be used with the V801SA handset. Save images captured using the handset camera and sound recorded using Voice Recorder. SD memory cards are referred to as Memory Cards in this manual.

Data Loss

 J-Phone shall not be liable for any damages resulting from the loss or alteration of data due to accident or equipment failure whether caused by connected devices or not, claimed by you or a third party.

Notes for Handling

- Do not insert or remove a Memory Card while the handset power is on.
- Do not detach the manufacturer's label. Doing so may result in damage to the Memory Card or data corruption.
- Do not attach new labels. Memory Cards are very thin and precision made. Labels may cause loose contact, and corruption or loss of data.
- Use an oil felt tip pen when writing on a Memory Card. Do not use a pencil or a ball-point pen. Doing so may result in damage to the Memory Card or data corruption.
- Always store a Memory Card in its case after removing it from its slot.
- Do not disassemble or modify the card.
- Do not bend, drop, moisten or apply impact to a Memory Card.



Notes for IrDA Communication

 Place sending and receiving Infrared ports within 20 cm before starting communication.



- Place devices on a stable surface, with their infrared ports aligned facing each other.
- Do not block the infrared port, with any objects such as hand strap during IrDA communication.
- Do not move the devices until data communication is finished.
- Communication may not work properly in direct sunlight or fluorescent light or near another infrared device.
