
With regard to MPR implementation issue, as one of the conditions of your grant to us dated October, 14th, 2009, we are sending you our comments as below.

We have recognized this issue and confirmed with our 3G module manufacturer, Ericsson AB, that this is due to Ericsson's design and implementation. We have also confirmed with them that measured maximum HSPA power is not more than 0.25 dB higher than the corresponding WCDMA measured maximum power. Ericsson provided us with an attestation letter to confirm these points, which we cannot disclose to public as it is deemed in scope of confidentiality between Ericsson and Sony. For detailed measurement data of the subtests for HSPA, please refer to page 20 of the SAR Report.

With these information, we, at Sony, have concluded that SAR evaluation for HSPA is not needed. We will appreciate your accepting this letter as Sony's attestation for this matter.
