Subject: Operating position for handheld radio

Mort,

In response to the question from the FCC, the radio is a handheld radio designed to be held in front of the face , when transmitting.

As can be noted from the position of the microphone element, in the upper left hand portion of the front of the unit, it would be impractical to hold the unit to the ear and transmit. The result would be that insufficient audio would be picked up by the microphone element for a successful transmission.

This unit IS NOT designed to be used in a manner similar to a cell phone where the receiver placed near the ear and the transmitter near the mouth. This is a simplex device, where there is no receive audio available to the user while transmitting.

I am enclosing an electronic photo showing the radio being operated in a typical and normal manner.

I hope this answers the FCC's concern in this area.
