


### Using the stand

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### To remove the stand:









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### **Labels**

The labels affixed or etched onto the tablet provide information you might need when you troubleshoot problems or travel internationally with the tablet.

# **Using the Home screen**

Use this section to identify the Home screen icons, use touch screen gestures, and use apps and settings.

## **Using the Home screen**

The Home screen provides a central location where you can customize the information, media, and applications that you would like to access quickly.

Touch an icon to perform the action described in the table.

**NOTE:** The icons on the Home screen and the appearance of the Home screen can vary. Some of the icons are for select products only.

## **Screen navigation**

You can navigate the screen using one or more methods.

- Touch gestures
- On-screen keyboard

### **Using touch gestures**

You can navigate the tablet screen using touch gestures.

#### **Touch**

Use the touch gesture to open an item on the screen.

• Using one finger, touch an item to open it.




### **Two-finger pinch zoom**

Use the two-finger pinch zoom to zoom out or in on images or text.

- Zoom out by placing two fingers apart on the screen and then moving your fingers together.
- Zoom in by placing two fingers together on the screen and then moving your fingers apart.


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### Left or right swipe

Use the left or right swipe to reveal your open apps, move through Home screens, and move through photos so that you can access them guickly.


**NOTE:** In select apps, this gesture might provide access to additional settings or other features.



### Top-edge swipe

Use the top-edge swipe to display the notifications.

To display the notifications, swipe down twice from the top edge.



### Two-finger top-edge swipe

Use the two-finger top-edge swipe to display the Quick Settings menu.


Using two fingers, swipe down from the top edge to display the Quick Settings menu.



### **One-finger slide**

Use the one-finger slide to pan or scroll through lists and pages, or to move an object.

- To scroll across the screen, lightly slide one finger across the screen in the direction you want to move.
- To drag, touch and hold an object, and then drag the object to move it.



### Using the on-screen keyboard

The on-screen keyboard is displayed by an app when you need to enter information.



**NOTE:** The appearance of the keyboard may vary depending on the app.

## **Using apps and widgets**

This section shows you how to find and open, organize, download, and uninstall apps and widgets.



**NOTE:** The icons and the appearance of the available selections can vary.

An app is an application or software program for your tablet, such as a document reader, file manager, or game.

- To see all apps, swipe up on the Home icon O.
- To open an app, touch the app.
- To return to the Home screen, touch the Home icon O.

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Widgets are apps with special functionality that display frequently updated content. You can view the updated content without opening the widget.

- To see all widgets, touch and hold on the Home screen to display the Widgets icon 

  the Widgets icon 

  .
- To open a widget, touch the widget. To return to the Home screen, touch the Home icon .

### Organizing apps and widgets on the Home screen

Add, move, or remove apps and widgets from the Home screen.

### Adding an app icon

To add an app icon to the Home screen, follow these steps.

1. Swipe up on the **Home** icon O on the Home screen.



Touch and hold the app icon until the Home screen appears. Slide the icon into place, and then lift your finger.

### Adding a widget

To add widget to the Home screen, follow these steps.

- Touch and hold on the Home screen to display the Widgets icon
   and then touch the Widgets icon
- Touch and hold the widget until the Home screen appears. Slide the widget into place, and then lift your finger.

#### Moving an app or widget icon

To move an app or widget icon to a different location on the Home screen.

- Touch and hold the icon.
- **2.** Slide your finger to the new position.
- **3.** Lift your finger. The icon drops into its new position.

### Removing an app or widget icon

To remove an app or widget icon from the Home screen.

- Touch and hold the icon.
- 2. While holding the icon, drag it to the **Remove** icon **X**.

NOTE: The Remove option is only available if you are touching and holding an icon. The **Remove** icon **X** usually appears at the top of the screen, but it can appear at the left of the screen when the tablet is in landscape mode.

### **Using the calendar**

Use the calendar to keep track of schedules.

To open the Calendar app, swipe up on the **Home** icon , touch the **Calendar** icon , and then follow the on-screen instructions.

### Using the clock

Use the clock feature to add an alarm, set a timer, or use the stopwatch.

▲ Swipe up on the **Home** icon **()**, touch the **Clock** icon **()**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

### **Downloading apps**


Download thousands of apps on Google Play

- Touch the Play Store app
- Touch a category.



### **Uninstalling apps**

To uninstall apps from the tablet, follow these steps.

- Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Settings icon
- Under Device, touch Apps & noti ication.
   Touch the app that you want to uninstall, touch Uninstall, and then follow the on-screen instructions.



## **Using Settings**

Use Settings for connecting to networks, setting preferences, and finding information about your tablet.

**NOTE:** The icons in Settings and the available selections can vary.

- ▲ To access settings, swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the **Settings** icon ★.
- TIP: Although the fastest path to **Settings** is swiping down twice, you can also swipe up on the **Home** icon and then touch the **Settings** icon .

TIP: Certain settings provide additional selections through the **Menu** icon .

#### **Network and internet**

Select from the following preferences when connecting your tablet to wireless and other types of networks.

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- **Wi-Fi**—Enable or disable Wi-Fi. When Wi-Fi is enabled, you can connect to a wireless network to check email, search the web, or access social media websites.
- **Bluetooth**—Enable or disable Bluetooth. When Bluetooth is enabled, you can pair a Bluetooth device, such as a headset or keyboard, with your tablet.
- **Data usage**—View a graph of the data used during the selected period. The data usage by each installed app is also displayed.
- More—Enable or disable airplane mode, VPN, or cellular networks.

For more information about connecting to networks, see Network connections on page 19.

### Security

Select preferences for screen locks, SIM card locks, passwords, and ingerprint logons. You can also set permissions for administrators and apps, set credentials, and select how your tablet is accessed. Select from the following security preferences:

- Screen Lock—Set how you want to lock and unlock your tablet.
- **Fingerprint**—Register your fingerprint to unlock your tablet.
- Smart Lock—Select unlocking options such as facial, body, voice, location, or other device recognition.
- Advanced—Select and customize security settings such as setting up guest user mode or screen pinning.

**NOTE:** For more details on using security features, see <u>Security on page 27</u>.



Select from the following device preferences:

- **Display**—Select display brightness, wallpaper, font size, screensavers, and sleep settings for your tablet. You can also make selections to wirelessly display content from your tablet to other devices.
- Sound & noti ication—Select volume, ringtone, and vibration preferences for your tablet.
- Apps & notification—View downloaded apps and running apps. To view information or uninstall an app, touch the app.
- **Storage & USB**—View the available space in the tablet memory and card memory (if installed), and view how the used space is allocated.
- **Battery**—View battery charge percentage and battery usage by various features.

To turn on the battery saver feature, touch **Battery**, and then touch the **Menu** icon .

- **Memory**—View memory use for the system and individual apps.
- Users—Enable or disable additional users for your tablet, set their pro iles, and enable or disable a guest user. For information about guest user mode, see <a href="Setting guest user mode on page 28">Setting guest user mode on page 28</a>.
   To have the ability to add users when the tablet is locked, touch the Menu icon , and then touch the checkbox for Add users when device is locked.

#### System

Select from the following system settings:

- **Date & time**—Enable or disable automatic date and time, and select preferences for time zone, time format, and date format.
- Scheduled power on & off Select times to automatically turn the tablet on or off.
- Accessibility—Enable or disable accessibility features, such as text size, display color settings, and reading and caption services.
- **Printing**—Enable or disable printing to a connected printer or cloud printing services. Touch the plus sign (+) to add printing services.
- About Tablet—Display the status, legal information, model number, and operating system version for your tablet.

To check for updates, touch **System updates**, and then touch **CHECK FOR UPDATE**.

# Using the camera

Use the camera to take photos, record videos, take screenshots, and view photos and videos.

TIP: To access the camera from a locked screen, place your finger on the **Camera** icon and slide the icon to the left.

## Taking a photo

Use the Camera app to take a photo with the front or rear camera.

- 1. Touch the Camera icon o.
- 2. To take a photo, touch the **Shutter** icon **S**.

The photo is saved in **Photos**.

## **Switching between cameras**

Your tablet is equipped with a front and rear camera.

To switch between the front and rear camera:


- Touch the Camera icon o.
- 2. Touch the Switch camera icon .


## Recording a video

Record a video using the Camera app.

▲ Touch the **Camera** icon , and then touch the **Video** icon .

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The video is saved in **Photos**.

## Taking a screenshot


Follow these steps to take a screenshot.

▲ Hold down the power button and the volume down button simultaneously for about 1 second.

A message is displayed when the screenshot is saved in **Photos**.



# Installing a microSD card

Insert a microSD card on supported models by following these steps.

- 1. Position the tablet display-side up on a flat surface.
- 2. Use the tray eject tool provided with your tablet or insert a small straightened paper clip (1) into the card tray access hole.
- Press in gently to release the tray.
- 4. Holding the end of the tray, pull the tray (2) straight out from the tablet, and then insert the microSD card (3).
- **NOTE:** Be sure the tray access hole is aligned with the access hole on the tablet before replacing the tray.
- 5. Replace the tray in the tablet with the same orientation as it was when you removed it. Press in gently on the tray (4) until it is firmly seated.

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# **Display accessibility**

Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Settings
icon

- **3.** Slide the switch to the right to turn on the setting.

# 2 Network connections

Connect your tablet to the internet, networks, and other devices.

**NOTE:** The icons and the available selections can vary.

Follow the directions in the sections below to connect by using one or more of the capabilities of your tablet:

- Wireless antennas—Connect you to a WLAN
- Mobile broadband (select tablets only)—Connects you to a WWAN
- Bluetooth—Connects you to Bluetooth components that are in close proximity to your tablet
- USB—Connects you directly to another device by USB cable

# **Connecting to a wireless network**

You must have an optional SIM card and be connected to a wireless network before you can connect to the internet.

To connect to a wireless network:

- Swipe down once from the top edge, and then touch the Wi-Fi icon to turn on the Wi-Fi.
- TIP: To add a new Wi-Fi connection, press and hold the **Wi-Fi** icon to open the Wi-Fi menu, and then follow the on-screen instructions to add a new Wi-Fi connection.
- Touch one of the available networks that is displayed.
- Type the password if required, and then touch Connect.

**NOTE:** To delete the password for a wireless network to which you have previously connected, touch the name of the network, and then touch **Forget**.

# Connecting to a mobile broadband network (select products only)

If a micro SIM card is not preinstalled in your tablet, you can purchase one from a mobile wireless carrier.

To install a micro SIM card, see Installing a micro SIM card on page 19

If a micro SIM is already installed, see Setting your mobile network on page 20.

IMPORTANT: To prevent damage to the card or the tablet, do not use force to remove or replace the tray.

IMPORTANT: Before turning the tablet screen facedown, be sure that the work surface is clear of tools, screws, and any other foreign objects. Failure to follow this caution can result in damage to the screen.

## **Installing a micro SIM card**


Insert a micro SIM card by following these steps.

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IMPORTANT: Inserting a SIM card of the wrong size or inserting the SIM tray in the wrong direction could damage the SIM card, damage internal components, or cause the SIM card to become stuck in the slot. Do not use SIM card adapters. To prevent damage to the SIM tray and internal connectors of the tablet, use minimal force when you insert or remove a SIM tray. Be sure to insert the SIM tray in the same orientation as it was when you removed it.

**NOTE:** Before purchasing a SIM card, follow these instructions to determine the correct SIM card size for your tablet:

- **1.** Go to <a href="http://www.hp.com/support">http://www.hp.com/support</a>, and then search for your tablet by product name or number.
- Select Product Information.
- **3.** Refer to the listed options to determine which card to purchase.
- 1. Position the tablet display-side up on a flat surface.
- 2. Use the tray eject tool provided with your tablet or insert a small straightened paper clip (1) into the card tray access hole.
- Press in gently to release the tray.
- Holding the end of the tray, pull the tray (2) straight out from the tablet, and then insert the SIM card (3).
- **NOTE:** Be sure the tray access hole is aligned with the access hole on the tablet before replacing the tray.
- 5. Replace the tray in the tablet with the same orientation as it was when you removed it. Press in gently on the tray (4) until it is firmly seated.

## Setting your mobile network

Set your mobile network by following these steps:

- Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Settings icon .
- Under Network & Internet, touch ••• More, and then touch Mobile Networks.
- **3.** Touch **Network operators**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

# Activating tethering or a portable hotspot (select products only)

To activate USB tethering follow these steps.

To share your mobile data connection through a USB device or as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot:

- 1. Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the **Settings** icon 🏩.
- Under Network & Internet, touch ••• More, and then touch Hotspot & tethering.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to continue.

# **Browsing the internet**

After you have established an internet connection, you can surf the internet using an internet browser.

To begin surfing the internet:

Swipe up on the **Home** icon O, and then touch the browser icon.

# **Using Bluetooth wireless devices**

Pair your tablet with a Bluetooth device, such as a headset or keyboard.

To connect to a Bluetooth device:

- 1. Turn on the Bluetooth device.
- Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Settings icon
- 3. Under Network & Internet, touch Bluetooth 🖹 .
- 4. Slide the switch to the right to turn on Bluetooth.
- 5. When the device name appears, touch it to pair the device to your tablet.
- TIP: If the device name does not appear, touch the **Menu** icon , and then touch **Refresh**.

NOTE: To maximize battery life, turn off Bluetooth when not in use.

# Turning off data connections

Airplane mode is a quick way to turn off all data connections.

When you turn on airplane mode, these connections are turned off:

- Wi-Fi
- Mobile data
- Bluetooth

To enable or disable airplane mode:


# 3 Managing power

Your tablet can operate on either battery power or external power. When the tablet is running on battery power only and an AC power source is not available to charge the battery, it is important to monitor and conserve the battery charge.

# Turning on the tablet

To turn on the tablet, follow these steps.

Press and hold the power button for 3-5 seconds until the tablet turns on.



# Powering off (turning off) the tablet

The Power off command closes all open programs, including the operating system, and then turns off the display and tablet.

Turn off the tablet when it will be unused and disconnected from external power for an extended period.

Follow the recommended Android™ shutdown procedure:

- 1. Press and hold the power button until the **Power off** message appears.
- Touch Power off.

If the tablet is unresponsive and you are unable to use the Android™ shutdown procedure, try the following emergency procedures in the sequence provided:

- Press and hold the power button for at least 5 seconds.
- Disconnect the tablet from external power.

# **Running on battery power**

When a charged battery is in the tablet and the tablet is not plugged into external power, the tablet runs on battery power. When the tablet is off and unplugged from external power, the battery in the tablet slowly discharges. The tablet will display a message when the battery reaches a low or critical battery level.

The tablet battery life varies, depending on power management settings, programs running on the tablet, screen brightness, external devices connected to the tablet, and other factors.

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## **User-replaceable battery**

Make sure to follow proper instructions when you remove, store, or dispose of a user-replaceable battery.

- **WARNING!** To reduce potential safety issues, use only the user-replaceable battery provided with the tablet, a replacement battery provided by HP, or a compatible battery purchased from HP.
- **IMPORTANT:** Removing a user-replaceable battery that is the sole power source for the tablet can cause loss of information. To prevent loss of information, save your work or shut down the tablet before removing the battery.

### Replacing the battery

If you purchased an optional battery, use this procedure and illustration to remove and replace the battery.

- 1. Position the tablet upside down on a lat surface.
- **2.** Loosen the battery cover screw **(1)**, remove the battery cover **(2)**, and then remove the battery from the tablet **(3)**.



3. Insert the new battery (1), replace the battery cover (2), and then tighten the battery cover screw (3).



### Storing a user-replaceable battery

Check your stored battery every 6 months. If the capacity is less than 50%, recharge the battery before returning it to storage.

IMPORTANT: To reduce the risk of damage to a battery, do not expose it to high temperatures for extended periods of time.

### Disposing of a user-replaceable battery

Be sure to follow proper disposal instructions when you dispose of your battery.


WARNING! To reduce the risk of fire or burns, do not disassemble, crush, or puncture; do not short external contacts; do not dispose of in fire or water.

See the *Regulatory, Safety, and Environmental Notices* for proper battery disposal.

## Charging the battery

The tablet does not use battery power when it is connected to external power with an approved AC adapter or an optional docking device or expansion product.

 Plug the AC adapter into a wall outlet (1), and then connect the other end of the cable to the power connector on the tablet (2).



- **2.** Verify that the battery is charging:
  - Check the Charging Battery icon , which appears in the top right corner of the screen.
  - Check the charging light. See Top and bottom on page 3 for more information.
- 3. While the battery is charging, keep the AC adapter connected until the battery information in the status area or notification area reads as 100% charged.

# Viewing battery life

To view approximately how much battery life remains:

Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Battery icon

## **Conserving battery power**

When your battery level is low and AC power is not available, turn on battery saver. This provides up to 90 minutes of battery life by turning off certain functions.

To conserve battery power and maximize battery life:

- Lower the brightness on the display.
- Turn off wireless devices when you are not using them.
- Initiate Sleep on the tablet when you are not using it by briefly touching the power button. To exit Sleep, press the power button again.
- Turn on the battery saver feature.

You can also select to turn on battery saver automatically when the battery level reaches certain percentages.

Swipe down from the top edge, and then touch the Battery icon

This enables and disables the battery saver mode.

# **Running on external power**

For information about connecting to external power, see the Quick Start guide included with your tablet.

The tablet does not use battery power when it is connected to external power with an approved AC adapter.

WARNING! To reduce potential safety issues, use only the AC adapter provided with the tablet, a replacement AC adapter provided by HP, or a compatible AC adapter purchased from HP.

**WARNING!** Do not charge the tablet battery while you are aboard aircraft. Some airlines might have different rules and/or restrictions.

Connect the tablet to external AC power under any of the following conditions:

- When charging or calibrating a battery
- When installing or modifying system software
- When performing a backup or recovery

When you connect the tablet to external AC power:

- The battery begins to charge.
- The screen brightness might increase.

When you disconnect external AC power, the following events occur:

- The tablet switches to battery power.
- Depending on your tablet, the screen brightness might automatically decrease to save battery life.

# 4 Security

Tablet security is essential for protecting the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of your information.

# Setting a screen lock

Follow these steps to set a screen lock.

Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Settings
icon



- Touch Security, and then touch Screen lock.
- NOTE: If you have previously set a screen lock, you must unlock the screen before changing the lock settings.
  - None—No screen lock is set.
  - **Swipe**—Unlock the screen by swiping in any direction.
  - Pattern—Draw a simple pattern to unlock the screen.
  - PIN—Enter four or more numbers to unlock the screen.
  - Password—Enter four or more letters or numbers. This option provides the most protection, if you select a strong password.
- Use Lock screen message to enter text to be displayed when the screen is locked.

# Using a ingerprint logon

Use a fingerprint to unlock your tablet. The fingerprint reader is located on the power button.

- 1. Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the **Settings** icon 🔹.
- 2. Touch Security, and then touch Fingerprint.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to register your fingerprint.
- After you register your fingerprint, touch your finger to the power button to unlock the tablet.

# **Using Smart Lock**

Use Smart Lock to select unlocking options such as facial, body, voice, location, or other device recognition.

**NOTE:** This option is only available after a screen lock has been set.



- Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the Settings icon
- \*

- 2. Touch **Security**, and then touch **Smart Lock**.
- 3. Touch your selection for Smart Lock, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

After setting a Smart Lock, every time you turn on your tablet, it will search for the unlock item. You can still unlock the tablet with your screen lock.

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# Locking and unlocking the tablet

Use these procedures to lock and unlock your tablet.

### Locking

Follow these steps to lock your tablet.

- Set a screen lock (see Setting a screen lock on page 27) or Smart Lock (see Using Smart Lock on page 27).
- Press the power button.

## Unlocking

Follow these steps to unlock your tablet.

- Press the power button to turn on the tablet.
- If you have your ingerprint registered to unlock your tablet, touch the appropriate inger to the power button to unlock the tablet.

-or-

Place your finger on the **Lock** icon and slide the icon up to unlock.

- Use your security unlock method, such as entering a PIN or facing the tablet for trusted face recognition, to unlock the tablet.
- TIP: To quickly access the camera from the locked screen, place your finger on the Camera icon and slide the icon up.

To quickly access the microphone from the locked screen, place your finger on the Microphone icon 😈 and slide the icon up.

# **Setting quest user mode**

Guest user mode allows others access to areas of your tablet that you specify.

Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the **Settings** icon



Touch **System**, touch **Advanced**, touch **Multiple Users**, and then touch **Guest**.

After you add a guest, your tablet logs out of your account and switches automatically to the guest account.

# Setting screen pinning

If you want to provide access only to a certain app, use the screen pinning function to lock the app on the screen. Others can use the app on your tablet, but cannot leave the app to explore the rest of your tablet.

## **Turning on screen pinning**

Follow these steps to turn on screen pinning.

- 2. Touch Security, touch Advanced, and then touch Screen pinning.
- 3. Slide the switch to the right to turn on screen pinning.

## Selecting an app to pin

Follow these steps to select an app to pin.

- 1. Swipe down twice from the top edge, and then touch the **Settings**, touch **Security**, touch **Advanced**, touch **Screen pinning**, and then turn on screen pinning.
- 2. Open the app that you want to pin, swipe up from the bottom of the screen while holding, and then release.
- 3. Tap on the app icon and select **Pin**.
- TIP: For security purposes, if you have a screen lock, check the **Ask for PIN** before unpinning. HP recommends a screen lock if you allow others to use your tablet.

### **Unpinning an app**

Follow these steps to unpin an app.

- With the pinned app open, swipe up from the bottom of the screen while holding, and then release.
- 2. Swipe up again and unlock your tablet.
  - NOTE: If you have a PIN, you will be prompted to enter it.

The app is now unpinned.

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# 5 Maintenance

It is important that you perform simple maintenance of your tablet to be sure that it works at peak performance.

# **Cleaning your tablet**

Cleaning your tablet regularly removes dirt and debris so that your device continues to operate at its best. Use the following information to safely clean the external surfaces of your tablet.

## Removing dirt and debris from your tablet

Here are the recommended steps to clean dirt and debris from your tablet.

- Wear disposable gloves made of latex (or nitrile gloves, if you are latex-sensitive) when cleaning the surfaces.
- Turn off your tablet and unplug the power cord and other connected external devices. Remove any installed batteries from items such as wireless keyboards.
- CAUTION: To prevent electric shock or damage to components, never clean a product while it is turned on or plugged in.
- 3. Moisten a microfiber cloth with water. The cloth should be moist, but not dripping wet.
- **IMPORTANT:** To avoid damaging the surface, avoid abrasive cloths, towels, and paper towels.
- 4. Wipe the exterior of the product gently with the moistened cloth.
- IMPORTANT: Keep liquids away from the product. Avoid getting moisture in any openings. If liquid makes its way inside your HP product, it can cause damage to the product. Do not spray liquids directly on the product. Do not use aerosol sprays, solvents, abrasives, or cleaners containing hydrogen peroxide or bleach that might damage the finish.
- 5. Start with the display (if applicable). Wipe carefully in one direction, and move from the top of the display to the bottom. Finish with any flexible cables, like power cord, keyboard cable, and USB cables.
- 6. Be sure that surfaces have completely air-dried before turning the tablet on after cleaning.
- 7. Discard the gloves after each cleaning. Clean your hands immediately after you remove the gloves.

See <u>Cleaning your tablet with a disinfectant on page 31</u> for recommended steps to clean the high-touch, external surfaces on your tablet to help prevent the spread of harmful bacteria and viruses.

## Cleaning your tablet with a disinfectant

The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends cleaning surfaces, followed by disinfection, as a best practice for preventing the spread of viral respiratory illnesses and harmful bacteria.

After cleaning the external surfaces of your tablet using the steps in Removing dirt and debris from your tablet on page 31, you might also choose to clean the surfaces with a disinfectant. A disinfectant that is within HP's cleaning guidelines is an alcohol solution consisting of 70% isopropyl alcohol and 30% water. This solution is also known as rubbing alcohol and is sold in most stores.

Follow these steps when disinfecting high-touch, external surfaces on your tablet:

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- Wear disposable gloves made of latex (or nitrile gloves, if you are latex-sensitive) when cleaning the surfaces.
- Turn off your tablet and unplug the power cord and other connected external devices. Remove any installed batteries from items such as wireless keyboards.
- **CAUTION:** To prevent electric shock or damage to components, never clean a product while it is turned on or plugged in.
- 3. Moisten a microfiber cloth with a mixture of 70% isopropyl alcohol and 30% water. The cloth should be moist, but not dripping wet.
  - CAUTION: Do not use any of the following chemicals or any solutions that contain them, including spray-based surface cleaners: bleach, peroxides (including hydrogen peroxide), acetone, ammonia, ethyl alcohol, methylene chloride, or any petroleum-based materials, such as gasoline, paint thinner, benzene, or toluene.
- **IMPORTANT:** To avoid damaging the surface, avoid abrasive cloths, towels, and paper towels.
- 4. Wipe the exterior of the product gently with the moistened cloth.
- IMPORTANT: Keep liquids away from the product. Avoid getting moisture in any openings. If liquid makes its way inside your HP product, it can cause damage to the product. Do not spray liquids directly on the product. Do not use aerosol sprays, solvents, abrasives, or cleaners containing hydrogen peroxide or bleach that might damage the finish.
- 5. Start with the display (if applicable). Wipe carefully in one direction, and move from the top of the display to the bottom. Finish with any flexible cables, like power cord, keyboard cable, and USB cables.
- 6. Be sure that surfaces have completely air-dried before turning the tablet on after cleaning.
- Discard the gloves after each cleaning. Clean your hands immediately after you remove the gloves.

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# 6 Electrostatic discharge

Electrostatic discharge is the release of static electricity when two objects come into contact—for example, the shock you receive when you walk across the carpet and touch a metal door knob.

A discharge of static electricity from fingers or other electrostatic conductors may damage electronic components.

**IMPORTANT:** To prevent damage to the computer, damage to a drive, or loss of information, observe these precautions:

- If removal or installation instructions direct you to unplug the computer, first be sure that it is properly grounded.
- Keep components in their electrostatic-safe containers until you are ready to install them.
- Avoid touching pins, leads, and circuitry. Handle electronic components as little as possible.
- Use nonmagnetic tools.
- Before handling components, discharge static electricity by touching an unpainted metal surface.
- If you remove a component, place it in an electrostatic-safe container.

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# 7 Accessibility

# **Standards and legislation**

Countries worldwide are enacting regulations to improve access to products and services for persons with disabilities. These regulations are historically applicable to telecommunications products and services, PCs and printers with certain communications and video playback features, their associated user documentation, and their customer support.

### **Standards**

The US Access Board created Section 508 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) standards to address access to information and communication technology (ICT) for people with physical, sensory, or cognitive disabilities.

The standards contain technical criteria specific to various types of technologies, as well as performance-based requirements which focus on functional capabilities of covered products. Specific criteria cover software applications and operating systems, web-based information and applications, computers, telecommunications products, video and multimedia, and self-contained closed products.

#### Mandate 376 – EN 301 549

The European Union created the EN 301 549 standard within Mandate 376 as an online toolkit for public procurement of ICT products. The standard specifies the accessibility requirements applicable to ICT products and services, with a description of the test procedures and evaluation methodology for each requirement.

#### Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)

Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) from the W3C's Web Accessibility Initiative (WAI) helps web designers and developers create sites that better meet the needs of people with disabilities or age-related limitations.

WCAG advances accessibility across the full range of web content (text, images, audio, and video) and web applications. WCAG can be precisely tested, is easy to understand and use, and allows web developers flexibility for innovation. WCAG 2.0 has also been approved as ISO/IEC 40500:2012.

WCAG specifically addresses barriers to accessing the web experienced by people with visual, auditory, physical, cognitive, and neurological disabilities, and by older web users with accessibility needs. WCAG 2.0 provides characteristics of accessible content:

- Perceivable (for instance, by addressing text alternatives for images, captions for audio, adaptability of presentation, and color contrast)
- Operable (by addressing keyboard access, color contrast, timing of input, seizure avoidance, and navigability)
- Understandable (by addressing readability, predictability, and input assistance)
- Robust (for instance, by addressing compatibility with assistive technologies)
