


# Frequency Response of E-Field



# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)

# $\textbf{Dynamic Range } \textbf{f}(\textbf{SAR}_{\textbf{head}})$







Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ±0.6% (k=2)




# **Deviation from Isotropy in Liquid**








Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ±6.3% (k=2)

# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)


# Frequency Response of E-Field




# **Frequency Response of E-Field**



# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)




# **Frequency Response of E-Field**



# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment:  $\pm 0.5\%$  (k=2)

# **Dynamic Range f(SAR**<sub>head</sub>)




Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ±0.6% (k=2)




# Frequency Response of E-Field









Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)








# **Deviation from Isotropy in Liquid**




# Frequency Response of E-Field




# Frequency Response of E-Field



# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$










# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$








# Frequency Response of E-Field



# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)

# Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>)







Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ±0.6% (k=2)



## Frequency Response of E-Field






Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ±6.3% (k=2)

# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$







Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ±0.5% (k=2)

# Dynamic Range f(SAR<sub>head</sub>)







Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ±0.6% (k=2)

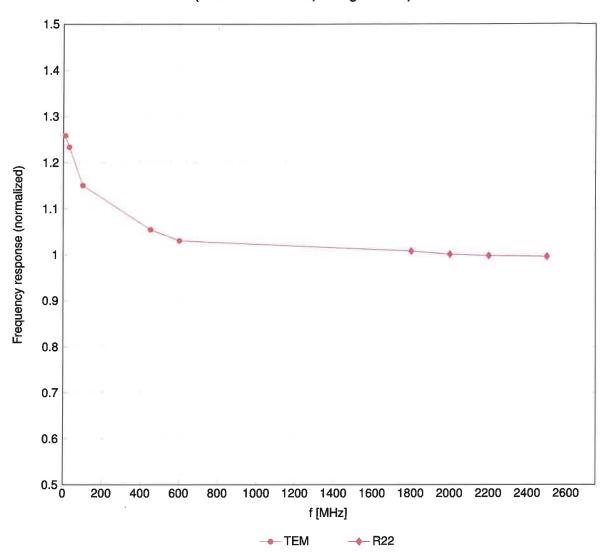

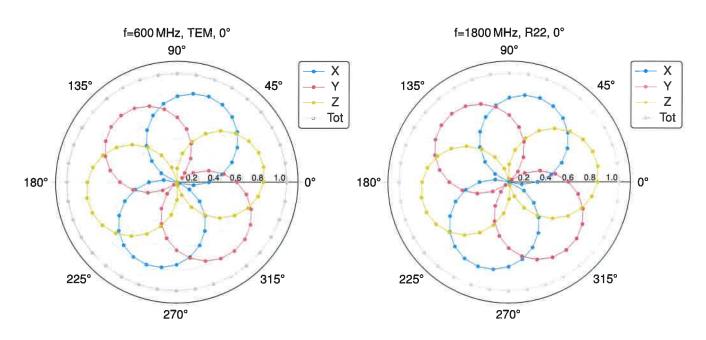

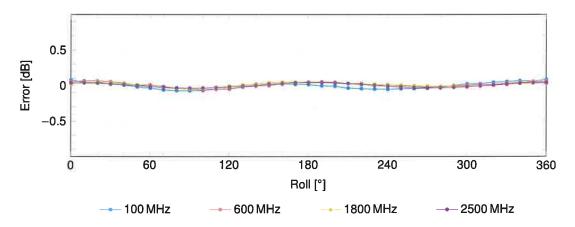


Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ±6.3% (k=2)

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# Receiving Pattern ( $\phi$ ), $\theta = 0^{\circ}$



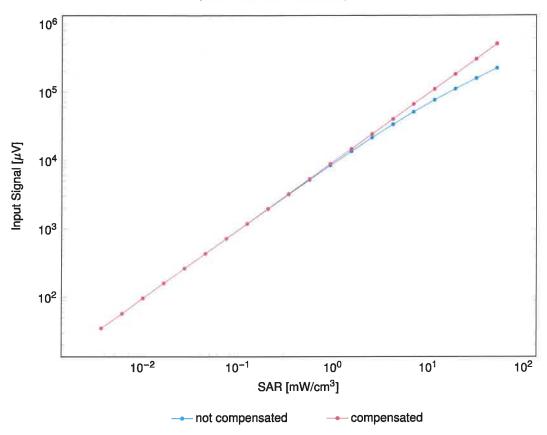


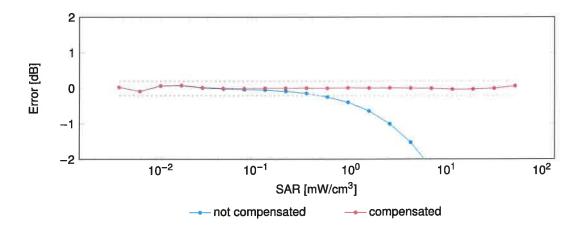

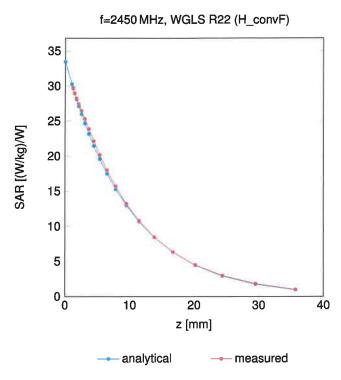
