2. TEST METHODOLOGY

The tests documented in this report were performed in accordance with FCC CFR 47 Part 2, FCC CFR 47 Part 15, ANSI C63.10-2013, RSS-GEN Issue 4, and RSS-247 Issue 1.

3. FACILITIES AND ACCREDITATION

The test sites and measurement facilities used to collect data are located at 47173 and 47266 Benicia Street, Fremont, California, USA. Line conducted emissions are measured only at the 47173 address. The following table identifies which facilities were utilized for radiated emission measurements documented in this report. 4. CALIBRATION AND UNCERTAINTY

4.1. MEASURING INSTRUMENT CALIBRATION

The measuring equipment utilized to perform the tests documented in this report has been calibrated in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, and is traceable to recognized national standards.

4.2. SAMPLE CALCULATION

Where relevant, the following sample calculation is provided:

Field Strength (dBuV/m) = Measured Voltage (dBuV) + Antenna Factor (dB/m) + Cable Loss (dB) – Preamp Gain (dB) 36.5 dBuV + 18.7 dB/m + 0.6 dB – 26.9 dB = 28.9 dBuV/m

4.3. MEASUREMENT UNCERTAINTY

5. EQUIPMENT UNDER TEST

5.1. **DESCRIPTION OF EUT**

The EUT is a tablet with multimedia functions (music, application support, and video), IEEE 802.11a/b/g/n/ac radio, and Bluetooth radio. The rechargeable battery is not user accessible.

5.4. **SOFTWARE AND FIRMWARE**

The software installed in the EUT during testing was 13E31820k.

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5.5. **WORST-CASE CONFIGURATION AND MODE**

Radiated emission and power line conducted emission were performed with the EUT set to transmit at the channel with highest output power as worst-case scenario.

The fundamental of the EUT was investigated in three orthogonal orientations X/Y/Z, it was determined that Y orientation was worst-case orientation. Therefore, all final radiated testing was performed with the EUT in Y orientation.

Worst-case data rates were:

GFSK mode: DH5 8PSK mode: 3-DH5

DQPSK mode has been verified to have the lowest power.

For simultaneous transmission of multiple channels from the same antenna in the 2.4GHz and 5GHz bands, tests were conducted for various configurations having the highest power. No noticeable new emission was found.

There are two vendors of the WiFi/Bluetooth radio modules: variant 1 and variant 2. The Wi-Fi/Bluetooth radio modules have the same mechanical outline (e.g., the same package dimension and pin-out layout), use the same on-board antenna matching circuit, have an identical antenna structure, and are built and tested to conform to the same specifications and to operate within the same tolerances.

Baseline testing was performed on the two variants to determine the worst case on all conducted power and radiated emissions.

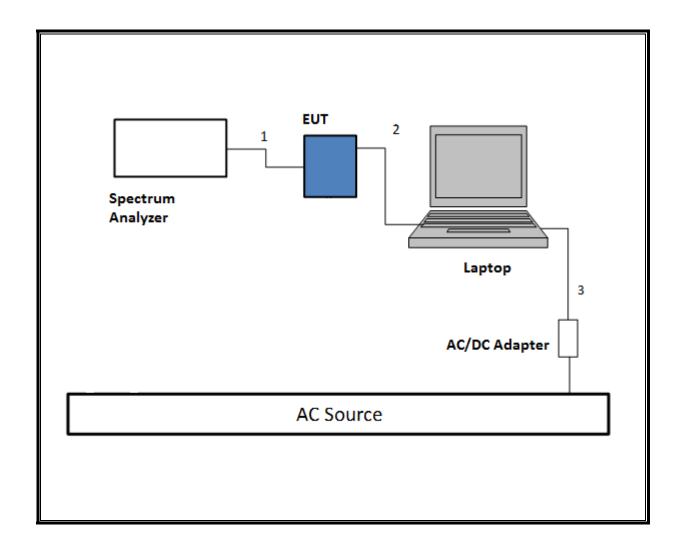

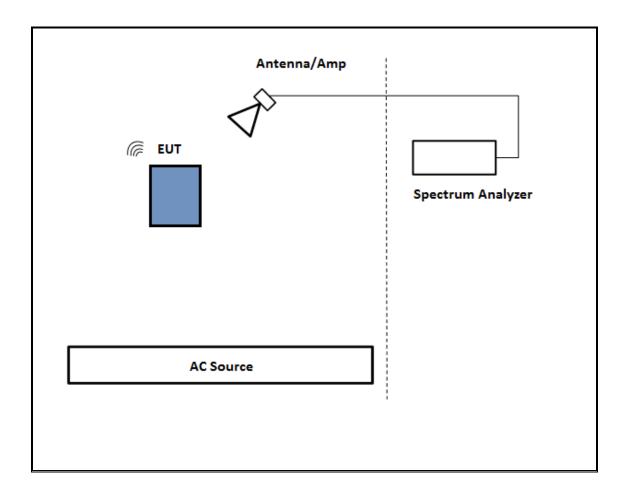

The EUT was tested connected to a host Laptop via USB cable adapter and spectrum analyzer to antenna port. Test software exercised the EUT.



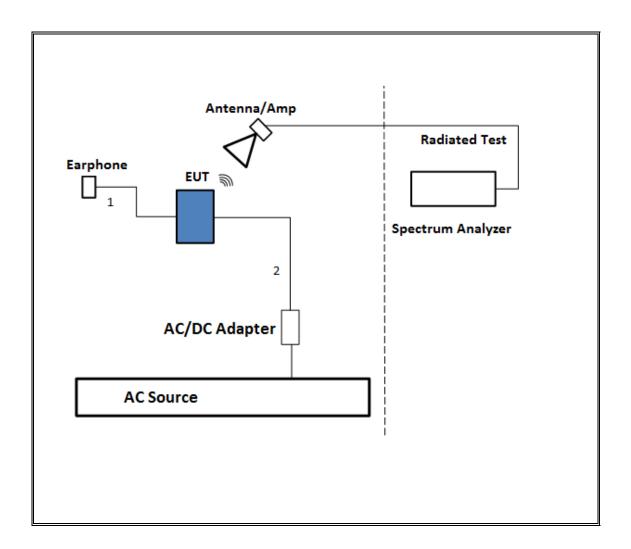
TEST SETUP- RADIATED-ABOVE 1 GHZ

The EUT was tested battery powered. Test software exercised the EUT.



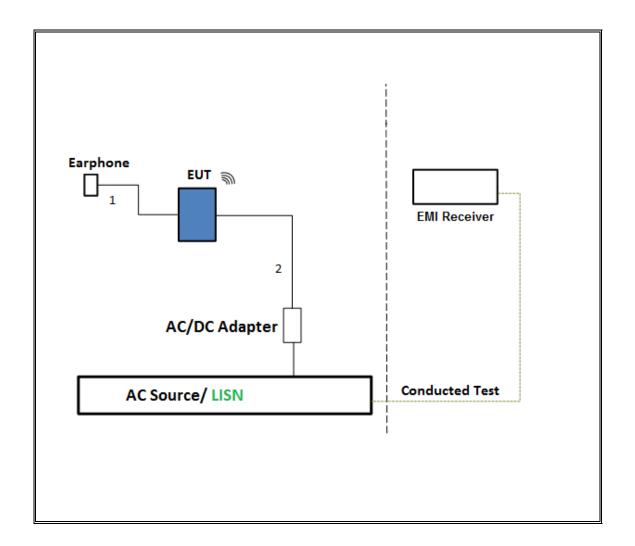
TEST SETUP- BELOW 1GHz

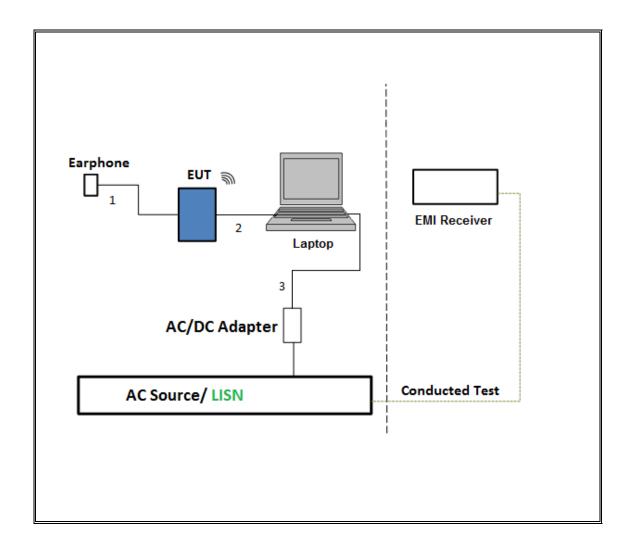
TEST SETUP- AC LINE CONDUCTED: AC/DC ADAPTER

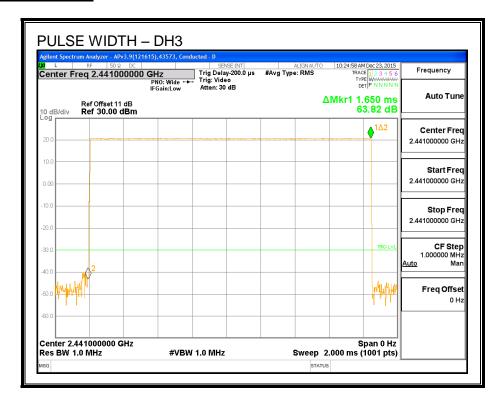


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - DH1

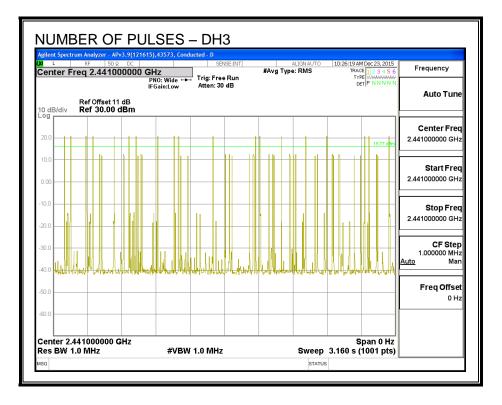


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PULSE WIDTH – DH3

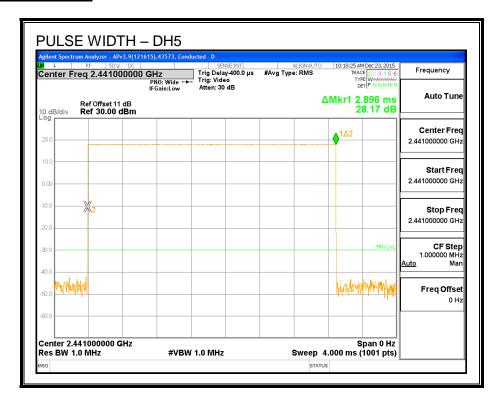


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - DH3

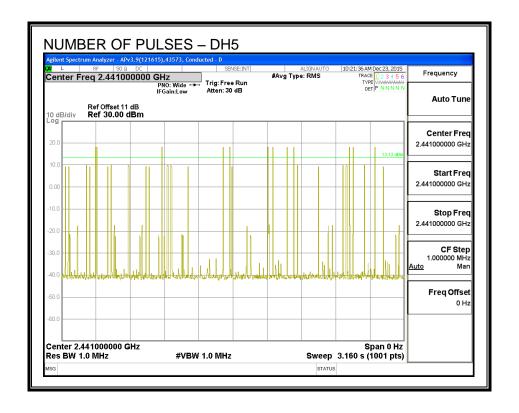


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PULSE WIDTH - DH5

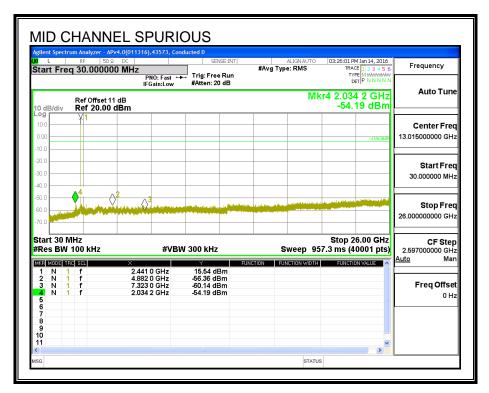
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, LOW CHANNEL



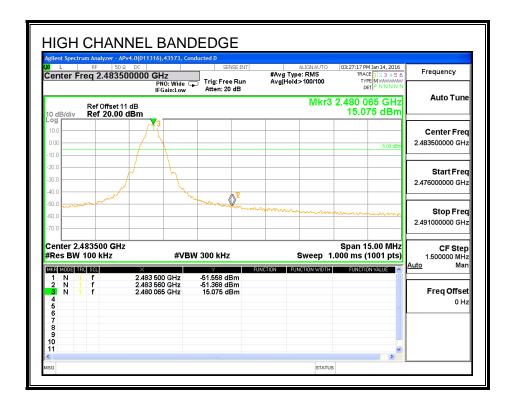


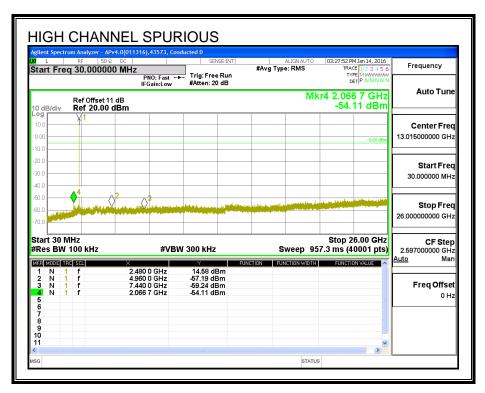
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, MID CHANNEL



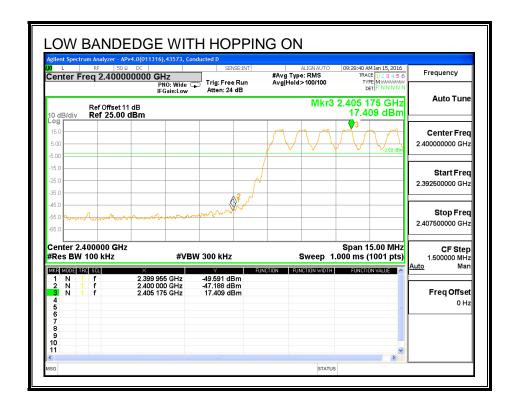


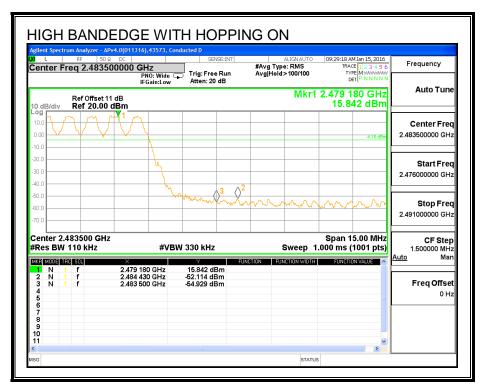
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, HIGH CHANNEL

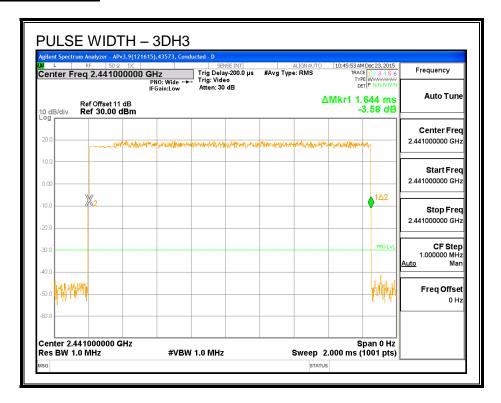


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - 3DH1

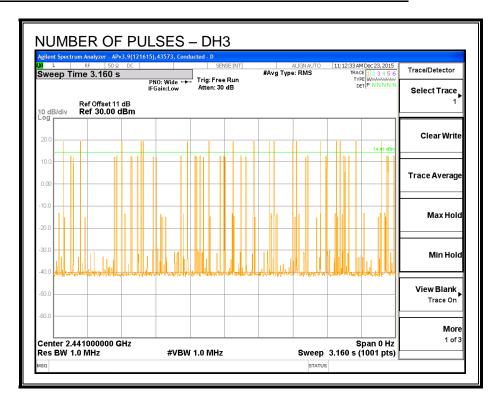

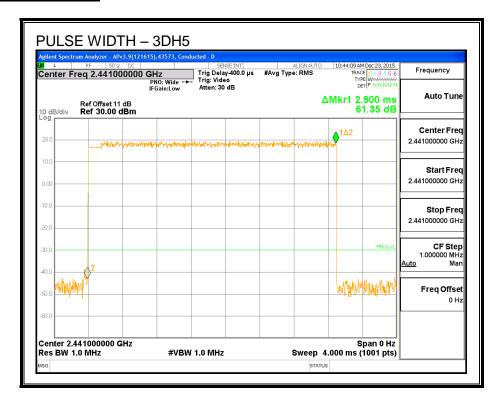


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - 3DH3

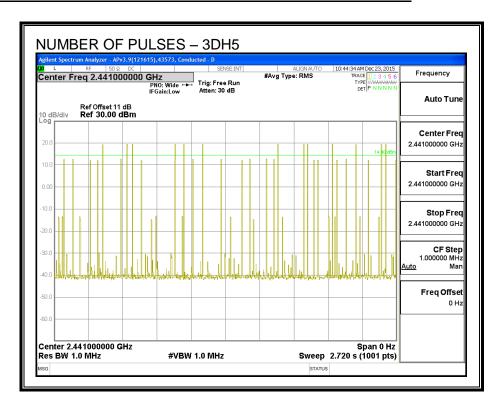


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PULSE WIDTH – 3DH5

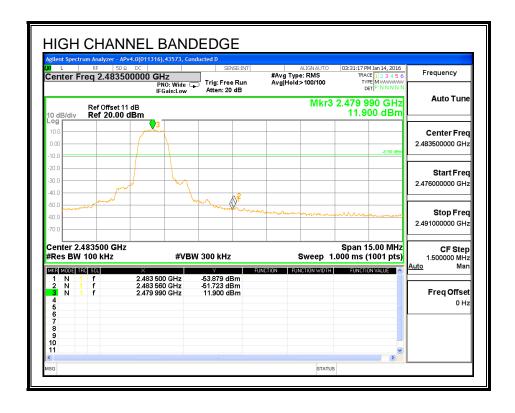


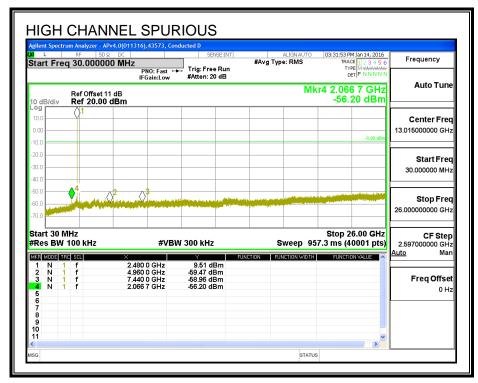
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, MID CHANNEL



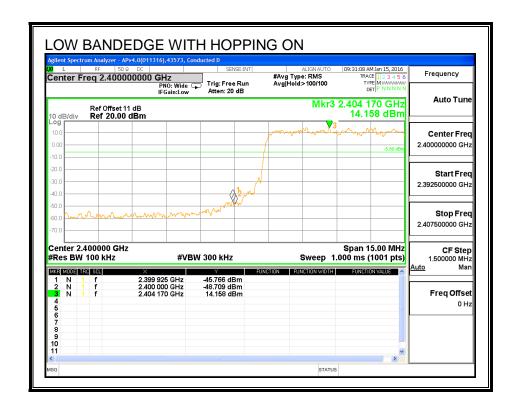


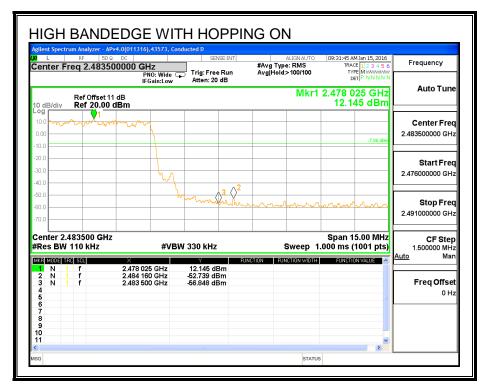
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, HIGH CHANNEL

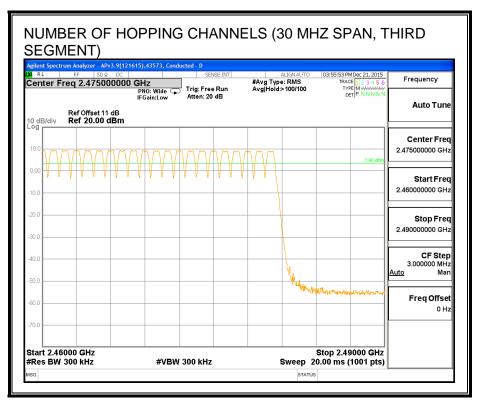
NUMBER OF HOPPING CHANNELS

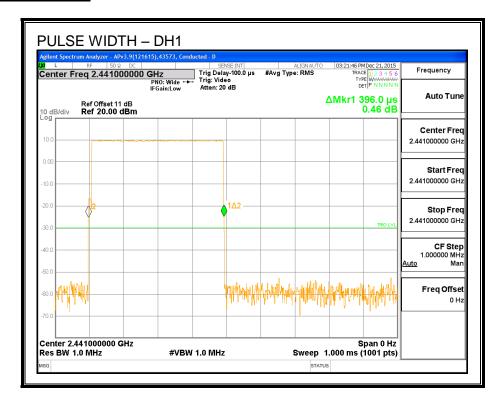

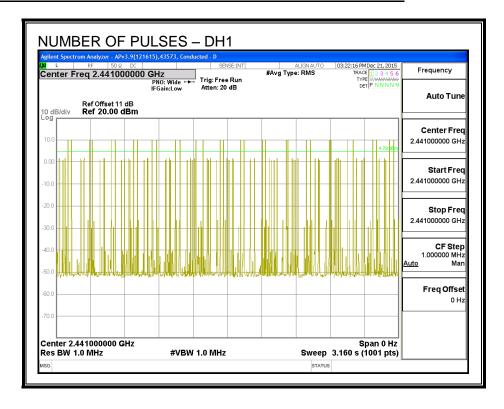

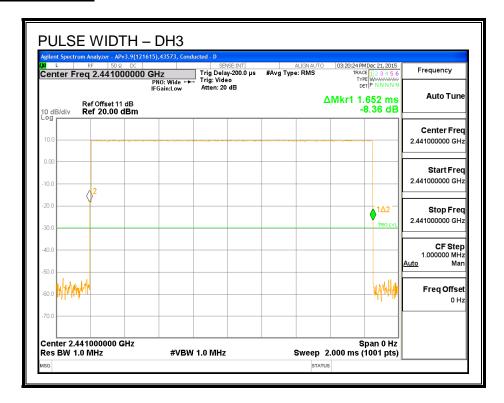


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - DH1

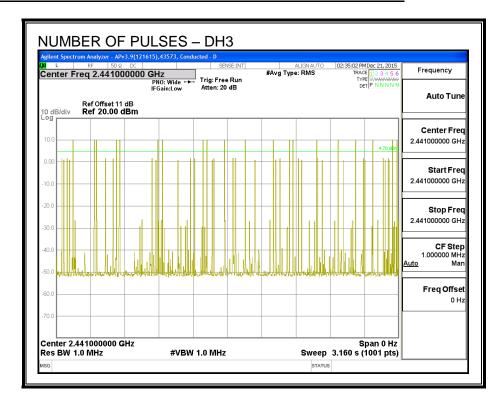


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PULSE WIDTH – DH3

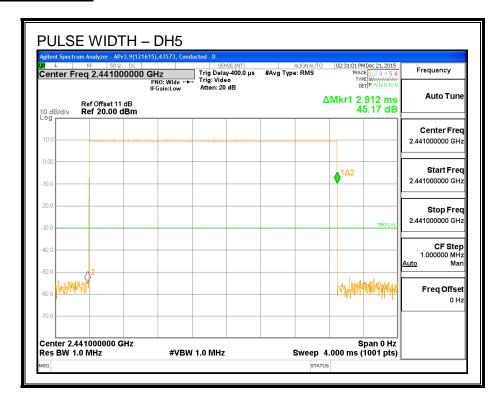


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - DH3

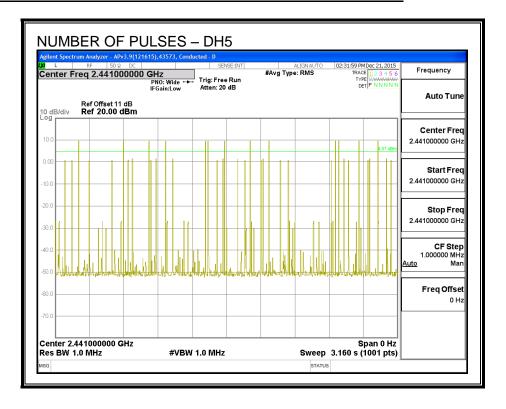


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PULSE WIDTH – DH5

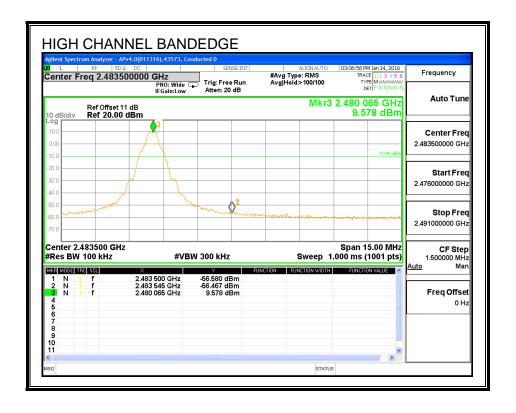


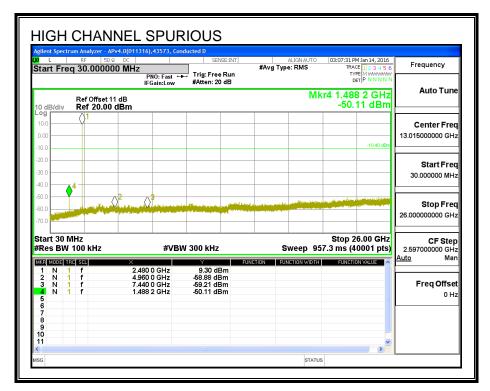
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, MID CHANNEL



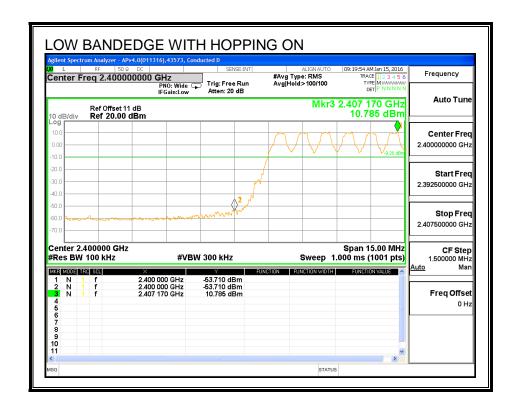


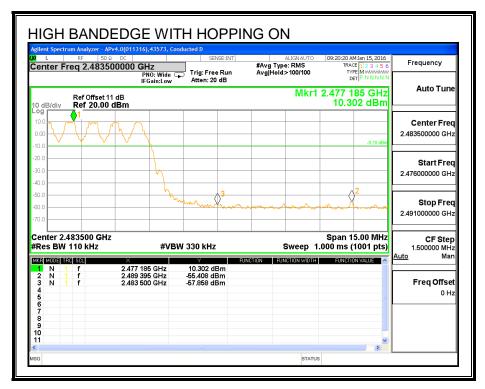
SPURIOUS EMISSIONS, HIGH CHANNEL

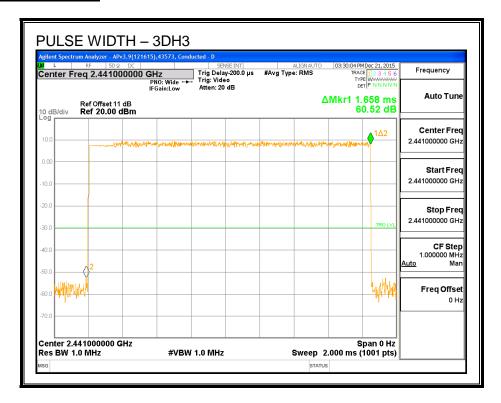


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - 3DH1

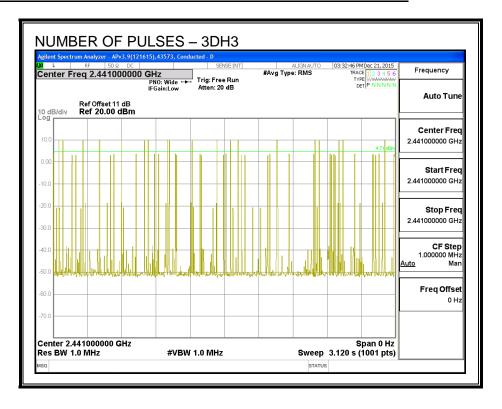

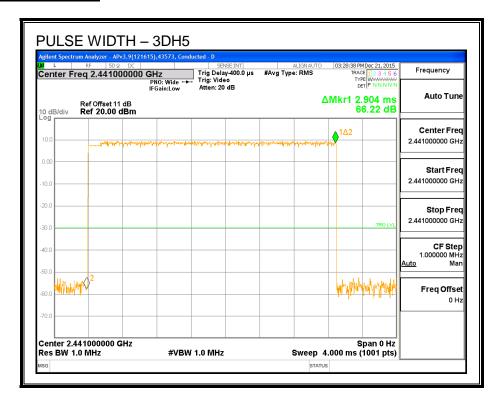


NUMBER OF PULSES IN 3.16 SECOND OBSERVATION PERIOD - 3DH3

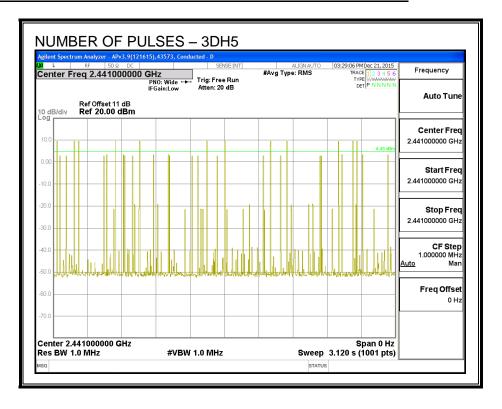


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PULSE WIDTH – 3DH5
