

Prediction of MPE limit at a given distance

Equation from page 18 of OET Bulletin 65, Edition 97-01

$$S = \frac{PG}{4\pi R^2}$$

S = power density where:

P = power input to the antenna

G = power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna

Example: +31 dBm carrier level with 55 cm. separation distance allows antenna gain of 12 dBi

Maximum peak eirp: 43.00 (dBm) Maximum peak eirp: 19952.62315 (mW)

Time Averaging: 100 (%)
Prediction distance: 55 (cm)
Prediction frequency: 869 (MHz)

MPE limit for uncontrolled exposure at prediction frequency: 0.579333333 (mW/cm^2)

Power density at prediction frequency: 0.524886 (mW/cm^2)

Margin of compliance: -0.4 (dB)

This equates to 5.248857193 W/m^2
