

Safety Information For FRS UNIT

Your wireless handheld portable transceiver contains a low power transmitter. When the Push-to Talk (PTT) button is pushed it sends out radio frequency (RF) signals. This device is authorized to operate at a duty factor not to exceed 50%. In August 1996, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for hand-held wireless devices.

WARNING: To maintain compliance with the FCC' s RF exposure guidelines, this transmitter and antenna must maintain a separation distance of at least 2 inches (5 centimeters) from your face. Speak in a normal voice, with the antenna pointed up and away from the face at the required separation distance. The belt clip is for storage purposes only. **DO NOT TRANSMIT WHILE USING THE BELT CLIP.** To transmit, hold the device away from your body and ensure that the antenna is at least 2 inches (5 centimeters) from your body when transmitting.

Use only the supplied antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the transmitter and may violate FCC regulations.
