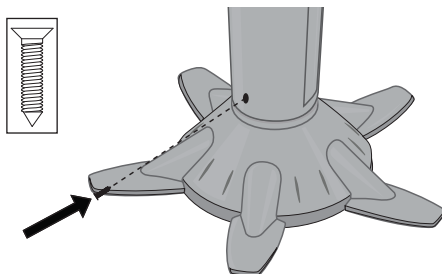
Installation



1. Turn the stand upside down and insert the feet as illustrated. Insert and tighten 2 black foot screws (shorter) for each foot (as illustrated). Repeat the above step for other feet.

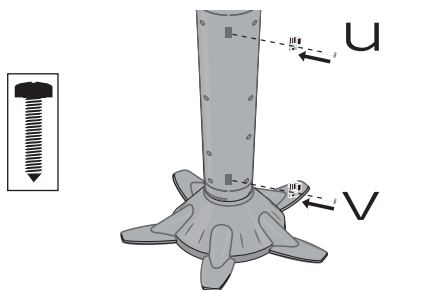


2. Insert the Pedestal into the Stand U and then gently rotate clockwise V until tight, making sure the screw hole in the Pedestal aligns with the screw hole in the Stand.

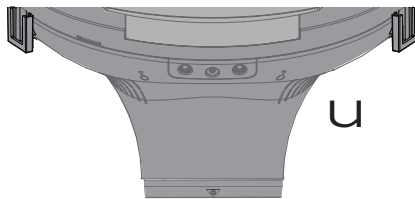


3. Insert and tighten 1 of the silver pedestal screws to secure the pedestal to the stand (as illustrated).

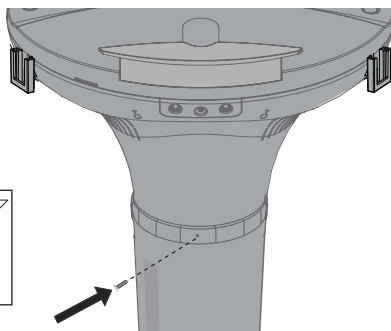
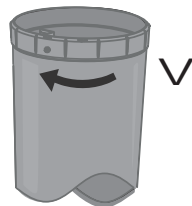

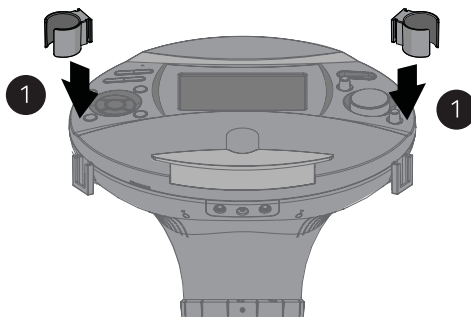
4. Insert the Power Cord Clips into areas **U** and **V** and secure using the two clamp screws (black).



5. Insert the Base into the Pedestal **U** and then gently rotate clockwise **V** until the screw hole in the Base aligns with the screw hole in the Pedestal.

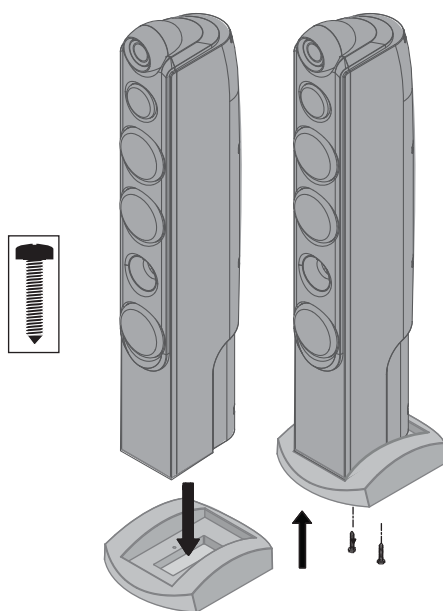


6. Insert and tighten another silver pedestal screw to secure the base to the pedestal.



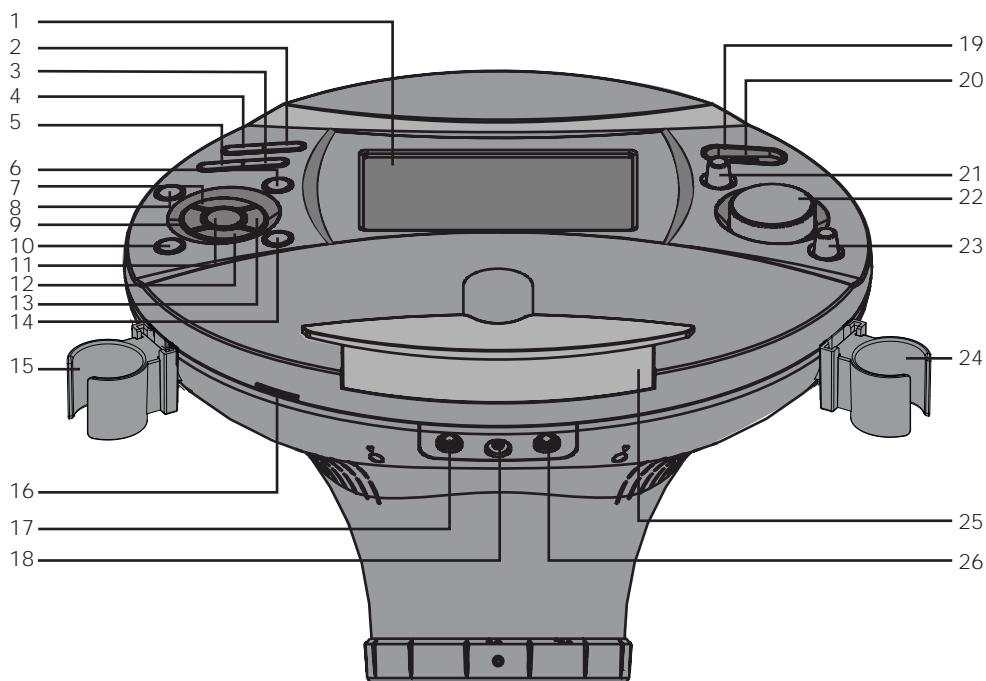
7. Insert the detachable mic holders **U** into the base mic holder slots.

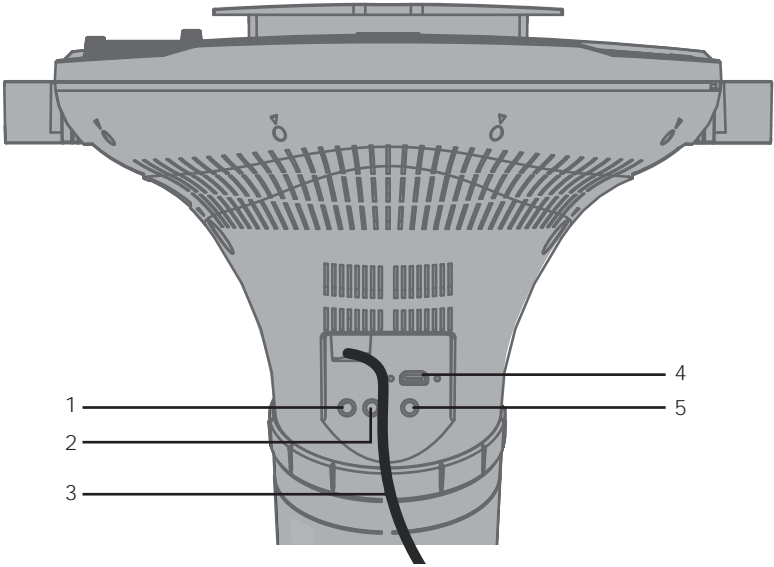
8. Insert the speaker body into the Speaker Stand making sure to align the screw holes, then insert two screws (black) through the bottom of the base into the bottom of the speaker body to secure. Repeat for other speaker.

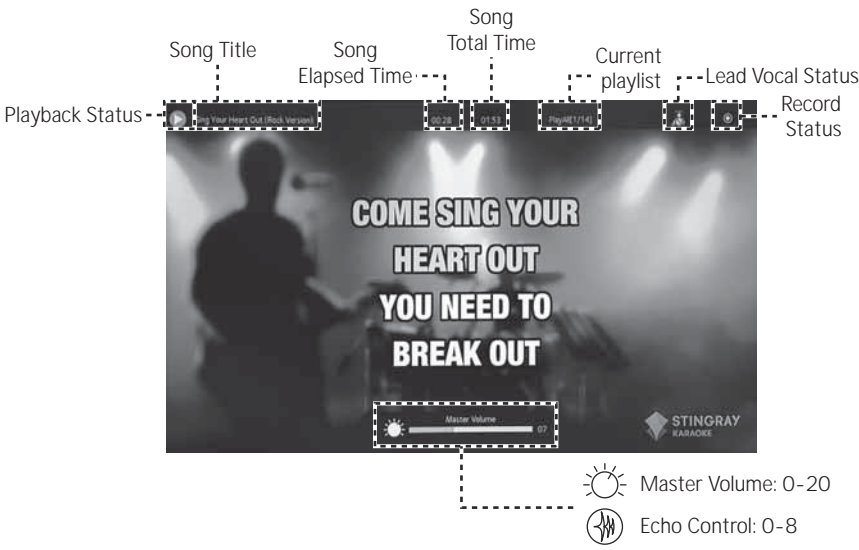

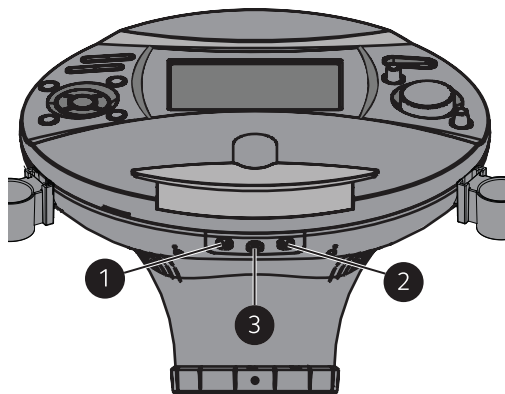

Connecting the Microphones and Headphones



Microphones:

Insert a microphone's plug into the Mic 1 jack **u**. Insert the other microphone's plug into the Mic 2 jack **v** (if desired).

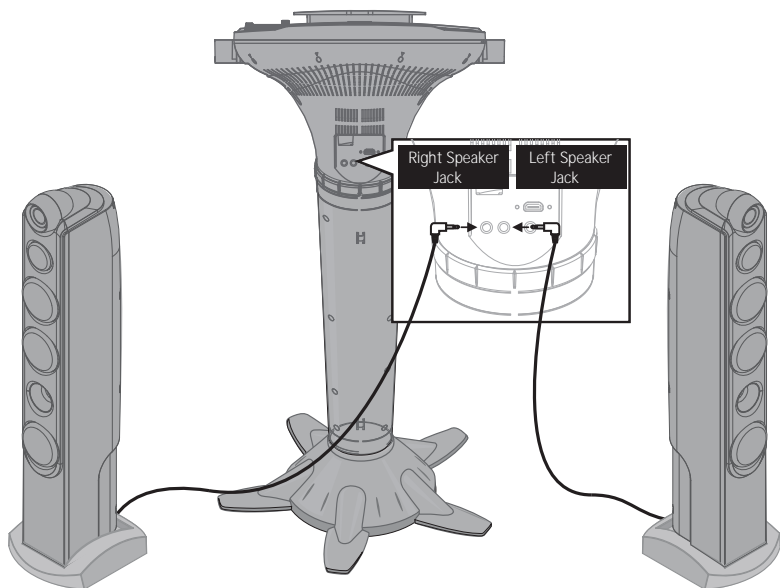
Note: Do not drop or tap the mic as damage to the mic or speakers may occur. Do not spin the microphone around for the same reason.

Headphones:

For private listening, use headphones (not included). Insert a headphone's plug into the Headphone jack **w**. Disconnect when finished so the included speakers can be used.

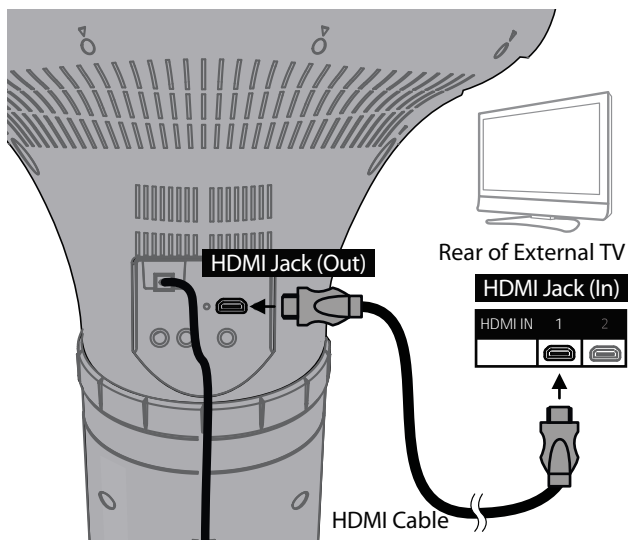
Connecting the Tower Speakers

- 1 To protect the speakers, make sure the iSM1060BT is off and the MASTER VOLUME and the MIC 1 and 2 VOLUME controls are set to minimum.
- 2 Connect the right speaker's plug to the Right Speaker jack and the left speaker's plug to the Left Speaker's jack.
- 3 Turn the power on and slowly raise the MASTER VOLUME and the MIC 1 and 2 VOLUME controls to a comfortable level.

Connecting the Unit to an External TV



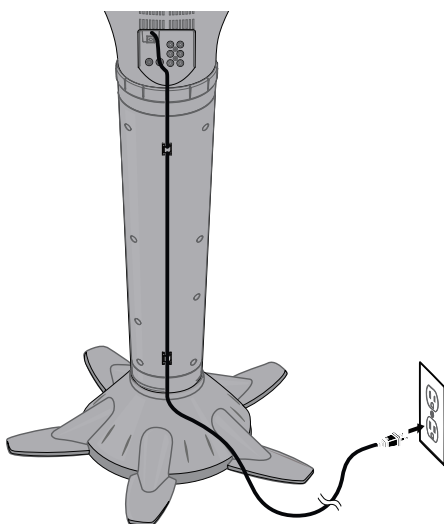
The video and lyrics will be shown on the built-in screen. If you would prefer to output the video and audio to your TV, then perform the following steps:

Connect the HDMI cable plug into the Jack on the back of the unit that is labeled HDMI. Plug the other end of the HDMI cable into the HDMI input on your TV.

Notes:

- This unit can be used with or without a TV.
- Also refer to the TV's or external unit's User Guide.
- HDMI cables is not included.

Connecting to AC Power



1 Insert the AC power cord into a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V AC, 60Hz

2 Secure the power cord into the Power clamps previously installed.

Notes:

- Make all connections before connecting to AC power.
- The AC Power Cord has a polarized plug that fits into the AC outlet only one way. If the plug does not fit properly, turn it over and try again. Do not force and do not file or cut the wide blade.

Singing Machine USB Flash Drive



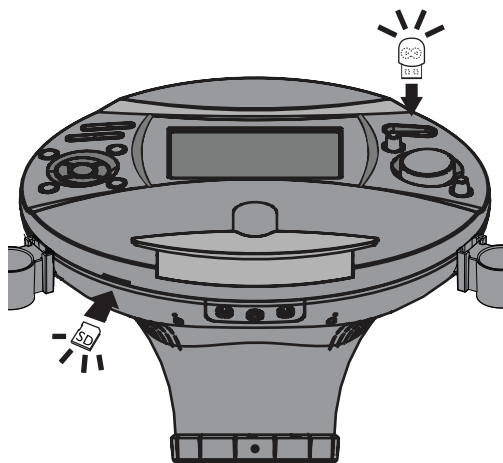
We include a **Singing Machine USB Flash Drive** for all the files storage (Karaoke video files and Recording files).

You can follow the operation on Page to start the HD Karaoke singing experience.

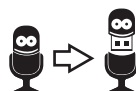
Notes: There are 2 demo songs installed into the USB Flash Drive.

To access the Karaoke Store for more HD karaoke songs, please follow the Welcome Kit instruction.

Insert the USB Flash Drive and SD Card into the unit



Before you insert the Singing Machine USB Flash Drive, please remove the stand to reveal the USB plug. Insert it into the USB slot of the unit with the face pointing backward.

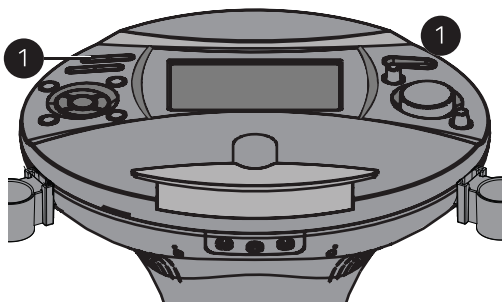




If you would like to have more memory capacity for the recording function, you can insert a SD Card (not included) to store the recording files.

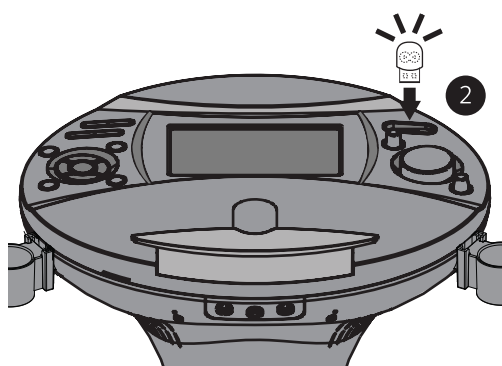
Notes: Once a SD card is inserted, the recording files will be saved in SD card prior to be saved in USB flash drive.

- 1 Connect the unit as described previously. Press the ON/OFF button  to turn the unit on; the ON/OFF indicator  will light blue and the LCD Screen will display below:

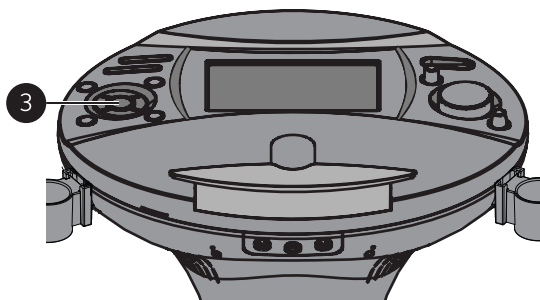


- 2 Remove the provided Singing Machine flash drive stand to reveal the USB plug. Insert it into the USB slot of the unit with the face pointing backward.

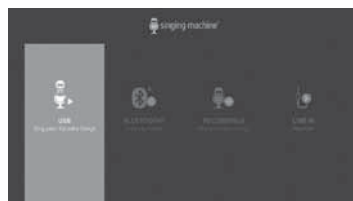


Notes:

- Singing Machine flash drive has 8GB capacity (the actual capacity may vary by different USB).



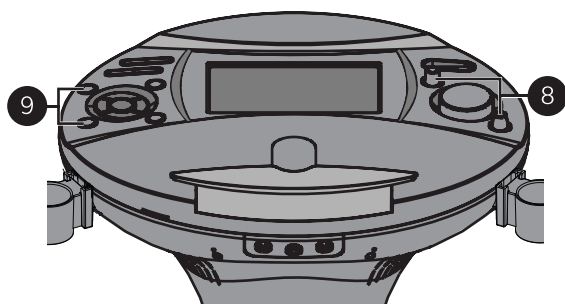
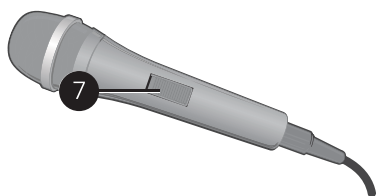
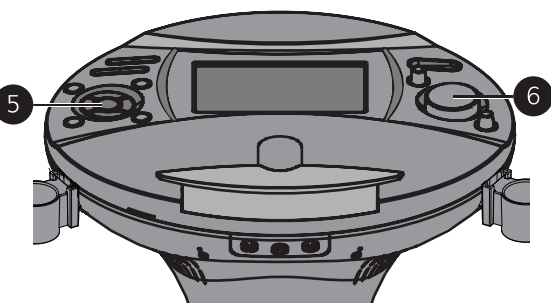
- 3 The USB mode should be selected by default. Press ENTER button to enter into the USB mode.



Notes:

- The USB mode cannot be entered until the flash drive is present.
- A loading icon will appear when the system is loading the songs.

4 Use the navigation ▲ up and ▼ down buttons to navigate through the list of songs in which you have previously downloaded into your USB.



5 Press the ENTER button to start the playback. The HD karaoke video will play on the screen. Press the ENTER button during playback will pause the song. Press the MENU button to stop the playback and go back to the USB menu.

6 Adjust the volume to a comfortable level using the MASTER VOLUME control.

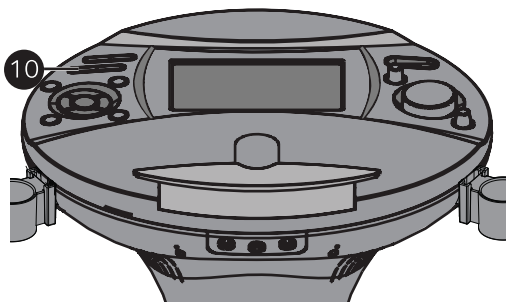
- If connected to a TV, there will be no display on the screen.
- If connected to a TV, the TV volume will not be depend on the unit's master volume.

7 Connect the microphone(s) as shown on page 8. Slide the power switch to the ON position

8 Adjust the MIC VOLUME 1 or 2 control as desired. Increasing this control will increase the volume of the respective microphone.

9 Press ECHO +/- buttons to add an echo effect to your voice. The higher the number, the more echo effect.

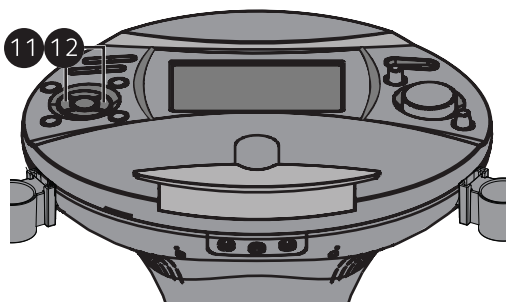

- 10 LEAD VOCAL:** You may want to perform your singing with the original lead vocal or sing with a help. During the song playback, press the **VOCAL** button to switch the lead vocal on. (It is normal to have a half second hesitation during switching) Press the **VOCAL** button again to switch back to music only.

Notes:

- Lead vocal function is depended on the downloaded song format. The song may be music only.
- Successive pressing **VOCAL** button might switch to different original vocal instead of switching back to the music only.

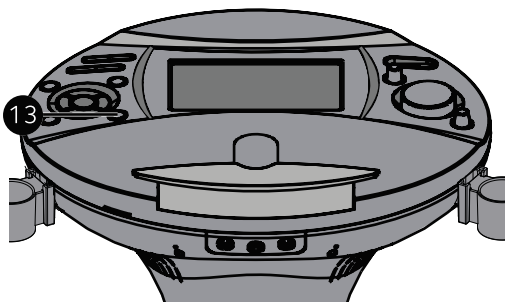


- 11 SKIP:** Advance or go back one track by pressing the navigation ► right or ◀ left button.

- 12 SEARCH IN THE TRACK:** During playback, press and hold either the navigation ► right or left ◀ button to move the player forward or backward within a track to locate a specific interval. When you release the button, normal playback will resume.

13 SINGING RECORDING

You can always record your singing with the music to an audio file (.mp3 format) to the inserted USB Flash Drive or SD Card (not included). When you want to record during the song playback, press the **RECORD** button to start. There will be a Recording Icon on the top right of the screen. Once you have complete your recording, press the **RECORD** button again to stop.

Notes:

- The audio file will be saved into the USB Flash Drive by default.
- The destination will be changed when there is a SD Card inserted.
- The recorded audio file will be named by starting with the Karaoke song title.

14 QUICK SEARCH A SONG BY ARTIST OR BY TITLE:

During USB menu, select the **SEARCH** tag by pressing **ENTER** button. A keyboard pop up on the bottom of the screen where you can use the navigation ◀ left and ▶ right buttons to navigate through the letters and use the **ENTER** button to select your desired letter.

A list of possible songs will appear.

Use the navigation ▲ up and ▼ down to navigate through the list of songs.

Notes:

- The search is only sensitive on the first letter of the Artist or Song Title.
- If you are already navigating through songs and you want to commit a search, press the **MENU** button to go back to the tags under the USB menu and then select **SEARCH**.

15 FILTER BY GENRE/ARTIST/TITLE:
To filter by Genre/Artist/Title, use the navigation ► right and ◀ left buttons to select the GENRE, ARTIST, or TITLE tag at the top. Press the ENTER button to go into the category. The keyboard will pop up again on the bottom of the screen. Use the navigation ► right and ◀ left buttons and ENTER button to start entering the letter to filter.

16 CREATING THE PLAYLIST
To create your personalised playlist, you have to navigate through the songs you have and add individual song to your playlist.
Use the navigation ▲ up and ▼ down buttons to select the song you would like to add. Press the navigation ► right or ◀ left button to circulate through "play once" / add to Playlist / add to Favorite. Select "Add" and press ENTER to confirm the operation. (Press ENTER again to deselect)
Repeat the above step for individual song.

Notes:

- The personalised Playlist will be kept even after the unit restart.
- You can always edit the Playlist after you create your playlist.

17 USING THE PLAYLIST

To play your previously created playlist instead of all songs, you can use the navigation **▶** right and **◀** left buttons to select **Playlist** tag. Then press the ENTER button to show the playlist.

You can use the navigation **▲** up and **▼** down buttons to play the shortlisted song right the way OR you can select **PLAY ALL** and press the ENTER button to play all shortlisted songs from the beginning.

To edit the priority of your personalised playlist, you can press the navigation **▶** right and **◀** left buttons to select **PRIORITY**. Press the navigation **▼** down button to start editing the priority of the songs with the numbers. (The songs will be ordered from lowest number to the greatest). To change the order of the song, select the song you want to move and press the navigation **▶** right or **◀** left button to change the song order. You will see the number change up or down on the priority list. Once you have selected the priority of the song, press ENTER and the playlist order will update. Once you finish editing the priority, you can press the MENU button to exit.

To remove the song of your personalised playlist, you can press the navigation **▶** right and **◀** left buttons to select **REMOVE**. Press the navigation **▼** down button to start editing the Playlist.

To confirm removing a song from the playlist, select the song and press the ENTER button.

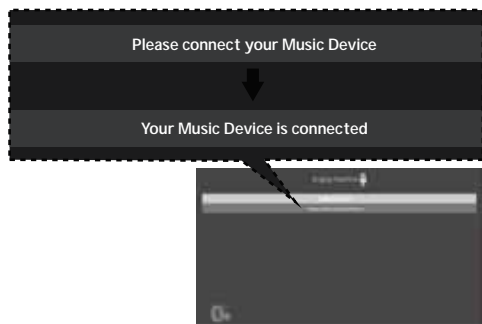
1 Connect the unit as described previously. Press the ON/OFF button  to turn the unit on; the ON/OFF indicator  will light blue.



2 Press the navigation  right or  left button to select the Bluetooth mode. Press the ENTER button to enter. Once you enter into the Bluetooth mode, you will hear the Bluetooth sound and see **"Please connect your Music Device"**.

3 Switch ON the Bluetooth function of your bluetooth compatible device within 10 meters (30ft) from the unit. You will see **"Singing Machine"** appear on your device's search list.

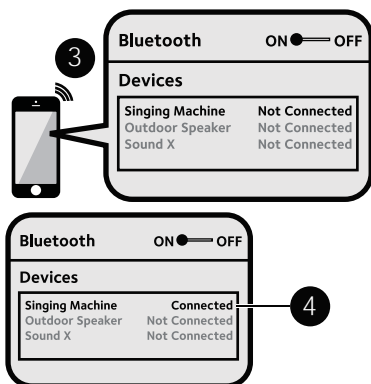
Notes: Please always refer to the user manual of your bluetooth device for detailed instructions.



4 Select **"Singing Machine"** to start pairing. Wait or completion of the pairing until you hear a beep from the unit. The bluetooth status will change to **"Your Music Device is connected"**.

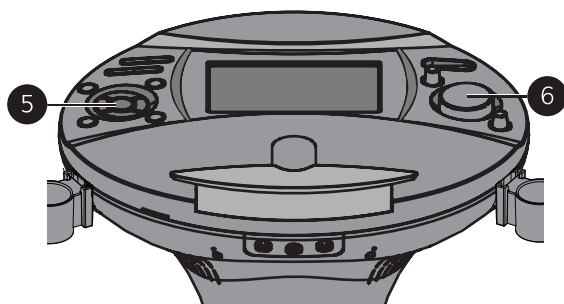
Notes:

- If your Bluetooth prompts you for a passcode during the pairing process, please enter "0000" to connect.
- If you have paired before, a list of previous searched results will be displayed. Select "Singing Machine" and confirm.
- On some Bluetooth devices (i.e., computers), once pairing is complete, you select your Bluetooth device as "Use as Audio Device" or similar.

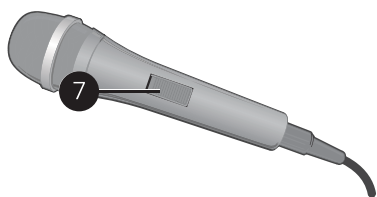


5 You can control your Bluetooth device to start the music playback OR press the ENTER button to start the playback. Press the ENTER button during playback can pause the song.

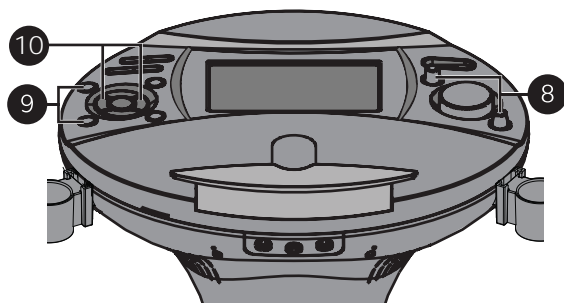
6 Adjust the volume to a comfortable level using the MASTER VOLUME control.

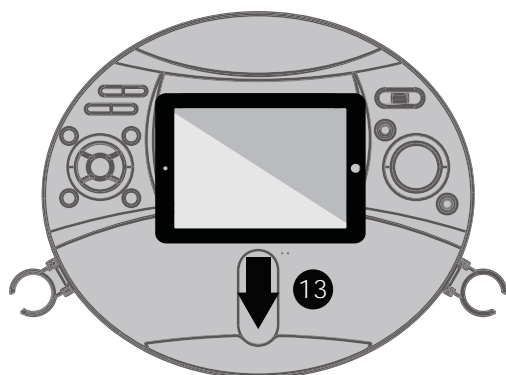
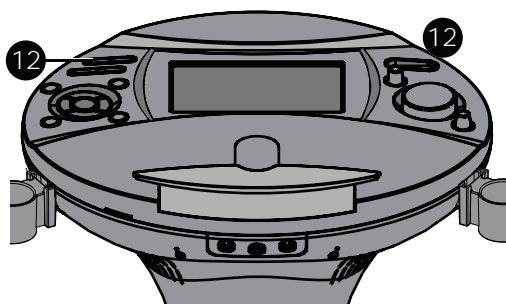
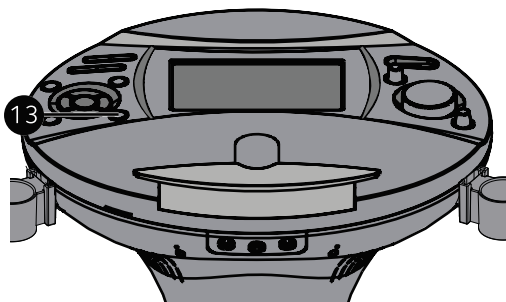
9 Press ECHO +/- buttons to add an echo effect to your voice. The higher the number, the more echo effect.

10 SKIP: Advance or go back one track by pressing the navigation ► right or ◀ left button.

Notes: Pairing remains intact when the unit and/or your Bluetooth device is taken out of communication range. An active connection will be re-established when your Bluetooth device returns within range. When the unit is turn on again, it will automatically try to reconnect with the most recently paires Bluetooth device. When the Bluetooth function of your Bluetooth enabled device is turned on again, reconnection can be achieved by pressing the MENU button on the unit.

11 SINGING RECORDING

You can always record your singing with the music to an audio file (.mp3 format) to the inserted USB Flash Drive or SD Card (not included). When you want to record during the song playback, press the RECORD button to start. There will be a Recording Icon on the top right of the screen. Once you have complete your recording, press the RECORD button again to stop.

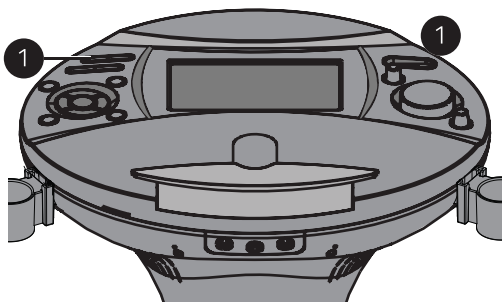

12 Press the ON/OFF button to turn the unit off; the ON/OFF indicator turn off.

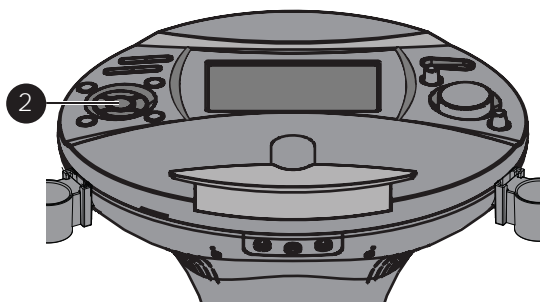

- 9 **MEMORY MEDIA**
You can also switch to listen those recorded audio files in SD card.
Press the the navigation ► right and ◀ left buttons to select the **Memory** tag at the top. Press the ENTER button to go into the Memory media selection.
Press the navigation ► right or ◀ left button to switch and ENTER button to confirm. The playlist order will update.
