





Safety Information

- Before operating the system, check that the operating voltage indicated on the typeplate of your system is identical with the voltage of your local power supply. If not, please consult your dealer.
- Place the system on a flat, hard and stable surface.
- Place the system in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build-up in your system. Allow at least 10 cm (4 inches) clearance from the rear and the top of the unit and 5 cm (2 inches) from each side.
- The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspapers, table-cloths, curtains, etc.
- Do not expose the system, batteries or discs to excessive moisture, rain, sand or heat sources caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- No naked flame sources, such as lighted candles, should be placed on the apparatus.

Hearing Safety

Listen at a moderate volume.

- Using headphones at a high volume can impair your hearing. This product can produce sounds in decibel ranges that may cause hearing loss for a normal person, even for exposure less than a minute. The higher decibel ranges are offered for those that may have already experienced some hearing loss.



The type plate is located at the rear of the system.

(A) Power

 Before connecting the AC power adaptor to the wall outlet, ensure that all other connections have been made.


- Use the supplied AC power adaptor only!

- For optimal performance, use only the original AC power adaptor.
- Never make or change connections with the power switched on.

To avoid overheating of the system, a safety circuit has been built in. Therefore, your system may switch to Standby mode automatically under extreme conditions. If this happens, let the system cool down before reusing it (not available for all versions).

(B) Antennas Connection

Connect the supplied AM loop antenna and FM antenna to the respective terminals. Adjust the position of the antenna for optimal reception.

 Position the antenna as far as possible from a TV, VCR or other radiation source.

Connecting a USB mass storage device or SD/MMC memory card

By connecting a USB mass storage device or SD/MMC memory card to the Hi-Fi system, you can enjoy the device's or card's stored music through the powerful speakers of Hi-Fi system.

Insert the USB device's USB plug into the socket on the set.

OR

for the devices with USB cables:

- Insert one plug of the USB cable (not supplied) to the socket on the set.
- 2 Insert the other plug of the USB cable to the USB output terminal of the USB device.

OR

for the memory card:

Fully insert the memory card into the SD •
 MMC slot on the top of the system.

Connecting other equipment to your system

 Use the supplied Aux-in cable to connect the AUX jack (3.5mm, located on the top panel) to an AUDIO OUT or headphone jack on an external device (such as TV, Laser Disc player, DVD player or CD recorder).

Note:

 To connect equipment with two AUX OUT (left/ right) terminals, you can use a "single to double" cinch cable (not supplied).








Inserting batteries into the Remote Control

- Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert two R03 or AAA batteries following the indications (+/-) inside the compartment.
- 3 Close the cover.



Using the Remote Control to operate the system

- Aim the Remote Control directly at the remote sensor (IR) on the front panel.
- 2 Do not put any objects between the Remote Control and the system while operating the system.

CAUTION!

- Remove batteries if they are exhausted or if the Remote Control is not being used for a long time.
- Do not use old and new or different types of batteries in combination.

- Press **STANDBY-ON/ECO POWER** (b) (or

Switching the system to standby mode

Press STANDBY-ON/ECO POWER (b) (or
 (b) on the remote).

- → The backlight for clock display is dim in standby.
- → The volume level (up to a maximum volume level of 12), interactive sound settings, last selected mode (ECO Power Standby or normal standby), source and tuner presets will be retained in the player's memory.

Switching the system to Eco Power Standby mode

- Press and hold STANDBY-ON/ECO
 POWER (b) (or (b) on the remote) for more than 2 seconds.
 - → The backlight will go blank.

Power Saving Automatic Standby

As a power-saving feature, the system automatically switches to Eco Power/ Standby 15 minutes after playback has reached the end and no control is operated.

Adjusting volume and sound

- Press VOLUME +/- (or VOL +/- on the remote control) to decrease or increase the volume.
 - → Display shows the volume level VOL and a number from MIN 1, 2, ...31 MAX.
- Press DSC repeatedly to select the desired sound effect: ROCK/POP/JAZZ/CLASSIC.
- 3 Press **DBB** to switch bass enhancement on or
 - → If the DBB is activated, IBB GN is shown.
 - → If the DBB is deactivated, IBB OFF is shown.
- Press MUTE on the remote control to interrupt sound reproduction instantly.
 - → Playback will continue without sound and MUTE will flash on the display.
- To activate sound reproduction you can:
 - press MUTE again;
 - adjust the volume controls;
 - change source.



Basic playback controls

To play a disc

Press ► II to start playback.
 The current track number and elapsed

playing time of the track are displayed during disc playback.

To select a different track

- Press I◄◄/▶► (or I◄ / ►) on the remote control) once or repeatedly until the desired track number appears in the display.
- You can also use the Numerical Keypad
 (0~9) on the remote to select a track directly.
- If you have selected a track number shortly after loading a disc or in the PAUSE position, you will need to press
 II to start playback.

Text display during playback In CD mode

- Press **DISPLAY** repeatedly to see the following information.
 - → Track number and elapsed playback time of current track.
 - → Track number and total elapsed playback time
 - → Track number and remaining playback time of current track.
 - → Track number and total remaining playback time

In MP3/WMA/USB/CARD mode

- Press **DISPLAY** repeaedly to see the following information:
 - → Track number and elapsed playback time of current track
 - → Title name
 - → Album name
 - → ID3 (if available)

Loading a disc

This CD player plays Audio Discs including CD Recordables, CD-Rewritables, MP3 CD and WMA disc.

- CD-ROM, CD-I, CDV, VCD, DVD or computer CDs, however, are not possible.
- Press **SOURCE** on the top of the system to select CD or press **CD** on the remote.
- 2 Insert a disc into the disc loader.
 - → Make sure the label side is facing up.
 - → Make sure you have removed any other disc from the slot loader.
- 3 Press ▶ II to start playback.
- 4 At any time, simply press to stop playback.





CD/MP3-CD/WMA Operation

To find a passage within a track

- Press and hold I◄◄/►►I (or ◄◄ /►► on the remote control).
- When you recognize the passage you want, release I◄◄/▶►I (or ◄◄ /▶► on the remote control).
 - → Normal playback continues.

To stop playback

Press ■.

To interrupt playback

- Press II during playback.
 The display freezes and the elapsed playing time flashes when playback is interrupted.
 - → To resume, press ► II again.

Notes:

CD play will also stop when;

- you eject the disc.
- the disc has reached the end.
- you select another source: TUNER, BT (Bluetooth), DOCK (iPod), USB, USB or CARD (SD/ MMC).
- you select standby.
- the set auto off time expires.

Playing an MP3/WMA disc

- Load an MP3/WMA disc.
 - → The disc reading time may exceed 10 seconds due to the large number of songs compiled into one disc.
- 2 Press **ALBUM PRESET** +/- (or ▲ / ▼ on the remote control) to select a desired album.
- 3 Press I◄◄/▶►I (or I◄ /►I on the remote control) to select a desired track.
 → The album number will change accordingly as you reach the first track of an album by pressing I◄◄ (I◄ on the remote) or the last track of an

album by pressing **>>** (**>** on the remote).

4 Press ► II to start playback.

Supported MP3 disc formats:

- ISO9660, Joliet
- Maximum title number: 999 (depending on filename length)
- Maximum album number: 99
- Supported sampling frequencies: 32 kHz, 44.1kHz, 48 kHz
- Supported Bit-rates: 32~256 (kbps), variable bitrates







CD/MP3-CD/WMA Operation

Different play modes: SHUFFLE and REPEAT

You can select and change the various play modes before or during playback. The REPEAT modes can also be combined with PROGRAM.

- To select your play mode, press MODE (SHUFFLE or REPEAT on the remote control) before or during playback until the display shows the desired function.
 - → **x** appears if the shuffle playback is activated and disappears if deactivated.
 - → If CD appears, it indicates to play the current track repeatedly.
 - → If C→ ALL is displayed, it indicates to play all tracks in the whole disc repeatedly.
 - → For an MP3 CD/WMA, if both ← and RL ⅓ appear on the display panel, it indicates to play the current album repeatedly.
- Press ► II to start playback if in the STOP position.
 - → If you have selected SHUFFLE, playback starts automatically.
- 3 To return to normal playback, press the MODE (SHUFFLE or REPEAT on the remote control) until → or → is no longer displayed.
- You can also press to stop playback and cancel your play mode.

Note:

- The Repeat and Shuffle functions cannot be activated simultaneously.

Programming track numbers

Program in the STOP position to select and store your disc tracks in the desired sequence. If you like, store any track more than once. Up to 40 tracks can be stored in the memory.

- Press **PROG** to enter the programming mode.A track number flashes.
- 2 Press I◀◀/▶►I (or I◀ / ►I on the remote control) to select your desired track number.
- For an MP3 CD, Press ALBUM PRESET +/-(or ◄ / ► on the remote control) to select a desired album number.
- Press PROG to confirm the track number to be stored.
 - ightharpoonup PR ightharpoonup displays, in which ightharpoonup denotes the next program number to be stored.
- Repeat steps 2-3 to select and store all desired tracks.
 - → PROGRAM FULL appears if you attempt to program more than 40 tracks.
- Press to finish programming.→ PROG displays on the screen.
- To start playback of your disc program, press▶ II directly.

Erasing the program

You can erase the program by:

- pressing once in the STOP mode;
- pressing twice during playback;
 → PROG disappears.
- ejecting the current disc;

Tuning to radio stations

- Press SOURCE repeatedly (or TUNER on the remote control) to select the tuner source (FM or AM).
- ② Hold I◄◄/►►I (or ◄◄ /►► on the remote control) and then release the button.
 → The system will start searching for a radio station with sufficient signal strength.







The Bluetooth capabilities of BTM630 enable it to receive audio from various other Bluetoothenabled devices wirelessly (for example, a mobile phone, PDA etc.) within a range of approximately 8 meters.

Supported Bluetooth profiles

Your system supports the following Bluetooth profiles:

Hands-Free Profile (HFP)

Headset Profile (HSP)

Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP) Audio Video Remote Control Profile (AVRCP)

Note:

 Before pairing a Bluetooth-enabled device with this system, please first read the user manual of the device to check whether it supports any of the above profiles.

Pairing a Bluetooth-enabled device with the system

IMPORTANT!

- The Bluetooth transmitter and receiver hardware in this system has an approximate operational range of 8 meter in open space. Generally Bluetooth devices can communicate with each other clearly within a regular sized room or office. Operation between different rooms will depend on the construction of the room. It is important to recognize the fact that Bluetooth communication range may be substantially reduced if the signal passes through a solid object. Human bodies, brick and concrete walls, and heavy furniture or bookcases will reduce the operational range of your Bluetooth devices. Glass, dry-wall or wood paneled walls and office partitions may have a less severe but noticeable effect. You should position your Bluetooth devices closer to each other if you observe communication difficulties.
- Please familiarize yourself with the Bluetooth capabilities of your device before connecting it to this system.
 Compatibility with all Bluetooth devices is not guaranteed!

- Wait for completion of the pairing until you hear a double beep from the system and the bluetooth icon turns on.
 - → If the connected device (mobile phone) supports the HFP and/or HSP profiles, the display panel of the system will show "PHONE CONNECTED" briefly.
 - → If the connected device (mobile phone or other device) supports the A2DP profile, the display panel of the system will show "PHONE CONNECTED" followed by "STEREO CONNECTED" briefly.
 - → You may be asked to grant permission for "AVRCP" or "Remote Control" functions. You should grant this permission for complete connection.
 - → The name of the paired device will appear on the display panel after successful pairing.
- Repeat the above steps if you want to pair more Bluetooth-enabled devices with the system.

To disconnect a paired device

- Switch off the device or move it beyond the communication range.
 - → "DISCONNECT PHONE" or "DISCONNECT STEREO" will appear on the display panel of the system briefly when the connection is terminated.
 - → You will hear a long beep from the system.

To disconnect all paired devices

- Press and hold on REJECT for more than 5 seconds until "DISCONNECT ALL" appear on the display panel of the system.
 - → No message on the display panel indicates that there is no active connection to terminate.

Notes:

The system can store pairing information of up to 7 devices. You do not need to pair a device every time you want to reconnect it with this system. As long as the system is powered on and the reconnection function of device is activated, the paired device will reconnect to the system whenever it comes into the communication range.

Operating a connected Bluetooth-enabled device through the system

BTM630 is designed with a built-in high-quality microphone (speakerphone) allowing you to make or end calls of a connected mobile phone through this system.

Notes for the speakerphone:

- To achieve the best performance from your system, please follow these guidelines for placement and use of the speakerphone:
- 1) Choose a quiet environment.
 The microphone on the unit will pick up your voice, as well as some amount of background noise. Using this unit in a quiet place will make it easier for the party you are calling to hear your
- 2) Minimize echo in the room.
 Using this unit in a room that has carpets, drapes and soft furnishings will give better performance than using in a room with highly reflective surfaces such as tile, concrete and glass.
- 3) Keep in range of the microphone.
 The closer you speak to the microphone, the more clearly your voice will be heard. If you are within 2 meter of the microphone you may talk at a normal volume and your voice should be clear to the party you are calling. If you move beyond 3 meter, you will need to raise your voice in order to be heard clearly. Use beyond 5 meter range is not recommended.
- 4) Choose a sensible listening volume.
 This unit is designed to perform best at moderate listening levels. If you increase the volume too much, you may begin to hear an echo. The best listening level is normally a maximum volume level of 16.

5) Place the unit in line with your mouth. If you will be using this unit while sitting down, place the unit at tabletop level, in line with the level of your mouth. Placing the unit on a high cabinet or on the floor may reduce the pick-up of the microphone.



Timer setting
