What you need before you can use your Internet Radio

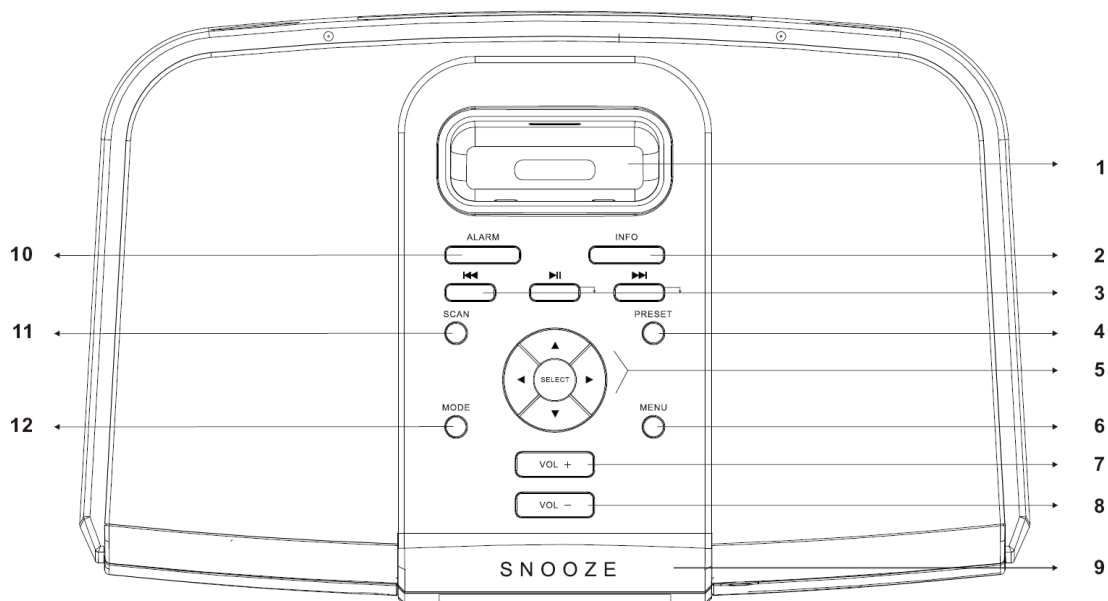
Before you use your Internet Radio, you need the following:

Wireless LAN Setting:

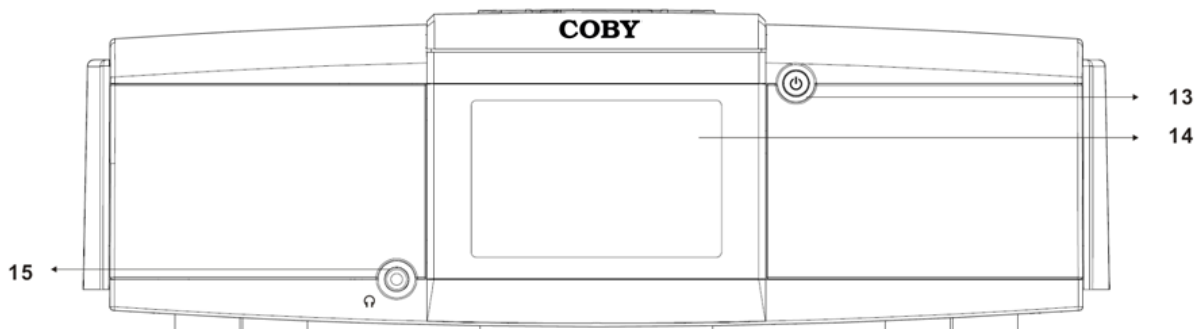
- A broadband Internet connection.
- A wireless access point (Wi-Fi) **connected** to your broadband Internet, preferably via a router.
- If your wireless network is configured to use Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) or Wi-Fi Protected Access (WPA) data encryption then you need to know the WEP or WPA code so you can get the Internet Radio to communicate with the network.
- If your wireless network is configured for trusted stations you will need to enter the Radio's MAC address into your wireless access point. To find the Radio's MAC address use menu items as follows:
Main menu → System settings → Network → View settings → MAC Address
- To enter the MAC address into your wireless access point, you must read the instructions supplied with the wireless access point.

Before you continue, make sure that your wireless access point is powered up and connected to your broadband Internet, to get this part of the system working you must read the instructions supplied with the wireless access point.

Connecting to wired network

Step 1 - Power up Radio

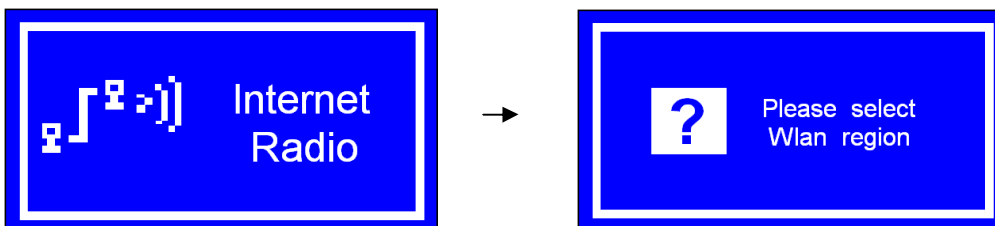
First, connect to your Internet Radio adaptor and ensure the Power LED is light up. In use, Radio can be switched on or off by press  button.



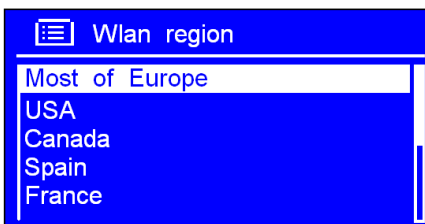
Step 2 - connect to the internet

1. Press **SELECT** to enter Internet Radio mode.

Alternatively, you may press **MODE** repeatedly until 'Internet radio' shows up, stop pressing.

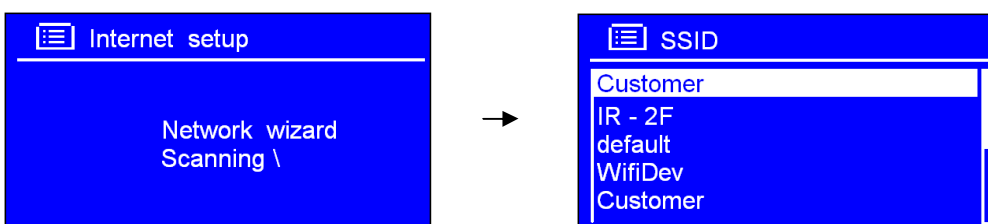

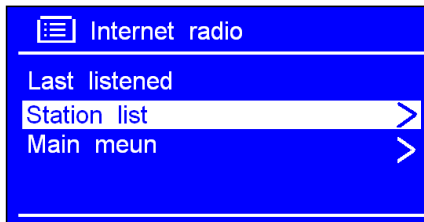
Step 3 – Select Your Region

1. Press **▲** or **▼** until your region is shows up, press **SELECT** to confirm, then your radio will ask you to enter network.



Step 4 – Access Network

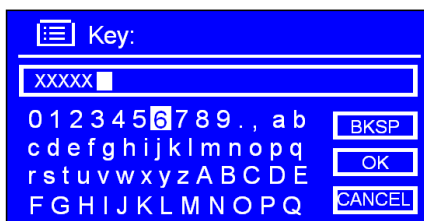
1. In some cases Radio may find more than one network. Press ▲ or ▼ to cycle through the name list, and then press **SELECT** when the name of your own network is displayed.
2. If your network is not configured to request a password (WEP/WPA), radio will connect to the network and display:



3. If a WEP/WPA key (password) is required, radio will now ask you to input the WEP/WPA code and will display the password entry screen as follows:



- Press ▲ or ▼ to cycle through the alpha-numeric character list. Press **SELECT** to select an appointed character.



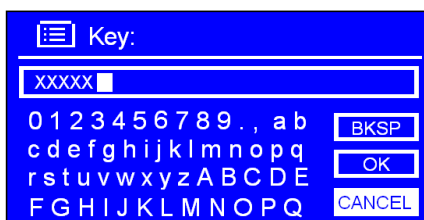
- If you make a mistake while enter your password, select ' **BKSP** ' icon to delete a character.



Note: a. for **BKSP** , its full name is Backspace.

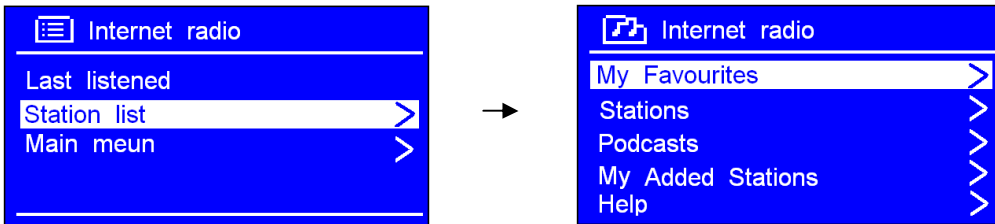
b. the method of select **BKSP** , **OK** or **CANCEL** icon is when cursor director to '0', continue press ▲ or ▼ to select.


c. WEP/WPA pass code input is case-sensitive



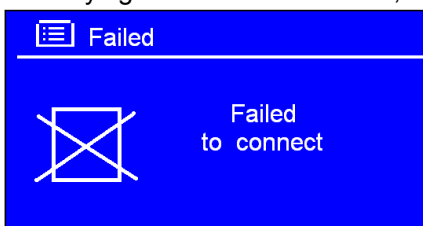
- Select **CANCEL** return to previous track.
- After selecting the final character of your password, press ▲ or ▼ to **OK** and press **SELECT**.

4. It should now successfully connect to your network, press ▲ or ▼ to <STATION LIST>, and then press **SELECT** to confirm.




 **Note:** a. Radio will automatically save the WEP/WPA you've input, so no use to re-entered, unless a <FACTORY RESET> is being executed.

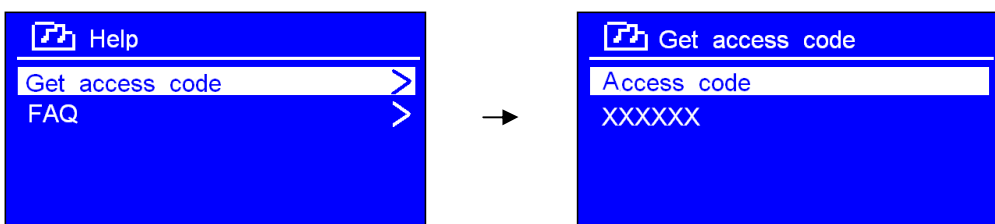


Perhaps you need:

- A. Check your router, see it working normally or not.
- B. Relocate your radio to a more strength signer area, may be necessary! Make sure your password is correct input.

 **Note:** If you make a mistake at any point, press ◀ to go back to the previous screen.

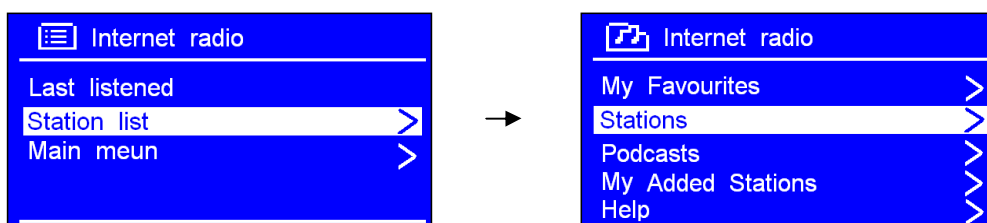
5. To get your access code or **FAQ** solutions, press ▲ or ▼ to <HELP>, press **SELECT** to confirm.



Choosing a station


After your radio has successfully connected to network, you are now ready to select a station.

1. Press ▲ or ▼ to <STATION LIST>, press **SELECT** confirm.

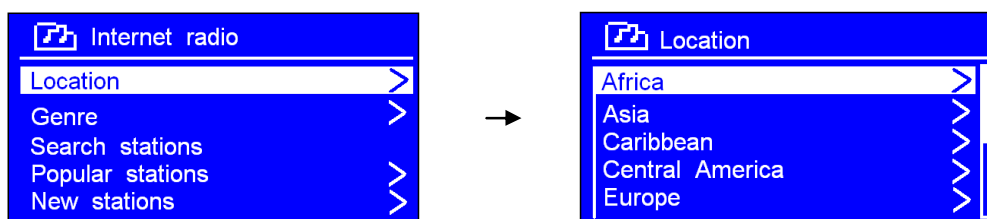


2. Press ▲ or ▼ to <STATIONS>, press **SELECT** to confirm.


3. There are five options available for you to choose a station.

 **Note:** 'LOCATION' enables you to choose from the radio stations provided by any country which you choose from a list.

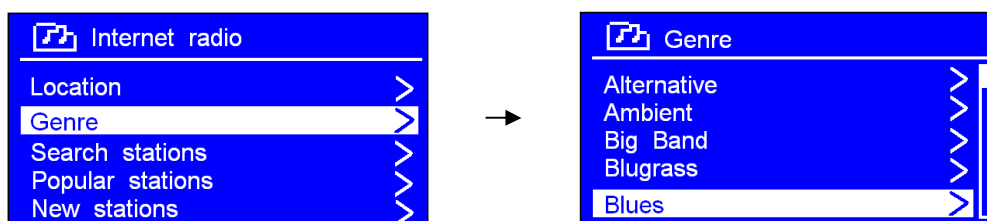
- a. Press ▲ or ▼ to <LOCATION>, press **SELECT** to confirm.




- b. Press ▲ or ▼ to your region, press **SELECT** to confirm, using the same method to choose country, station in turn, Radio will now loading.

 **Note:** 'GENRE' enables you to choose radio stations according to their content, for example Classic Rock, Sport, News, etc.

- a. Press ▲ or ▼ to <GENRE>, press **SELECT**, and then press ▲ or ▼ to the type of content you want, press **SELECT** to confirm.



- b. Press ▲ or ▼ to the station you want, press **SELECT** to confirm.

 **Note:**

- a. Some radio stations do not broadcast 24 hours per day, and some stations are not always on-line.
- b. If this station has on-demand content (that is, it gives the option of listening to programs which have already been broadcast).

Changing the Station Information

It is possible to change the information that is displayed on the second line of the display when listening Internet program. To change the information displayed by pressing **INFO**.

1. Description of Station

This is scrolling text information supplied by the Internet station. It may comprise information on music titles or details of the programme and is provided by the broadcaster.

2. Location of Station

This is a description of the type of programme provided by either internet radio station or broadcaster.

3. Reliability of Station

This will show the degree of reliability of station which you are listening to.

4. Signal Information of Station

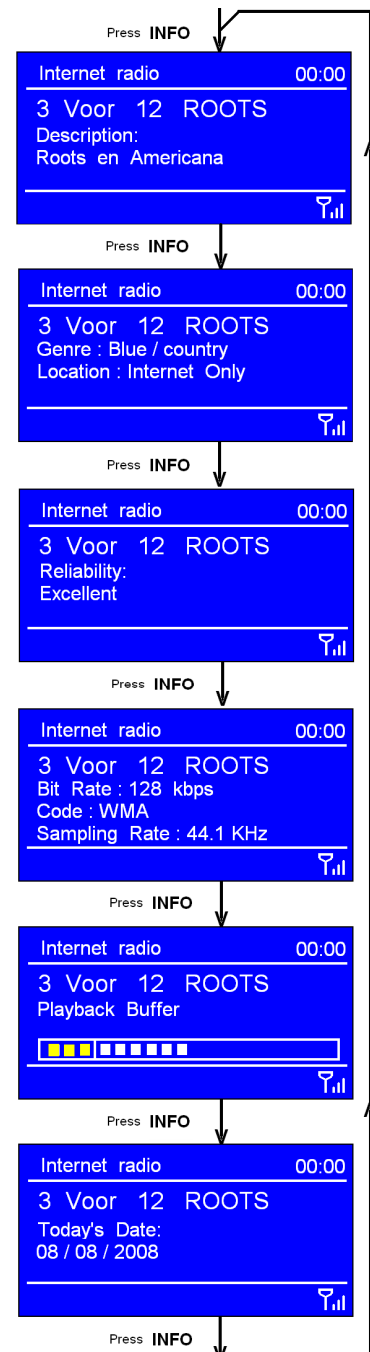
This shows the digital bit rate and the signal mode.

5. Playback Buffer of Station

This displays the playback buffer strength of current station.

6. Date of Station


This displays the date and is provided by the broadcaster so will be accurate.



Station Updates

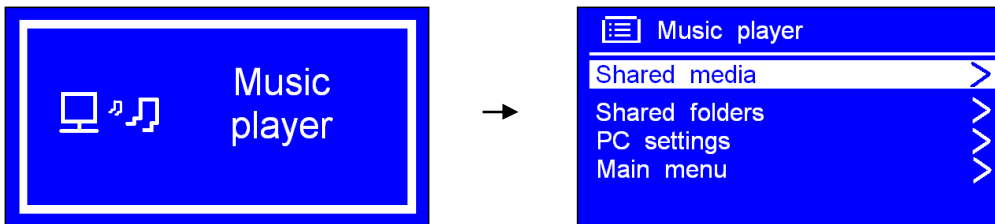
Occasionally, Radio will tell you that it is receiving an updated station list. It does this automatically and periodically, ensuring your Radio always has the latest station directory on-board.

Music player Operation Mode

 **Note:** To play this order, reading appendix at first, which at following pages is highly recommending!

A. PLAY SHARED MEDIA

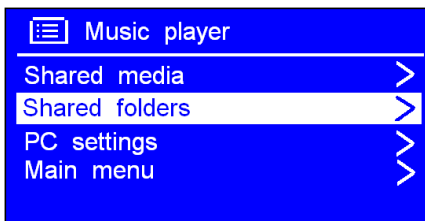
1. Press **MODE** repeatedly until <MUSIC PLAYER> is shows up. Or enter 'MAIN MENU', and then press **▲** or **▼** to <MUSIC PLAYER>, press **SELECT**.



2. Press **▲** or **▼** to your purpose one, then step by step to your ideal Music. Alternatively,

B. PLAY SHARED FOLDERS

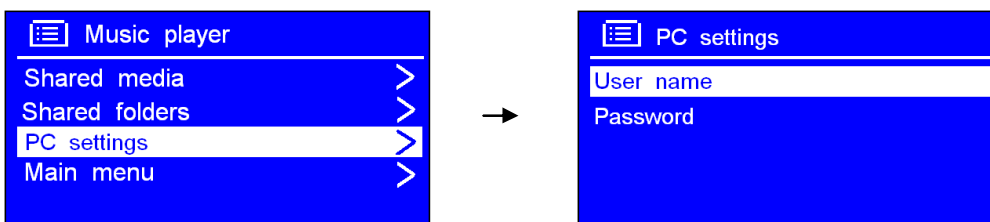
1. At <Music player> subdirectory, press **▲** or **▼** to <SHARED FOLDERS>, press **SELECT** to confirm.



2. Press **▲** or **▼** to your purpose one, then step by step to your ideal Music.

C. PC setting

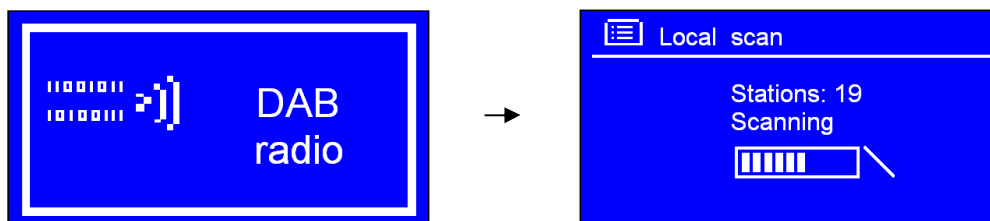
1. At <Music player> subdirectory, press **▲** or **▼** to <PC SETTINGS>, press **SELECT** to confirm.



2. Press **SELECT** to confirm to input your 'user name', and then press **▼** to input your 'Password'.

DAB Operation Mode (optional item)

1. Switch Radio on and press **MODE** repeatedly until <DAB RADIO> is shows up. For initial use, it will now scan for DAB stations in your area and store them in memory.

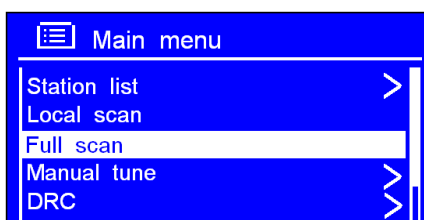


 **Note:** to enter this mode, you may also press ◀ to goes back to <MAIN MENU>, and then press ▲ or ▼ to <DAB >, press **SELECT** to confirm.


2. Once the scanning is completed, the DAB stations will be displayed in alphanumeric order. The first station in the list will be selected.



3. You can move back to the previous screen at any time by press ◀, then there is <Local scan>, <Full scan> and <Manual tune> available for your choice.



4. Once the scanning is completed, press ▲ or ▼ to cycle through stations list, and then press **SELECT** to confirm.

 **Note:** a. if no DAB signal is found in your area, it may be necessary for you to relocate your radio.

b. "Local scan" only search the stations which located at Britain region, if you at other location, make a "Full scan" is highly recommending!

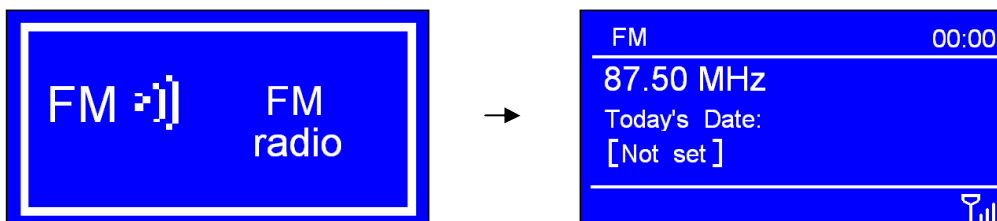
Dynamic Label Segment (DLS):


This is scrolling text information supplied by the DAB station. It may comprise information on music title or detail of the program and is provided by the broadcaster.

FM Operation Mode


A. GENERAL OPERATION

1. Switch Radio on and press **MODE** repeatedly until <FM RADIO> is shown up. For initial use, it will start at the beginning of the FM frequency range (87.50MHz). Otherwise, the last FM station you were listening to will be selected.



 **Note:** to enter this mode, you may also press ◀ to go back to <MAIN MENU>, and then press ▲ or ▼ to <FM radio>, press **SELECT** to confirm.

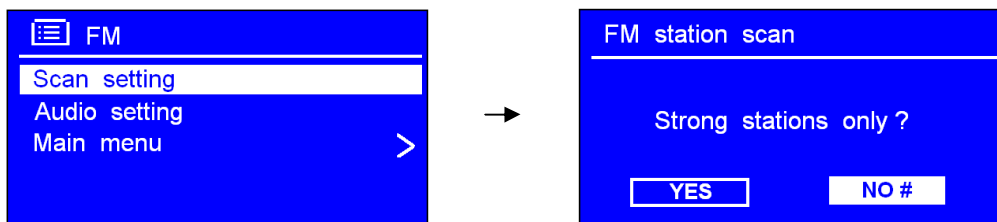
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to increase or decrease the frequency by 0.05MHz per step.
3. To 'SEEK' active station automatically, press and hold ▲ or ▼, or alternatively press **SCAN**.

 **Note:**

- a. To 'seeking' the next active station automatically, repeat step 3.
- b. The unit will display the frequency changing until it stops on the next station.
- c. After it running to the end of the frequency range, it will restart search.

B. SCAN SETTING

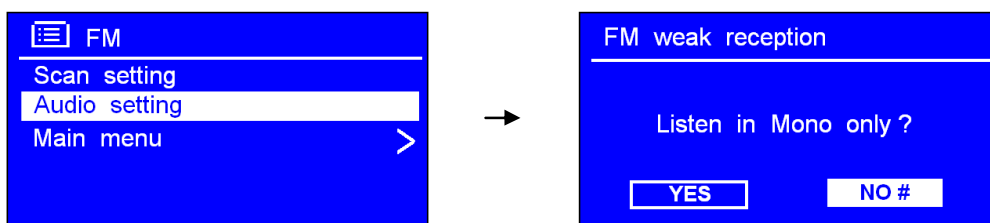
1. Running into FM mode, at any step by press ◀ to enter, and then press ▲ or ▼ to <SCAN SETTING>, press **SELECT** to confirm.



2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select 'YES' or 'NO', and then press **SELECT** to confirm.

C. AUDIO SETTING

1. Running into FM mode, at any step by press ◀ to enter, and then press ▲ or ▼ to <AUDIO SETTING>, press **SELECT** to confirm.

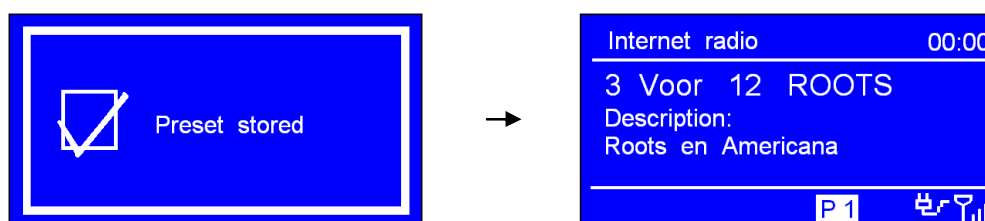

Setting Station Presets

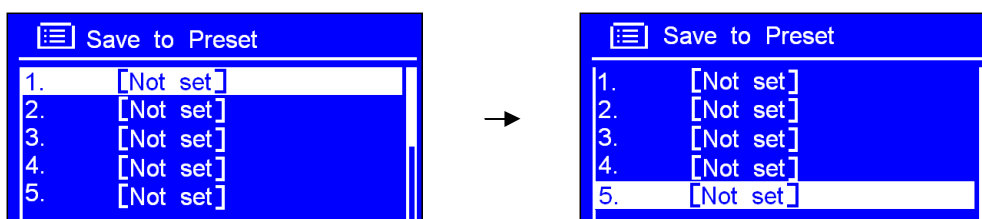
Your Radio can store 10 Internet, 10 DAB and 10 FM stations preset, to preset current station:

1. Press and hold one of **PRESET** buttons 1-10 on remote control, until it say:

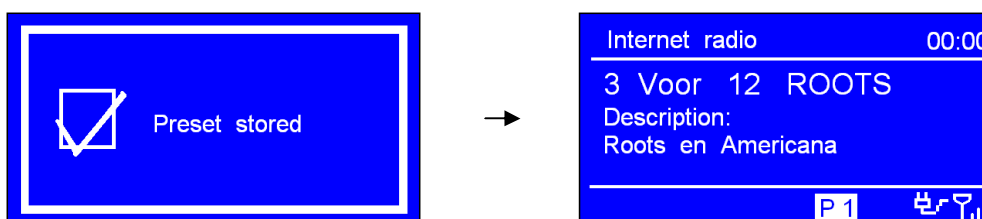


Or alternatively, you can store stations through:

- Press and hold **PRESET** at first, and then press ▲ or ▼ to your purpose one.



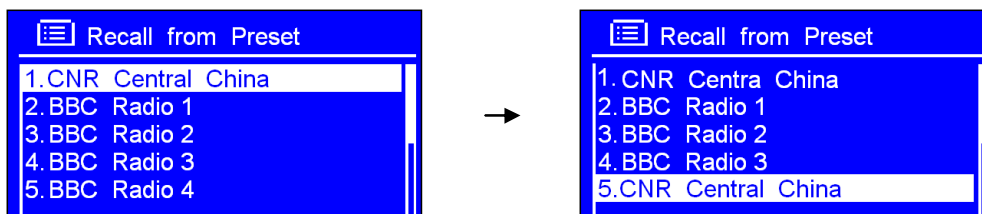
2. Press **SELECT** to confirm, and then it will return to its normal working condition, and preset icon appeared on display.



Selecting a Preset station

To select a stored station:

1. Enter corresponding mode at first, and then press **PRESET** at first, and then press ▲ or ▼ to your purpose one.



2. Press **SELECT** to confirm.



Note: a. do not hold the button down - if you do then the station currently playing will overwrite the one stored in the preset, be careful!

b. Or press **PRESET** buttons 1-10 on remote control after enter corresponding mode to directly enter.

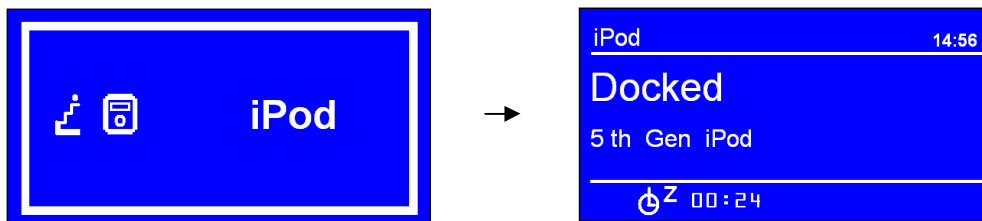
Docking and playing your iPod

The dock of unit can play music files stored on your iPod through the stereo speakers.

Docking your iPod

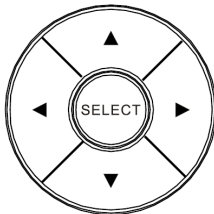
Insert the Dock Adapter that fits your iPod model, then plug it in your iPod.

1. Insert your iPod into the iPod docking on the top of the unit. IR68N Dock will begin to charge your iPod if necessary. Charging will stop when the iPod is fully charged (check the iPod screen).
2. Press the **MODE** button until the audio source is 'iPod mode';



3. How to play?

- a. Press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to previous or next track, press the ▲ or ▼ buttons to upward or downward track name, press **SELECT** to confirm;



- b. Select and play a track using your iPod.

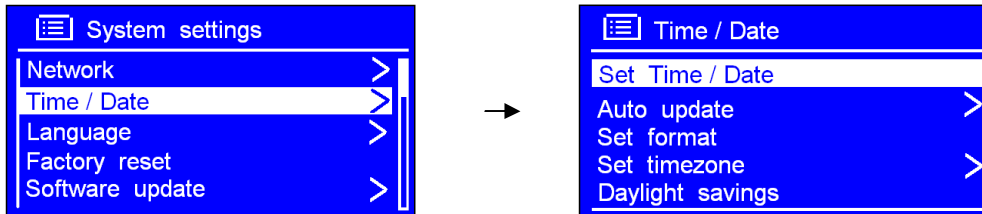
- c. Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to quick select, there is no need press **SELECT** to confirm; press ▶|| to pause, press again to continue enjoying.



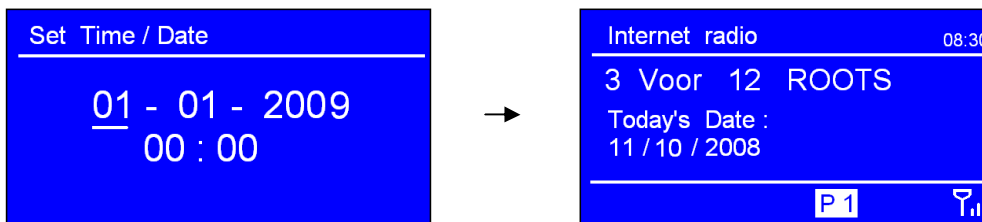
- d. Adjust the playback volume by press **VOL +** or **VOL -**, do not adjust the volume on the iPod.

Setting Clock

1. At any mode, enter 'MAIN MENU', → 'System settings' → 'Time/Date', press **SELECT**.

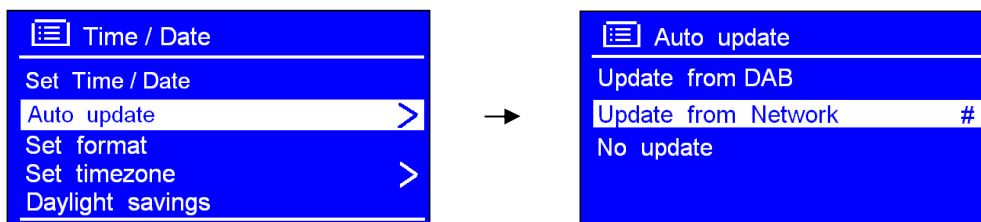


2. Press **SELECT** to confirm to set 'Set Time/Date', and then press ▲ or ▼ to set date, press **SELECT** to confirm.

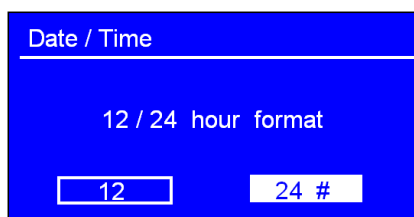


Note: Using the same method setting month, year, hour and minutes.

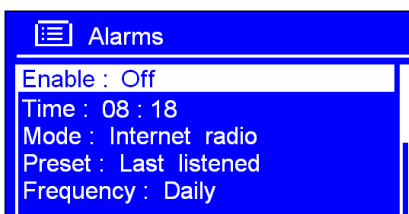
The display will show 'Alarm Saved' for 3 seconds, Alarm icon appeared.



To check alarms status, press ⏻ to enter standby mode.



8. When alarm is coming, press any button except **SNOOZE** to deactivate it, press **SNOOZE** will stop it between 5-30 minutes. Press **SNOOZE** again to show how long it will be expired.
9. To cancel Alarm you need to press **ALARM** to enter its setting mode, and then press **SELECT** to turn 'On' to 'Off', finally press ▼ to 'Save' your settings.




Alternatively, perform a 'factory reset'.

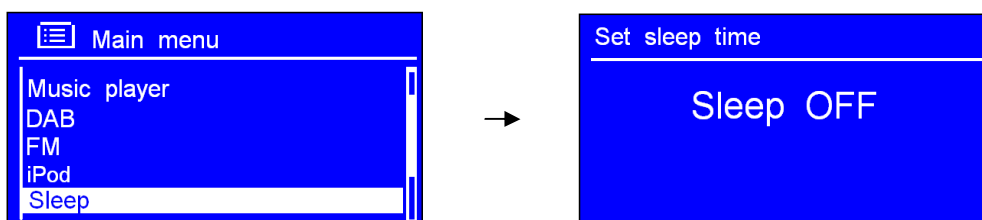
Note: Alarm volume level can be adjust to your desired level before turning OFF the unit, and stored it in memory, if you set **Volume Level** to min., when alarm is coming, you might be won't hear it.

Sleep Function

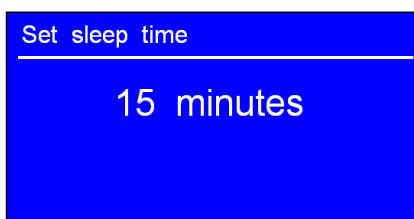
1. Directly press **SNOOZE** to enter, or alternatively, press **SNOOZE/SLEEP** on remote control.

 **Note:** make sure no alarm is coming when you press this button to set sleep.

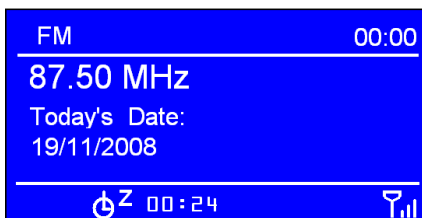
Or It also can be activated from 'MAIN MENU' → 'SLEEP', press **SELECT** to confirm.





2. Repeat press **SNOOZE** or **SNOOZE/SLEEP** to define the sleep period which between 0 – 60 minutes.



3. When your purpose sleep period is appeared, stopping pressing. Later, it will return to normal working condition.




 **Note:** a. The interval time is 15 minutes per step.
B. At this step, and sleep icon shows up, as well as show how long it will be expired

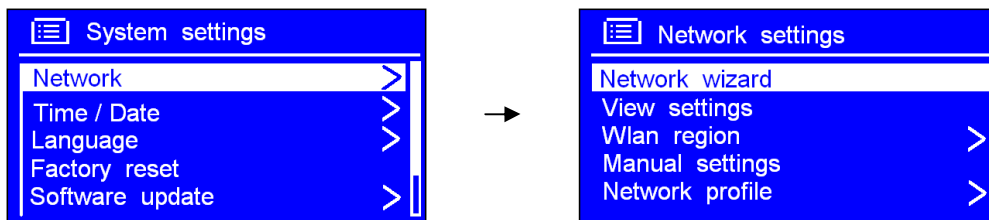
5. Radio will now automatically put itself into standby mode after it has elapsed.

System settings

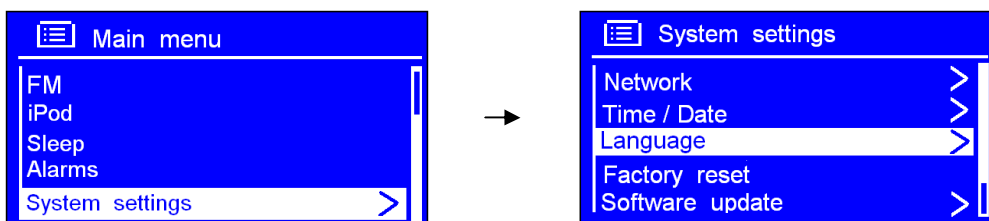

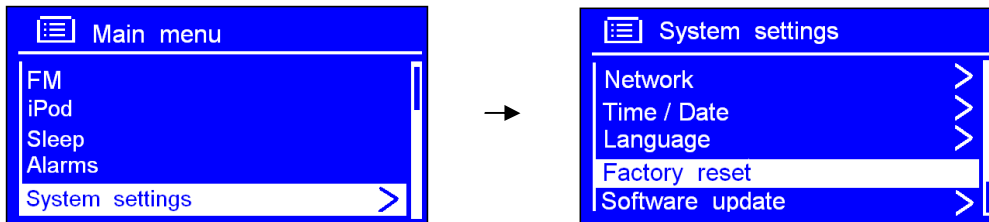

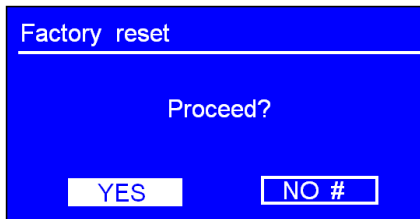
Factory reset

Step 1: Set Up Media Sharing in WMP 11

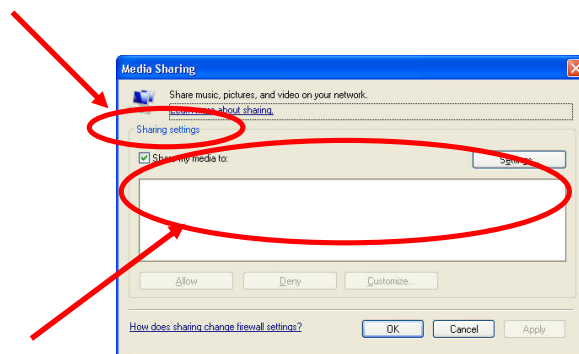
After you download and install Windows Media Player 11 for Windows XP and connect your Radio to the network, you need to set up media sharing so that you can share music with your Radio.

The following steps describe how to set up media sharing in Windows Media Player 11.

1. In Windows Media Player 11, click the small arrow below the **Library** tab, and then click **Media Sharing**.



2. In the **Media Sharing** dialogue box, select the **Share my media** check box.



Check the “share my media to” box. In the list, click your **Radio** *, click **Allow**, the selected device will now show a green tick and then click **OK**.

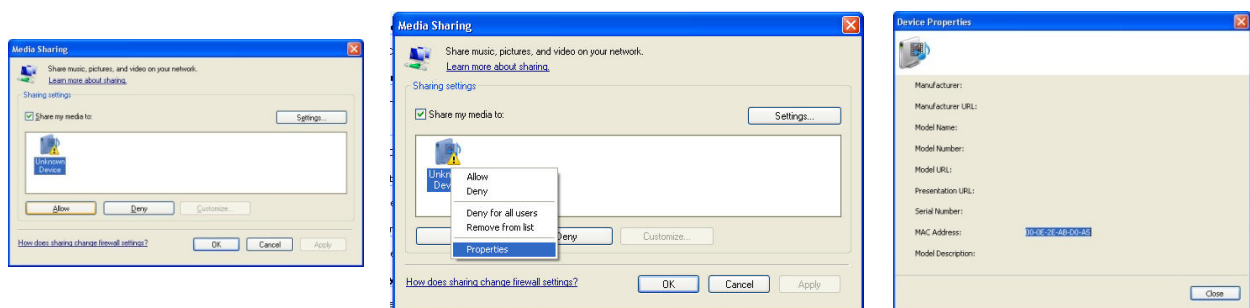
* **If your device does not appear in the list of devices, perform the following steps:**

From the "Media Player" menu of your internet Radio select "UPNP Servers"

A list of available computers will appear.

Select the required computer.

Your device will now appear in the list. If you want to check that this is your Radio, right click on the device and select “Properties”: your Radio's MAC address will be shown.



Step 2: Play Music on the Internet Radio.

After installing and configuring your Radio and Windows Media Player 11, you are now ready to play music via a wireless connection.

The following steps describe how to play music with your Radio.

1. Select "UPNP Servers" in the "Media Player" menu.
2. Select the computer you wish to play the music files from.
3. Use the controls to browse according to the following criteria: All Music, Genre, All Artists, Contributing Artists, Album Artists, Composers, Albums, Playlists, Folders or Star Ratings and then press the **SELECT** button to confirm.
4. Select the tracks you want to play, and then press the Select button. Enjoy the music!

Set Up Media Sharing in MAC OS

Using the Radio with a MAC will require Windows File Sharing. MAC OS 9 and earlier versions of the OS will need extra software to use Windows File Sharing, but MAC OS X 10.2 and later versions have Windows File Sharing built into the OS.

Set up Windows File Sharing on a MAC

- From the 'Dock', click on 'System Preferences'. From the 'System Preferences' window, under the 'Internet & Network' section, click on 'Sharing'.
- From the 'Sharing' window, do the following:
 - Under the 'Services' section, enable 'Personal File Sharing' and 'Windows Sharing'. In order to do this, tick the corresponding boxes or click on 'Start' for each of these services.
 - Under the 'Firewall' section, switch off the firewall.
 - Under the 'Internet' section, switch off 'Internet Sharing'.

Accounts Setup

- From the 'System Preferences' window, in the 'System' section, click on 'Accounts'. Select an account and remember its 'Short Name' and password. This will be used for the Radio to connect to the MAC.

Directory Setup

- From the 'Dock', click on 'Finder'. From 'Finder', click on 'Applications' then 'Utilities'. Click on 'More Info' for 'Directory Access' and ensure that the 'Read/Write' option is enabled. Double-click on 'Directory Access' and enable the following:
 - AppleTalk
 - LDAPv3
 - SLP
 - SMB/CIFS
- For 'SMB/CIFS', click on 'Configure' and select an appropriate workgroup.
- Copy and paste the mp3 files to 'Documents' in the 'Finder' window.
- Turn on 'AirPort' (wireless sharing).
- Wait for a few minutes.

In the 'Media Player' > 'Windows Shares' menu, enter the MAC account's short name and password. The Radio should then be able to connect to the MAC.

Troubleshooting

If you have trouble connecting the Radio to your wireless network, these steps may help to resolve the problem:

1. Confirm that a Wi-Fi connected PC can access the Internet (i.e. can browse the web) using the same network.
2. Check that a DHCP server is available, or that you have configured a static IP address on the Radio. You can configure a static IP address on the Radio using the menu item 'System setup -> Network -> Manual setting-> Wireless', and then select 'DHCP disable'.
3. Check your access point does not restrict connections to particular MAC addresses. You can view the Radio's MAC address using the menu item 'System setup -> Network -> View setting-> MAC address'.
4. If you have an encrypted network, check that you have entered the correct key or password into the Radio. Remember that text-format keys are case sensitive. If, when attempting to connect to an encrypted network, your Radio displays: 'Wireless error' followed by a 5-digit number, then please ensure that you enter the correct passphrase for the network. If the problem persists, then you may need to consult your network configuration.
5. If your Radio can connect to the network successfully, but is unable to play particular stations, it may be due to one of the following causes:
 - a. The station is not broadcasting at this time of the day (remember it may be located in a different time zone).
 - b. The station has reached the maximum allowed number of simultaneous listeners.
 - c. The station is not broadcasting anymore.
 - d. The link on the Radio is out of date.
 - e. The Internet connection between the server (often located in a different country) and you is slow.
Try using a PC to play back the stream via the broadcaster's web site.
6. If you can play back the station with a PC, use the form at <http://www.wifiRadio-frontier.com> to notify us so that we can change the station data that is used by the Radio.
