

Equipment Function and Configuration

The EUT is a 908 MHz low power transmitter used to wirelessly interface with compliant equipment in an alarm panel installation. The CellComC Transceiver performs wireless monitoring of for use in alarm system. The unit is marketed for use to incorporate a wireless link in an alarm system solution. The design operates from direct current power only and offers no provision for connection to utility power systems. A 12-volt power supply was used to power the EUT during testing. The design incorporates an authorized Cellular communications module (FCC ID: MIVCNN0301) to provide for emergency contact through cellular communications services. Testing of the CellComC was performed with the EUT placed in the manufacturer defined configuration. As requested by the manufacturer and required by regulations, the equipment was tested for emissions compliance using the available configurations with the worst-case data presented. Test results in this report relate only to the products described in this report.

In accordance with the Federal Communications Code of Federal Regulations, dated October 1, 2013, Part 2, Subpart J, Paragraphs 2.907, 2.911, 2.913, 2.925, 2.926, 2.1031 through 2.1057, and applicable parts of paragraph 15, Part 15C Paragraph 15.249 and Industry Canada standard RSS-210 Issue 8 the following information is submitted. Testing for the AC line-conducted emissions were performed as defined in sections 7 and 13.1.3, testing of the radiated emissions was performed as defined in section 13 of ANSI C63.4-2009.

AC Line Conducted Emission Test Procedure


The EUT operates from DC power only received from the AC/DC power adapter. For testing purposes, the manufacturer supplied AC/DC power adapter was used to power the EUT. Testing for the AC line-conducted emissions testing was performed as defined in sections 7 and 13.1.3 of ANSI C63.4-2009. The test setup including the EUT was arranged in typical equipment configurations and placed on a 1 x 1.5-meter wooden bench, 0.8 meters high located in a screen room. The power lines of the system were isolated from the power source using a standard LISN with a 50- μ Hy choke. EMI was coupled to the spectrum analyzer through a 0.1 μ F capacitor internal to the LISN. The LISN was positioned on the floor beneath the wooden bench supporting the EUT. The power lines and cables were draped over the back edge of the table. Refer to diagram 1 showing typical test arrangement and photographs in the test setup exhibits for Specific EUT placement during testing. Refer to photographs in the test setup exhibits for EUT placement during testing.

Radiated Emission Test Procedure

The EUT was placed on a rotating 1 x 1.5-meter wooden platform, 0.8 meters above the ground plane at a distance of 3 meters from the FSM antenna. Radiated emissions testing was performed as required in CFR47 15, RSS-210 and specified in sections 6 and 7 of ANSI C63.10-2009. EMI energy was maximized by equipment placement, raising and lowering the FSM antenna, changing the antenna polarization, and by rotating the turntable. Each emission was maximized before data was taken using a spectrum analyzer. The frequency spectrum from 9 kHz to 25,000 MHz was searched for during preliminary investigation. Refer to diagrams 2 and 3 showing typical test arrangement and photographs in the test setup exhibits for specific EUT placement during testing.




- 1. Interconnecting cables that hang closer than 40 cm to the ground plane shall be folded back and forth in the center forming a bundle 30 cm to 40 cm long see (see 6.2.3.1).
- 2. I/O cables that are not connected to an accessory shall be bundled in the center. The end of the cable may be terminated, if required, using the correct terminating impedance. The overall length shall not exceed 1 m (see 6.2.2).
- 3. EUT connected to one LISN. Unused LISN measuring port connectors shall be terminated in 50 Ω loads. LISN can be placed on top of, or immediately beneath, reference ground plane (see 6.2.2 and 6.2.3).




Diagram 3 Test arrangement for radiated emissions tested on Open Area Test Site (OATS)

Intentional Radiators

As per CFR47, Subpart C, paragraph 15.249 and RSS-210 the following information is submitted.

Antenna Requirements

The equipment design contains permanently attached antenna design etched on the printed circuit board. The equipment offers no provision for user service, replacement, or antenna modification. The antenna connection point complies with the unique antenna connection requirements. The requirements are fulfilled and there are no deviations or exceptions to the specification.

Restricted Bands of Operation

Spurious emissions falling in the restricted frequency bands of operation were measured at a distance of three meters on the OATS. The EUT utilizes frequency, determining circuitry, which generates harmonics falling in the restricted bands. Emissions were measured at the OATS, using appropriate antennas or pyramidal horns, amplification stages, and a spectrum analyzer. Emissions emanating from the EUT in the restricted bands of operation are presented in Table 1. No other significant emissions were observed which fell into the restricted bands of operation.

Summary of Results for Radiated Emissions in Restricted Bands

The EUT demonstrated compliance with the radiated emissions requirements of CFR 47 Part 15C and RSS-210 Intentional Radiators. The EUT demonstrated a minimum margin of –15.1 dB below the requirements. Peak, Quasi-peak, and Average amplitudes were checked for compliance with the regulations. Worst-case emissions are reported. Other emissions found in the restricted frequency bands presented at least 20 dB below the requirements.

AC Line Conducted Emissions Procedure

The EUT was arranged in a typical equipment configuration and placed on a 1 x 1.5-meter wooden bench 80 cm above the conducting ground plane, floor of a screen room. The bench was positioned 40 cm away from the wall of the screen room. The LISN was positioned on the floor of the screen room 80-cm from the rear of the EUT. The manufacturer supplied AC/DC adapter for the EUT was connected to the LISN. A second LISN was positioned on the floor of the screen room 80-cm from the rear of the supporting equipment of the EUT. All power cords except the EUT were then powered from the second LISN. EMI was coupled to the spectrum analyzer through a 0.1 µF capacitor, internal to the LISN. Power line conducted emissions testing were carried out individually for each current carrying conductor of the EUT. The excess length of lead between the system and the LISN receptacle was folded back and forth to form a bundle not exceeding 40 cm in length. The screen room, conducting ground plane, analyzer, and LISN were bonded together to the protective earth ground. Preliminary testing was performed to identify the frequency of each radio frequency emission displaying the highest amplitude. The cables were repositioned to obtain maximum amplitude of measured EMI level. Once the worstcase configuration was identified, plots were made of the EMI from 0.15 MHz to 30 MHz then the data was recorded with maximum conducted emissions levels. Refer to figures one and two for plots of the EUT AC Power Line conducted emissions.




Figure One AC Line Conducted Emissions Line 1




Figure Two AC Line Conducted Emissions Line 2

General Radiated EMI Testing Procedure

The EUT was arranged in the test fixture emulating worst-case equipment configuration and operated through all available modes with worst-case data recorded. Preliminary testing was performed in a screen room with the EUT positioned 1 meter from the FSM. Investigations were performed to identify the frequencies, which produced the highest radiated emissions. Radiated emission investigations were performed from 9 kHz to 12,000 MHz with the EUT positioned in three orthogonal axes per regulations. Frequencies of interest were recorded for use during testing on the OATS. Each investigated emission was then maximized at the OATS site before final radiated emissions measurements were performed. Antennas used were Loop from 0.09 to 30 MHz, Broadband Biconical from 30 MHz to 200 MHz, Log Periodic from 200 MHz to 1 GHz, and/or Biconilog from 30 MHz to 1000 MHz, Double-Ridge, and/or Pyramidal Horns and appropriate amplification stages above 1 GHz.




Figure Three Plot of Output Across Operational Band




Figure Four Plot of Occupied Bandwidth




Figure Five Plot of Lower Band Edge




Figure Six Plot of Higher Band Edge
